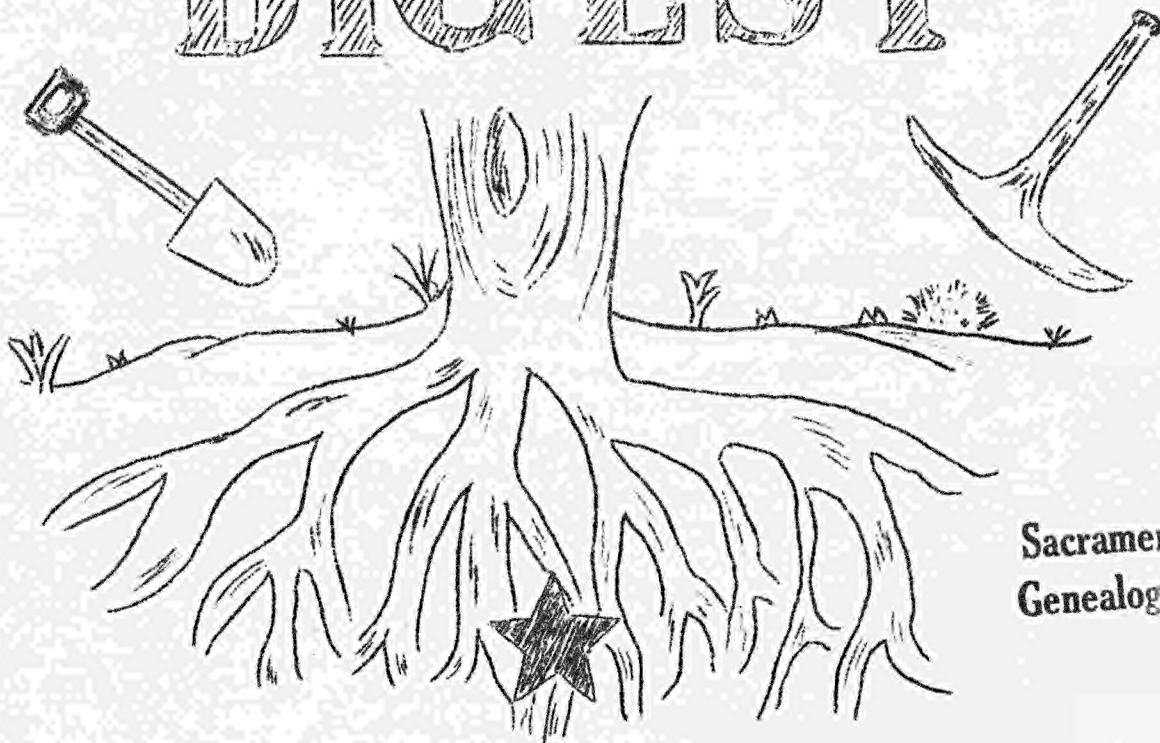

(rental & postage) This library is for the use of all those interested in genealogy, not limited only to members of the LDS Church. OUR CALENDER

When I first became interested in genealogy and found a date written 1 February 1682/83 I was told this was because the first day of the New Year used to be March 25th, not January 1. I wondered why anyone would pick March 25th to start a new year.

Well, once upon a time, a long time ago.....

In the early days of civilization, the phases of the moon were of great interest, and the word month evolved from the word moon. The solar day, the solar year, (the time men thought it took the sun to travel around the earth), and the lunar month, were natural divisions of time. Hours and weeks are only arbitrary and conventional.

When men began to gather together, and officials took charge of certain events, it became necessary to have a means of keeping track of a schedule for certain events, such as Feast Days, and Tax Collection Time.

The early Romans called their feast days "calares". This calare or calendae, became our word calendar.

Different sections of the world had their own calenders until Julius Caesar, born about 100 B.C. became ruler of the great Roman Empire. With the help of a Greek astronomer, Sosignes, and other learned men, he developed a calender for the year. This calender was naturally called the "Julien Calender". Caesar decided the first month of the year would be March, and every other month, beginning with March, would have 31 days. The other months would all have 30, except for February, which would have 29. The months gradually took on names relating to Roman events and emperors.

