## SUTTER CO. DIRECTORY 1878

Organized in 1850. Bounded on north by Yuba and Butte, east by Yuba and Placer, south by Sacramento and Yolo, and west by Yolo and Colusa counties. Area, 576 square miles; County Seat, Yuba City; population estimated 7,800; value of real and personal property, estimated \$5,400,000. The county was named after General John A. SUTTER, one of its first settlers, and who for many years made his home at Hock Farm, on the banks of the Feather River. It was in the General's mill-race on the south fork of the American River at Coloma, El Dorado county, gold was first discovered, on the 19th of January, 1848. "The Buttes," a group consisting of three rugged peaks, rising abruptly from the plain to an altitude of 1,100 feet, and covering an area of twelve miles in length and four miles in breadth, form a land mark of the valley. The resources are exclusively agricultural, the Co. occupying a fertile section in the center of the Sacramento Valley. Productions, small grains and fruit. The BRIGGS orchard, one of the most valuable in the State, is located two miles south of Yuba City. The producers are favored with two navigable streams on the east and west of the county, which gives quick transit and low freights to tide water. County officers: Jesse H. CRADDOCK, County Judge; M.C. EARNEY, sheriff and Tax Collector; A.B. VAN ARSDALE, Treasure; A.E. CLARY, Assessor; J.G. MC MILLAN, Surveyor; Jasper FIELDS, Coroner and Public Administrator; O.E. There were four of us girls and my brother. I was 8 (Mary Ann), Emaretta 10, Emline was 13, and brother was 4 years old (Lorenzo), and Afaline 7. Father told us we would have to gather buffalo chips to cook our food with. We told him we would not pick up the dirty stuff, but we did and soon didn't minde at all. It made a very good hot fire, we used our dining chairs for a sled to put the chips on and it wore the back legs off to a point.

We had a little camp cook stove with an oven and Mother (Lydia) cooked on that. She had a churn and put cream in it and as we traveled the action of the wagon churned the cream so we had butter from the past milking and plenty of fresh milk at each stop.

There was a great many other families in our wagon train and the Captain of our train found two children, a boy and a girl, that had been stolen or else escaped a massacre. Anyway they were alone and lost on the prarie, he took them and cared for them. The girl died but the boy grew up and later made a trip east with his foster father.

We formed our wagon trains into a big circle with the wagons on the outside as per regulations. It was the style of those days.

One time we children found clams and dug them. Mother made us a nice clam soup. Mother thought they were oysters, but Father said "No clams.."

Father told us not to let the Indians see us eat for fear they'd want to eat too and then we would not have enough for us. Some times we got pretty hungry if the Indians escorted us too long at a time.

We saw a wagon on the desert that was all fastened up with a note on it, "Do not disturb or enter here. This belongs to me and I'll be back for it." I do not remember exactly but anyway we did not disturb it, and we never knew if the owner came back for it or not or if some one stole it, but always hoped the right one got it.

One time when our animals were famished for water we came upon a hot springs and the men had a terrible time holding back the animals from the hot water while other men dug a hole at a little distance and let the hot water flow into it and cool enough for the animals to drink.

We passed an Indian burrial ground where the dead were placed on platforms built up high on poles.

Another place we passed where we could get a thick gum from trees. This we gathered and wormed enough to pack on the Oxens hoofs when the were sore and cracked.

MARY ANN PARKER, REYNOLDS, VAN NORMAN, WILGUS

This was copied from a note book that Philip VAN NORMAN had and submitted by Eleanor VAN NORMAN STEWART, 115 Burr St., Corona, Calif., 91720.

Notes about her life as told by Mary Ann PARKER, REYNOLDS, VAN NORMAN, WILGUS. Now residing (1935) at 2727 Santa Clara Way, Sacramento, Calif.

I was born in Sagamon Co. Illinois, near Abraham Lincoln's birthplace. I had six sisters and four brothers. My father, Alonzo PARKER, made two trips to California before Mother, Lydia Ann BRINK, PARKER, and we younger children came with him.

My oldest sister Susan and her husband Ed HUFMASTER came west with father on his first trip. My second sister Cordelia married David HUFMASTER, brother of Ed. Cordelia died while father was west and David HUFMASTER came west with father on the second trip. He left his little daughter with his mother in Illinois. David HUFMASTER never reached California, but died on the way out and was buried on the plains in a coffin made from boards from a wagon box and stones were piled over it and a marker also made from pieces of wagon box. The first trip to California Father brought mules, but on the second trip he brought cattle and oxen. He was gone four years on his first trip, 1849-1852.

