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BEWARE COATS OF ARMS THAT MAY BE FALSIFIED OR ILLEGAL

Genealogy-conscious(people of the United States) may look at a coat of arms as a source and symbol of family pride. However, a coat of arms could be an illegal possession and may not represent the true family line.

Heraldry, a term for the creation and use of coats of arms, is a much misunderstood art in the United States, according to Jerry D. Wells, manager of Brigham Young University's Family History Services, a non-profit research arm of the school.

Very few people have a legal right to display coats of arms. Displaying a coat of arms without establishing the right to do so is a punishable offense under the laws of European countries, Brother Wells explained.

This legal practice is still followed in Europe, but there are no such laws in the United States. Because of this, many Americans display coats of arms that have nothing to do with them, Brother Wells said.

"I would estimate that 95 percent of all LDS families descend from people who were not entitled to display coats of arms," Brother Wells stated. "Most early American colonizers were working-class people, and very few could claim membership in the wealthy European classes."

"Coats of arms were originally used to identify soldiers in the battlefield," Brother Wells explained. "The heavy armor worn by warriors in the Middle Ages required some extra identification and the most popular place to put the identification was on the battle shield."

Over the course of several hundred years, coats of arms developed into legal properties and became matters of official jurisdiction in England and other European nations. Official registers were established to record coats of arms and related pedigrees.

An original coat of arms belonged to an individual, not to a family. It was passed down through the generations from father to oldest son. Other family members were allowed to use variations of the original coat of arms.

For this reason, the chances of individuals having the legal right to display coats of arms are very slim, according to Brother Wells, who said that having the same surname as the one connected with a coat of arms does not give a person the right to display it.

Brother Wells said there are several companies in the United States that make a business of writing to individuals and asking if they would like copies of their family coat of arms.

Such companies generally massproduce the coats of arms and make no attempt to verify authenticity. Not only may such coats of arms be illegally purchased from such organizations, but they may not even represent the individual's family line.

Sometimes the promoters of these schemes will go to a public library and copy coats of arms from books of heraldry. At other times they will simply make up a new coat of arms.

There are thousands of different coats of arms in existence. Many public libraries have volumes containing coats of arms.

Some church members doing genealogical research may discover that one of their ancestors was an important official in Europe. It would then be worthwhile to see if that ancestor was entitled to display a coat of arms.

Likely candidates for coats of arms would be sheriffs, mayors and major landowners, he said.

The Dictionary of California Land Names

by Phil T. Hanna. 1946

- Pg. 7 ALPHA. Alpha and Omega were adjoining mining camps in 1850, the latter being shown on the Bancroft map of the mines on the north side of Bear River near the head waters. The names, the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, in the Scriptures denotes the beginning and the end. Alpha seems to have disappeared but Omega is shown on a plateau south of the south fork of Yuba River, Nev. Co.
- Pg.29 Birchville. A gold camp in the early fifties near the south fork Yuba River.
- Pg.30 North Bloomfield. Originally Humbug in 1851-52.
- Pg.34 Boulder Bar. South Fork, Yuba River, also known as Rocky Bar.
- Pg. 35 Brass Wire Bar. South Fork, Yuba River.
- Pg.37 Brownsville, Yuba Co. Honors I.E. Brown, he built a sawmill in 1851. The next year Martin Knox and P.E. Weeks purchased the mill. In 1858 Knox and his wife founded the Knox Institute.
- Pg.37 Buckeye House. On the Marysville-La Porte road.
- Pg.39 Bullards Bar Dam. Covers the site of Bullards Bar, founded in 1849 on the north fork Yuba River. Named for Dr. Bullard. The first bridge across the Yuba River was built here in 1850.
- Pg.40 Butte Co. Formed in Feb. 1850. The Buttes were a part of the county. The boundary was changed in 1854.
- Pg.47 Camptonville. First known as Gold Ridge, in 1850-51. The name was changed in 1852.
- Pg.47 Canal Bar. On the south fork of the Yuba River.

