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Editor's Notes

Deeds are a valuable source of genealogical information, but they are often ignored by researchers. In the early days of "The New World", land was plentiful, and people were anxious to acquire it. Thus, deeds are among our earliest records and sometimes even exist where other records have been destroyed.

Marriage records, completed probate records, and miscelaneous court records, were usually not replaced after their destruction; but the land owner had to prove ownership of the land before he could pass it on to someone else. This often led to a history, in the deed, which included all the owners from the earliest grantee, with their relationship, if any, explained.

The first deed a family has to land in an area may indicate, not only when the family arrived, but where they came from. The last deed may indicate when they leave an area, and where they are moving to. (Remember in your search to study the history of the county. County and state lines were often moved or adjusted. Sometimes a person is given as a grantor, but you must look to the earlier seat of government to find him as the grantee.) Deeds were private acts between people and were not always recorded immediately. Sometimes the purchaser did not record his ownership until it was necessary for him to do this so he could sell it.

Deeds may be the only public document where you can find the name of a wife. Land could be purchased by the hustand,—but, even in the male dominated society of the early days, the wife usually had to agree to the sale of the land. Many deeds will have a notation at the end that the wife was examined separately and agreed to the sale. The wife then had to sign this.

The names of witnesses should also be noted. It was a common practice to use relatives of the principals involved as witnesses.

Land descriptions given in deeds may be a very important factor in a search. If you can locate where the family lived, you may be able to locate a nearby church or cemetery that the family used, and thus locate other records. Land descriptions may also include the names of neighboring land owners. These neighbors may also relatives. Neighbors often married neighbors, and also migrated to new areas together.

In my research I have found the following in deeds, and this is just a sample of what you may find.

Jefferson Co., Al --1832--A father had no land but deeded his household goods to his children, and naming their relationship to him. No probate found.

Cabarrus Co., NC - 1803 - Aged parents deeded their land to their son and his wife for "care and affection in their old age" (names all given). Probate records for this county were lost by fire.

Perry Co., Il -1851- The probate record available named only the administrator, but the deed book named all ten children as "the heirs of the deceased", when the land was sold.

Murray Co., GA - 1849 - Thr probate record named the wife and the children, but gave no death date. When the land was divided, the deed book included the wife's dower settlement, and gave the date of her husband's death.

GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH -- HOW TO PEGIN

Unless you are a king or a president or other notable, finding your ancestors and making sure a family tree is kept for future generations may be up to you. The federal government does not do family research, nor does its National Archives collect or preserve family trees. Books on family history and genealogy are collected, compiled, and published by private individuals who do so because they are interested descendants.

As the depository of the Federal Government's records deemed of permanent value for historical purposes, the Mational Archives houses many records that can be helpful to persons who wish to trace their ancestry. The search, however, cannot be completed at the National Archives alone. Many other depositories should be consulted. Following are suggestions about things to do and ways to go

about getting a start at finding your ancestors:

START VITH YOURSELF

You are the beginning 'twig' on the vast family tree. Start with yourself, the known, and work toward the unknown. Find out all the vital information you can about your parents, write it down, then find out about your parents, great grandparents, etc.

MANES, DATES, PLACES, RELATIONSHIES

You will be concerned with pulling from the many and varied documents of recorded history four key items: names, dates, places, and relationships. These are the tools of the family searcher. Ieople can be identified in records by their names, the dates of events in their lives (birth, marriage, death), the places they lived, and by relationships to others, either stated or implied in the records.

The place to begin is at home. Here you can find much information in family bibles, newspaper clippings, military certificates, birth and death certificates, marriage licenses, diaries, letters, scrap= books, backs of pictures, baby books, etc.

RELATIVES AS SOURCE

Visit or write those in your family who may have information, particularly older relatives. Here often than not others before you have gathered data about the families in which you are interested. You should make a letter, personal visit, and telephone survey to find out about such persons and what information is already collected.

FINDING DISTANT RELATIVES

Before launching your research program in libraries and archives, search for distant relatives who may have already performed research Advertise in the local genealogical bulletins (city, county, or stat where your ancestors lived. The most widely circulated genealogical magazine (which also specializes in getting people together who are working on the same families) is "The Genealogical Helper", Everton lublishers. Inc., F.O. Box 368, Logan, UT 84321

CHURCH RECORDS

A few churches have records of important events in the lives of members but many do not. Investigate the possibility of finding genealogical data in the records of the church to which your ancestor belonged.

DEEDS AND WILLS

Records of property acquisition and disposition can be good sources of genealogical data. Such records are normally in the county courthouses. Often the earliest county records or copies of them are also available in State archives.

