CHERRYVALE, KANSAS

Cherryvale - so named because of the pleasant abundance of wild cherry trees along the creeks and in the woods of the vicinity - came into existence because of a railroad in May, 1871. Its being, its growth, and its history all have been dramatically linked to the rise and fall of the railroad industry.

It is ironic that we note the continuance of this close association between the community and its railroads as in this, Cherryvale's Centennial year, almost to the day, we witness the departure of the last passenger train to leave our city on the last day of April, 1971 - one hundred years after a railroad designated the site for the city of Cherryvale. This is another important link in the chain of incidents etched into her history in this Centennial year.

Sturdy pioneers laid out the town, name its streets, formed its government and dedicated their lives to its growth and prosperity. Located on the Osage Mission - Independence Trail, a winding, beaten path across Eastern Kansas, the village, equipped with public wells and watering troughs soon became a welcome stopping point for weary travelers in covered wagons immigrating to Indian territory in the state of Texas.

Springing up from the Kansas prairies, Cherryvale - the villagesuffered growing pains through the dust of dry days and mud of rainy spells and fashioned a community with a desire for better things.

From the dust and mud came board walks in the rapidly growing business section, a welcome relief for the lady shoppers in their long full skirts. Hitching posts and watering troughs were made available and were welcomed by the many cowboys who visited the town for grub and supplies. Those businesses supplying life's essentials were first established. Then came the entertainment centers, the churches, and the schools. Homes began to crowd the townsite, and industry crept into the growing city.

With the growth of industry came some of the accompanying problems. More money was available; more time for celebrating. Some of the old timers recall that the block north of Main Street on Neosho might have been the inspiration for Las Vega's Strip. It seems there was gambling, drinking, and maybe a house or two of ill repute along this path of perhaps no return.

The Labette-Montgomery County line, a mile east of Cherryvale, became notorious for some fabulous crap games on smelter paydays. Raids were not uncommon from the cooperating sheriffs,

but the stake-outs were effective and usually the raiding lawmen found a group of congenial workers having just a friendly bull session. Somehow the dice had disappeared,

Again, there was the effect of the railroad tracks which divided the town right through the middle and caused other problems - social problems. By this division the railroad tracks created an East Side and a West Side in Cherryvale. It was sort of a Hatfield and McCoy situation with the railroad tracks as the bantering line.

It just wasn't safe for an Eastsider to get caught down on the West Side, maybe calling on his girlfriend after dark. And if a Westsider happened to get caught on the East Side under the same circumstances he usually went home through the outskirts of town. Love, of course, in those days, knew no boundaries. And there were even some East Siders who married some West Siders and lived happily ever after.

However, it cic get so involved and serious at one time that the city fathers ordered a curfew for anyone underage, and after nine o'clock at night the younger generation was fair game for the local night policeman known as Pussyfoot Sinclair. He meant business for East Siders and West Siders as well.

Up from the dirt streets, the board walks, the public wells, and watering troughs the city grew into paved streets and sidewalks, gas lights, then electric, and the age of the automobile brought a prosperous and changing economy well into the twenties. One arm driving became popular. It still is.

The Roaring Twenties found Cherryvale booming with new industries, new people, new homes, new schools, new churches. There were also a few other new things such as flappers, the Charleston, boot-leggers, movies, radio, Model T's, bobbed hair, short skirts, pompadours, knickers, marathons, and motor-cycles. Billy Sunday was packing them in by the thousands.

And then came the Thirties; and the crash. It was heartbreaking to watch the home town crumble; but it was not alone. And it stood the test. It didn't fold. Today, after one hundred years of rugged experience. Cherryvale stands again on the threshold of growth and prosperity with a rebirth of the spirit of those early pioneers who founded a city with the fortitude for survival even from the depths of futility and despair.

REVIEW OF RESEARCH VOLUME

Most genealogists are unaware of a splendid research volume that is still available, although it has been out of print for fifty-five years. HISTORY OF KANSAS NEWSPAPERS, published in 1916 by the Kansas Historical Society, may still be obtained from the Society offices at 10th and Harrison Sts., in Topeka, Kansas, for one dollar.

This splendid little volume gives a comprehensive account of the history of Newspapers in Kansas, in a reprint of a speech by Captain Henry King, Editor of the St. Louis Globe Democrat, at Kansas University in 1906. Also, included are pictures and biographies of many Kansas Editors.

Two-thirds of the book tells of each County, including those absorbed by others, and gives each town that had a newspaper with the length and date of it's existance. And, the names of Editors and Publishers. Also, included under each county is a thumbnail sketch of the area's history - how the county got it's name - the industries - population - resources - etc.