- Pg.57 City of 76. A mining camp in 1851 on the middle fork of the Feather River.
- Pg.59 Clipper Mills. Butte Co. Established in 1855.
- Pg.62 North Columbia, Columbia Hill. Established in 1853.
- Pg.63 Condemned Bar. At the mouth of Dobbins Creek on the middle fork of the Yuba River.
- Pg.65 Cordua Bar. Established 1849 on the Yuba River above Marysville.
- Pg.79 Dobbins. Established in 1849, named for Wm. M. and Mark D. Dobbins.
- Pg.81 Downieville. Frank Anderson discovered gold in 1849. The town was laid out in February, 1850 by James Vineyard. B. F. Parks suggested the name Downieville.
- Pg.83 Durgan Flat. Also Washingtonville. On the Yuba River near Downieville.
- Pg.86 Eliza City. On the Feather River south of Marysville. Settled by the Kennebec Co. The land was purchased from John A. Sutter and named for his daughter.
- Pg.87 Empire Ranch. Near Smartsville, established in 1849.
- Pg.88 English Bar. On the Yuba River, settled in 1851.
- Pg.88 Enterprise, in Butte Co. Named for the Union Enterprise Mining Co., 1852.
- Pg.90 Eureka, Sierra Co. Settled in 1856 on Eureka Creek near Downieville.
- Pg.90 Excelsior Diggings. Near Eureka on the north fork, Yuba River.
- Pg.92 Camp Far West. Established in Oct. 1849.  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles above Wheatland on the Bear River. The camp was closed in 1852.
- Pg.93 Featherton. On the Feather River below Honcut Creek.

- Pg.94 Findley's. A trading post in 1849 near the emigrant trail crossing to the Bear River. For a time the only point of supply between Salt Lake City and Sutter's Fort.
- Pg.96 Forbestown. Settled in 1850, named for B. F. Forbes.
- Pg.97 Forest, Sierra Co. Settled in 1853. Gold was discovered by Michael Savage, first called Forks of Oregon Creek, next, Yomana.
- Pg.97 Foster's Bar. Established by Wm. M. Foster and his wife Sarah. (Sarah Murphey of the Donner Party)
- Pg.99 Freeman's Crossing Bridge. The first bridge was built in 1851 by Tom Hess. The bridge was flooded out that winter, and rebuilt in 1852. Solt to Tom Freeman in 1854.
- Pg.101 French Ravine. On the middle fork of the Yuba River near the mouth of the south fork. The second largest nugget found in California in 1853, weighed 51 lbs.
- Pg.105 Galena Hill. Near Camptonville. Settled in 1852 by miners from Galena, Ill.
- Pg.107 Gibsonville. Sierra Co. First called Sears Diggins. Named Gibsonville in 1850. Mr. Gibson discovered gold in Secret Ravine nearby.
- Pg.112 Graniteville. Nevada Co. Settled in 1850, first called Eureka South, then Granitville in 1877.
- Pg.113 Greenville. Yuba Co. Near Challenge. Settled in 1850. Originally called Oregon Hill.
- Pg.114 Grissel Bar. On the south fork of the Yuba River.
- Pg.125 Hoodoo Bar. Settled in 1850 on the North fork of Yuba River.

- Pg. 133 Indiana Ranch, Yuba Co. On Indiana Creek near Frenchtown. A. P. (Pete) Labadie had a hotel, store and race track. Settled in 1851.
- Pg. 136 Jackass Flat. Settled in 1850 on the south fork Yuba River.
- Pg. 138 Jersey Flat. Settled in 1850 on the south side of the north fork Yuba River near Downieville. Jim Crow speared a trout that weighed 14 lbs. After boiling the trout, he found gold in the pot.
- Pg. 138 Jim Crow Canyon. Near Downieville, settled in 1850.
- Pg. 138 Jimmy Brown Bar. On the south Yuba, settled in 1850's.
- Pg. 139 Johnson's Rancho. A Spanish Grant of five leagues granted to Pablo Gutierrez in 1844. Later owned by Wm. Johnson.
- Pg. 142 Kanaka Bar. Middle fork Yuba River near Alleghaney.
- Pg. 142 Kanaka Creek Middle fork Yuba River. Discovered 1850 by Kanaka Capt. Ross, son of King Kamehameha.
- Pg. 143 Kennebec Bar. Settled 1849 Yuba River above Marysville.
- Pg. 144 Keno Bar. 1850s South fork Yuba River.
- Pg. 144 Kentucky Ranch. Near Dobbins.
- Pg. 144 Kentucky Ridge. Discovered 1851, near Rough and Ready.
- Pg. 145 Keystone Ranch, Kaystone Creek, near Indiana Ranch. Settled 1850s.
- Pg. 150 Landers Bar, 1850 south side Yuba River at the mouth of Deer Creek.
- Pg. 154 Lexington House. On Marysville-LaPorte road near LaPorte.
- Pg. 154 Linda. Settled in January 1850 on the south side of the Yuba River above Marysville. Named for the steamer Linda built by Lewis Cunningham of New York, in San Francisco in 1849. Operated between San Francisco and Marysville.

