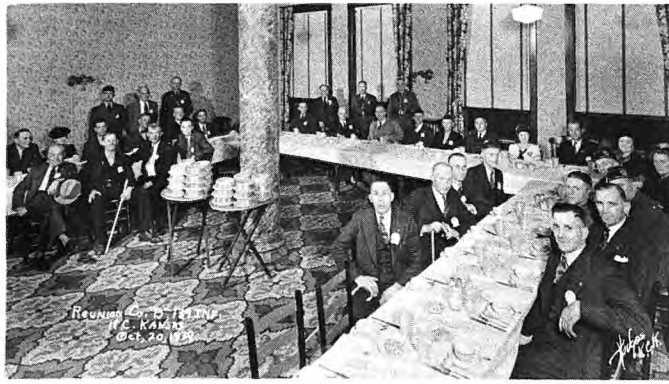

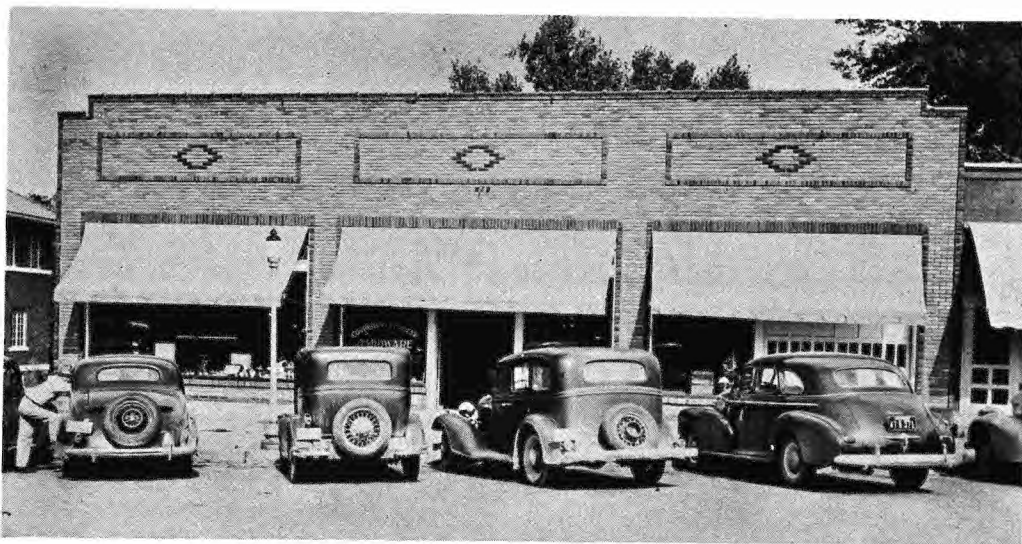

## Oskaloosa Independent



The year 1856 A. D. and the year 2 of the tiny territorial settlement called Oskaloosa (named for the Iowa origin of its first settlers) brought to this locality a young Ohio attorney, John W. Day, whose participation in the struggles of "bleeding Kansas" and his communications to his home town newspaper, the Waynesville Gazette, fired the imagination of that paper's editor, John Wesley Roberts, induced him to sheathe his literary blade in an environment of security and draw again that keen rapier on the far prairies where the fight was hottest. Thus was founded, six months before Kansas was

admitted to the Union of States, The Oskaloosa Independent. In the files of the Independent, through the years, may be found almost countless articles concerning Oskaloosans who have participated in the wars from the Civil conflict through World War 11. The Editors appreciate the efforts of Lerner-Segraves Post in adding this volume to the permanent records of community history.