When Augusta, born 63 B.C. became emperor of Rome, he named a month August. This month was chosen by him for this honor, to remind his people of the great deeds he accomplished for them in that month. A problem arose. August was a month of only 30 days. Augusta didn't like having July, named for Julius Caesar, to have more days than his own month. The Roman Senate agreed, so a day was taken from February and added to August. Then, not wanting three months in a row to have 31 days--this threw the lunar months too far off, they took a day from September and November and added them to October and December. At this time, the equinox fell on March 25th, and this was delegated as the beginning of the New Year.

This calender had enough error in it so, by 1582, when Pope Gregory the 13th ruled much of the world, the equinox fell on March 11th. March 25th, by this time, had taken on the honor of being considered the date the Angel Gabriel had appeared to tell Mary she was to bear the Messiah, since this was nine months before the day celebrated as his birthday.

Pope Gregory, with the help of many scholars, altered the calendar; and directed that it was necessary to suppress ten

days to make the new calendar correct.

This suppression of the ten days often caused rioting by the people. For example: when a country changed to the new calendar and the ruler, in order to make the change, said that -- perhaps -- October the 13th would follow as the next day after October 2nd, the people thought their ruler was taking ten days away from their lives, and they were badly frightened.

This calendar we now use, became known as the Gregorian Calendar. It was accepted quite readily by most of the Catholic Countries, but the Protestant countries were sometimes slow to change. England did not make the change until 1752. Up until that time, England's legal new year still began on March 25th. Thus a date coming before March 25th, and after December 31st might show (old date) 1633/1634 (new date).

There were two groups in this country who used the Gregorian Calendar before England adopted it. The Quakers used it, (I don't know the reason for their use), and the Dutch in New York used it. The Dutch had adapted the newer calendar before coming to the new world. They continued to use it even after the English gained control of their settlements.

England was not the last country to change to the Gregorian Calendar. Russia adopted it on 14 February 1918, and Greece did not change until 1 March 1923.

RESEARCH IN MISSOURI

There were many, many, families that passed through Missouri at one time or another on their way to settle in other places. So, it seems a lot of people are researching in this state.

Missouri has an interesting history. If you are going to do research there, it would be well to at least read the histories of those Counties in which you are interested, as well as those from which your County was taken.

The Handy Book for Genealogists by Everton Publishers of Logan, Utah, gives the information about the counties formation in not only Missouri, but for all the states.

The first white men came into Missouri in 1541 with Hernando DeSoto's expedition. The next to come were the French from 1682-1762. Ste Genevieve was really the first settlement about 1735, and by 1762, the population was 1,000. About 1763 St Louis was established. In 1813 the Choteau brothers, Pierre and Francois, were sent by the American Fur Company to establish trading posts. One of these posts was near where Kansas City now stands. Most of the families were French Canadian men and their Indian wives.

Even though Missouri didn't become a State until 1821, there were many settlements and even counties long before 1821, and we need to be aware of this. There were five original counties formed in 1812. They were Cape Girardeau, New Madrid, St. Charles, Ste. Genevieve, and St. Louis, all along the Mississippi River.

There were many trails and waterways that led in and out of Missouri, which made it the hub of the great westward movement for people seeking new homes and lands for their families.

If some of your ancestors had French names and you do not know where in Missouri to look for them, look in the St Louis area, St Charles Co., and the Kansas City area.

The Mc Clures, Minnicks, and Gilberts, came into Livingstone Co as early as 1840. Rowans, Millers, Scotts, and Cox, families came from North Carolina into Ray and Daviess Counties. The Gulick, Hicks, and Hawks families from New York came into Caldwell County. Before 1821 in Boone Co., were the Barclay, Barnes, Iipe, Hicks, Stephenson, Fulcher, Richardsons, Bartons, Thrall, Iarker, Woods, Harris, Wilhites, Lightfoot, Ketchum, Gosline, Slack, Stephens, Cochrane, Hatton, Laughlin, Head, Berry, McQuitty, Beatty, and Dale families.

We are all familiar with getting War Records from the National Archives on the Revolution, War of 1812, and the Civil Wars. Many of you may not be aware of the other Wars where records are available. Many of these papers available on the other Wars do not give any family records, but if you have an elusive ancestor, at least you may be able to place him in a certain place at a certain time. You can obtain this information from the Adjutant General's Office in the various States including Missouri. These records are often available at no charge.

Information concerning the Military Records on File In The Office Of The Adjutant General Of Missouri

WAR OF 1812: Alphabetical card file and large books containing photocopies of muster-in and muster-out rolls reflecting period of service, place of muster-in, county of residence, place of release, and amount of money received for his service. No family or personal descriptive information. Extract of service furnished without cost.