- Pg. 168 Marysville. Originally New Mecklenburg after Mecklenburg, Germany. Birth place of Theodore Cordua. In Oct. 1848 Chas. Covillaud bought a half interest in the tract. In 1849 A. LePlongeon laid out the townsite calling it Yubaville, becoming California's first planned city, patterned after Paris, France. At the town meeting on 18 Jan. 1850 the name was changed to Marysville in honor of Mary Covillaud (Mary Murphy, survivor of Donner Party). The city was incorporated 5 Feb. 1851.
- Pg. 170 Meadow Lake City, also known as Excelsior and Summit City. Settled in 1858, near the south fork Yuba River. The South Yuba Canal Co. built a dam for mining purposes. A Quartz discovery, by Henry Hartley in 1863.
- Pg. 177 Missouri Bar. On the north fork Yuba River. Named by miners from Pike Co. Missouri.
- Pg. 181 Mooney Flat. Settled in 1855-56.
- Pg. 182 Moore's Flat. Settled in 1851 near the south fork Yuba River. Named for H.H. Moore.
- Pg. 191 New Helvetia Rancho. Two grants, first 11 leagues to John Sutter in 1841, an additional 22 leagues granted him in 1845. The Rancho included the sites of Yuba City, Marysville and Nicolaus.
- Pg. 192 New York Flat. The New York Ranch included a race track. Settled in 1855-56.
- Pg. 192 Nicolaus, Sutter Co. Named for Nicolaus Allgeier, a Hudson Bay trapper, came to California in 1840. He worked for Sutter at Hock Farm. Settled at Nicolaus in 1846, built a ferry and hotel in 1849. County seat of Sutter Co. 1850-51, again in 1852 and 1854.
- Pg. 198 Onion Valley. Discovered July 1850. On Jan 1, 1851, \$6,000.00 was recovered in one hour. One nugget valued at \$1,800.00.
- Pg. 199 Oregon Bar. On the west side of the north fork Yuba River, four miles above Foster's Bar.
- Pg. 200 Oregon House. Atchison Bros. from Garden Valley built the original hotel.

- Pg. 209 Parks Bar. Located about 12 miles above Marysville on the Yuba River. Gold discovered in August 1848 by Stephen Cooper, John Marsh, John P. Long and Clay, W. Willis and Nickolaus Hunsaker. They took out 525 lbs. of gold. They were followed by David Parks for whom the bar was named. He and his family were emigrants of 1848, headed for Oregon, heard of gold discovery in California. Parks took out \$85,000 by 1849. Later he settled in New Orleans. His sons Stayed in California. The original bar is now covered by 70 feet of hydraulic debris.
- Pg. 218 Poker Flat. Near LaPorte on Canyon Creek. Gold discovered in 1850. The mines produced \$700,000 in one month.
- Pg. 219 LaPorte. Settled in 1851, first known as Rabbit Creek. In 1857 the name was changed to LaPorte by Frank Everts, for his home town, LaPorte, Indiana.
- Pg. 219 Port Wine. Settled in 1850, Prospecters found a keg of port hidden in the brush by packers. After drinking the wine they hunted for water and found rich gravel.
- Pg. 225 Railroad Hill. Four miles north of Camptonville. Settled in 1852. This was the first camp where iron rails and cars were used.
- Pg. 230 Relief Hill, Nev. Co. A station on the route of the relief party to the Donner Party. The expedition was headed by Reasin P. Tucker from Johnson's Rancho in 1847.
- Pg. 236 Rose Bar. Named for John Rose, native of Scotland. He came to California in 1839 via Mexico. Settled at Yerba Buena (San Francisco). In 1848 Rose was building a grist mill for Vallejo when gold discovery was announced. He mined on the American River before finding gold at Rose Bar. Later he built and operated a store on the bar until 1857. He became one of the promoters of Marysville.
- Pg. 237 Rough and Ready, Nev. Co. Settled in 9 Sept. 1849 by a group from Wisconsin led by Capt. A.A. Townsend. His company was called, the Rough and Ready Co., as Townsend had served with Gen. Zach Taylor (Old Rough and Ready) in the Mexican War. In 1850 they refused to pay a Federal tax on miners, formed the State of Rough and Ready, adopted a constitution, ceded from the United States and established the Great Republic of Rough and Ready.

