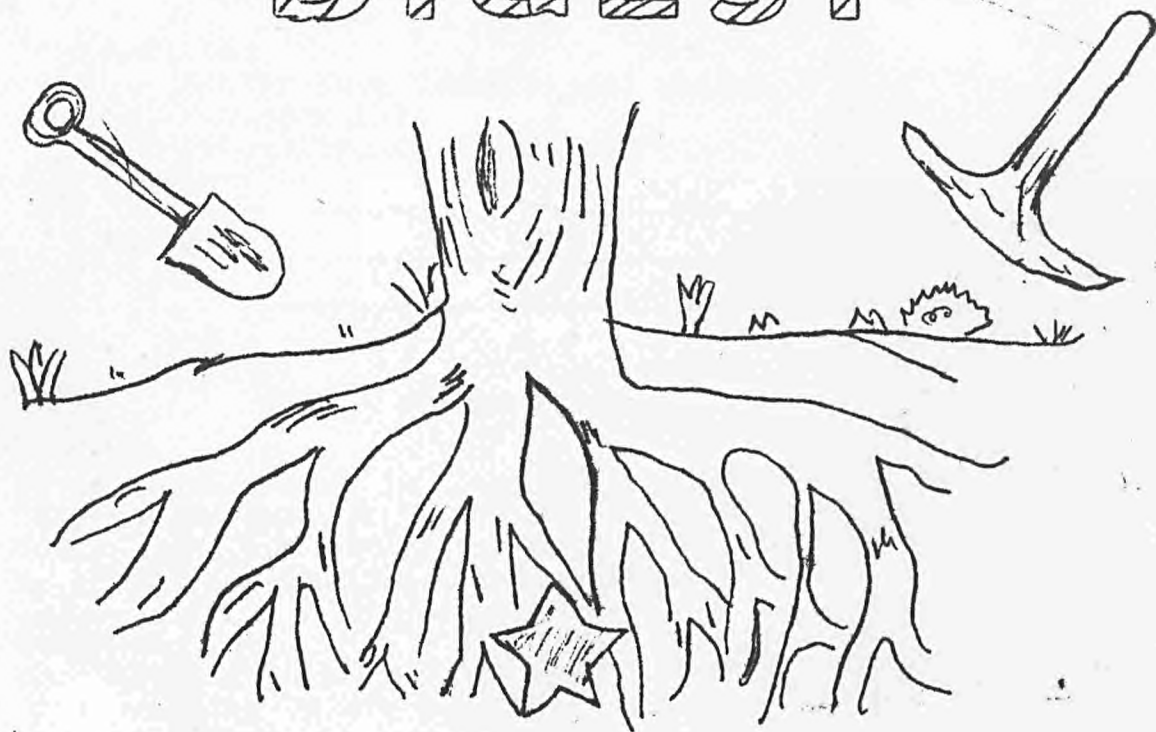

## Editor's Notes

In the past, when I have taken Genealogical research trips, I have concentrated mainly on county court houses and State Archives.

This past summer I still checked these sources; but, I also made a special effort to visit the local libraries in the area of my interest. I am so glad I finally did this.

Many libraries, even quite small ones, have made a great effort -- especially in the past few years -- to gather genealogical records for their areas; and they have usually set aside a special room for research. The libraries are often aided in this project by genealogical and/or historical groups.

These collections may include cemetery listings; old county records; local family genealogies; county histories; church records; old newspapers, etc. The list is almost endless, and the material is often indexed for quick review.

Mrs. Fronia Martha (Scoggin) Smith Story

(Continued from previous issue)

After the soldiers told us we must move because we were harboring rebels -- meaning my father-- we did nothing for awhile. They had told us many times to move and then left us alone. This time they returned and told us to leave or they would burn our house with us in it.

My Aunt Sarah and Uncle John had a little house and we moved in to it. My Uncle John was not a soldier, he was a Baptist preacher; and had gone down South to teach at this time.

Women could do things in those days. We had a yoke of oxen. We hitched the oxen to the wagon and moved bedding and clothes, which was about all we had left, across the river, about 6 or 7 miles out of the range of those soldiers. After we left our house, they left it alone.