FEDERAL RECORDS

The National Archives in Washington, D.C., has records of use in genealogical research. The Federal census made every 10 years since 1790 is a good source. The census records are also available on microfilm in the National Archives' regional branches located in 11 metropolitan areas throughout the country. The National Archives also has military service and related records, passenger arrival records, and others. See the free leaflet, "Genealogical Records in the National Archives."

LIBRARIES, SOCIETIES, ARCHIVES

Visit the State, regional, and local institutions in your area. Libraries, historical and genealogical societies, and archival deportionies are all good sources for genealogical and family history data

USING THE CENSUS

The most widely used record ever created by the Government is its Federal census of population. The Federal Government started taking censuses in 1790. The first census was taken to help apportion representation to Congress. A population census has been taken every ten years since that time. Over the years the original purpose has expanded to include the gathering of data for various statistical uses, which has progressively increased the research value of the census.

The census is one of the first records beginning family history searchers consult, since the data they find can be used to entirely or partially reconstitute families. Researchers usually examine the latest census available to find their ancestors living that year. They then work back through each available decennial census.

The National Archives has the Federal Population Census Schedules on microfilm for the years 1790-1900. These microfilm publications are available at the National Archives Building in Washington, D.C., and in 11 regional archives branches located in metropolitan areas throughout the country. Many State and local research depositories

have purchased copies of all or part of these microfilmed census holdings. The 1890 census was virtually destroyed in 1921 in a Department of Commerce fire. The remaining 1890 entries, some 6000 in number, are on microfilm, and there is an alphabetical i index available. The 1910 and later censuses are under restriction and have not been released for public use. Recent censuses are withheld from researchers out of respect to the privacy of living individuals who were enumerated; however, under certain conditions the Bureau of the Census will release some information. The National Archives has forms available (Form BC 600) for use in contacting the Bureau regarding recent censuses.

The 1790-1840 censuses give the names of the free heads of house-hold only; other family members are tallied by age and sex but are not named. In 1850, the census takers listed the names and ages of every free person living in every household. Also listed was the State, Territory, or country of birth of each free person. Additional information was included with each succeeding census.

The census schedules are organized primarily along geographic lines, that is, by State, county, and county subdivision (such as township or municipality). Since the records are thereunder unarranged, the searcher must scan the pages line by line until locating the desired name.

Many statewide indexes are available in the finding aid section near the microfilm reading area. The 1900 census has an accompanying soundex, which is an index based upon the sound and spelling of surnames. The 1880 census also has a soundex, but it relates only to households containing children 10 years old or younger and is consequently not a complete index.

To use a soundex, you first code the name, following the instructions on page 90 in the catalog, Federal Population Censuses 1790-1890. The soundex roll list for 1880 is on pages 75-85. The 1900 soundex roll list is in the catalogue titled 1900 Federal Population Census Schedules, beginning on page 31. First locate the State and note its series number. For example, on the 1880 soundex the series number for North Carolina is T-766. If the name you have coded is J 270, look for the T-766 roll that contains names ranging from J 210 through J 666.

Mount the film on a microfilm reading machine and find the appropriate code and name. The microfilmed index cards under each code are arranged alphabetically by the individual's first or given name or initials. In the arrangement, there will be different surnames having the same code as the one you are looking for. Do not be misled by this. When you have found the name you want, look for four items of information located in the upper right corner of the card: volume, enumeration district (e.d.), page, and line numbers. If you do not locate a name, perhaps you missed the entry or the family was listed in some other places. Check to make sure you coded the name properly, and ensure that you have the correct roll.

Consult the catalogs, 'Federal Population Census Schedules 1790-1890, or the 1900 'Federal Population Census Schedules,' to find the roll numbers for the microfilmed census schedules. In the catalog locate the census year, State, and county, then find the number of the roll you need. Be sure you have the right census year. Census years are arranged chronologically beginning with the 1790. Note the series number given at the beginning of the listing for each census year. For example. M704 is the series number for the 1840 census.

The census microfilm is normally available to you in "self-service" fashion. All boxes or drawers are marked to indicate the roll numbers they contain. If the roll you are looking for is not in the drawer or box, it may be in use; check with others im the room.

Sometimes the wrong roll has been put into a box. Check at the beginning of the roll to see that the number of the microfilm matches the number on the box. If the film appears to be upside down when you have threaded it onto the reader, try reversing the reels. Sometimes patrons fail to rewind film. If that is the case, you can either view the film from back to front, or rewind it and look from the beginning.

