





I, Samuel Richardson of the County of Cole and State of Missouri, being in good health of body and sound mind and memory praised be God for the same and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs whilst I have strength and capacity so to do do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofor made and first and principally I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God my Creator who gave it, hoping for a free pardon and remission of all my sins and to enjoy everlasting happiness in his heavenly kingdom through Jesus Christ my Savior, my body I comit to the Earth at the discretion of my friends

Item 1st \_\_\_\_\_ my just debts be paid

2nd. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, Mary, during her widowhood all the improved land or the benefits thereof on my home tract. Also, I give her fifty acres of land on the Osage to dispose of as she may think proper, joining Brows. Also all farming utensils and household and kitchen furniture together with four head of horses and all the home stock.

3rd. I give and bequeath unto my son James Monroe Richardson all the tract of land on the Osage where he now lives.

4th. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Jane Todd and her heirs one hundred and twenty acres of land whereon she now lives.

5th. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Williams five dollars.

6th. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarahan five dollars.

MEMORANDUM OF HENRY SHIBLEY, VANBUREN, ARKANSAS (Continued from Vol. III No. 3)

Nov. 24. Jop took me through quite a snow storm to the railroad at Noving, got aboard the freight train and went to Kirksville. Found brother George there. (Visited with) John T. Smith and Howard Sheeks.

Nev. 25. Went with sister Sarah te Thanksgiving dinner, met with my eld friend Othe Beeman.

Nev. 26. Called an William F. Smith and Mrs. Ivie. Late in the evening went by train to Sublet, 10 miles north of Kirksville. Walked a mile and a quarter to John Eleys, (then) walked over to David Elys (father). He took delight in telling ethers that forty years age last August we came together with others to look at this country and in the October following we moved to the westside of the Chariton River before Adair County was organised, and that upward of twenty years age I moved to Arkansas. (Talks about David Eleys farm, building, cheese factory and stock, etc. Eley described his well he had just completed. Will bring this description from page 37 of the original diary.)

I have before spoken of David Elys woll. It seems that is remarkable enough to be noted down here as he told it to me. He dug forty feet through joint clay and struck a drift of sand and clay in which he found all kinds of timber and brush that grow in that country with leaves, acorn, hickory nuts, hazel nuts, schumack berries, firecoals, one piece of cedar wood and some traces of mineral.

He dug in the drift seventy five feet then walled the well up. It was then one hundred and ten feet. He then bared seventy five feet and struck water, the last four er five feet of baring the auger settled down af its own weight. The water rushed up the bared hele about fifty feet but the hele filled with sand. So after going in all 185 feet for water he had failed to get a supply from the bettem of the well. He has not given up.

Nev. 27 & 28 & 29. Back to Kirksville. Called on Celey Thacher. He furnished me a herse and we rede out to Bear Creek about four miles to William H. Parcells.

Nov. 30. The morning was so cold that we both walked and led our horses all the way to Kirksville. Met there Isaac Herrington. After dinner with sister I rede with her to Jeseph Brashers and his wifes.

Dec. 1st. I am sixty five years ald teday. Wrete letters. Went in the evening to A. D. Hickmans.

Dec. 2nd. "Deck" (A.D.) dreve me ever te Blackbird te see Ben and David Beyd. They are living en their fathers eld place.

Dec. 3. Went to Gabe Vansickels, mot there Frederick Miller one of my first acquaintances when I first moved to Chariton. He told of the death of Even Mulinix. He also told us that Preston Mulinix. Took a walk across the creek, took a look at my old place where I first settled on coming

to the country in the fall of 1840 and where our second son was bern. (Dr. Ine Samuel Shibley)

Dec. 4. At my sisters, this time I took a memorandum of their family. Alexandri Davenpert Hickman and Cyrona his wife have three children - John Reyal Charles age 17, Armenta aged 7, and age 4. They have lest seven. Went to Isaac Cernfields.

Dec. 5. Teek dinner at Jeseph Hickmans.

Doc. 6. John and I went to George Seamans, he married a granddaughter of Peter Brownelle. Met David Pickens, sent by me his kind regards to James Waters. After dinner went to Lewis Waters. They have 7 children.

Dec. 7. After dinner passed on to Kirksville and met Andy Linder on the street. Went on to Kenedy Owenbys. His son in law William Herron. Wont to Cal Owenbys he received us with old fashioned hospitality.

Dec. 8th. Traveled semething ever ten miles - Rawsen Ceeks. Stepped at Wm. Parcells to warm, saw the remains of twentyone half grown chickens frozen to death a night or two before.

Dec. 9. Thermemeter 10<sup>6</sup> belew zere. Cook and his wife insisted that we should stay. After leaving Cooks we drave five or six miles to A. L. Gibbs.

Dec. 10. Returned to Kirksville and spend some time with Dick Ringe at his bank.

Dec. 11. Called with Nathaniel Billingtens, returned to Kirksville took dinner with my sister Sarah Burns.

Dec. 12. Went with John and Rachel to Henry Capps on Spring Creek. John, Rachel, Capps and his wife went ever to W. J. Sandrys a sen in law of Capps, then to Johns after returning Capp & wife.