Aunt Sarah had her children with her. Sophronia was the oldest, there was also Cass, Emma, John, Theodosia, and some little ones. Theodosia died and was buried in the church yard that pa gave the land for.

Pa gave the land several years before the war while we lived at Daranell. The people built the church, it was a pretty good sized church. My Uncle John Adams was the pastor.

After the surrender my father came home. He was in a better condition than when he left. He was staying with friends several hundred miles away where he was not in any danger of being shot all the time. Dad had Rachel, the negro servant, with him, and she cooked for them.

We never went back to our tan yard or home. So many people we knew there were turned on the other side. We went South to the place where pa had been staying. We stayed there less than a year, still in Arkansas. We rented a house from some people by the name of Scoggin. She was a widow and thought we were all related. The house we lived in was about a quarter mile from their house.

This Scoggin family had a big plantation and about 100 negroes.

At night when the negroes work was done, you could hear them coming home singing, "Oh Miss Lucy, Hoa! Oh Miss Lucy, Hoa!" Just as soon as they finished their work, they started to sing. They did not know what to do with their freedom, so they stayed right where they had been living. They were given pieces of ground and lived on there.

The Scoggin Family had a boy, Jake, and a girl, Margaret, plus many married sons. Jake, Margaret, and I would go possum hunting together. Margaret was older than we were, but there were no other white girls around, so she always came to our house.

We would roast an egg in the fire place and when it got done we would fill it up with salt and we had to eat half of it, salt and all. In the night we would get very thirsty, and the man who brought us a drink of water in our dreams was the one we would marry.

The men would shoot tin cans for their sport.

We stayed there all winter and then moved further west toward Texas, but still in Arkansas, the Southern part close to the Red River. We used our oxen and covered wagons to move. We stayed there, renting, for about a year and raised cotton, corn, and tobacco.

Father got word that they wanted a tanner in a big tanning yard in Texas. He went over and took charge of it and the whole family moved. It was about 40 or 50 miles from where we lived, over across the Red River.

I was about fourteen then. Three of the children in our family had died that year while we were living on the Red River in Arkansas. That was one reason we left there, it was so sickly. The three that died were Minerva, Johnny, and the little baby. It may have been malaria and fever.

We had a good doctor in the community. He would come on horse back and he had saddle bags. We would always be so curious about the saddle bags. The Doctor's name was Dr. Thomas. He would give us blue mass and calamel. Before giving the blue mass to the sick child, he would take it in his own mouth and moisten it so he could roll it into a ball just like a big pill.

We had a school there, taught by a Miss Mary \_\_\_\_\_. I can't recall

her last name. There were no Catholic or Protestant Churches there in that part of Arkansas.

We got a big farm in Texas about 8 or 9 miles from the river. It was a big 400 acre ranch, with a great big two-story house set back on a hill, with lots of trees and flowers all around it. I remember particularly the bridal wreath we had around the house. We leased the house from the Lasaters. They wanted to leave because they wanted to go to Clarksville, Texas.

I went to a school way down below Dalby Springs. The school was called Wildwood Seminary. I started with pretty low studies because I hadn't been going to school much. We stayed there for three or four years. When I quit school I was studying Ancient History, Geometry, Astronomy, Algebra and Higher Arithmetic, and Composition. There were two teachers there, Mrs. Carter, and her sister, Miss Scoggin. Mrs. Carter taught all the smaller children, and Miss Scoggin taught Higher Mathematics, Algebra, etc.

It was a Subscription School and people had to buy their own books and pay for attending.

Miss Scoggin and Mrs. Carter had their training and went to College at McKenzie College at Clarksville, Texas. They all called the president of the College, the "Old Master." They told us of an incident one time that I'll always remember. At boarding school one time, the "Old Master" walked through the dining room when they were all eating. He just happened to glance up at the ceiling and saw a big piece of butter there. He asked them how the butter happened to be there. One of the boys said, "Well, it's old enough to speak for itself."