Forms are available at a nominal charge for recording the information you find. If you do not use the forms, be sure to copy all pertinent data. This should include all elements of information on any given individual, including the page number; and, for later censuses, the enumeration district, volume, sheet, and line numbers (+++my note--also note families nearby, they may be relatives++) Proper notetaking will enable location of the entry again when needed and will ensure that you have sufficient information for recording sources in the preparation of research articles or family histories.

You may have copies made of microfilm images. The fees are posted. The research room attendant will help you.

NATURALIZATION RECORDS

During the 19th century any court of record at any level of government, - city, county, state, or Federal - was authorized to conduct naturalization proceedings and the records may still be with that particular court. In other instances the records may have been turned over to an archival institution but the court has retained the indexes. The regional archives branches, in most instances, have only those Federal naturalization records found in their appropriate regions. Naturalization records have not been microfilmed. In most cases, naturalization was performed in non-Federal courts. To begin a search for a naturalization record one should write first to the Clerk of the appropriate city, county, state, or Federal Court to determine the location of the records and the petition number before attempting to use the naturalization records.

Two kinds of documents were filed to become a naturalized citizen, the declaration of intent and the petition. Declarations of intent were not necessarily filed in the same court of the petitions since a 3 to 5 year (or longer) period had to pass between the filing of the two documents. In the meantime the potential citizen may have moved or the courts might have reorganized. Also, some courts file civilian petitions separately from military petitions and your request for a petition should indicate if you are seeking a militar; or civilian petition.

FEDERAL LAND RECORDS

Federal land records document only the first transfer of title to land from the United States to another party. Records of later transactions should be in the office of the county recorder.

The Federal Archives and Records Center, San Bruno, has tract books and abstract books from local land offices in California and Nevada that record entries made upon the public land. If you can give us the legal description (section, township, and range numbers of the land in question we will search the tract books for that entry or you may use the tract books in our search room.

We also have several microfilm publications concerning private land grant claims (Spanish and Mexican) in California. The microfilm may be used in our search room or it may be borrowed on interlibrary loan. For more information about these publications, pleas see our booklet 'Microfilm Publications Concerning Spanish Private

Land Grant Claims.'

Maps and other survey records are in the Genter for Cartographic and Architectural Archives, Science and Technological Archives Division, National Archives and Records Service, Washington, D.C. 2-408. No forms are needed to request information or copies of records.

The General Archives Division, National Archives and Records Service, Washington, D.C. 20409, has land entry files containing applications, affidavits, receipts, and similar records, created during the process of perfecting a homestead or similar land entry. No forms are needed to request information or order copies of records.

The General Archives Division has Federal land records for the following States; Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Florida, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, Wisconsin, and Wyoming. The remaining States were never part of the Federal public domain.

Land entry papers cannot be located with just the name for those States for which the Division does not have an index. For these States, to find land entry papers when the certificate identification is not known, you should furnish a legal description of the land in terms of range, township, section, and fraction of section. This can usually be obtained from the county recorder of deeds. (Sometimes he can also furnish the certificate identification.)

There are indexes for ontries after 1908.

Military bounty land warrants are arranged by act of Congress, certificate number, and for warrants under the acts of 1847-1855. by number of acres. There are indexes for the Revolutionary War and most of the War of 1812 warrants, but not for the warrants under the acts of 1847-1855. To identify warrants under these acts use GSA Form 6751 to request a search of bounty land warrants applications among the military service records. After obtaining the warrant application number, furnish this information to the General Archives Division for a search for the surrendered warrant and other records relating to its use to acquire land.

The land entry papers and abstract books for all Federal public domain States and the record copies of patents and central office tract books for western States are in the General Archives Division

The Bureau of Land Management, Eastern States Office, 7981 Eastern Avenue, Silver Spring, MD 20910 has tract books and copies of patents for eastern states (those east of the Mississippi River and Louisiana, Arkansas, Missouri, Iowa, and Minnesota).

MILITARY AND CIVILIAN PERSONNEL RECORDS

The regional archives branches do not have military and civilian

service and pension records.

GSA Form 6751, Order and Billing for Copies of Veteran's Records, should be used to request records checked below from Military Service Records (NNCC). National Archives (GSA), Washington, D.C. 20408.

=== Pension application files based on United States (not State) service before World War I. (Pensions based on military service for the Confederate States were authorized by some Southern States, but not by the Federal Government until 1959. Inquiries about State pensions should be addressed to the State archives at the capital of the veteran's State of Residence after the war.)

=== Bounty-land warrant applications files based on United States

(not State) service before 1856.

