


PERSISTENT FAMILY TREE HUNTERS DISCOVER

NEGLECTED AREA CEMETERY

BARTLETT - Sometimes you really have to dig for lost family tree roots. Last fall Melvin and Marian Chambers of Coffeyville found that was the only way to read the inscriptions on tombstones found in a small cemetery two miles north and a mile and a half east of here on the Wayne Banzet farm.

After seeking permission to get to the graveyard, they found it hidden from view in a thicket of yucca and cedar. All the stones lay flat on the ground where they had fallen years before and most were completely covered by top soil.

After uncovering several stones and recording the inscriptions, the couple found what they had been looking for: the graves of Marian's great-grandparents, William and Salome Kreighbaum, early day settlers of the Bartlett area.

Avid genealogical hunters, both Marian and her husband are active members of the Montgomery County Genealogical Society of Coffeyville and have spent much time in gathering information on the Dreitzler family of Bartlett.

She is the daughter of the late Clyde and Edity (Anthon) Dreitzler, and the granddaughter of Frederick Anthon and Jacob Dreitzler. Her great-grandfather, Jacob H. Dreitzler who settled in Hackberry township in 1883, has presented quite a problem in her family research and she needs more complete information on his origin which may be in Ohio.

On July 5, 1887 the Board of Commissioners of Montgomery County granted the petition for incorporation of Caney as a city of the third class. There were about 250 inhabitants of the town, the required number for the incorporation.

Actually, the town had been in existence for 17 years, but it had never had any governmental body. The initial beginning of the town, as such, was the filing for a record of the "Cana Original Plat" on March 15, 1872 by the Cana Town Company, organized by O.M. Smith, Berryman Smith, J. E. Stone, J. G. Woodruff and Jasper West.

A second effort was made and a new town company was organized in 1883 and was called the "Caney Town Company" and the "Caney Original Plat" composed of the sixteen blocks centered on State Street and Fourth Avenue. Prior to this, there had been some controversy over the naming of the town. The Cana had been dropped when the Post Office was established on May 16, 1870, but later some wanted to change it to Taylorville in honor of Dr. Taylor, but he politely refused the honor. Another faction wanted to call it Caneyville and some old documents show it thusly. However, after filing of the new plat, the permanent name of Caney was established.

With the coming of the railroad, the town began a rapid growth. The First Addition composed of 39 blocks were plated in 1887. The expanding population warranted the incorporation of the town a few months later.

The County Commissioners granting incorporation were John Costello, Thomas M. Beily and George Foster. They ordered an election be held on July 18, 1887 and appointed John Todd, A. M. Taylor and P. C. Dosh to act as judges and W. K. Godden, D. K. Mitchell and A. Pattison clerks.

On the appointed day two tickets appeared in the field, the "People's" and the "Compromising."

The successful candidated, and the first city officers were: Mayor, P. S. Hollingsworth: Councilman, J. A. Summers, H. V. Wiltsie, W. B. McWilliams, J. J. Hemphill and W. E. Rogers: Police Judge, F. H. Hooker: Treasurer, D. K. Mitchell. The first city clerk appointed was F. G. Dye and the first street commissioner and city marshal, W. V. Toner. On Sept. 26, 1887 the first 16 ordinances were approved and became effective on Oct. 28.

The town continued to grow under the direction of these men and others that followed them in successive elections. Through the succeeding years the City records show some items of interest.

In 1889, P. S. Hollingsworth was elected mayor and Pattison, Todd, Cranor, Skinner and Summers were councilmen. Marshal G. W Smire received a salary of \$25 per month. Dogs seemed to be a problem even in those days and the marshal was paid 50¢ each for each unlicensed dog he shot. Sidewalks were being built throughout the city and C. J. Reynolds, the city clerk, was paid the sum of \$6,25 for three months' services.

-continued

In 1891, P. S. Hollingsworth was elected mayor with Skinner, Reynolds, Blivins, Dye and Shultz serving as councilmen. These fine gentlemen raised the marshal's salary to \$28 per month.

In 1892, J. L. Schooley became mayor after a tight race with J. E. Stone, 146 voted to 138 votes.

E. B. Skinner became mayor in 1893 and Sheridan, Bergman, Truskett and Green councilmen. S. H. Barr was elected city attorney and the city was paying the amount of \$4 per month to Reynolds for use of the Booker Building as a City Hall. The city fathers became quite benevolent and paid out \$3.40 for merchandise to be given to the poor.

In 1894, J. E. Stone was again beaten in the elections and John Todd became mayor. Jarvis, Smith, Ridgeway, Sheridan and Truskett became councilmen and G. W. Purcell, city attorney, with J. W. Minner, city clerk.

The city marshal, S. A. Wilson, was back to a salary of $\notin 25$ per month. On Nov. 16 R. D. Kellog was granted exclusive rights to the use of all streets, alleys, roads and public grounds to furnish gas to the citizens of the city.

