Left Neuves Matson, September 11, arriving Liverdun on September 12; entering the Argonne Woods at 6:30 a.m., September 12. Left Argonne Woods by trucks on September 18; arriving at Ealaries (Argonne Woods), September 19. Left for Clermont (Argonne Woods); arriving September 21. Left Clermont September 25, arriving in position for the BIG DRIVE on September 26 and were relieved on October 1; going to Auzeville same day.

Left on the 6th of November for Fort Vaux; arriving October 25. Left Fort Vaux on the 6th of November; arriving at Cote de Lerre, November 7. Left there for Semoncourt, arriving on the 7th. Left Semoncourt, November 9; arriving at Bannoncourt same day. Left Bannoncourt November 10, arriving at Forest de Marcaulieu, November 10. 11 a.m. November 11, ARMISTICE SIGNED. Left Marcaulieu, December 2, arriving at Negre on same day. Left Negre for Vignot on 8th of December; arriving same day. Left Vignot and entrained at Lesouville for Coutra Belle on March 9, 1919; arriving there on the 12th. Hiked same day to Boufay, arriving about 6 a.m. Left Boufay on the 19th; arriving at Champagne (Belgian Camp) on the 19th. Remained at Champagne from the 19th until the 24th; then went to the Barrack Camp (Champagne) and remained until April 1. Left Champagne April 1; arriving at Camp Monitor St. Nazairre, April 2. Left Camp Monitor on April 13 and boarded ship at St. Nazairre at noon. Sailed from St. Nazairre on the Good Ship Matsonia homeward bound.

Arrived at Newport News on April 24 at 1 p.m. Arrived at Camp Stuart at 3 p.m. same day. Left Camp Stuart May 1; arriving at St. Joseph, Missouri, 4 a.m., May 7; leaving there 4 p.m. same day, reaching Topeka on May 4 at 11 p.m. Remained there until next day at 1 p.m. and left for Camp Funston arriving at 4 p.m. Left Camp Funston on May 8; arriving at Oskaloosa on May 8.



The year 1856 A. D. and the year 2 of the tiny territorial settlement called Oskaloosa (named for the Iowa origin of its first settlers) brought to this locality a young Ohio attorney, John W. Day, whose participation in the struggles of "bleeding Kansas" and his communications to his home town newspaper, the Waynesville Gazette, fired the imagination of that paper's editor, John Wesley Roberts, induced him to sheathe his literary blade in an environment of security and draw again that keen rapier on the far prairies where the fight was hottest. Thus was founded, six months before Kansas was

admitted to the Union of States, The Oskaloosa Independent. In the files of the Independent, through the years, may be found almost countless articles concerning Oskaloosans who have participated in the wars from the Civil conflict through World War 11. The Editors appreciate the efforts of Larner-Segraves Post in adding this volume to the permanent records of community history.