- Pg. 237 Rush Creek. A rich camp producing \$3,000,000. South of the south fork of the Yuba River.
- Pg. 254 North San Juan. First here was Christian Kientz, veteran of Vera Cruz in the Mexican War. Settled in 1853. So called for resembling a bluff near Vera Cruz at the Castle of San Juan de Ulloa, the fort guarding Vera Cruz. North was added to the name in 1857 when the post office was established.
- Pg. 276 Sharon Valley. The Sharon Valley Mill was established by L.T/ Crane in 1853.
- Pg. 279 Sicard Flat. Gold camp of 1849-50. Sicard Bar, first discovery of gold on the Yuba River. Named for Pierre Theodore Sicard, a French sailor and carpenter. He arrived in California in 1833, worked for Sutter. Received a Spanish grant, Nemshas Rancho, 1844.
- Pg. 279 Sierra City. First settled in 1850 by Philo A. Haven and Joe Zumwalt. It was destroyed by an avalanche in 1852. Rebuilt in 1858. In 1868 the Monumental nugget was found by Mexican Frank and Joe Tierney at the bottom of the shaft of the Monumental Mine. The nugget was broken in removing but the main piece weighed 104 lbs. When minted, more than \$23,000 in gold pieces were made. Other nuggets weighing 20 to 50 lbs. were found here.
- Pg. 279 Sierra County. Formed from Yuba Co., 16 Apr 1852.
- Pg. 286 Spect Bar. On the Yuba River, a few miles above Marysville. Jonas Spect who came to California in 1847. In the spring of 1848 he discovered gold on Spect Bar. He established the town of Fremont, farmed in Colusa Co., a State Senator from Sonoma Dist. during the first legislature at San Jose, 15 Dec. 1849. Unseated 24 Dec. Died, Colusa Co. 3 July 1883.
- Pg. 287 Spenceville. Stopping place on the Grass Valley Road, established in 1866. Named for Edward F. Spence, druggist of Nevada City, who donated lumber for a schoolhouse built in Spenceville in 1868. Copper discovered about 1870, mined until 1890 and again in 1914-15.
- Pg. 287 Stanfield Hill. Named for Wm. Stanfield. His tavern was called the Stanfield House.

- Pg. 291 Strawberry Valley. Named in 1850 by Capt. Wm. Mock. The Indian name was Pomingo. Before 1860 part of the town was in Butte Co., the rest in Yuba Co.
- Pg. 291 Sucker Flat. A mining camp near Smartsville. Once called Gatesville.
- Pg. 301 Timbuctoo. Established in 1850. Hydraulic mining began here in 1859. Had a population of 1500.
- Pg. 301 Tincup Bar. On the north fork of the Yuba River. Paid a tincup of gold per man per day.
- Pg. 323 Wheatland. A Spanish Grant to Pablo Guteirrez in 1844 of 5 leagues on the north bank of the Bear River. Sold by Magistrate John Sutter to Wm. Johnson and Sebastian Keyser on 28 April 1845, Johnson receiving the east half. Johnson's was an important stop on the Truckee Route. The first relief parties for the Donner Party left from here. In 1849 the military camp at Camp Far West was established. Wheatland was established in 1866. Johnson was a native of Boston, came to California in 1840, mate of the "Alciope". Married Mary Murphy in June 1847 and divorced her a short time later. She later married Charles Covillaud. Johnson disappeared from the scene in 1852.
- Pg. 324 Whiskey Diggings. Established in the early 1850s. Also known as Newark.
- Pg. 327 Winslow Bar. Settled in the early 1850s on the Yuba River. Named for Capt. Winslow who brought the first shipload of Chinese from the Sandwich Islands to work in the mines.

To: H. H. Folsom, County Supt. of Pub. Schools of Yuba Co., State of Calif.

We, the undersigned heads of families and residents of the Buckeye  
School District, Yuba Co., Calif. hereby enter our protest against the  
petition of James Bryden and others asking to be set off from the Buckeye  
School District of Yuba Co., to that of the Salam School Dist., Butte  
Co. for the following reasons herein set forth:

1st: That the residences of Jacob Nagler is no nearer to the Salam  
School House than it is to the Buckeye School House. That the residences  
of James Bryden and W.H.C. Bartlett are nearer to the Buckeye School House  
than they are to the Salem School House - each being nearer than two miles  
from the Buckeye School House, as will be shown by the accompanying map.

2nd: That the above mentioned parties who represent six census child-  
ren have the same opportunity of travelling the same road that nine tenths  
of the pupils of the Buckeye School have travelled for the last 12 years,  
and previous to the removal of the school house to its new site, and farther  
than this there is an old travelled road from Jas. Bryden's house, passing  
by W.H.C. Bartletts, that is over Mr. Bryden's ranch to within  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a  
mile or less from Buckeye School House, and thence over a travelled road  
across the land of the estate of the late Daniel Donahoe direct to the  
Buckeye School House, and that said road is open for at least three fourths  
of the time, and then closed only by Mr. Bryden.

