PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

February 1984

Greetings!

While we are into the year 1984, we wish to review - and to give credit to those responsible for the interesting and informative programs and activities of 1983. Dorothy Pearce, an outstanding chairman, arranged the schedule as follows:

January 24 We were given a comprehensive introduction to the use of computers in the storing of genealogical information and research by Dan Hamilton of Concord, California.

February 22 Sutter County Clerk, Lonna Smith, talked about the wealth of records stored in the County Archives.

March 22 Yuba County Clerk, Frances J. Fairey, reported on the resources available at the Yuba County Court House.

April 26 A visit to the Community Memorial Museum. Director Jean Gustin had prepared an excellent exhibit, indicating the types of material for research that is held there.

May 24 Barbara Wood brought displays, and demonstrated the use of forms to be used in recording and organizing research.

June 28 Nancy Hunter, recently from the Salt Lake City LDS Genealogical Library, explained holdings and methods for research at that facility.

September 27 Jean Waller and Stacey Brucker presented the system they are marketing -- Pat Beadle's book on Organizing Your Family Tree.

October 25 The 10th Anniversary of the founding of the Society was observed with a gala celebration.

November 22 Anita Laney, local historian and 'woman of many talents' presented a showing of Vintage Apparel, 1860-1910, with a talk on how old photos, unidentified and undated, can be approximately dated by observing the styles of clothing worn by the subjects and comparing them with illustrations of a known era.

We hope to further expand the possibilities for research here in the local area, and have available information for research in all other areas. The Society Library, in the California Room, Packard Library, Marysville, is growing; and due to much work by our librarian and helpers, the material has been organized and classified.

DON'T WRITE THE RUSSIAN EMBASSY

Take heed from one who did! It is entrapment.

If you see a notice in any Genealogy magazine, Brochure, Periodical, etc., that suggests you can write the Russian Embassy in Washington, D.C. and receive assistance on how to secure Genealogical information from behind the Iron Curtain, Forget It!

I saw such an ad and since I teach a Genealogy Class, I thought this might be helpful information to have available. (I do not personally have any Russian Ancestors.)

I received a large package containing 24 manuals; from 2 page folders to 242 page paperback books, with such titles as "Peace Plan & Progress," Brezhnev, "Our Course, Peace & Socialism," "USSR, 1000 Questions and Answers," to pamphlets on "Stop The Spread of Nuclear Weapons," and "Stop the Death Cloud," Nothing pertaining to Genealogy. All propaganda. Approximately one month later I received an out-dated magazine "Soviet Life." Still nothing pertaining to Genealogy.

My husband and I took it as a joke on us, until a policeman friend of ours mentioned that our Government might be keeping a record of these packages going to private citizens of the United States; and, at some later date, if one of our children or grandchildren wanted to get into certain Government service, This Joke might come back to haunt us. Think about it.

We are going to turn this material over to a Government Agency.

Editor's Notes

I hope everyone is aware of the new program called FAMILY REGISTRY, began this year by the Genealogical Department of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints -- AND, not only aware of it but becoming active participants. I believe it can be one of the greatest aids offered to genealogical researchers. For those who may be unaware of this program, or desire more information on it, the following article is taken from a pamphlet entitled, "The Family Registry - Cooperation in Research", published by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Salt Lake City, Utah, 1983.

What is the Family Registry?

The Family Registry is a new service available to anyone interested in genealogical research. It is offered without charge by the Genealogical Department of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

What can the Family Registry do for you?

The Family Registry can help you find others who are doing research on the same family lines you are working on. You can then contact them to coordinate your efforts and share results. When you coordinate your research with others, your research can be more thorough, and you can avoid costly duplication of time, money and effort.

For a family organization, this provides a way to tell others about your organization. Those interested may support your research efforts.

For those wishing to coordinate research, this lets you tell others what you are doing and find out what they are doing. You can then contact researchers working on your lines, and they can contact you.

For those seeking genealogical information, this helps you learn about individuals or family organizations researching your lines.

