A reception for the newlyweds was held at the American Legion in Atchison, Kansas. The room was decorated with cream colored balloons, accented with gold decorations.

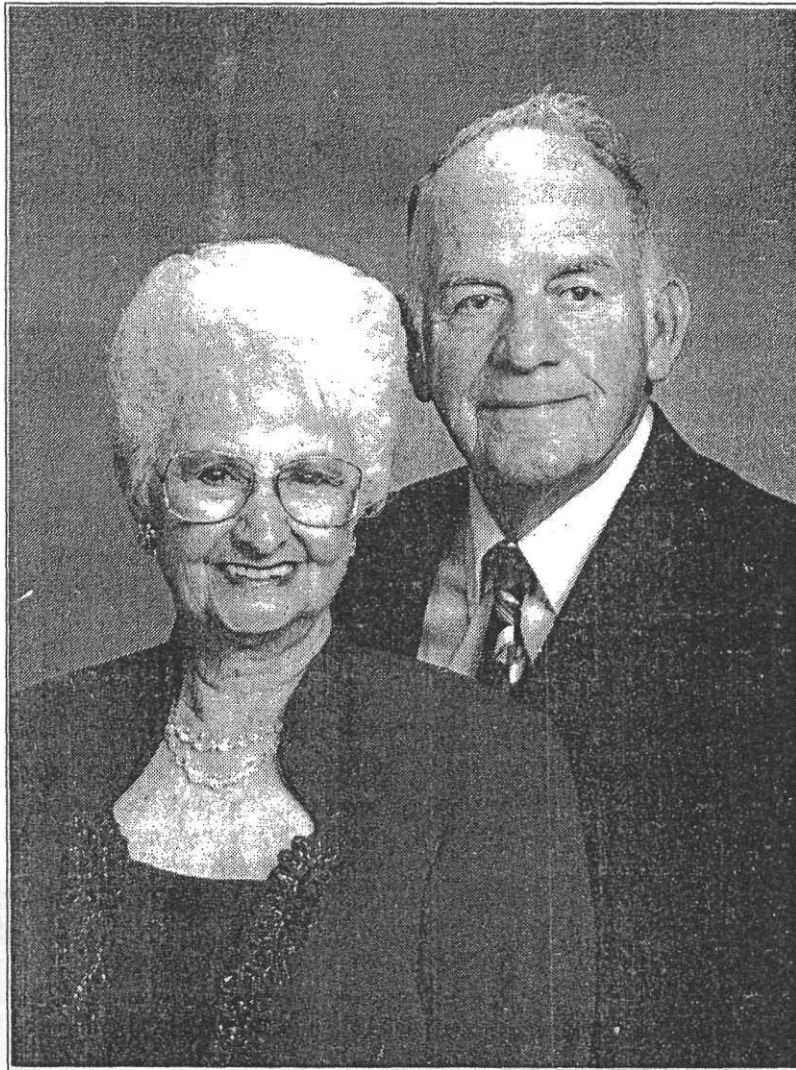

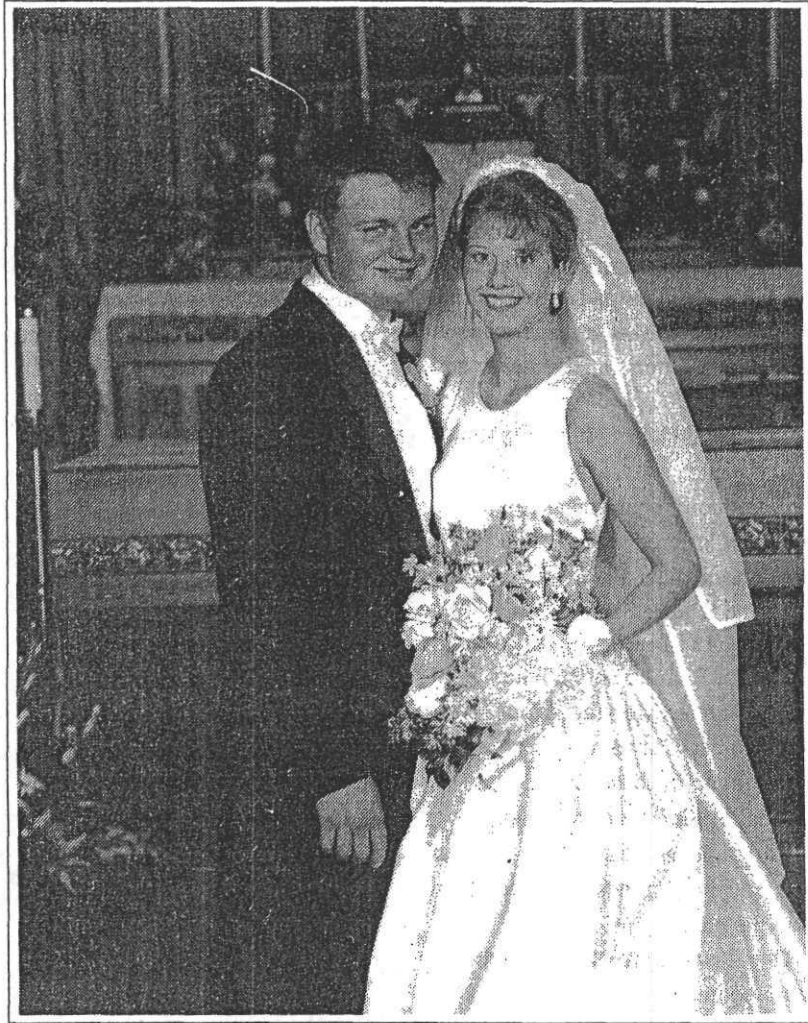
