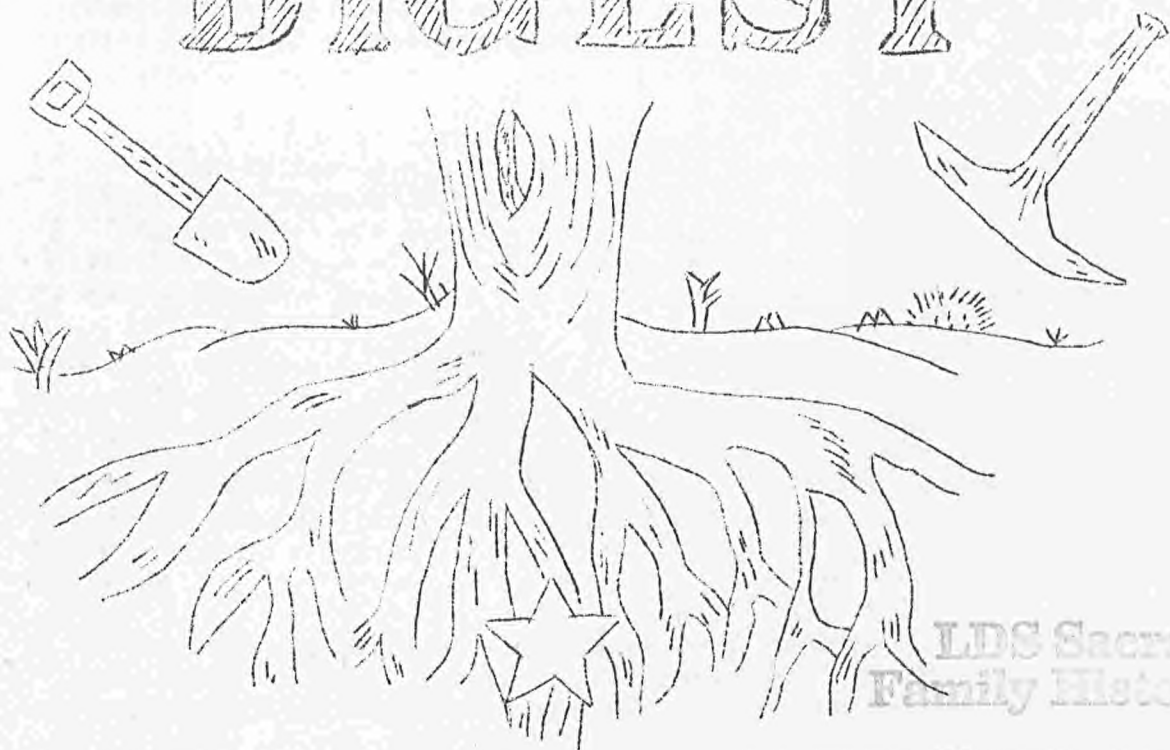

FIFTEEN WAYS TO FIND A MAIDEN NAME

Maiden names are where you find them. Some of you have some I won't have thought of. All fifteen won't work on the same person, it depends on the time and place, and where the person lived. Also, don't stop when you locate one record that has a maiden name on it, go for at least three, and if you are lucky at least two will agree. It's not a bad idea to go for four or five proofs. It seems that once you find the maiden name, it turns up everywhere, and you will think "Why did I think it was so difficult?"

LAND RECORDS

Land records are the most often overlooked major source of genealogical information in the United States. They are important for three major reasons:

1. They exist for early periods of time when few other records exist.
2. Early American settlers were land conscious and nearly everyone owned land.
3. They contain information on relationships and other clues of genealogical significance. Modern land records seldom contain too much information but earlier records gave much more.

There are three categories of land records:

1. Conveyances from the colonies (pre-revolutionary) and from states to individuals.
2. Conveyances from the U.S. federal government to private individuals.
3. Conveyances of real property between private individuals. (These usually have the most information).

Land records are not a perfect research tool by themselves, but are valuable when used in conjunction with other types of records. (vital, census, probate, etc.)

Availability: The records are kept by County Recorders, County Clerks, or the clerk of the circuit court, or the registry of deeds. (p. 309 of Val Greenwood's book gives the jurisdiction in each state where these records are kept on a state or county basis.) Some records are found in the State and National Archives depending on the jurisdiction of the land transfer.