In 1895, John Todd lost the election to T. W. Truskett and Smith, Connelly, Shultz, Booth and Skinner were elected councilmen. Skinner was also appointed city clerk.

For improvements of streets the city paid \$15.50 for a road plow. On Aug. 29 a contract was let to the Howe Pump and Engine Company to start a waterworks project. This same year the City Volunteer Fire Department was organized.

The next year, 1896, D. N: Plowman was appointed fire chief and equipment was purchased. Skinner was re-elected mayor with Todd, Booth, Wellman, Meeker and Garlinghouse, councilmen.

BILLS ALLOWED

April 3, 1995, bills allowed included: G. B. Atwood for road olow, \$15,50; A. M. Parsons, printing, \$7.00; Crane & Co., poll books, 50 cents; Jesse Orr, street work, \$5.00; W. A. Barr, clerk at election, \$2.00; John Luppy, salary as marshal, \$25.00; G. W. Purcell, rent, \$4.00; James Thomas, sexton, \$3.25; Caney Chronicle, printing, \$1.00.

Bible of John F. Clossen of Liberty, Kansas and Ella M. Hughs of Liberty, Kansas

Married at Independence, Kansas, 8 August 1883 by Thomas Harrison, Probate Judge.

John Franklin Clossen was born in Muskingum Cty., Ohio on 25 April 1858.

Ella May Clossen was born in Bond Cty, Illinois on 5 February 1865.

Roy Hughs Clossen was born in Liberty, Montgomery Cty, Ks on 6 June 1885.

OBITUARY OF JOHN F. CLOSSEN.

Funeral services for John F. Clossen, for 57 years a merchant of Coffeyville, were held Wednesday afternoon from the Skinner chapel, with Dr. C. I. Coldsmith, of the First Methodist church officiating, and burial was in the Fairview cemetery, with the A.F.& A.M. conducting the Masonic ritual service at the graveside.

John Franklin Clossen was born in Zanesville, Ohio, April 25, 1857 and was in his 89th year. Until a few months ago he was in active charge of his grocery and queensware store at 809 Union where the business was launched 47 years ago, under the firm name of Clossen and Luken. Harvey H. Luken being the other member of the firm. When Mr. Luken died 16 years ago, Mr. Clossen conducted the business. When illness caused him to remain at home the past several months the business was in charge of his brother Cal M. Clossen.

Mr. Clossen died at his home 502 Elm, Monday night. When he built his residence it was in Parker township, and separate from the city limits by a pasture, extending to about Elm and Eighth street. From Ohio Mr. Clossen located at Liberty about 65 years ago, and on August 8, 1883 he was married to Miss Ella May Hughes. She died in November, 1934. The Clossen's left Liberty and moved to Morehead, where he was placed in charge of the Farmers Store. Later this store was moved to Coffeyville, and Mr. Clossen was transferred here as manager. Later he was identified with the firm of Boswell & Company, and was also manager of one of the Barndollar stores. In 1898 the firm of Clossen & Luken was organized, and continued as such until Mr. Lukin's death.

On Mr. Clossen's birthday in 1939 he was the honoree guest at a dinner given him by the officers and directors of the First National Bank. He had been a customer of the bank since its establishment, starting with the first president, Thos. G. Ayres. At this event he was given an enlarged portrait of himself, and in his acceptance gave a reminescing talk on many early day events in Coffeyville.

He was a member of the First M.E. Church and for 40 years was the Church Treasurer, and was also one of its trustees.

He also held memberships in the A.F.& A.M. and the Order of the Eastern Star.

In early day municipal affairs he served as city councilman, being designated city treasurer of the Board of Education.

In addition to the brother mentioned other survivors are Roy H. and Oren F., sons, who reside at 504 and 502 Elm, respectively.

The material from the Clossen Family Bible was given by the courtesy of Mrs. Roy H. Clossen.

The Obituary was taken from "The Coffeyville Leader" Coffeyville, Kansas, Thursday, November 22, 1945. A weekly paper published every Thursday by Roy Benedict Editor and Owner.

This paper is no longer in existance.

The Montgomery County Genealogical Society is fortunate to have such a dedicated member as Mrs. May Wiley Pond who has donated the noteworthy family history for the benefit of area researchers.

In the introduction Mrs. Pond states "This is a meet your grandparents book". But, it is much, much more. The introduction itself sets the stage for the charts and records with the description of the forebearers as they become flesh and blood and not statistics in a chart.

The whole book is well organized and documented with sources for deeper study; photographs; photostats of official records and costs of arms.

Included in the charts are excerpts from histories, encyclopedias and first hand biographies of ancestors named in immediately preceeding pedigrees or family sheets. This arrangement makes for quicker identification, being placed where it is relevant to the group rather than in a separate biography section.

One of the marks of the scholarly handling of this work is the five page index giving all the names of the heads of households and their wives is children are mentioned.
