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

Many times we hear those who wish to do genealogy say, "but where do we begin"?, or "How do we start". They look at a publication and say "Thats nice, but I don't know how to

use it." This section of our publication is for YOU, THE BEGINNER. It is hoped that we will be able to aid you in starting your genealogical records and research.

We invite anyone to send questions to the QUESTION BOX, % M.C.G.S., Box 444, Coffeyville, Kansas 67337. We do not do any research for individuals but we will attempt to answer questions about the methods of record keeping and filing. We also will be glad to advise you as to what research would be beneficial to you. These will be answered as space permits in our quarterly publication.

Those who wish to start climbing their "family tree" should first acquaint themselves with terminologies used by the genealogist. Words such as ancester, descendant, progenitor, surname, maiden name, and given names will readily become

part of your every day vocabulary.

After you have acquainted yourself with these terms, you should acquaint yourself with a pedigree chart and a family group chart. These are printed in different sizes and styles. The choice of which kind one uses is strictly a case of personal preference. If, however, you are a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints you will want to consult your ward or branch genealogy leader. Members of this church use an 8½X14 pedigree chart and use a family group sheet of the same size. These family group sheets have room for recording dates pertaining to Temple ordinances. All types of sheets may be obtained from the Everton Publishers Inc., P.O. Box 368, Logan, Utah 84321. Upon request, they will send you a catalog which illustrates all their genealogical supplies and quotes their prices.

I do wish to caution you not to invest in a lot of books and supplies until you have been doing genealogy long enough to be able to determine which books will be of the greatest

aid to you.

In doing genealogy we always work from the known to the unknown. Your first step will be to record on pedigree charts and family group sheets all information known.

When recording names, dates and places always follow the following rules:

- 1. Record full names. Never abbreviate any part of a name.
- 2. Record surname first in capital letters followed by a comma and then the given names.

3. Always record a womans maiden name when known.

- 4. When recording dates, record the day of the month, the month and the year. le. 4 July 1776. Use standard abbreviations for the months.
- 5. When recording places always record the name of the town or city in full. You may abbreviate the name of counties and

states or their foreign equivalants.

Following these rules, start your pedigree chart. Number 1 on your pedigree chart is YOU. Record your name and details about yourself. Number 2 is your FATHER. Numbers 4 and 5 are his FATHER and MOTHER. Number 3 is your MOTHER. Number 6 and 7 are her MOTHER and FATHER. This pattern of recording is followed through to the end of the chart. Record only facts you know,

do not guess at any information.

Once you have recorded all known information on your pedigree chart you will begin filling out family group sheets. Fill out one family group sheet for you and your spouse. If not married your first family group sheet will be that of your father and mother. Next fill out a family group sheet for each husband and wife shown on your pedigree chart. Use the same rules for recording names, dates and places as those used for your pedigree chart. There is one additional rule. When recording children, record them in order of their birth, the oldest child first.

When you have recorded all known information on your pedigree and family group sheets, the next step will be to consider if the information you don't have can be obtained from records at home. There are many sources in the home that can be of great genealogival value. Some of these are:

1. Certificates Birth, christening, blessings, baptism, confirmation, ordinations to priesthood, graduations marriage, apprenticeship records, and deaths.

2. Books and Manuscripts
Bibles, diaries, journals, account books, baby books,
scrap books, family histories, biographies and memorials.

3. Newspaper clippings Births, christenings, announcements, engagements, marriages, divorces, deaths, obituaries and memorials.

4. Military Records Enlistment and induction notices, orders, discharges and separation documents, pension documents.

5. Land and Estate Records
Abstracts of title, deeds, mortgages, leases, agreements,
wills, pepitions, letters of testamentary and of administration, trust documents and tax records.

6. Miscellaneous Records Letters, receipts, memorials, pictures, citizenship and Naturalization, passports, etc.

CEMETERY DIRECTORY

The following records were taken from the record books of the Coffeyville Furniture Company in possession of Skinner Hamlin Funeral Home, 2405 Woodland Ave., Coffeyville, Kansas. In copying these records we took only information of interest and help to those doing genealogical research. To help you use these records we believe the following information to be an aid to you.

