DOCUMENT PRESERVATION

Genealogical research begins with one's immediate family. Most people are pleasantly surprised to discover how many important family records are already in their own files or those of close relatives. Some records may have considerable monetary value, some may be of historical importance, but most items are of sentimental value. The physical condition of these records probably varies also. Some items may be very old but still in remarkably good condition; others may be in the last stages of deterioration. As a family genealogist, you must make some decisions about these records. Which ones are worth preserving? Do you have the capability and the finances to undertake preservation? Do you know which procedures to use on each type of record?

First, ~~decide~~ which records you don't have to worry about. These are the items with sentimental value but of no lasting importance. Examples include greeting cards and newspapers with headlines announcing the end of a war or the assassination of a president. These items might have a lot of personal sentimental value, but they may not be worth the time and cost of preservation.

At the other extreme are records of great monetary value and/or historical importance. Are you equipped to prevent their loss. Would it be better to transfer these materials to a museum or archive that is equipped to repair and preserve the records carefully and prevent their theft? A copy of the original and documentation of their transfer may provide you and your family with the same information as though you still had the original.

This still leaves a fairly large collection of records that should

remain with the family but needs your attention to prevent deterioration. You will be surprised at the range of materials that are in this collection: books, old letters, certificates, licenses, all kinds of photographs, newspaper clippings, military papers, tape cassettes, scrapbooks, possibly cloth samplers, and many of the more physical mementoes of a family's existence. Each item is in some stage of deterioration. Every time you touch one of these items, you leave a faint film of oil and perspiration on it. Even though you place the item in some type of a container so that you do not touch the original, you still accelerate deterioration when you expose it to fluorescent lights, a change in temperature, or a change in humidity. Each category of items requires its own special preservation techniques.

I. Causes of paper deterioration

A. Environmental - 10-25%

1. Biological - insects, rodents, fungus
2. Mechanical - tearing, crumpling, folding, fire, flood
3. Atmospheric - temperature, humidity, light

B. Acidity - 75-90%

II. Controlling the environment

A. Biological and mechanical

1. Self evident

B. Atmospheric

1. Temperature range - 60-75°F. Each 18° F increase in temperature doubles the rate of chemical reactions in the paper
2. Humidity range - 50-60%. High temperature plus high humidity encourages fungal growth. High humidity increases the water content of paper; when the water begins to move in the paper, it causes internal stress that breaks the cellulose chains. High moisture content also leads to other chemical reactions such as acid hydrolysis.

3. Light - avoid sunlight and fluorescent light; these cause photo-oxidation of the chemical bonds that hold paper together. Special filters are available for fluorescent lights to reduce or eliminate ultraviolet wavelengths.

III. Controlling acidity

- A. Causes of acidity - In the early 1800s, paper made in the United States was made from 100% linen rag. It was sized with gelatin from hoofs, hides, and horns of animals. Sizing is necessary to make a hard surface for writing and prevent the ink from bleeding. The paper was strong because of the long linen fibers. It contained practically no acidity. It lasts for several hundred years.

In 1827, a method for making paper from wood pulp was invented. The pulp contained tannic acid. Alum, another acidic material was used for sizing. Sometimes a bleach was used to make the paper whiter; bleach contains an acid.

Today, newer methods of making paper from wood pulp have speeded the process and reduced the cost. Stronger acids are used to treat the pulp. There is even less effort to remove the acids from the final product. The acid content of today's paper is even higher than the paper of the early 1900s. Many papers have a pH of 4. This is nearly as strong as vinegar.

- B. Methods for neutralizing acidity.

1. Barrow two-step deacidification. This method is used by the Maryland Hall of Records for documents that can tolerate an immersion in water. The documents are first soaked in a solution of calcium hydroxide to neutralize all the acids in the paper. Then the document is soaked in a solution of calcium bicarbonate which precipitates an alkaline buffer. The buffer neutralizes any acidity that might develop later.

Document Preservation (continued)

2. Cunha cocktail. Crush one milk of magnesia tablet and dissolve it in one liter (about one quart) of club soda. Four into a pan or large flat container. Sandwich the document between two pieces of pelon or plastic screening. Immerse the document for two hours, then place it on a flat surface and blot it dry. Let it continue to dry overnight under weights. The active ingredient is magnesium carbonate. Any excess $MgCO_3$ in the paper will neutralize any acidity that develops in the future. This is a water-base material and should not be used for papers with an ink that is water-soluble.
3. Vapor phase deacidification. Chemical crystals contained in a plastic packet are placed between the leaves of a book or in a closed container with the documents. As the crystals vaporize, they neutralize the acidity in the paper. This method is used in Europe and England. This method does not provide a buffer to neutralize acidity that may develop in the future.
4. Interleaving with alkaline paper. Tissue paper or bond paper with a high pH is placed between the leaves of a book. By a very slow process, the acidity is neutralized. This also is a good way to preserve textile materials; just wrap them in tissue paper with a high pH.
5. Wei T'o solution or spray. This is a non-aqueous solution that can be used on most inks. Dr. Richard Smith, Park Forest, IL, invented and patented the process in 1968. The active ingredient is methyl magnesium carbonate. You should always wet an inconspicuous area of the document first to be sure the ink does not dissolve.

