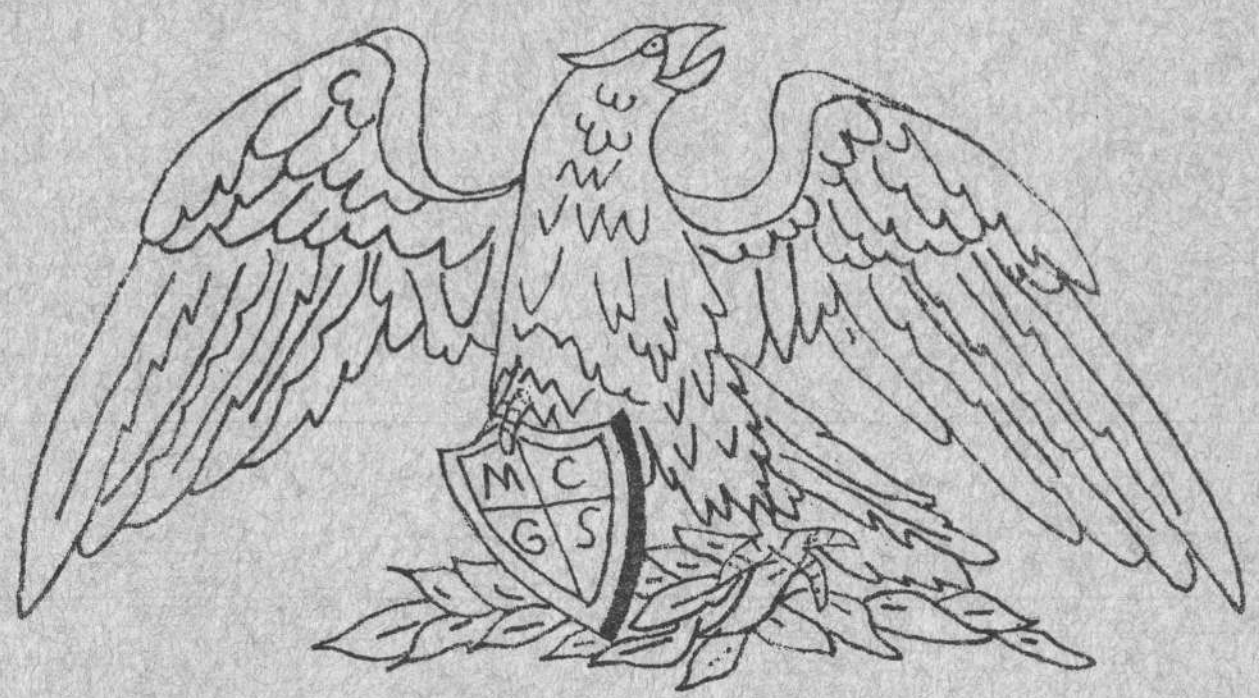

PETER HEINZE

(Compiled by Esther L. Miller, grand-daughter,

PETER HEINZE was born of German parents in the village of Dreispitz, State of Saratov, Russia, in the German Volga Colonies, on 15 July 1854. His father was Johann Friederich Heinze, Doctor, born about 1804. His mother was Eva Elizabeth Langhofer, born about 1808; she died age 91 or 92. Both parents, sister Sophia, and brothers Andrew and Gottfried were buried in Russia.

Sisters and brothers of Peter Heinze are: Sabina Elizabeth, born 1830; Maria Katherine, b. 1831; Andrew, b.--; Gottfried, b. 1836; Sophia, b. 1839; Reinhardt, b. 1840; David "King Dave", b. 1848; Katarina Elizabeth, b. 1852

EMIGRATION FROM VOLGA RIVER TO PLAINS OF KANSAS

Passport (Reise Pass) issued in City of Saratov, Russia, Sept. 20, 1875. This was to allow him to go to America freely without any interference on tour. It was signed by Gouverneur Galkin-Wrasky Sept. 30, 1875 (day of departure). It was made in three languages: French, German, and Russian. (Fred Heinze, Greensburg, Ks., has original book.)

Peter Heinze and his nephew, Peter Steinle, came together on the long voyage....imagine them coming to a strange country they knew nothing about; neither of them knew one word of English! They settled in Marion and Dickinson Counties, near Peabody and Marion.

FIRST JOB, FIRST WIFE, FIRST CHILD

According to my father (David Henry "Twin-Dave" Heinze) Peter worked in a flour mill at Enterprise, Kansas. He met and married Juliana C. Weber on 12 Nov 1877, Dickinson Co., Ks. R.N. Smith, Judge of the Probate Court, Abilene, affixed his seal. A.R. Darling, J.P. joined couple in marriage at residence of D.H. Heilman. (Dickinson Co., Gen. Soc.) Ks. Marriage Records of 1861 - Book A - Page 10). (Courtesy Kans. Soc.)

