

*** There are three tax assessment books for 1857 in the Sutter County Museum. They are not listed as book 1, 2, or 3, as I shall refer to them in these records; nor are the pages numbered. Most of the names are listed with surnames beginning with the same letter of the alphabet, but some names are scattered hither and yon through the books in no discernable order. BASIC POLICIES AND INFORMATION

HOURS: The Library is open to the public Monday through Friday from 9 am to 4 pm. It is closed Saturdays and all legal holidays. The Library is now open every Sunday afternoon from 1 to 5, except on those Sundays which precede a holiday. During the month of April each year the Library is only open to DAR members during Continental Congress. Please check for exact closing dates during April each year.

ENTRANCE FEE: Non-members pay a daily entrance fee of \$5.00; \$3.00 on Sundays. A lunch-time fee is charged to accommodate mid-day researchers; \$2.00

LOANS: The Library is strictly a reference collection with no inter-Library Loan.

PHOTOCOPYING: Photocopies can be supplied within the limits of the Copyright Law and the following policies:

1. Requests for copies should include author, title, date of publication and pages needed. Be as specific as possible.

2. We cannot search unindexed books to locate individual names.

3. A maximum of 30 pages per order can be processed by mail. The price for copies by mail is \$1.00 for the first page from each book and 25¢ for each page thereafter. These fees cover searching, copying and postage. Prepayment is preferred. Checks should be made payable to "Treasurer General, NSDAR", and marked "Library photocopies" and mailed directly to the library.
4. The Library does not copy entire books.

5. Because photocopying may damage old and rare books, the Library Director reserves the right to refuse to copy such material.

DAR APPLICATION PAPERS: For information concerning application papers of DAR members and their Revolutionary ancestors, please address your inquiry to the Office of the Registrar General, NSDAR, at the above street address.

GROUP VISITS: Group visits are welcomed and encouraged. Please follow these guidlines when planning your visit;

1. We request that all such visits be scheduled as far in advance as possible to avoid conflicts, special closings, etc. Groups may not visit during the month of April. The DAR observes most

federal holidays; remember that these holidays may fall oh a slightly different day than in your locality. In short, give

yourself plenty of time to adjust schedules.

2. The standard entrance fees apply, and there are no group discounts or reductions for more than one day. Collect fees before you arrive and present them at the Library entrance. Checks for the total amount are acceptable (made payable to "Treasurer General. NSDAR")

3. All group members should wear a name badge for easy entrance to the building. Everyone should sign the register in the Library,

not at the front door.

4. Orientations are available if we know when you will arrive and how many are in the group. The Library can provide additional information sheets in advance upon request by mail. Specify the number of copies needed.

5. Should your plans change and you need to either shift or cancel

your visit, please let us know.

MAJOR RESOURCES OF THE DAR LIBRARY

GENEALOGICAL RECORDS COMMITTEE REPORTS: These reports have been collected since the late 1920's and contain previously unpublished genealogical information from all over the country. Each state society has a set of these volumes, and each set varies in length. The GRC reports represent a unique collection of several thousand volumes and are available only in the DAR Library in their entirety. Bible, cemetery, personal, county, and other records are found in these typescript volumes. The reports in the Library in 1971 were microfilmed by the LDS Church. Several indexes have been prepared for the specific set of an individual state, and the following published indexes have been prepared from the LDS microfilm.

John D. and E. Diane Stemmons. "The Cemetery Record Compendium: Comprising a Directory of Cemetery Records and Where They May Be Found." Logan, Utah; Everton, 1979.

E. Kay Kirkham. "An Index To Some of the Family Records of the Southern States: 35,000 Microfilm References from the NSDAR Files and Elsewhere. (Vol. 1) Logan, Utah: Everton, 1979

E.Kay Kirkham. "An Index to some of the Bibles and Family Records of the United States (excluding the Southern States): 45,500 References as Taken from the Microfilm at the Genealogical Society of Utah (NSDAR). Salt Lake City, Utah; Everton, 1984. (Vol.2)

Most of the entries in these volumes refer to material in the DAR Library. The hundreds of volumes which have come to the Library

