Instead of the steady picnic diet, we had a hay rack ride in the fall. One big thrill of the year was showing off our new class rings. December 7 we presented the play "Great Caesar's Ghost" which was received with much enthusiasm. We worked hard and long on our Jr. and Sr. Banquet, the theme of which was the "Southern Plantation."