Dec. John and I went to Newton Hatfields - not at home - saw his wife, my niece Emely Melvine. Went on to Hiram Hatfields a brother of Newtons who married another niece of mine Martha Boyd. In the evening went to Jessee Whitworths, his wife is another niece Margaret Edna.

Dec. 18. The whele face of the country was covered with ice. We had designed in this trip to have visited old lady Burns and her daughter Rachel and also George Ledford and others but it was so slippery we concluded to return heme.

Dec. 21. After biding the felks goodbye brother John teek me ever to Jep Sibeles - he was net at home - talked with his wife Pheby and went on to Weltha Sheeps. After dinner John bid me goodbye and returned home. This was the last farewell of relatives of the Shariton river. I then and at other times realised in some degree how hard and (I new believe) unwise it is for relatives to be parted. But thanks to our medern improvements the cruel distances that

heretefere interveined between distant friends is very much everceme by our railreads and pestal facilities. Wealtha's sen Jehn Sheep. (Tells of Jehn Sheeps very good farm). Enjeyed my self with Philip and his wife whe he thinks is a relative of ours on my fathers side. Her name was Shents, the maiden mame of my grandmether Shibley.

Dec. 22. We were up early and Philip teak me to the railread. Get abord the train and in a few minutes was in Kirksville.

Dec. 23. My good brother and sister were up by time and had breakfast ever in time te accempany me te the depet to take the train for visit Quincy on my way to Ralls County, at about 8 AM the train arrived but my brother George Shibley was not abord so I had to bid my friends farewell and start my journey alone, I felt semewhat dis-appointed and a little lonesome. A little before 12 m arrived at West Quincy. The train for Hannibal had not yet started but from the wreng statuent of a passenger I missed the passenger train. Had to wait about an hour for a freight train and get to Hannibal between 2 & 3 PM. Hannibal has impreved quite censiderably since I used to be acquainted there, has developed one of the largest lumber markets above St. Louis. About 3:30 PM took short line train for New London - arrived about 4 PM - was teld that if I had been an hour seener I could get a waggen to our eld neighborheed but that the waggen for the day had gone. Put up at a hetel acress the street south of the courthouse - very kind. A Mr Brown played the vielin quite well. Played the Arkansas Traveler for me and introsted me in telling about the

eld time citizens I used to knew more than forty years age. Dec. 24. Looked about for conveyance to my brother in law Singleton Boyd. Wanted to write back to Adair and home on going to the Post Office the Postmaster told me that he had not a postal card nor a sheet of paper in the house.

On looking about town thought New London had improved but little in the last forty years. Guess it is about dead.

About cleven ocleck I found a man with waggen going within two miles of my brother in laws. He was very kind and charged me nothing for my ride. I have forgetten his name but not his kindness.

Between 2 & 3 PM arrived at Singletens, found all well except John Beyds baby. It was quite sick with the measles. John lives at his father's in a part of the house. I went there first - his mether came in and knew me - his father could not place me and could not call my name.

Dec. 25. Christmas. Spent the day at Singletons. During the evening several members called to see me.

Dec. 26. This was Sunday - during the evening went

te Richard I Beyds about twe hundred yards distant from his fathers. At night Dick and his family went with me to Grim Leeks - took supper - went heme with Dick.

Dec. 27. Dick and family with Singleton ~ Nancy went with me to Jasons, Jason lives on Singleton's old place. Back to Singletons.

Dec. 28. Nancy gave me a memorandum of their family. Singleten Wilmere Beyd was bern 26 April 1810. Nancy Ellis bern 21st August 1811. They were married 9th Aug 1835. William Themas was bern Sept 25 1837, married Abby Simmens March 12 1861. They have several children, 5 sens and five daughters. 1 dau married, eldest sen grewn. John Wasen bern July 25 1839 had three children had three children by this marriage, Ida May Anna Belle and George Edward. Married second wife Aug 1879, one child Jessie S. (died while I was there Jan 1st). Jasen Lee bern March 10 1841 married 1866, have three daughters, Nera, Margaret Belle and Carie Ed.a. Richard I bern Apr 1, 1843 married July 8 1866 Ceres (Yeres) daughter a niece of George Shibleys wife, they have two sons 10 to 12 years old and one daughter, a small child think they have lest some children. The childrens names are William Elmers James Perry, and Blythe Viela. In the evening Singleten went with me to Enoch Hendrix about 3/4 of a mile and I stayed slept in the room that grandma died in just one year ago, ago 91 years lacking 19 days.

Dec. 29. The celdest yet 20° to 25° belew zere. Teek memerandum of Enoch's family. Enoch Hondrix was born May 4, 1817. Angeline Beyd was born Nev 6, 1822, married Dec. 24, 1844. John Harrison 30th Nev 1845 been married 12 yrs have five children, one dead, living three sens and one daughter. William Themas, aged 32 yrs been married ten years have four sens. Willis E. age 26, been married ten years, have 1 sen and 1 dau. Mary Emeline, age 20 years the 25th of Aug 1880. Leura Belle 17 yrs the 9th of last June, married Daniel B.
