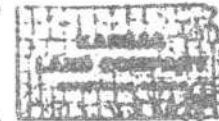

MEMORANDUM OF HENRY SHIBLEY, VANBUREN, ARKANSAS
(Continued from Vol. III No. 3)

Nov. 24. Jop took me through quite a snow storm to the railroad at Neving, got aboard the freight train and went to Kirksville. Found brother George there. (Visited with) Jehn T. Smith and Howard Sheeks.

Nov. 25. Went with sister Sarah to Thanksgiving dinner, met with my old friend Othe Beeman.

Nov. 26. Called on William F. Smith and Mrs. Ivie. Late in the evening went by train to Sublet, 10 miles north of Kirksville. Walked a mile and a quarter to Jehn Eleys, (then) walked over to David Elys (father). He took delight in telling others that forty years ago last August we came together with others to look at this country and in the October following we moved to the westside of the Chariten River before Adair County was organized, and that upward of twenty years ago I moved to Arkansas. (Talks about David Eleys farm, building, cheese factory and stock, etc. Eley described his well he had just completed. Will bring this description from page 37 of the original diary.)

I have before spoken of David Elys well. It seems that is remarkable enough to be noted down here as he told it to me. He dug forty feet through joint clay and struck a drift of sand and clay in which he found all kinds of timber and brush that grew in that country with leaves, acorn, hickory nuts, hazel nuts, schumack berries, fireseals, one piece of cedar wood and some traces of mineral.

He dug in the drift seventy five feet then walled the well up. It was then one hundred and ten feet. He then bored seventy five feet and struck water, the last four or five feet of boring the auger settled down of its own weight. The water rushed up the bored hole about fifty feet but the hole filled with sand. So after going in all 185 feet for water he had failed to get a supply from the bottom of the well. He has not given up.

Nov. 27 & 28 & 29. Back to Kirksville. Called on Coley Thacher. He furnished me a horse and we rode out to Bear Creek about four miles to William H. Parcells.

Nov. 30. The morning was so cold that we both walked and led our horses all the way to Kirksville. Met there Isaac Herrington. After dinner with sister I rode with her to Joseph Brashers and his wives.

Dec. 1st. I am sixty five years old today. Wrote letters. Went in the evening to A. D. Hickmans.

Dec. 2nd. "Deck" (A.D.) drove me over to Blackbird to see Ben and David Boyd. They are living on their fathers old place.

Dec. 3. Went to Gabe Vansickels, met there Frederick Miller one of my first acquaintances when I first moved to Chariten. He told of the death of Even Mulinix. He also told us that Presten Mulinix. Took a walk across the creek, took a look at my old place where I first settled on coming

to the country in the fall of 1840 and where our second son was born. (Dr. Jno Samuel Shibley)

Dec. 4. At my sisters, this time I took a memorandum of their family. Alexandri Davenport Hickman and Cyrena his wife have three children - Jehn Royal Charles age 17, Armenta aged 7, and age 4. They have lost seven. Went to Isaac Cernfields.

Dec. 5. Took dinner at Joseph Hickmans.

Dec. 6. Jehn and I went to George Seamans, he married a granddaughter of Peter Brownelle. Met David Pickens, sent by me his kind regards to James Waters. After dinner went to Lewis Waters. They have 7 children.

Dec. 7. After dinner passed on to Kirksville and met Andy Linder on the street. Went on to Kenedy Owenbys. His son in law William Herren. Went to Cal Owenbys he received us with old fashioned hospitality.

Dec. 8th. Traveled something over ten miles - Rawson Coeks. Stopped at Wm. Parcells to warm, saw the remains of twentyone half grown chickens frozen to death a night or two before.

Dec. 9. Thermometer 10° below zero. Coek and his wife insisted that we should stay. After leaving Coeks we drove five or six miles to A. L. Gibbs.

Dec. 10. Returned to Kirksville and spend some time with Dick Ringe at his bank.

Dec. 11. Called with Nathaniel Billingtons, returned to Kirksville took dinner with my sister Sarah Burns.

Dec. 12. Went with Jehn and Rachel to Henry Capps on Spring Creek. Jehn, Rachel, Capps and his wife went over to W. J. Sandrys a son in law of Capps, then to Jehns after returning Capp & wife.

Dec. Jehn and I went to Newton Hatfields - not at home - saw his wife, my niece Emely Melvins. Went on to Hiram Hatfields a brother of Newtons who married another niece of mine Martha Boyd. In the evening went to Jesse Whitwerths, his wife is another niece Margaret Edna.

Dec. 18. The whole face of the country was covered with ice. We had designed in this trip to have visited old lady Burns and her daughter Rachel and also George Ledford and others but it was so slippery we concluded to return home.