MISSOURI MILITIA 1804-1861: There are no files of the organization or individual records of service of the Missouri Militia covering this period.

Research in Missouri (continued)

INDIAN WARS 1832-1838: Record of service cards which in most cases indicate the date and place of enrollment and date of release. No family or personal descriptive information. Photocopy of record of service furnished without cost. (Blackhawk, Seminole, and Osage)

MORMON WAR 1838: Alphabetical card file which lists period of service and organization only. No family or descriptive information. Information cited in letter of reply.

IOWA WAR 1839: Alphabetical card file which lists period of service and organization only. No family or descriptive information. Information cited in Letter of reply.

MEXICAN WAR 1846-1847: Alphabetical card file and record of service card which contain date and place of enlistment and date and place of release. Age at time of enlistment is sometimes listed. No family or descriptive information. Photocopy or record of service furnished without cost.

CIVIL WAR 1861-1865: Union: Alphabetical card file and record of service card which reflect date and place of enlistment together with date and place of release (not in all cases). Some individual descriptive information on file for certain volunteer type units. No family information. Photocopy of record of service furnished without cost. Confederate: Alphabetical card file and record of service card. Information on record of service card is often sketchy as it was gathered from many varied sources. Confederate pension applications and application for admission to the Confederate Home are also among these holdings. Accumulated files number only approximately one-half of the reported 40,000 who served from Missouri. Photocopy of information furnished without cost.

MISSOURI MILITIA 1865-1900: County enrollment lists for 89 of the 114 counties for the period immediately following the Civil War. Place of residence and personal descriptive data is available. There are some files of Missouri Militia covering the 1866-1900 period. No family information available. Information cited in letter of reply.

SPANISH-AMERICAN WAR 1898: Alphabetical index contained in the Adjutant General of Missouri Report of 1897-1898. Holding consists of those who were members of the Missouri National Guard and entered with their unit. Personal descriptive, nativity and name and address of parent or guardian is available. Extract of available information furnished without charge.

WORLD WAR I 1917-1919: Alphabetical record of service card file and bonus application file. Bonus application contains date and place of birth together with names of parents, if living. Record

of service card shows date and place of enlistment, age or date of birth and place, home address, promotions, places served, period of any over-seas service, if wounded and date of release. Photocopy of record of service and any supplemental information. cited in letter of reply. Information furnished without cost fo authorized recipients.

MISSOURI HOME GUARD 1917-1919: Alphabetical record of service on those individuals who served with the Missouri Home Guard, while the National Guard was in federal service. Date and place of enlistment together with physical description is available. Certificate of service furnished without cost to authorized pers

MISSOURI NATIONAL HOME GUARD 1900-1940, 1946- : Alphabetical record of service card from 1900-194- and military personnel files from 1946 to present. Files vary as to content and can ge considered an excellent source of genealogical research. Certificate of service furnished without cost to authorized persons. (Record of service On Mexican Border (1916) also on file.

MISSOUR NAVAL MILITIA 1905-1941: Information contained in personnel file varies, but will give place of birth, age at enlistment or possibly date of birth, name of parent, guardian or wife is usually shown. Certificate of service furnished without cost to authorized recipient.

MISSOURI STATE GUARD 1940-1947: Alphabetical record of service card for those individuals who entered the Missouri State Guard during the federal service of the National Guard. No family information available. Information on date and place of birth is available. Certificate furnished to authorized recipients.

WORLD WAR II 1941-1946: Alphabetical file of the Report of Separation. Date and place of birth is shown and general summary of the military service and awards. Certificate of service furnished without cost, to authorized recipients. (Photocopy also available)

DD FORM 214 REPORT OF SEPARATION 1947-1975; Alphabetical file of the Report of Separation. Sate and place of birth is shown, and general summary of the military service and awards. Certificate of service or photo, furnished withour cost to authorized recipients.

Many of you may not know about a quirk in the History of Missouri, that took place during the Civil War. This quirk was known as Order #11, and was given by General Thomas Ewing who commanded the Union Forces along the Missouri border with Kansas. If you would care to read about this event for

yourself, there is a book, author not recalled, named "A Dynasty of Western Outlaws." Chapter two of this book is "Order #11, and the Aftermath." If you had families in Jackson, Cass, Bates, or part of Vernon County, and you lost them after 1860, it could be because of Order #11.