Cousin Ella married one of the Professors in the McKenzie School. His name was Professor Parks. Cousin Ella used to come and stay with us quite a bit before she got married. I remember one time she was staying with us and Professor Parks came to see her. I was going from one room to another and I started to go in my room and he was there with his head in her lap. I was so embarrassed, I got out of there as fast as I could. They were married soon after that. They lived in a big house next to his Uncle and I used to visit them.

I boarded at the Seminary. When I would go home for vacations, Miss Scoggin and Cousin Ella sometimes went with me. Miss Scoggin married a man where we boarded. His name was Ben Dolby.

After Cousin Ella was married, her husband went to farming. They had a lot of hired help on the farm. When I stayed with them I used to always set the table for the men. There was one fellow I didn't like at all because he always ate with a knife. They had one little sharp knife and one time I took and put it at his place at the table. I thought if he cut his mouth he might be cured of his bad habit.

They used a turning plow and other tools, but I don't think they had any they rode with. They had horses, no oxen, and lots of negroes to help, along with their white men.

We didn't board the negroes, just gave them molasses, rice, etc., and take that out of their pay.

Every fall my Father had to take the cotton down to Jefferson, Texas, and bring back 2 barrels of molasses, 2 barrels of sugar, 1 barrel of rice, and cheese. He had to give the men whiskey or they wouldn't stay on the place. They would just come to the house and ask for it every morning. They would say they just couldn't hoe without whiskey. Everybody drank whiskey then.

My father wouldn't have anything for breakfast. He just drank a cup of coffee and get up and go out about sun-up. He would always be tired when he came in at night. He would always call me "Biggey", and he would say, "Come and make me a toddy, Biggey". Then after that he would go in and have his dinner.

We had a fine cemetery there, and that's where some of the children are buried. My oldest sister died there, her name was Hassie Graham. It was a common thing for a great many children to die. No one ever raised a whole family.

I think De Kalbe was our County Seat, but we just never went there. We always went to Clarksville.

The Indians were throughout the country at that time. The Choctaw Nation was right by the river. They used to come over and bring

baskets and things over to sell. We used to be afraid of them when they came.

We lived at this place for about three or four years. We had a big 10 acre place down by a spring. They didn't have any railroads along there then, and the farmers from Texas would come by with their great herds of cattle and stop over at our place because it was so large, and the only place they could keep all their cattle together.

There was one man that came by every year with his cattle on the Chisum Trail, and he always stayed at our house. He always wanted to talk with me, but I was too bashful. When ever there was anyone staying over night, or we had company for dinner, I would never go to the table.

One time a fellow got his hack and came by for me to take a ride, I went with him but took all Uncle's children with me, and also took Uncle John along. I thanked him for the ride and said it was very nice. He told me that if I would give him my address he would send a Lady's Book and two other books. I gave him my address and he sent me the books.

We were always prepared for company. We had plenty of meat, (hogs and beef), dried apples and other fruit, meal for bread, and mother always made bisquits and great big corn ponies for breakfast and light bread also.

Our social life centered on the Church. We had not hotels in the Community, and there were no musicals; it was a frontier town. The negroes had their religious songs and music almost every night. They played the violin and banjo and sang.

There had been 13 or 14 children altogether, but when we left the ranch and moved to Pilot Point, there was only myself, Ed, Rufe, and Ethia. All the others had died. We moved all our things in two wagons. I don't remember us driving any horses or cows with us. I was about 18 years old then.

We first settled about one mile South from Pilot Point. Then my father bought this hotel in Pilot Point, "Scoggin Hotel", and we moved there. It wasn't a very big hotel. I kept the house clean and

worked in the hotel.

Pilot Point wasn't a very big place. It was just a country town right in the edge of prairie and timber. There were three churches, but no railroads. There was a railroad through Sherman, and people had to go there for their freight and things. There was a daily stage that run from Pilot Point to Sherman. When we lived a mile from town, I always rode my Pony to church. That was how I got acquainted with many people.

I went to school at Pilot Point, also. They had a fine school house there. It was called a seminary and was just like a high school with all the different departments. It was taught by a professor NewBerry.