Most states require the records to be indexed by the names of both the grantor (seller) and the grantee (buyer); or the mortgager or mortgagee, so the records are usually easily located. Most records are signed by both the husband and wife or specifies if the signer is single. Exception: In the early years in America, women could not own land so it was recorded in their husband's name.

Land records contain clues that may lead to other important genealogical records. Watch especially those records with multiple grantors or grantees. These usually had family connections. See "Land and Property Records" (at the end of this article) for the types of records and documents which may be filed and their possible value. Check the Book of Conditional Contracts if you find no land record for an ancestor who lived on land for many years. He may have purchased the land on the installment plan and died before finishing the payments and never obtained title to it.

Early Land Records: Early in the Revolutionary War the Continental Congress

authorized each private and noncommissioned officer to receive a bounty of \$50., 50 acres, and a new suit of clothes for his service. Various states also authorized bounty land for Revolutionary War veterans and preserved tracts of land in their western territories for this. The Western Reserve in North-eastern Ohio is an example of this. Connecticut reserved this land to grant to her veterans when she ceded her western lands to the federal government in 1786.

Later bounty land was also granted to the military men for the service in the War of 1812, the Indian Wars, and the Mexican War. More specific details of the bounty land acts can be found in Val Greenwood's book.

The Homestead Act in 1812 and later bills made various changes in the method by which a settler could obtain public lands. The Homestead Act provided land only to citizens or those who declared his intention to become a citizen. The papers of an alien who had declared his citizenship intentions may show his name, date and port of arrival, and place of birth. By 1935, all public lands were closed to individual ownership.

Most land entry records for public domain are found in the National Archives, although a few are still in land offices in the individual states. The Bureau of Land Management in Washington, D.C., has 5 volumes of indexes for tract books from the Ohio land offices at Canton, Chillicothe, Cincinnati, Marietta and Zanesville, and Steubenville. Ohio was one of the states that had the most bounty land area.

Generally the New England research requires that the towns be treated as mini-counties, since many records are kept on a town basis. They have state, county, and town records. New England land grants usually went to a group of men called town proprietors who laid out the town homesites and fields and sold these divisions of land into private ownership, creating many small towns.

The Southern land grants were made to individuals creating a rural area of scattered farms with few towns. The southern plantations are good examples of this.

Many other types of records may be filed in the local land offices. These could include various court records and miscellaneous probate records including wills. Almost any document affecting land titles can be found in the land record file. Search the records for everyone of your surname in the locality of your ancestor (including spelling variations). You are looking for relationships, and may find a missing link.

ANNIE RAUB LETTERS -- YUBA CITY, 1880 & 1881

These letters were written by Annie Raub to Ellis E. Tilton (or Filton) of Jelloway, Ohio. The letters were sent to us by Irene Clough Hahn of Modesto, California. She made no mention of how they came to be in her possession, and we are grateful for her kindness in sending them.

(There are marriage records for some of these Raubs in Sutter County, including one for Annie M. Raub, who married George Laverne Jones, on 24 August 1882)

Yuba City, Cal.
Dec 19, 1880

Dear Friend Ellis,

Almost three weeks ago, I was very much surprised at receiving a letter from a friend whom, I thought, I had long since forgotten me. I have often thought of you and we "young folks" have spent many a pleasant time talking of our sportive games with the "Tilton' children," and it doesn't seem possible that my old "playmate" has entered manhood, and that letter, written in such a man-like hand, was from him.

Memory pictures you to me, as a little boy of 4 or 5 years, or as you was when last I saw you. Of course, you have changed as well as I. Fifteen years will change anybody a great deal. I would like to see you anyway and see what you look like. Next Friday will be my 19th birthday. Just about eight months younger than you. If we lived closer I would give a birthday party and invite you all over.

I am at home this winter, the first winter I have missed school since we left Knox Co., O. Last term I attended school for almost nine successive months and I feel like staying at home for awhile. I may start, though after the holidays. I would have tried teaching but after the examination was over the schools were all engaged.

You wished to know where Charlie and Willie are. Charlie is bookkeeper in the farmers Cooperative Union warehouses in this town, Yuba City, and boards at home, so he is here a good share of the time. Willie is at home. He was sick in Sept. with an attack of typhoid fever and has never become really well yet. Isn't able to do anything at all. Florence is living about 5 miles out in the country.

We had no rain since last May until Dec. 1st, and since then we have had rain every day, so you can imagine just how muddy our roads are.