IV. Preservation of Old Documents

A. Principles

1. Restore if possible; copy if restoration is not possible
2. Treat for acidity

3. Store under ideal conditions of temperature, humidity and light

B. Photographs: Some Do's and Don'ts

1. Do store in cool, dry, dark place
2. Do not expect color prints to last more than 7-10 years
3. Do make black and white copies of all photographs to be kept
4. Do not mount photographs in a "magnetic" album
5. Do store negatives in mylar or acetate envelopes
6. Do label negatives, or envelope in which stored - clearly
7. Do not write on the back of photographs with felt-tip, or ball-point pen. Use a lead pencil.
8. Do handle prints and negatives only by the edges, oils from fingerprints can destroy both a negative and print.
9. Do not store negatives or prints loosely in a box. They will slide around and scratch each other.
10. Do make duplicates of all photos that you wish to handle frequently. Store originals, handle them infrequently.
11. Do not clean an old photograph until you know exactly how it was made and how to clean that particular type. Many commercial photographers know little about old photographs.
12. Kodachrome will last a lot longer than Ektachrome; Kodachrome will last 50-100 years; Ektachrome up to 50 years. Polaroid should last longer than conventional color prints.

C. Papers

1. If the document is folded and brittle, place in a humidifier until it can be unfolded without cracking. Follow the same process if the document is wrinkled and brittle.
2. Flatten the document under weights.
3. Remove all paper clips, pins, staples and other metallic

items; also remove rubber bands and other non-paper materials. Use plastic clips to hold pages together if this is necessary.

4. Clean the document; use a camel's hair brush or a shaving brush to remove all loose dirt; use a soft pencil eraser to remove pencil marks; use draftsman's eraser powder to remove imbedded dirt. As an alternative, wallpaper cleaner or any kneaded cleaner probably can be used; art gum erasers and pink pearl erasers also can be used if you are careful. Be careful with newspaper clippings that the eraser does not remove the ink.
5. Treat for acidity, using one of the methods above.
6. Repair tears, using rice paper and paste or special mylar tapes with acid-free gums.
7. Mount on acid-free paper if working with small documents, such as newspaper clippings or photographs. Do not use any of the sticky tapes sold in department stores; rather, use the special tapes and mountings sold by archival supply companies.
8. Encapsulate
9. Store in acid-free file folders or boxes.

HEADSTONES IN OLD SMARTVILLE CEMETERY

Cemetery found on right hand side of Camp Beal Road, going toward the Smartsville Fraternal Cemetery, off Hwy 20, near Road that enters Smartsville. Copied by Nalda E. Bahling, of Sacramento, who included the following information. ---- 'I had visited this cemetery with my grandmother, Veronica (Schmidt) Manasco, in 1915 when there were many tombstones. Her brother, Joseph Schmidt, was buried there, but I found no evidence of his stone.'

ELLEN R., wife of S. MOODY, died July 9, 1856, aged 32 years. "Gone but not forgotten."

JOHN CLAYTON, only son of Thomas B. and Mary H. SIMPSON, born March 29, 1860, died March 11, 1865. "Jesus said suffer little children to come unto me and forbid them not, for of such is the Kingdom of Heaven"

JOHN DITTNER died July 2, 1871, aged 40 years & 10 months "Dear wife, farewell, I go to dwell with Jesus Christ on high, there to sing praise to my King to all eternity"

WILLIAM BOWMAN died Aug 29, 1867, aged 49 years "Fare well, my wife and children all, from you a father Christ doth call. Mourn not for me, it is in vain, to call me to your sight again"

"PILLAR STELE" knocked from its base, but standing erect alongside one of the four sided stone was vacant, each of the following was engraved on on of the other three sides:

ELIZABETH CORY died Nov 20, 1868, aged 36 years
WILLIAM H. CORY died Oct 10, 1873, aged 20 years
DANIEL CORY died Jan 8, 1899, aged 70 years

Another badly damaged stone was found - almost unreadable --- this was the best I could do.....

Died Dec 31, 1899, aged 43 years & _____

SMARTSVILLE

(Written 1921)

James Smart built a hotel at Smartsville in the Spring of 1856. This was the first building except a few miners cabins. The old Masonic Hall is still standing. It was moved from Rose Bar a short distance from Smartsville in the year of 1857. Mr. Mooney's house on the old Empire Ranch is still standing. Mooney's home was the Meca for gatherings of Sunday sports. Horse racing, cock fighting, and prize fighting were the sports indulged in; Mr. Mooney being the biggest sport of all.

Pipes and tunnels of the famous Pactola and Blue gravel mines are still in evidence.

The Catholic church which was burned in 1859 was rebuilt the same year and is still standing. There is still standing, also, the home of Mrs. J.V. Berry, the first public school-teacher who taught in 1857.

The once beautiful homes of Mr. O'Brien, Mr. McGanny, and Mrs. L.B. Clark are still occupying their original positions, having been built in the early fifties.

The Government settling basin, or what is known as the Bonanza Ranch, Hammonton, and Marigold, was once the property of Mr. O'Brien of Smartsville. For many years, this property was used for grazing purposes. In recent years it has been taken over by mining interests, and today it is considered the greatest gold-dredging district of the United States, operating in the neighborhood of twenty (20) Gold dredgers.