3rd: That if the proposed change was made, it would take  $\frac{4}{5}$  of the  
best land in the Buckeye District out of the county as taxable property  
for school purposes, and would work a great hardship to the remaining resi-  
dents of the Buckeye School District for the reason that the district would  
contain less than 20 census children, as will be shown by the last Census  
Marshals Report, which will cause the district to lose \$100 per year public  
money, and they consequently would be compelled to have their school only  
six months instead of eight months, as in former years.

4th: That it would take the land to within  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a mile of the Buck-  
eye School House on the North and 1 mile on the West and transfer it to the  
Salem School District, whose school building would be 4 miles or more away  
in an air line.

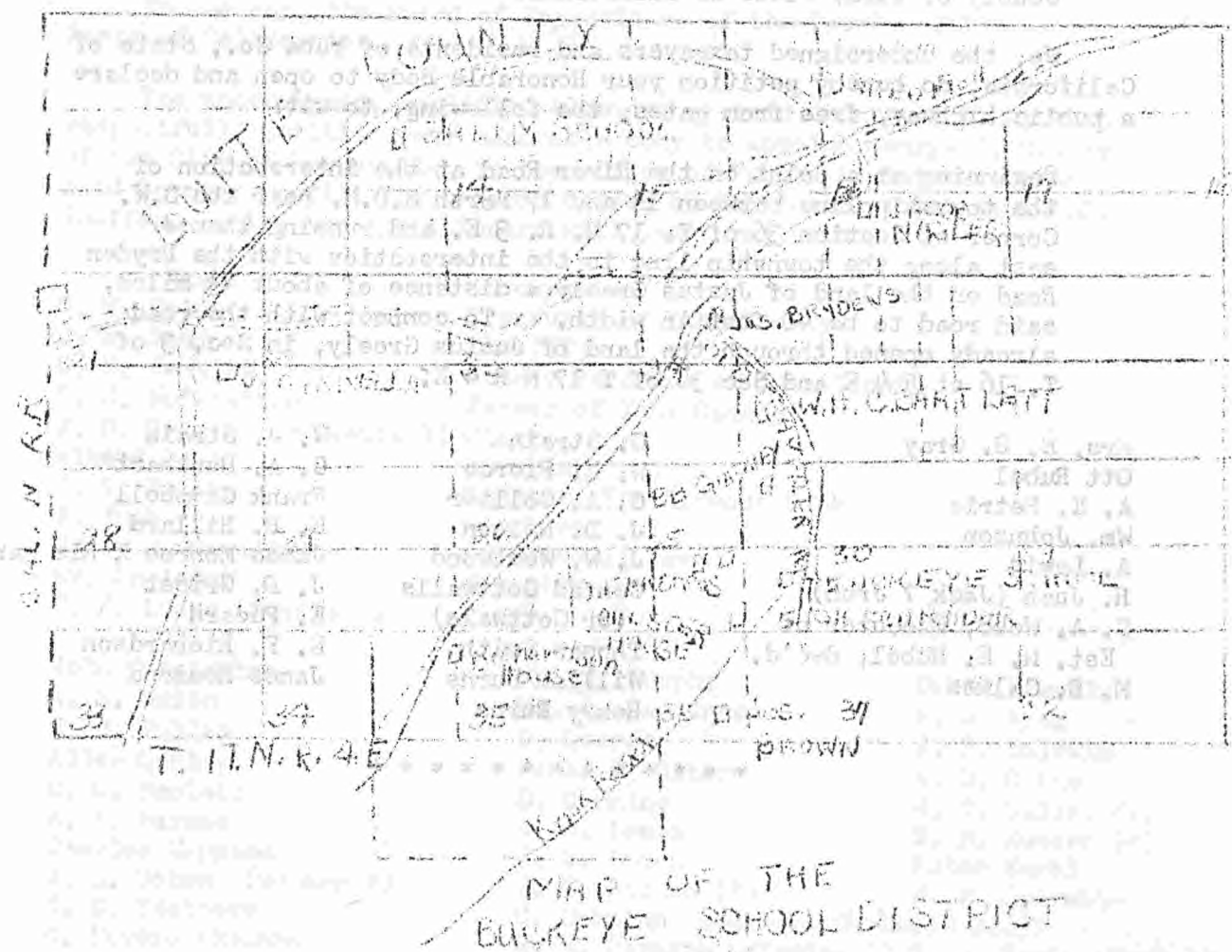