CEMETERIES

- Catholic -- now Calvary Cemetery, a section of Fairview Cemetery.
- Catholic -- turn West on Oklahoma line just South of Coffeyville go i mile West to Cemetery.
- City -- All burials designated city are believed to be in the Elmwood Cemetery.
- Country -- All burials designated country are believed to be in private cemeteries outside the city limits.
- Edna -- 1 mile West of Edna, Kansas.
- Elmwood-- the Elmwood Cemetery is now located at 16th and Maple Coffeyville, Kansas.
- Fairview-- is now located at the corner of Cline Road and Woodland Ave., Coffeyville, Kansas. It should be noted that there are two cemeteries adjoining each other. The one on the East being Restlawn and the one on the West being Fairview.
- Hickory or Hickory Creek -- go South of Coffeyville to Wann Road and turn East for a short ways.
- Melton -- South on highway 169 abt. 2 miles South of South Coffeyville, Okla. Turn East go across bridge abt. 3/4 mile.
- Nation -- unable to determine location.
- Roberts -- E. on old highway 166 abt. 3 mi. East of River bridge to Rock Creek Church sign, South 2 mi., E. 1 mi.
- Robbins -- 52 miles West of Coffeyville on U.S. 166.
- Timber Hill -- 5 mi. West of Coffeyville, 5 mi. South

POND or POUND FAMILY

The name of POND or POUND is believed to be of Anglo Saxon origin and to have been taken by its original bearers at the time of the adoption of surnames in Great Britian because of their residence at or near a pond or pound. A pond or pound was anciently " an enclosure for strayed cattle", and the two forms of spelling were used interchangeably. Some etymologists have been led, mistakenly, to believe that the "pond" at which the original progenitors of the family resided was a pool, as in the modern usage, but the above given derivation is undoubtedly correct."

The following is one of the many family lines. This information was given out at a family reunion in 1965.

********* JOHN *******

John Pond, the first known ancestor of our line of the family is known to us positively by his name only. However, "to the Suffolk County line in England, one Pond, (Christian name unknown) was the father in the latter part of the sixteenth century to two sons, John and probably Robert, although the identity of the latter is not certain. These two brothers emigrated with Governor Winthrop in 1630". In that year, Samuel Pond, our first known ancestor in America, was born. The father of this Samuel was named John, and it is possible that the above mentioned John and he are identical.

******* SAMUEL *****

Samuel Pond, the second in our line was born in 1630 and died in 1665. He made his home in Windsor, Connecticut, and married Sarah (probably nee Ware). The children of Samuel were four as follows: (1) Isaac, (2) Samuel*, (3) Nathaniel (killed by the Indians in the Nargansett fight in the year 1675), (4) Sarah.

******** SAMUEL ******

Samuel Pond, II, the third in our line, was born in 1648 and died in 1718. He resided in Bradford, Connecticut, and married Miriam Blatchley or Blakeley, February 3, 1669. The names of their children were: (1) Nathaniel, (2) Abigail, (3) Samuel, (4) Josiah, (5) Lois, (6) Moses*, (7) Miriam, (8) Mindwell.

******** MOSES *****

Moses Pond, the fourth on our line was baptised in 1693, and died in 1747. He married Mary ? in Stanford, Conn. and left numerous issue in that place.

Gad Pond, the fifth in our line, was a twin to Asher. He was born in 1727 and died in 1791. He married Mary _ ? He was a physician in Wallingford, Connecticut in 1765. With his wife and children he moved in 1789 to Jewett, Greene County, New York and lived on what is now known as "the Adams place". He was the first physician in the Catskill Mountain region. He died about two years after coming to Jewett and his widow settles on the O.T. Bailey place. This place was owned by his descendants until about 1945. His children were ten as follows: (1) Luce, born in Wallingford, Conn. in 1753, (2) Althea, born in 1762, (3) Samuel, born in 1764 died unmarried, (4) Mary Sophia, born 1766, married Uri Cook, (5) Clara, born in 1767, (6) Moses, born 1770, moved to Ohio. His sons were Horace and Selden, (7) Aaron, born in January 1773, died of yellow fever in New York City. (8) Phineas, born 1776, moved to Ohio. His sons were Albert, Everett and oscar. (9) David was born in 1778, (10) Luther* was born in 1782, and died in 1858. For Gad see "Morant, County of Essex. Vol 1, 1778." Gad

Pond is officially mentioned in a list of practicing physicians in Wallingford, Connecticut before 1800. The book is in the Essex Institute in Salem, Massachusetts. The genealogy of Gad Pond and his descendants, to and including Aaron and his brothers and sisters, is recorded in the "Dedham Settler Book" Dedham, Mass. (Hill, Dedham Records, Vol 1, 1886). This is also recorded at the end of "A Genealogical Record of Samuel Pond" by D.S. P. Local History and Genealogy, Albany, N.Y.