How does the Family Registry work?

The service consists of two parts: registration and inquiry.

1. Registration: Individual researchers and family organizations may register by submitting forms to the Genealogical Library or one of its branches.

2. Inquiry: Microfiche copies of the registration forms and an index of the registry will be available for searching at the Genealogical Library in Salt Lake City and at branch genealogical libraries.

Who should register?

1. Active researchers: If you are actively doing genealogical research, you can register the names of the deceased individuals you are currently researching. If you want to share information you have previously researched, you may also register those names. Others may then contact you to coordinate future research and share results.

2. Family organizations: If you are involved in genealogical research as a family organization (even though your organization may be small), you can register so that others who want to coordinate research, provide funds, or otherwise participate may contact you. If you are interested in forming an organization, you may also register.

Two types of family organizations may be registered. a. Ancestral

family organizations, which coordinate genealogical activity on common family lines. b. Surname organizations, which search records for a selected surname in a specific locality and time period. Researchers may piece the families together from the information they have collected.

Note: Do not register grandparent or immediate family organizations centered around living individuals, because this information is already known by descendants.

How do I register?

If you are an active researcher, register by completing the Research Coordination Registration Form (FGS2501).

If you are a representative of a family organization or are interested in forming one, register your organization on the Family Organization Registration Form. Family organizations may also register lines they are actively researching on the Research Coordination Registration Form (FGS2512).

You may pick up and return registration forms at the Genealogical Library in Salt Lake City or at any of its branch libraries. You may also write:

How do I search the Family Registry?

The Family Registry alphabetically lists the surnames being researched together with the names and addresses of those who have registered. You will be able to search the registry to find if other individuals or family organizations are researching your lines. You can then contact them. If you register, others may contact you.

What does this cost?

Both registration and inquiry services are free.

What is my responsibility?

If you register, you are expected to respond to others who wish to coordinate with you. Whenever you write to a registrant, remember to include a stamped, self-addressed envelope. If you request information, registrants may expect you to reimburse them for photocopy expenses.

The Family Registry is not intended for mass registration or mass contacting of registrants for commercial purposes.

It is expected that the microfiche Family Registry index and copies of the submitted registration forms will be distributed to the Genealogical Library in Salt Lake City and branch genealogical libraries in mid '984. It will be possible to submit corrections and update material submitted in this program. Information on this may be obtained through Salt Lake, or the branch libraries.

Editor's Notes: CHECKLIST FOR GENEALOGICAL INFORMATION SOURCES

Many of us doing genealogical research become very discouraged at times in our quest for that elusive information necessary to solve our problem. The following list of various sources of information may help. I know the list is very incomplete; and I would appreciate your sending to me a list of the other sources you have used. ABOUT ANCESTORS

Ancestors are to be found along with antique furniture and closet skeletons in nearly all of the well regulated families. They consist of forefathers, foremothers, foreuncles, and foreaunts, not to mention forecousins, who became famous in history like, for example being beheaded by a king, or who managed to become a mayor or something like that. This enables an ancestor to be pointed out with pardonable pride by his descendants forever more.

Come to think about it, an ancestor is one of the easiest things to come by and the most fascinating objects of all of our earthly possessions. Being an ancestor consists merely of being boasted and toasted by one's descendants. Many ancestors have, therefore, been enabled to make good long after they are gone from this world. More than a few of our ancestors who departed this life as poor and obscure characters, only a few jumps ahead of the sheriff, have had the good fortune, centuries later, to become the ancestors of many ambitious families, with plenty of money, fame and publicity, and as a consequence of which their tombstones have had to be greatly enlarged and adorned.

Ancestors are one of the most valuable and satisfying of all of our worldly possessions. They are non-taxable, and they can not be stolen. Their upkeep is practically nothing, and they do not deteriorate with age. As a matter of fact, ancestors increase in value as they become older and older. Ancestors who were here hundreds of years ago are worth a thousand times more than our grandparents.