The Emersons were the most prominent people in that area. They were in the cattle business. Other families I knew were the Keiths, the Marchants, and the Wilsons. Mr. Wilson was the biggest merchant in the town. Then there was Cooney Harrison who was in the livery stable business. On Sunday afternoons every buggy was out. That was what everyone did every Sunday afternoon. Take their buggy and horse and go for rides.

We also had other activities on other days. We went horse back riding, to dances, and to parties.

I met my future husband about the time we bought the hotel. He was a fruit tree man and nursery-man. He always claimed he used to know me when I was small and used to watch me when I was a bare-footed girl climbing persimmon trees.

He had four or five men working for him, and they all rode horse-back around and sold fruit trees for him. He always had to go St. Louis to get his trees. One time he got too many and couldn't sell them. He wanted a good man to take him out of Pilot Point to where people hadn't planted many trees to see if he could sell them. My father took him out there.

My father was on the Southern side in the army and Mr. Smith was on the Northern side. On this trip they started talking about the war and different things. They found out that my Dad took the oath of allegiance from Mr. Smith. Mr. Smith would always say what he thought

about the war and politics. Pa used to tell him to be careful because the Southern people were plenty sore about everything that had happened, and that he should watch what he said around those people. Pa had many controversies with him, but never got into any fights with him.

When they came back from this trip, they had been up into some country where there were lots of cactus flowers and shruba, and Mr. Smith brought a lot of cactus back to me.

Pa also told me when they came back that Mr. Smith had told him of a rich widow in Nevada that he was going back and marry, and that he wouldn't be living here very long.

Mr. Smith came to the house one evening with the furniture man, Tom Nunn. I liked this Mr. Nunn a lot, but just as a good friend. My friend, Bell, was staying all night with me that evening and we sat around and talked with Tom and never paid much attention to Mr. Smith at all. After Mr. Smith got through with his business with Pa, he came over and sat down with us and was just so extremely pleasant and tried to be so nice and everything like that, but I didn't like him because he was a Yankee. I wasn't going to have anything to do with him, but Pa said he was a mighty fine straight-forward young man, and he didn't care anything about the politics now as it was all over with, and he liked him.

Mr. Smith ran around with a fellow by the name of Frank Davis. I got acquainted with him, and he was a regular book-worm. He got all the new novels and would read them and then give them to me. I liked him very much, but I just didn't like Mr. Smith as well. He just seemed rather old, and I liked all the other boys the best.

It was several months before I ever went with him anywhere. I just saw him at parties and around home. He boarded at our hotel and just lived on the other side of our rooms. He used to come home on Friday evenings and leave Monday mornings.

I don't remember when he first asked me to go with him. Whenever he asked me to go someplace, he would write on one of his cards a little note and send it to me by some little kid. He would present his compliments and ask me to go someplace in that way. The day we went

off and was engaged he sent me a card, he always did that.

There were six girls and six boys, we were all friends and all went in a bunch everywhere. We would always hire buggys at the livery stable every Sunday and go for rides up in the prairie up around Emerson's house. Well, we were on one of our rides out there--the couples were just all strung out. Mr. Smith asked me to marry him. After I said yes, he asked my parents for their permission. My mother said, "Well, I believe you are a fine man and I don't know of anyone I would trust her with any more than with you; but she is a dainty flower and I want you to be good to her." After that Mr. Smith always called me his dainty flower. We were married in October of 1872.

Mr. Smith was a presbyterian and didn't want to get married in a church. He wanted to get in a buggy and ride over to this Presbyterian Minister house. The minister didn't preach in town because there wasn't a church for him.

We just took a ride like we always did. The whole bunch went with us. We started about two in the afternoon on Sunday, October 5, 1872, and went to the Presbyterian Minister's house. Mr. Smith got out and went to the door. The minister's wife said he had gone up town, but would be back soon. She said if we would take a ride and then come back, he would probably be home.

As we were riding back through town, we met the minister going home. We stopped him, and Mr. Smith asked him to marry us right there. We all stayed in the buggies and he performed the ceremony right there in the middle of the street. There were three buggies set abreast one way and the other three were set the other way facing the others. When the minister got through, he went on home, and we went on and took our ride as usual.