******** LUTHER ******

Luther Pond, the sixth in our line was born in Wallingford, Conn. in 1782, and died there December 3, 1858. He married Martha Distin* (1789-1871). When he was about seven years old his family moved from Conn. He became a cloth manufacturer in Prattsville, New York. Later his mill burned and he worked in Mill Hollow. He afterward went to live with his mother (the widow of Gad Pond) in a log house on the mountain side above the "Bailey's place", (now Timberline). There he farmed. David Pond, Luther's son, continued to live on his father's farm and built the two story part of the house. David'S daughter Martha married O.T. Bailey, from whom the place took its name.

Martha Distin's father was Joseph Distin, who enlisted in the British Navy at the time of the Revolutionary War and fought at the Battle of Bunker's Hill. Soon after the battle he was taken prisoner by the Americans, As they had no prisons, he and others were boarded in the homes of American families.

Joseph and several other prisoners were boarded in the home of Amos Parker in Connecticut. After a time the British prisioners were exchanged, and Joseph and two others deserted the British Army and came back and married the three daughters of Amos Parker.

Joseph Distin settled in Conn., but his widow and children came to Jewett, New York. In the latter part of her life she lived with her son-in-law, Luther Pond and his wife, Martha Distin Pond, on the O.T. Bailey place.

Distin Pond, on the O.T. Bailey place.

The following story is told of Amos Parker, Jr., brother of Martha Distin Pond, by Emmons Pond, Martha's grandson:
When the British were at New York and the Americans were in Brooklyn, the British stockaded Blackwell's Island. They kept troubling the Americans by firing on them. LaFayette wished to take the stockade, and for that purpose picked a company of men, of which Amos Parker, Jr., was one. They went with muffled oars and loaded guns to the island. There was to be no shooting without orders, under penalty of death. Amos Parker, who was a very strong man, pulled up sufficient posts of the stockade for a man to squeeze through. As LaFayette went through, a sentry stood ready to stab him with his bayonet, but Parker took his gun and fired, killing the sentry. LaFayette took the fort, and needless to say, Parker was not

punished for shooting without orders.

In later years when LaFayette returned to this country Parker went to New York to see him. After pushing his way through the crowd our hero shook hands with LaFayette and asked if he remembered him. When LaFayette said "no" Parker mentioned the incident at Blackwell's Island. Realizing that this was the man who had saved his life there LaFayette threw his arms around Parker and wept.

Helen Pond remembers this story about Amos: "This Amos Parker used to visit Grandpa David Pond's mother (wife of Luther) and the children would coax him to show them his feet, and to tell them the story of how he lost parts of his toes because of marching over frozen ground without shoes when in the Pavalutionary Wer."

Aaron Pond the seventh in our line, was born in Jewett, Greene County, New York on May 15, 1809, and died there March 16, 1875. He lived in West Jewett, near Lexington, where he owned two farms. In 1858 he moved the old original house over the well, and built the permanant home. This later became the home of Judson Pond and his family.

Aaron was first married Nov, 15, 1836 to Eunice Chase. On February 18, 1838 he married Eunice's sister, Lucy Ann

Chase (for the Chase genealogy see pp. 40-46).

Aaron's will is recorded in the Surrogates office at Catskill, Greene county, New York and transfers of property (to and from him are recorded in the County Clerk's records at the Catskill Court House dating back to 1880 at which time Ulster County was divided and Greene County came into existence. Aaron's children were five as follows: (1) Dwight, (2) Sherlock, (3) Dorlon, (4) Judson*, (5) Eunice.

Judson Buck Pond, the eighth in our line was born in West Jewett, New York, August 29, 1850, and died at Jewett Heights, January 18, 1917. He is buried beside his father, Aaron, in the Jewett Heights Cemetery. September 21, 1871, he married Elnora Van Valkenburg. They lived on the Aaron Pond homestead and reared their family there. On October 20, 1898, he married Rosetta West (1853-1904), the adopted daughter of Perlina Pond West and William West and moved to Jewett Heights. On May 12, 1905 he married Mrs. Alice Lacy (1848-1920). Her maiden name was Alice W. Warner. Her first husband was Judson B. Lacey, son of Althea Pond Lacey. The children

of Judson and Elnora were three, as follows: (1) Eri*, (2) Herbert, (3) Adeline Louisa, April 13, 1880- October 1888.

***** ERI MINARD ******

Eri Minard Pond, the 1st son of Judson, was born in Jewett, New York, August 24, 1872. (The name "Minard" is that of his great grandfather on his mother's side: (Minard Van Valkenburg). On September 3, 1895, Eri married Minetta Irish, Minetta Irish was born 12 Nov. 1874 in Wittenberg, Ulster county, N.Y. She is the daughter of Joseph Talmadge Irish and Harriett Berthina Reynolds.