Pa and Ma are well pleased with that photo. I think Pa has sent Mr. and Mrs. Tilton, Nellie and Frank's photos. If he hasn't, he will send one. I will send you one of mine soon. I can very distinctly remember Mr. E.L. Watly, but can not remember of ever seeing Miss Allie. Well, Ellis, I have written an uninteresting letter, but take the will for the deed, and I will endeavor to do better again. Please write soon as convenient.

P.S. Please excuse me for not writing sooner. If it had not been for sickness, I would have been more prompt. Mama was sick, and it threw the work on me so I could hardly find time. She is much better now.

Yuba City, Cal.
Feb. 9, 1881

Dear Friend Ellis,

Received your letter five weeks ago and answered it some time ago, but I guess you did not receive it for I did not send it. So I shall attempt another answer now, and perhaps I'll send this one. This is a beautiful day, sun shining and the air is scented from the almond blossoms, but, O, the streets and the view of the country west of us.

We have had a flood and the water is nearly all over the country. It is just running off as fast as it can but the sloughs are all full yet and to get in town from the country is almost impossible. The flood was caused by excessive snows in the mountains and rain in both the valley and the mountains. The snow was deeper than has been known by the "white man", when the weather comes off warm (Thermometer ranging from 50 to 75 degrees) Heavy rains fell causing landslides in the mountains and water more than the levees would hold. The levees were broken both above and below town and Yuba City did not go under although we all thought it would. It is situated just opposite the mouth of Yuba river which empties into the Feather and Marysville is just across the Feather River at its junction with the Yuba. So it is a great wonder to me why the levees here were not all washed away and the town too, but all the men and boys in town, and a great many outside of town worked at the levee and fought the water back. They had been at work for two days and still held the water.

But Thursday night (last) at two o'clock the church and school bells were tolled to alarm the people of town that the levee had given away. This break was about two miles above town, and as it was quite large, the water rushed out across the country and had to back up into town, so

it did not get here until Friday at about noon. It was about two feet deep in the lower end of town, but did not get into our lot as we live on a high knoll. All the dry land that could be seen in the valley west ward was the Butte mountains. O, I won't attempt to describe the awful desolation of the country for to do that would be impossible.

The steamer, Governor Dana, went over the plains east and west from Sacramento last Sunday picking up people from house tops, trees, levees, etc.

No lives were lost that we have learned yet. The railroads were so badly "dilapidated" that to use them is impossible. Our mail express and passengers now come from Sacramento to Marysville on the steamer. There were heavy snows in the mountains last Sunday and Monday again. The people were afraid we should have another flood, but I do hope we will not.

The valley is clear from clouds now and the wind seems to be turning toward the North. It is awful to think that such a pretty country as this valley is subject to such floods and that some day before long it will have to be yielded over to the miners. If they would only cease hydraulic mining the country might be saved yet. The valley is so small a portion of the state, that it does not interest itself much about us and send no help.

You can't imagine how well pleased I was to receive that splendid big letter, and I hope you will not be disgusted with me for delaying so long, but will write another and I will make a desperate attempt to answer it immediately.

The wild flowers are beginning to bud and will soon be blooming. If you were only close enough, I might give you a buttonhole bouquet of violets.

The Chinamen keep us well supplied with vegetables "right from the gardens". They were nearly all under water for a day or so, but are now out again.

Ellis, come over and take Supper with us. Pa just received a new supply of vegetables today. Of course we don't have any such variety as we will later, but I presume you would be surprised to see what the gardens do contain in February. Oranges are now ripening.

Annie Raub Letters (Continued)

You wished to know if Ma had not blue eyes. No she has not. Her eyes are black or very dark brown. Pa has blue eyes, but he is the only blue eyed in our household.

I spent Christmas at home. There was nothing going on because of rain.

New Years and the following week were spent in the country. Attended a Grand Leap Year Party at the court house in this town, December 30, 1880. The Gents gave a return party two weeks ago and I had a splended time.

Hve not gotten the picture for you yet, but will get soon as I can get to town. (Marysville) and would be very much delighted to receive one of my old playmate's. Please excuse this long delay. Your letter would have been answered long ago if it had not been for the flood excitement which has existed during the past month.

You would excuse this horrid scribbling if you knew what a very sore finger I had to use in writing it. Please write soon and believe me. Supper time and I must go. Regards to you and all.