=== Military service records based on service in the United States Army (officers who served before June 30, 1917, enlisted men before October 31, 1912), Navy (officers and enlisted men who served before 1896), and Confederate armed forces (1861-1865).

Information concerning restrictions on military personnel records in the custody of the National Personnel Records Center is contained on GSA Form 7231, Statement Concerning Requests for Genealogical Information From Military Personnel Records at the National Personnel Records Center.

The personnel records for most civilian employees whose service terminated after 1909, and records of the service with some

agencies prior to that date, are located at the National Personnel Records Center (Civilian Personnel Records), GSA 111 Winnebago Street, St. Louis, MO 63118. The release of most personnel information, however, is subject to restriction imposed by the Privacy Act of 1974. While certain items of information are releasable to the general public under the Freedom of Information Act (i.e., name, present and past position, titles, grades, duty stations, and salaries), additional information is releasable only with the written authorization of the former employee. Researchers who are unable to obtain the written authorization of the former employee may submit their request to the Director, Bureau of Manpower Information Systems, U.S. Civil Service Commission, 1900 E Street NW, Washington, D.C. 20415, for a determination on the release of the information.

SELECT LIST OF ORIGINAL RECORDS USEFUL FOR GENEALOGICAL PURPOSES

(To be used ONLY in our research room)

Original records housed in the Regional Archives Branch in San Bruno were generated by several Federal Government offices located in the area served by this facility. Our area includes Northern California and Northern Nevada counties as well as Hawaii, American Samoa, and the Pacific Ocean area. Although the records created by these offices came into existence as a result of their daily functions, and were not created with a regard to their future use by genealogists or any other special interest group, the data collected and the information that emerged can provide some answers to genealogists' questions.

Following are some of the types of original records available here.

Declaration of Intent (Citizenship:

Until about 1900, naturalization proceedings were handled by any court of record, on various local and state as well as Federal levels. We have only those naturalization records generated by, or held at one time by the Federal Courts in California, Nevada, and Hawaii. Two sections of the San Francisco Federal Court conducted naturalization functions during the 19th Century. We have indexes and most of the records from these courts, beginning in 1850. Naturalization records from Nevada, Hawaii, and Sacramento are sparse.

Crew Lists, 1854-56; 1861-62; 1883-86; 1892; 1900-1950:

These are lists of men signed on as members of the crew of merchant vessels engaged in foreign trade. Crew lists indicate, among other things, a physical description of the crewman, his citisenship, and country of birth. Lists are arranged chronologically for the years cited above, and then alphabetically by the name of ship within each year. To use the crew lists, it is necessary to know the name of a specific vessel, or at least know the approximate year the crewman sailed with a merchant vessel.

no passenger lists for the Port of San Francisco, as they were destroyed by fire. Information about passengers can be found in Louis Rasmussen's "San Francisco Ships" Passenger lists, which draws together data found in other sources. Passenger lists for some Gulf and Atlantic Coast ports are found in the National Archives in Washington, D.C.

Other Censu Indexes:
Printed indexes to the Federal population census schedules for many states from 1790-1880 available. The printed index collection is not complete for all years, as there may not have been indexes compiled and printed for certain states and certain years.

INDIAN CENSUS ROLLS, 1885-1940

On the 692 rolls of this microfilm publication are reproduced Indian Census Rolls, 1885-1940, with a few later rolls. These census rolls were usually submitted each year by agents or superintendents in charge of Indian reservations as required by an act

of Congress of July 4, 1884.

The information given in the rolls varies to some extent; but usually given are the English and/or Indian name of the person, roll number, age or date of birth, sex, and relationship to head of family. Beginning in 1930 the rolls also show the degree of Indian blood, marital status, ward status, place of residence, and sometimes other information. For certain years—usually 1935,1936, 1938, and 1939—only supplemental rolls of additions and deductions were compiled. The 1931 or 1932 census rolls often include separate lists that recapitulated births and deaths for the years after 1924. Most of the 1940 rolls have been retained by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and are not included in this microfilm publication. The preparation of rolls was not required after 1940, but a few later ones were submitted.

There is not a census for every reservation or group of Indians for every year. It was not always possible to take a census on some reservations; and some rolls were lost over the years. Only persons who maintained a formal affiliation with a tribe under Federal supervision are listed on these census rolls. Some tribes, particularly those in the East, have never been under Federal jurisdiction. Because many persons with some degree of Indian blood did not maintain a tribal connection, their names do not appear on the rolls. For the Five Civilized Tribes of Oklahoma (Cherokee, Chickasaw, Creek, and Seminole Indians), there is only

an 1885 census of the Choctaw Indians.