Their first daughter, Lydia, was born 1 Dec 1878; died 9 Dec. 1878. Their son, Carl, was born 13 Nov 1879, thirteen miles south of Wilson, Ks., (Ellsworth Co.) (Letter: Louella Heinze Steinle, Santa Ana, Calif.)

After a continuous battle against the pioneer hardships of this country he made a home for himself and family 2½ miles south of Dorrance, Ks., where he resided until his death.

NATURALIZATION: Russell County, Ks.

(Certificate of Copy, Clerk of Dist. Court, Vol. B, Page 46)

On 4 Nov 1887 Peter Heinze produced a certificate of his intention to become a Citizen of the United States, issued by the Clerk of the 14th Judicial Court of Kansas. On the 17 day of September, 1901, he received his papers of Citizenship signed by Lee Monroe, Judge of the 23rd Judicial District, State of Kansas.

PREACHER

Witnesses: Alois Kochenfoerfer, Gottfried Langhofer, David Langhofer; Paper indoctrinating Peter Heinze as a preacher, giving him privilege of joining in matrimony and all duties of church performance. Services were held in home south of Dorrance, Ks. (Paper held by Lydia Heinze, Denver, Col)

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 43,461, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office:

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Isaac Clover was enrolled on the 9th day of Oct., 1861, at Newport, Ind. in Co. "I" 43rd Regiment of Indiana Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Corporal on the 9th day of Oct. 1861, at Newport Ind, in Co. "I", 43rd Regiment, of Indiana Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "I" of that Regiment, for the months of Nov. Dec. 1861; Jan. & Feb. (4 months muster) 1862, he is reported "Died at South Carrollton, Ky., Jan. 26, 1862". Cause of death not stated.

To the Honorable Commissioner of Pensions:

I, William A. Hays, Guardian of Mrs. Hannah Clover (insane widow of Isaac Clover) which said Hannah Clover is a Pensioner under Pension Certificate numbered 180088, hereby apply for arrears due to said Pensioner on her own account and also on account of Lucy Clover, a minor heir of said Isaac for whom I am also guardian and who was until June 13th 1875 a Pensioner under the same certificate and whose right to such pension expired on that date by reason of her arrival at the age of 16 years. This application is made under the provisions of an Act of Congress approval January 25th 1879. My Post office address is at Clinton in the County of Vermillion and State of Indiana.

On this 14th day of January A. D. 1864, personally appearing before me, William E. Linengood, Clerk of the Circuit Court within and for said Co. and state aforesaid, John J. Martin, a resident of the County of Vermillion and State of Indiana who being duly sworn upon his oath according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of a provision made by the act of Congress approved July 14, 1862, That he is the Guardian of Hannah Glover, who is now insane and incapable of managing her own affairs. And he further states that the said Hannah Glover is the widow of Isaac Glover who was a private in Company I commanded Captain Samuel J. HEART ATTACK FATAL to Mrs. De Coster

Heart attack last night (Tuesday, May 19, 1931) proved fatal to Mrs. Anais (Malfaire) De Coster, 67, wife of Theodore De Coster, at the family home, 501 S. 12th. She had been ill since December. When stricken shortly before 7 o'clock, physicians were summoned but she died before they arrived.

Born at Charleroi, Belgium, March 6, 1864, she came to the United States with her husband and family in 1895. They were married in 1884. An experienced glass worker, Mr. De Coster was first employed in Indiana. He brought his family to Kansas in 1904 and lived at Fredonia and Chanute before coming to Independence in 1910.

Mrs. De Coster had visited Belgium three times since coming to this country. Her last trip was made 25 years ago. The Battle of Waterloo was fought near Charleroi and members of the family said Mrs. De Coster's mother had to flee from her home during the engagement.

Besides the husband three children survive. They are: Fred E. De Coster, Amarillo, Tex, Theodore De Coster Jr., and Mrs. Julia Haines, both of Independence. Two brothers and two sisters also survive. One lives in Ohio while the others live in Belgium. Besides rearing her own family she reared three grand children, sons of her daughter Marie Anais (DeCoster) Pence who proceeded her mother in death in 1918.

Reverend Theodore Dunton, pastor of the First Christian Church, will have charge of the funeral services for Mrs. De Coster, which will be held tomorrow (Friday, May 22, 1931) at 2:30 at the Potts Chapel. Burial will be in Mt. Hope cemetery, Independence, Kans.