On the 23rd of August 1863, two days after Quantrill and his gang burned Lawrence, Kansas, General Thomas Ewing, Commander of the Union forces, issued Order #11. Regardless of right, or justice, or even if families were loyal to the Union cause, that were forced to leave their homes with what little they could carry. The belongings that were left behind were looted and their homes and fields burned. They could not even sell the property they left behind. Cass County at that time had a population of 10,000. Order #11 reduced this to 600. Those who could establish loyalty to the satisfaction of the commanding officer could move to one of the garrisoned towns.

My own great grandfather was caught up in this, and moved his family to Greene Co., Illinois. He lived in the upper half of Vernon County. A family biography made me aware of the move and the time period, and then I learned of Order #11, which tied it all together for me. My family returned to Missouri in early 1867, but many other families may have remained in their new location.

CENSUS RECORDS: There were state censuses taken in 1821, 1824, and each four years thereafter until 1864. One was also taken in 1876. All were lost when the State Capitol burned in 1911. Copies of some still exist in the county clerks offices in some counties. St. Charles County has them for 1817 and 1819. St. Charles County at that time, included Howard, Lincoln, Pike, and Montgomery Counties. The first Federal Census for Missouri was taken in 1830, and every ten years thereafter. The only portion of the 1890 Census is the Union Veterans List only. The 1880 and 1900 has the regular census and the soundex. These are available through the LDS Branch Library in Gridley, and may be available from Sutro Library in San Francisco, through inter-library loan. They are also available, along with all the Federal Censuses, at the Regional Archives in San Bruno. Mortality schedules: 1850, 1860, 1870, 1880. The originals are at the Missouri Historical Society at St. Louis. The 1850 and 1860 are on film at the LDS Library in Salt Lake, Utah.

CHURCH RECORDS: Major denominations in Missouri in 1890 were Catholic, Methodist, Baptists, and Deciples of Christ. "A Survey of Church Records" by E. Kay Lirkham should give you more information as to where to write for records. This book is in the Gridley LDS Branch Library.

LAND RECORDS: Land records in Missouri are somewhat unique in that land has been granted by three nations, France, Spain, and the United States. Land records from 1804 to 1811 is mostly

individual private claims, and these were made by early settlers to obtain a clear title from the U.S. to land they had owned or had been granted by the French or Spanish Governments. Recording the land titles began at St Louis on 16 September 1805. United States land sales were delayed until 1818 because of The New Madrid Earthquake in 1812. Those with injured land were entitled by a Congressional Act to new land from the public domain. All records of land transactions of Missouri, which are available, are on microfilm at the Missouri State Archives in Jefferson City. Later ones may be in the Recorder of Deeds office in each county or in the Circuit Clerks Office.

Naturalization Records: Sometimes filed in the Circuit Court

Probate Records: Probate records are found in different offices according to the time period. From 1804-1813, in the Probate Court; 1813-1818, in the Common Pleas Court; 1815-1820, in the Circuit Court; 1820-1825, in the County Court; 1827-1875 in various County Courts; from 1875 to the present, in the Present Probate Courts.

Vital Records: Birth and death records available from the State office beginning with January, 1910. St Louis City, since 1850; St Louis County, before 1910, at the City or County Health Department. The same is true for Kansas City. Since 1883, they may be available from the County Clerk where birth or death occurred. Prior to 26 June 1881, no marriage license was required. The marriage was recorded at any convenient courthouse. After licenses were required a portion of the license was returned to the Recorder where the license was obtained, and the marriage was recorded in that county only. Prior to February 1853, the General Assembly granted divorces occasionally. If the divorce was obtained prior to 1853, you can check the personal acts section in an Index to the "Statute Laws of Missouri" by James S. Garland, to see if the divorce was granted by a legislative act.

Great Registers, Voters or Poll Books, Tax Lists, Accessions Lists: All places to search for an ancestor.

Some Missouri Counties with States Where Early Settlers Came From

- Adair - Settlers from Kentucky
- Atchison - Germans from St Louis
- Boone - Families from Kentucky and Virginia
- Buchanan - French, Irish, Germans, and Creoles. The 49ers passed through St Joseph on their way to California
- Caldwell - When the Mormons were first driven from Ohio, they first settled in Jackson Co., Mo. In 1836, most of them moved into Caldwell.

Research in Missouri (continued)

Cape Girardeau - Many settlers were here before 1800. German settlers from North Carolina.