- since the microfilming in 1971 are not, of course, included in these published indexes. Indexing projects at the Library are providing access to these new materials
- ANALYTICAL INDEX: This index provides researchers with the location of information on thousands of families found in old county histories periodicals and many of the GRC reports. Other special indexes reveal information on various specific subjects such as Delaware Oaths of Allegiance, Michigan Pioneer Families, Virginia women of the Revolution, New York records, and the 1850 District of Columbia census.
- THE LIBRARY'S ARRANGEMENT: The Library's arrangement of books is in itself a resource because patrons can easily browse in the open stacks in the section on a state or family of interest. The term classification system used by the Library is unique to this collection and requires some getting used to, but it works very well in a genealogical collection.
- GENEALOGICAL and HISTORICAL PERIODICALS: The Library owns a large collection of periodicals for most states, many of which are difficult to locate. Expansion of holdings is an ongoing priority.
- DOCUMENTATION FILES: The documentation files which have accompanied DAR membership applications are in the custody of the Library. Many applications do not have this supporting material because it was returned to the applicant, lost or destroyed over the years. The surviving thousands of files contain every imaginable type of genealogical document. Arrangement is by the name of the member's Revolutionary-era ancestor. Some restriction may apply to these files; inquire of the Library for details.

THE LINEAGE BOOKS OF THE DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION

From 1890 to 1939 the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution published 166 volumes containing the lineages of accepted members through National Number 166,000 (admitted in April 1921). The set is available in many large libraries around the country and is often the genealogist's first contact with DAR records.

Use Caution when studying the Lineage Books. Over sixty years have passed since the last lineage in these volumes was approved in 1921. During this period many new sources have become available and thousands of corrections have been made to the records in this set. These corrections have not been published in supplemental volumes to the Lineage Books, and are therefore available only in the Office of the Registrar General at DAR Headquarters in Washington. Corrections are however, periodically published in the DAR Magazine, but there is no

NSDAR Library (continued)

index to these. All lineages, whether they be those in the Lineage Books or those submitted subsequently to them, should be verified with the Registrar General's office.

Should one wish to correct an inaccurate lineage, please send a letter of explanation and documentation supporting the change to the Corrections Genealogist, Office of the Registrar General, DAR, 1776 D St., NW, Washington, D.C. 20006-5392. Such corrections are welcomed.

The Genealogy Department no longer accepts lineages cited in the Lineage Books when reviewing new applications for memberships. In short, the Lineage Books are only useful for clues to a lineage and should be used very carefully.

Availability of volumes in the set: All volumes of the Lineage Books have been out of print for many years. There are no plans to republish any of these volumes in either book form or microform. No copies are available from any office at DAR headquarters.

Indices to the Lineage Books: A four volume set of indices to the Lineage Books was published between 1916 and 1940, In 1980 the Genealogical Publishing Company of Baltimore, Maryland republished this set as Index to the Rolls of Honor in the Lineage Books of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution, four volumes in two. The indices cover volumes 1-160, but not the last six volumes. Copies of this set of indices are not available from any office at DAR headquarters. The Genealogical Publishing Company reprint is now out of print.

GENEALOGICAL GLEANINGS FROM OTHER PUBLICATIONS

LOST PASSENGER LISTS FOUND

As in a scene right out of "Raiders of the Lost Ark," archivists recently opened some government crates and made an important discovery. Long lost passenger lists for San Francisco and other Western seaboard ports were found to be intact according to Cynthia Fox of the Judicial, Fiscal and Social Branch of the GSA. These records were found last summer at the Washington National Records Center in Suitland. The passenger lists include arrivals at Honolulu, Portland, San Diego, San Francisco, San Pedro, and Seattle. Also included are arrivals at other cities such as El Paso, Galveston, Miami, Newport News, Port Huron, and Oswego. There are at least 10,000 volumes and it will be a number of years before the records and inventoried and microfilmed. - U.S. News and Canadian Report, Gen. Lib., March 1985. (Contra Costa Genealogical Society Publication)

An item from UGA in same publication of CCGS states the microfilming is already taking place. San Francisco lists will be on 470 reels of film.

THE MARRIAGE YOU'LL NEVER FIND

The California statutes of 1877-78 first authorized that unmarried persons living together could be officially married by a clergyman without a marriage license. A record of the marriage was then filed among the clergyman's church records. The intent of the law was to protect the inheritance rights of the children of such unions. Today this discreet method of marrying has become a way to save money. No waiting and no blood test is required. A public notary may officiate at the marriage by filling out a blank marriage license. Records of these marriages are deposited with county government, which keeps them under seal. Last year one third of all California marriages were of this kind. This year there will be an estimated 85,000 cases. (Population Today, Nov. 1987, via German Society of Sacramento)

VITAL RECORDS

Records of births or deaths on the high seas; When a birth or death occurs on the high seas, whether in an aircraft or on a ship, the determination of where the record is filed is decided in the terms of the direction in which the craft was headed at the time of the event. a) If the craft was outbound or docked at a Foreign post, request for copies of the record should be made to the U.S. Department of State, Washington, D.C., 20520. b) If the craft was inbound and the port of entry was in the U.S., write to the registration in the city where the craft landed in the U.S. c) If the craft was of U.S. registry, contact the U.S. Coast Guard facility at the port of entry. (McLean Co., IL, Genealogical Society)

CEMETERY RESEARCH

When reading tombstones in a cemetery, have your binoculars handy. You can stand at a distance and read stones better than close at hand.

