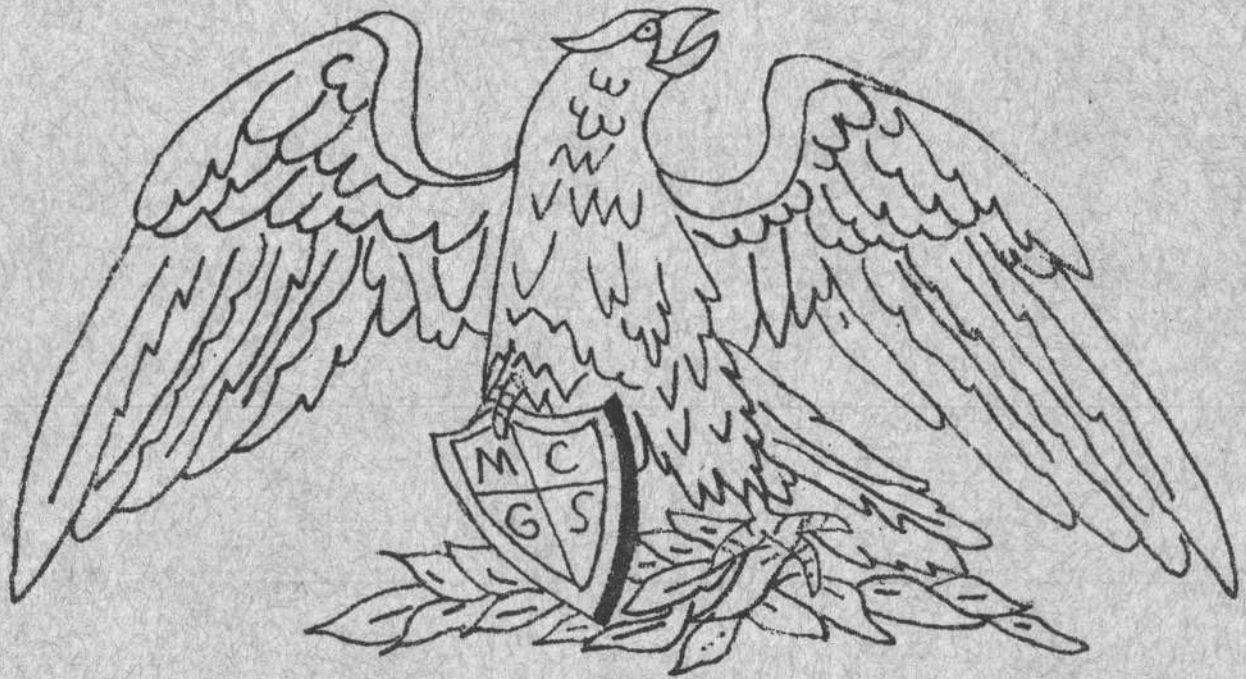

Theo G. De Coster Taken Suddenly

Theodore G. De Coster, 70, died suddenly of a heart seizure Thursday (Apr 5, 1934) afternoon at 2:30 at his home North of Independence, Ks. Mr. De Coster had been a resident of this city for the past 20 years or more.

Theodore G. De Coster was born Oct 6, 1863 in Belgium, where he lived for 30 years. He was married in Belgium to Anais Malfaire. In 1895 the De Coster family came to the U.S. and settled in Orestes, Ind., where Mr. De Coster was employed as a glass worker. The De Coster family spent nine years in Ind. and in 1902 moved to Chanute, Kans., where they lived for a short time before they moved to this city, where he was employed by the glass plant until about nine years ago, when he took a position as caretaker of the flowers at Riverside Park. Three children survive here, all of whom were born in Belgium.

Surviving relatives are: One daughter, Mrs. Julia Haines of this city; two sons, Theodore, also of this city and F.E. of Amarillo, Texas. Three grandsons also survive, two being of this city and one of Amarillo. The wife of the deceased preceded him in death May 19, 1931.

Funeral services will be held Sat. afternoon at 2:30 from the Potts Funeral Chapel with Rev. Harold Humbert, pastor of the Christian Church officiating. Burial will be in the family lot at Mount Hope Cemetery with the Potts Mortuary in charge.

STONE POSTS AND HAND-HEWN TROUTHS

Fences around the farm fields were made of "posts of stone". They were quite heavy to handle. The holes for the stone posts had to be dug by hand with a shovel. As much of the stonepost was in the ground as was used for the actual fence, to which barbed wire was attached.

Hand-hewn troughs were made from short pieces of rock. They were used to water the chickens and other farm animals

Charles C. Howes, author of: "THIS PLACE CALLED KANSAS" states: "German-Russian settlers in Ellis, Rush, Russell, and nearby counties are said to have been the first to use stone fence posts. In most instances these farmers, who were generally living in sod shanties or dugouts, were too poor to buy wooden posts. The stone fence-post has also been used extensively in the region in public buildings, county courthouses, city halls, churches, and many business structures....The Kansas Geological Survey calculated the value of the stone fence posts in Ness and Hodgeman counties to exceed \$750,000.00. The value of the stone used in public buildings, business structures, and residences exceeded a million dollars.