The census rolls are arranged alphabetically by name of agency or other jurisdiction and thereunder by year. For jurisdictions with more than one tribe or band or more than one reservation, there may be several rolls for each year. On the individual rolls family groups are listed together. There is often no discernible order to the listing of families on the earlier rolls, but entries on the later rolls are usually arranged alphabetically by surname of head of family. Supplementary rolls follow the regular rolls for a year.

In the list and contents filmed, currently accepted spellings of names of tribes have been used except when it was believed that this would be confusing to the user. In the census rolls themselves obsolete spellings are often used; and the name of a tribe may be spelled several ways in different rolls. Sometimes even

the name used for a tribe was changed from year to year.

The records reproduced in this microcopy are part of the records in the National Archives designated as Record Group 75, Records of the Bureau of Indian Affairs. There are other census rolls interspersed throughout this record group. Most of them were prepared

for a specific purpose, such as the determination of those eligible for a land allotment or a per capita payment. Three of these census rolls have been reproduced as separate microfilm publication. The 1832 Census of Creek Indians Taken by Parsons and Abbott (T-27) the Census Roll, 1835, of the Cherokee Indians East of the Mississippi and index to the roll (T-496); and the 1895 Old Settler Cherokee Census Roll (T-985). Other census rolls are among the Letters Received by the Office of Indian Affairs, 1824-80 (M-234). There are also other lists concerning Indians such as emigration muster rolls, annuity payment rolls, and land allotment schedules, which often contain the same kind of information as the census roll Indian census rolls are also in Record Group 48, Records of the Office of the Secretary of the Interior. Among them are the Final

HOW MARYSVILLE CAME TO BE MARYSVILLE

In 1842, Theodore Cordua obtained a lease for 19 years from Captain John Sutter for land that included the site of the present city of Marysville. He built his home and other farm buildings where the foot of D Street is now. Capt. Sutter wanted the area called "New Mecklenburg'" in honor of Cordua's birthplace, but it soon became known as "Cordua's Ranch"

In 1849 Michael Nye purchased the land, and it was known for a short period as "Nye's Ranch." There was a question of the legal ownership of part of the land for awhile, but that was ended in 1850, and a land company called, "Charles Covillaud & Company," began selling lots. Locaters and their tents multiplied, business of many types became numerous, and it was apparent the community, now called, Yubaville, needed some type of city government.

The first election was held January 18th, 1851, (things moved more rapidly then). On the evening following the election, a celebration was held in the home of Stephen J. Field. Field had received a grand total of nine votes, and was thus elected, Alcalde During this celebration the name of the town was discussed. Yubaville was considered too similar to Yuba City, which was just across the river.

Various names were suggested and discarded. Finally a gentleman, thought to be Reverand Wadsworth, arose, and in a next little speech, he proposed the town be called Marysville, ""in honor of the most beautiful lady in the place, Mary Covillaud." At this time she was also the only lady in the place. This proposition was accepted.

Mary Covillaud was formerly, Mary Murphey. She was a survivor of the Donner Party, and the wife of Charles Covillaud. Charles Covillaud, at the time of the naming, was the principal citizen

of the town.

1851 GOLD SEEKERS ON THE YUBA RIVER

This index is from a hand-ruled book which contains the names of gold miners with claims located along the Yuba River. It was made for the purpose of collecting \$5 Yuba County poll tax and \$3 California State poll tax. The book has no date but it must be the first list made for this purpose, so it was probably made about 1851. If a name is recognized, a copy of the original hand written page will be sent for 25 cents and an SASE.

Did you know that Pleasant Grove, Sutter County, California, was known as Gouge Eye, until the post office came, and a more "pleasant" name was sought?

Many original marriage certificates issued between 1850 and 1904 in Yuba County were never "picked up" by the couple involved. Thes "left over" certificates were being discarded by Yuba County Officials when they were rescued by a member of our society. This member believed descendents of the couples might wish to have the certificates. (I found my husband's grandparents' certificate—they were married in 1885—and it was in beautiful condition)

These certificates are being indexed in groups according to year issued. The ones listed here are from 1900-1904. Earlier ones will be listed in future publications as the index is completed.

If your ancestors are listed, and you wish the certificate, you may have it by sending a SASE, plus \$1.00 (handling, listing, etc.) to the Society. It is, of course, a first come, etc. If you send for one that someone else obtains first, your money will be returned and we will also send you the name of the one who received it. This way, you may be able to obtain a copy, plus contact a lost cousin.