Useing chalk (on its side to rub across tombstone writing) will not harm the stone and can be easily removed with a damp cloth. This will make the engraved letters easier to read.

In locating an unmarked grave, use a metal finder. There are usually metal holders outside the burried casket that will zing as one passes the instrument over the surface. You can practically outline a casket in this manner. (Jacksonville Genealogical Journal)

In many old cemeteries, tombstones may have fallen over and become covered with several inches of soil with the passing of time. Using a probe, very carefully, may allow you to locate these stones so that they may be replaced on the top of the ground as well as read for valuable information.

BRITISH NAMING PATTERNS 1700-1875

The first son was named after the father's father.
The second son after the mother's father
The third son after the father's eldest brother
The first daughter after the mother's mother
The second daughter after the father's mother
The third daughter after the mother
The fourth daughter after the mother's eldest sister

There were exceptions when names were duplicated such as both father's father and mother's mather having the same names. In that case, the name was taken from the next on the list.

It was common to name a child the same as a child who had died previously. (San Joaquin Genealogical Society, Nov/Dec 1987)

ORPHAN'S COURTS

Probably the least used resource of all, primarily because most of usthink that this facility can not possibly have any information we could use, are the Orphans Courts found in many states. This group handles a variety of records which can be most profitable. First, we must understand that the legal definition of an orphan is one who has lost his natural father. It is not tied to the mother or to any specific age. Orphan Court records, called dockets, are used to appoint or change the appointments of guardians for orphans, incompetents and sometimes indigents. They also record administrators for estates and frequently trustees. Many property transfers, inventories of estates, marriages, births and deaths are to be found in these dockets. You might even uncover an elusive maiden name, for when a widow asks that an individual be appointed guardian of her son, it is possible that the person she suggests may be her relative. So, if the states you are sesearching maintain Orphans Courts, add those courts to you list of sources. (Contra Costa Gene. Society)

SOCIAL SECURITY

From the beginning in the late 1930's applications for Social Security included the names of parents, date, and exact place of birth, residence, place of employment and signature of applicant (if applicable). To obtain a copy of this document, address your local S.S. office and state that you make this request under the Freedom of Information/Privacy Act, permitting release of this data once a person is deceased. Include a photocopy of the death record along with the S.S. number and ask for a photocopy of the original application. (Lake County Gene. Society via Hayward Gene. Society)

-RAILROAD RECORDS

During the early part of the century some 24 million people worked for the railroads. In the 1930's the Railroad Retirement Board was created. Write to them at 884 Rush St., Chicago IL 60611. Some of the information they have on file includes: applications for employment, applications for employment annuity, employee registration, certifications for termination of service. These records will include full name and date of birth, place of birth, parents' names, mother's maiden name, social security number, occupational title, etc. It is helpful if you know the social security number and/or railroad retirement number. (Puget Sound Genealogical Society)

Now, this letter was the second received. The first contained \$5. and in return, all references found in the Hall of records checked, newspaper index checked (this goes to about 1950) cemeteries in Yuba City and Sutter City were checked and info sent to Ms. Butcher.

After the second letter was received, a trip to Oroville (60 miles round=trip) was made to check the CA death index to 1960. Nothing found. I then decided to check the L.O. cemetery record, and there was Mr. Jackson. I took a picture of his tombstone. I now had the date of death, which was in 1963, and the fact that he had died in a Veteran's hospital in the S.F. area. With this info, I located his extensive obituary in the newspapers on microfilm in Yuba City. I enclosed a listing of the search, the picture of his tombstone, and a photo-copy of the obituary, and mailed all of this to Ms. Butcher. This included the distance traveled, first trip to Yuba City (25 miles round=trip) trip to Oroville (60 miles roundtrip) return trip to Yuba city (25 miles round-trip) This was last March. Nothing has been heard from MX. Butcher since.