When we were coming west, Emaretta (my sister just older than I) was walking barefoot she stepped on a purse made of doe skin and upon investigation, found it to be full of gold dust. It came in handy!

Emaretta had red hair and blue eyes and Father used to tease her by telling her the Indians liked red haired girls, so she always hid when she saw Indians for fear they would steal her.

Another time David my father's younger brother went out to find some strayed oxen and found one that had been lost or strayed from a former wagon train, so he brought it in too.

The men took turns watching and sleeping the entire time. Some times they kept warm when sleeping by putting their heads on a mule. One could always tell if anything was wrong because the mule would raise it's head to listen and that would wake the sleeper.

On the first trip out Susan saw snow and thought it was close and wanted to get some. Father told her it was too far up on the mountain to get. It didn't look far to Susan so she went after it. She was surely dead tired from walking when she overtook the wagon train but she had her apron full of snow.

We passed beautiful places and wanted Father to live there but each time he said "No" and kept right on facing west.

We saw enormous Sunflowers and we picked the sun dried gum that oozed from the tree like stalks. This must have been in Utah as they talked about the Mormans bringing the seeds to raise food for their stock.

When Ed HUFFMASTER was working in a saw mill on Diamond Springs, Calif., Susan, his wife cooked for the men. Their small son Johnny wanted a piece of cake. Susan told him to run outside and play and she would make him some. He wandered out side where some logs were piled and being tired he laid down in the shade of a pile of logs. The logs started to roll and rolled over him, so he never got his cake after all. Father, Alonzo PARKER, was there at the time.

Father put out some fruit trees, they were some of the first trees to be planted in California. We rented at Wheatland on the SETH PARKER PLACE. We always thought it queer his name and ours alike but no relation.

My teacher gave me a peach for being good in school and it was a real prize as they were so scarce.

When I was seventeen I married Rhubin REYNOLDS in Wheatland, Yuba Co. Calif. 8-25-1866. We first lived at Coon Creek but later moved to Wheatland. We had three children, Addie, Emaretta, and Blanchard.

In September Rhubin my husband went up near Mt. Shasta to a grist mill with a load of grain to get our year supply of flour made. While there he died of typhoid pneumonia and was burried at Edgewood, Old Butteville, Oct. 3, 1871. (A widow at twenty three and three little children.)

Later I married Nathaniel VAN NORMAN, March 20, 1873, in Marysville, Yuba Co. Calif. We lived on Hat Creek in Shasta Co. We lived there about twelve years and I had five children. BIRTHA, VANDY, RETTA, OTTO, and CONVERSE.\*

Emaretta REYNOLDS and BIRTHA VAN NORMAN both died in the Diphtheria epidemic of 1878. They were burried at DOYLE CEMETERY at Hat Creek. (no longer a cemetery) Nathaniel's health became so bad he could no longer run the ranch and we moved to Millville, where he died in 1896. He was hurt by his horse running away and the horse ran under a limb of a tree and knocked him off. he had paralysis from this accident. I had known VAN NORMAN when I was a child, He was a scout on the wagon train when we came west. He was 6 ft. tall, grey eyes, light complexion, brown hair. He was 17 years older than I was. I had a Chinaman to do the washing and help with the work, and garden. I

thought he was dirty so Van took him to the creek and scrubbed him with a brush.

I came to Sacramento to live. I met and married Lorenzo WILGUS, a Civil War Colonel. We were married in Oak Park, Sacramento, September 10, 1903. This has been my home for 35 years and I lost Co. WILGUS the first of this year at the age of 93. Jan. 28, 1934.

I am still in fairly good health and love to go places and see things yet. I have ridden in Ox Carts across the plains from Illinois to California, and recently I was able to fly in a big aeroplan. I certainly enjoyed it very much.

(Mary Ann lived to be 92 years old. Died Jan 9, 1911.)

Sorry about the delay of the Publication, but it has been a combination of things that was the cause, but the biggest one is the paper strike for the last 6 months.

## YUBA COUNTY

Organized in 1850. Bounded north by Butte, east by Sierra and Nevada, south by Placer and Sutter, and west by Sutter and Butte Counties. The area equals six hundred square miles. County seat: Marysville (incorporated city).