Adam is our oldest and best known ancestor. If he were still around he would be about six thousand years old. Adam had a fairly good earthly record considering that the serpent, his wife, and the apple turned out to be his booby trap. But Adam is everybody's ancestor; he is taken for granted just like rain or sunshine, or like education or ignorance, like taxes or liberty, so he does not rate a very great number of coupon books at the shopping center. Nearly all people own and operate ancestors, even the poorest of people. Many a man who has only one shirt to his back and the other in the washing machine often can boast of having ancestors who are the envy of all of his friends and neighbors.

The moral of this story is that everyone should be proud of his ancestors. To be sure, there were a handful or two who did not or could not walk the straight and narrow; but, what the heck, they weren't your ancestors!

Mrs. Fronia Martha (Scoggin) Smith Story

(Continued from a previous issue)

After Mr. Smith and I were married, we stayed right there at the hotel in Mr. Smith's room until along in the winter. In the meantime, he had bought a lot of trees and shrubs that he didn't get rid of, so he bought a couple acres about 3/4 of a mile from Pilot Point, facing the school, and set out the plants. He also had a lot of horses he had taken in pay for trees, so he took the horses to St. Louis and sold them. When he came back, he built a house on this place.

He planted silver-leaved maples all around the edge of the place, and in the back planted grape vines. In front of the house were flowers and evergreens, and I thought it was the prettiest place I had ever seen. We also had chickens, a cow, and two horses. After awhile he planted a garden of sweet peas and other flowers. We had a water well in the back of the house next to the back porch; that was the only way we had of getting our water. We didn't have any sink or anything like that then; and we had a wood stove. Everyone said I made the best biscuits, and people used to come down to the house all the time and I would make them some.

We lived there about three years. About that time I sold the hotel and went to live about ten miles out on the Sherman Road where there was a big farm. I stayed there about two or three years, and raised a lot of corn, and got a lot of hogs. That gave Mr. Smith and Dad the notion of buying a lot of hogs and going west.

Mr. Smith went to the Centennial in Chicago that year. While he was gone I stayed home. There was a negro woman who used to help around the house, and she stayed with me. When Mr. Smith came home he decided to rent our place and move into my father's place. I and Mr. Smith were crazy to go into the hog business; so we went up to the Little Colorado in Brown Country. I, Mr. Smith, & My brothers Rufe and Henry, drove the hogs to the little Colorado on foot.

My mother and myself drove one wagon with horses. We put up tents

and camped out at night. The men would have to pen the hogs up each night. We had about 200 of them, and along the way the men put all their money into feeding the hogs, until finally we ran out of money. Most of the pigs then died and we only had a very few left by the time we reached our destination.

No one had to lease land where we went. It was a wild prairie country, and a man by the name of Buck Hannon told us about a claim up the river in a good little valley, so we went there. Buck had just been away out west to kill buffalo and had about two wagons full. He gave us quite a bit of buffalo meat, and it was the finest meat I had ever eaten.

Mr. Smith and I didn't stay there, but I a and I a made it their permanent home. Dad was going to farm a little, and because they had traded some hogs for cattle as we went along, he stayed there to go into the cattle business. Mr. Smith and I went on to Austin, and then, after looking around a bit, we went on down to Waco, a big town off the Brazos River, where Mrs. Smith got back into his old trade again.

We had ornamental trees, then we put up greenhouses and had flowers, things like that. We would go back up the Colorado River almost every summer to visit the folks when we would sell out most of our stock, and we'd stay there two or three months.

There were quite a few negroes in Waco, and they would take their watches and go to a certain pawn broker there and pawn their watches. This pawn broker would have baskets full of watches and try to sell them. Finally he got the idea of letting Mr. Smith take the watches on his trips and try to sell them. Mr. Smith got half of what he sold them for. Uncle Arthur and Mr. Smith took a trip once and took all the watches up to the soldiers at Fort Concho, and other forts and tried to sell them. Many of the watches were stolen by the people looking at them, and also, on the return trip people tried to steal their money.