Dec. 21. After bidding the folks goodbye brether Jehn took me over to Jep Sibeles - he was not at home - talked with his wife Pheby and went on to Weltha Sheeps. After dinner Jehn bid me goodbye and returned home. This was the last farewell of relatives of the Shariten river. I then and at other times realised in some degree how hard and (I now believe) unwise it is for relatives to be parted. But thanks to our modern improvements the cruel distances that

heretofore interveined between distant friends is very much overcome by our railroads and postal facilities. Wealtha's son Jehn Sheep. (Tells of Jehn Sheeps very good farm). Enjoyed my self with Philip and his wife who he thinks is a relative of ours on my fathers side. Her name was Shents, the maiden name of my grandmother Shibley.

Dec. 22. We were up early and Philip took me to the railroad. Got aboard the train and in a few minutes was in Kirksville.

Dec. 23. My good brother and sister were up by time and had breakfast ever in time to accompany me to the depot to take the train for visit Quincy on my way to Ralls County, at about 8 AM the train arrived but my brother George Shibley was not aboard so I had to bid my friends farewell and start my journey alone, I felt somewhat disappointed and a little lonesome. A little before 12 m arrived at West Quincy. The train for Hannibal had not yet started but from the wrong statement of a passenger I missed the passenger train. Had to wait about an hour for a freight train and get to Hannibal between 2 & 3 PM. Hannibal has improved quite considerably since I used to be acquainted there, has developed one of the largest lumber markets above St. Louis. About 3:30 PM took short line train for New Lenden - arrived about 4 PM - was told that if I had been an hour sooner I could get a wagon to our old neighborhood but that the wagon for the day had gone. Put up at a hotel across the street south of the courthouse - very kind. A Mr Brown played the violin quite well. Played the Arkansas Traveler for me and interested me in telling about the old time citizens I used to know more than forty years ago.

Dec. 24. Looked about for conveyance to my brother in law Singleton Boyd. Wanted to write back to Adair and home on going to the Post Office the Postmaster told me that he had not a postal card nor a sheet of paper in the house.

On looking about town thought New Lenden had improved but little in the last forty years. Guess it is about dead.

About eleven o'clock I found a man with wagon going within two miles of my brother in laws. He was very kind and charged me nothing for my ride. I have forgotten his name but not his kindness.

Between 2 & 3 PM arrived at Singletons, found all well except Jehn Boyds baby. It was quite sick with the measles. Jehn lives at his father's in a part of the house. I went there first - his mother came in and knew me - his father could not place me and could not call my name.

Dec. 25. Christmas. Spent the day at Singletons. During the evening several members called to see me.

Dec. 26. This was Sunday - during the evening went

to Richard I Beyds about two hundred yards distant from his fathers. At night Dick and his family went with me to Grim Leeks - took supper - went home with Dick.

Dec. 27. Dick and family with Singleten - Nancy went with me to Jasens, Jason lives on Singleten's old place. Back to Singletens.

Dec. 28. Nancy gave me a memorandum of their family. Singleten Wilmore Beyd was born 26 April 1810. Nancy Ellis born 21st August 1811. They were married 9th Aug 1835. William Thomas was born Sept 25 1837, married Abby Simmens March 12 1861. They have several children, 5 sons and five daughters, 1 dau married, eldest son grown. John Wasen born July 25 1839 had three children had three children by this marriage, Ida May Anna Belle and George Edward. Married second wife Aug 1879, one child Jessie S. (died while I was there Jan 1st). Jason Lee born March 10 1841 married 1866, have three daughters, Nera, Margaret Belle and Carrie Ed. a. Richard I born Apr 1, 1843 married July 8 1866 Geres (Yeres) daughter a niece of George Shibleys wife, they have two sons 10 to 12 years old and one daughter, a small child think they have lost some children. The childrens names are William Elmer, James Perry, and Blythe Viola. In the evening Singleten went with me to Enech Hendrix about 3/4 of a mile and I stayed slept in the room that grandpa died in just one year ago, age 91 years lacking 19 days.

Dec. 29. The coldest yet 20° to 25° below zero. Took memorandum of Enech's family. Enech Hendrix was born May 4, 1817. Angeline Beyd was born Nov 6, 1822, married Dec. 24, 1844. John Harrison 30th Nov 1845 been married 12 yrs have five children, one dead, living three sons and one daughter. William Thomas, aged 32 yrs been married ten years have four sons. Willis E. age 26, been married six years, have 1 son and 1 dau. Mary Emeline, age 20 years the 25th of Aug 1880. Laura Belle 17 yrs the 9th of last June, married Daniel B. Nutgrass the 16th of January 1878, one son born the 18th of May 1880. Went to Singletens and stayed over night.

Dec. 30. Still extremely cold. In the evening went over to James Hultz, he is one of our neighbors that we get acquainted with when we first moved to the county in the winter of 1835 and 6. Living on the same place he did then - is in his 81st year.

Dec. 31st. Hardly so cold this morning - went over to Enech's then to Singletens, found Johns baby worse and returned to Enechs. In the evening Daniel Nutgrass kindly took me in his sleigh to Uncle Richard Brashers. Aunt Emily knew me but Uncle Dick failed to until he was told.