Principal towns: Camptonville, Wheatland, Smartsville, Timbuctoo, Brownsville, and Brown's Valley. Yuba, with its principal city (Marysville) at the confluence of the Yuba and Feather rivers, and with the different lines of railroads entering it, possesses important commercial resources. The county comprises both mountain and valley land - the former productive in gold and abounding in valuable forests of pine, and the latter producing grains, fruits and all classes of vegetation to great perfection. The placer mines at Sucker Flat, Smartsville, Timbuctoo, camptonville and Sicard Flat, are the most productive of their class in the State, and quartz mines are being successfully worked at various places. The fruit orchards of Yuba have attained a wide celebrity, and have been very remunerative to their owners. The principal orchards being the Millar Bros., James Strain, and the New England, owned by Treat & Co., and are the finest in the State, having the reputation of always sending the first fruit to the San Francisco market each season. There is also an extensive almond orchard four miles north of Marysville, known as the Taylor Almond Orchard, of over eight thousand bearing trees. The foothill lands have awakened a new interest, in that they have proved to be the finest fruit-producing lands in the State, and are now being rapidly brought under cultivation. The Bonanza Ranch in the foothills east of Marysville have over four hundred acres of fine alfalfa grass, and several thousand orange trees, all of which denote the value of this class of land. Peaches, oranges, grapes and other delicate varieties of fruits are largely produced through the county. Small grains, as wheat, barley, oats, etc. are very generally grown upon the plain lands; failures have never occurred and short crops are very rare. The navigable waters of Feather river and the Railroad afford cheap means of transportation. The California and Oregon Railroad passes through the county, connecting direct with San Francisco, has its terminus in Marysville, but is not at present in operation, the piling across the tule in Sutter county having been swept away by high water. It is anticipated the road will soon be placed in running order. The Northern California road connects with Oroville (Butte Co) and Marysville.

BROWN'S VALLEY: Situated twelve miles northeast of Marysville. Population, 100 persons. A post-office with mail three times a week. Valuable quartz lodes exist here. \$100,000 plus expended in developing mines, but owing to great flow of water into lower levels, they were finally abandoned, and only wrecks remain.

SICARD FLAT 14 miles northeast of Marysville and 3 miles from Brown's Valley. One of oldest mining camps in county, as well as most prolific in its yield of gold. Hydraulic claims now at work; one of largest being South Feather & Union Mining Co, Sicard Flat. The mines give promise of an increase of receipts, and will probably last many years.

BROWNSVILLE: A small settlement 32 miles northeast of Marysville. A post-office with mail 3 times a week. Fine Hotel owned by Martin Knox and a Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellow. Fine orchards and valuable mines.

**BULLARD'S BAR:** 35 miles from Marysville on Camptonville Rd. Post Office, tri-weekly mail, and also a public school.

**CAMPTONVILLE:** 41 miles northeast of Marysville. 300 residents. Bank, Post office Telegraph and express offices. Settled in 1852, at one time was one of most flourishing mining camps in State. Tri-weekly mail w/ Marysville by stage. Also Nevada City and Colfax.

**HANSONVILLE:** In foothills, 25 miles NE of Marysville on Forbestown stage road. Has tri-weekly mail. Rich mineral deposits here. Fruit orchards and vineyards.

**HONCUT:** 12 miles N of Marysville. Postoffice w/tri-weekly mail. Fine agricultural.

**MARYSVILLE:** County seat, incorporated, largest and most prosperous north of Sacramento. In 1841 the present site of city and vicinity were occupied as a ranch, known as Cordua Grant, being named after Mr. Cordua. Spring, 1849, Cordua's interest in grant goes to Messrs. Nye, Covillaud & Foster - and it becomes "Nye's Ranch". In 1849 the city was laid out and in 1851 it was incorporated. Deep discussion on name of town, and Capt. Edward Power, St. Louis, proposed to name it after Mrs. Covillaud. Became Marysville.

**Oregon House:** 23 Miles NE of Marysville. Twi-weekly mail and PO for large district.

**STRAWBERRY VALLEY:** 45 Miles NE of Marysville. Center large district. Tri-weekly mail and Wells Fargo & Co. express have an agency here.

**SUCKER FLAT** Mining Camp, 1 mile from Smartsville.

**TILBUCTOO:** 16 Miles East of Marysville. 200 inhabitants. Daily stage and mail.

**WHEATLAND:** Incorporated town of 400, 12 miles SE of Marysville on California-Oregon Railroad line. Town laid out in 1866. Fine agricultural region, and a trading center of considerable importance. In the town, a large flouring mill, a bank and a number of fine brick buildings, with an excellent public school. The Wheatland Recorder, a local journal, is published weekly.