Clinton - Settlers from Kentucky and Tennessee

Daviess - About 1836 hundreds of Mormons moved in from Clay, Jackson, and Ray counties. In 1838 they were driven from this area.

Grundy - Settlers from Howard and Randolph Counties as early as 1834

Holt - First settlers were from Indiana, later many Germans came

Jackson - Mormons began to come in 1831, within two years there were 1200 here. In 1834 they moved into Clay Co.

During the Gold Rush, Independence was an important stop-over. Kansas City was originally known as Westport.

Lafayette - County seat is Lexington, named for Lexington, Ky, where most of the people came from

Lincoln - Bohemian Settlers near Hawk Point

Lawrence - Waldensians, a religious group from France settled the town of Verona

Livingston - Early Creole Settlers entered the area pre 1800

Maries - German and Irish Settlers came in 1855 to Vienna

Montgomery - KY families settled in 1806 on Lourtre Island

Morgan - Settlers from Kentucky, Tennessee, and Virginia moved into this area as early as 1820. After the Civil War many Germans and Swiss moved into this county.

Oregon - First Settler said to be Thomas Hatcher, who came about 1815. Within a few years, several families from Kentucky joined him.

Osage - Bavarians settled near Rich Fountain

Pemiscot - Some from Tennessee

Perry - Lutheran Saxons settled the town of Attenburg

Pike - Settled about 1808, but not organized until 1818.

Bowling Green is the county seat, named for the settlers who came from Bowling Green, Warren Co., Kentucky.

Phelps - Italians settled Rosati

Ralls - Many families from Kentucky, some from Butler Co., some from Scott County, Kentucky

Saline - Settled by immigrants from Kentucky, Tennessee, and Virginia.

Shelby - Germans

Scott - Germans

St Charles - Settlers from Virginia as early as 1817, also French people

Ste. Genevieve - French were the first settlers

St Louis - Founded as a French Trading Post in 1764

They have hundreds of County Histories, Published Family Histories, Military Records, Pension Lists, 1200 volumes of Black U.S. History or Culture, called the Ramos Collection, in memory of Dr. John F. Ramos, Jr., first black member of the Board of Education of Kansas City; also microfilm of a number of black oriented newspapers published in the 19th and 20th centuries.

Their prize possession is the Missouri Gazette of 1808. Also have files on nearly 400 other newspapers.

St Charles County Archives Deeds from 1798 to 1865, Bounty Payments 1817-1818, Builders Leins 1836-1897, Wills of the 1800's and 1900's, Circuit Court Records 1809-1839. They charge \$2.50 an hour for research.

SUTTER COUNTY'S FIRST COUNTY SEAT

When the first Legislature of California met in San Jose in December, 1849, and February, 1850, Sutter County was one of the twenty-seven counties named. The location for the county seat was sought by many communities.

Thomas Jefferson Green, State Senator from the area including Sutter County, had purchased, along with his cohorts, land near the present town of Nicolaus. Senator was a very persuasive speaker; and he won the day for his land. This first county seat was named Oro.

Oro was a noble city of broad streets, imposing buildings, and splended public squares----ON PAPER. In fact, it was a tract of land fronting on the south branch of Bear Creek, WITHOUT A BUILDING ON IT.

The first county court tried to meet in a hastily built shack. This shack had a zinc roof, no windows, and no shade. A May sun poured down, the heat inside the building rose rapidly, and the court meeting was of very short duration. The lawyers, litigants, jurors, judge, witnesses, all fled the building, never to return.

SEARCHING FOR A "LOST," "LIVING", FAMILY MEMBER?

Many people are searching for LIVING family members in cases not related to genealogy, as well as for genealogy.

I read of a Salvation Army program and wrote to that organization for more detail. This is their reply:

"Our Missing Persons service is to help locate relatives. I have enclosed one of our forms so you can see the kinds of information we need. The fullname; birthdate; birthplace; parents names; and the last known address are essential in order for us to start a search. The back side of the forms show the kind of inquiries that we do not get involved in. (+++see below for this)

There is a lot of expense involved in some of the cases we handle but we do not have a charge for our service. If a person feels they want to donate something that is up to them.

If we do locate a person we cannot give out any information concerning the person without their consent.

The purpose of our Missing Persons is to make a genuine reconciliation of relatives and to give counseling when necessary.

If a person needs to use our services they could call or write a letter and we will send them a form."