Because the Editors of Kansas were the Founders of the Kansas Historical Society, each copy of Kansas papers has been preserved in the Archives. The collection was started in 1875 and in 1916 Society records show that there were more than fifty thousand bound copies. These included copies of all major cities both in the United States and abroad.

Anyone doing research in Kansas should obtain a copy of HISTORY OF KANSAS NEWSPAPERS. Newspapers of a town or area that the researcher did not know existed may contain pertinent information concerning an ancestor. Only through this fine handbook could a person ascertain the possibility of printed material deposited with the Historical Society.

In Montgomery County there are 93 discontinued Newspapers listed, including towns of Independence, Caney, Cherryvale, Coffeyville, Deering (now Dearing), Elk City, Havana, Liberty and Tyro. Thirty-seven short lived newspapers are also listed from the above towns.

Adjoining Chautauqua County lists discontinued papers from Sedan, Cedar Vale, Chautauqua Sorings, Elgin, Hewins, Niotaze and Peru.

This volume gives hope to researchers who have come up against a blank wall because an ancestor lived in a Kansas town no longer in existance or, where there seem to be no records pertaining to the family. If a discontinued newspaper for the town or area is listed it would be well

worth the time to visit the Historical Society and check their copies of the paper for genealogical information.

Genealogists owe a large debt to newspaper men, now long dead, who had the foresight to preserve the printed news records for posterity. And, an equal amount of gratitude is due the Historical Society for maintaining the records and building the newsprint volumes to the point where it is the largest depository of such records in not only the United States but in the world.

A GLIMPSE AT EARLY TYRO, KS.

Tyro, to the east of Caney, was not Tyro until after the railroad came in 1870. It was Mawn and later Fawn Creek in 1886. The first signs of a town were at the four corners of the present highway. On the north side, Joe Lenhart had a general store. Alice Mahaffy lived west of Lenharts and provided sleeping rooms for transits. Mr. Henry Bradley came to Tyro about 1882 and built just east of the Lenhart location. Another old landmark was Flav Dillenay's store also on the highway. George Clup ran a blacksmith shop west of Lenhart's and William Chambers operated a hotel at the four corners.

When the Denver, Memphis and Atlantic Railroad was built in 1893 the Tyro townsite was organized, two of the chief backers being Lenhart and Black. Lenhart then moved his store to the townsite nearer the railroad, as did Chambers his hotel. Chris Ellis lived on the south side of the highway and the street running north and south was named for him. The local residents jokingly referred to the town thus: Joe Town, Ellis Street, Mahaffy Hotel, With nothing to eat. Names of other early settlers were T. L. Dewitt, Umbarger, Col. Burns, Isaac Price, E. A. Tunneycliff, Ben Duell, Jack Wheeler, Richard Harding, John Fields, Ben Gaskill, Harry Ray and John Gordon.

Tyro was just a country town until the oil boom came about 1904, when its population shot up to about 700 to 800. There were good oil wells right in the town. During that period Jim Butler's farm at the northeast edge of the town was sold and divided into town lots on which many new homes were built. It had a splendid school system with an accredited high school, three churches, Christian, Nazarane and Methodist, and, all in all, was a progressive community.

BOUNTY LAND APPLICATION OF PRUDENCE LONDON

STATE OF IOWA COUNTY OF MARION

On this 19th day of January A.D. one thousand eight hundred and sixty nine personally appeared before me Clerk of the Court within and for the County and state aforesaid Prudence Lunden aged 65 years a resident of Marion County in the state of Iowa who being duly sworn according to law declares that she is the widow of James Lunden deceased who was a private in the company commanded by Captain Willy B Green in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Neal in the Winnebago War in the year A. D. 1827. That her said husband volunteered in the spring of 1827 (but she cannot say what month) in the County of Morgan State of Illinois. She cannot state the length of service nor the time nor place of discharge. He also served in the Black Hawk War of 1832 he was in the company commanded by Captain John Henry in the regiment commanded by Colonel A. B. Dewitt. That he volunteered about the month of April A. D. 1832 in Morgan County State of Illinois but cannot state length of service nor place of discharge.

She further states that she was married to the said James Lunden in St. Genevieve County in the State of Missouri on the 10th day of December A. D. 1818 by one John Barrett a justice of the Peace and that her name before her said marriage was Prudence Hunt. That her said husband died in Marion County in the State of Iowa on the 2nd day of

September A. D. 1854 and that she is now a widow.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which she may be entitled under the Act approved March3, 1855. Also the monthly pay in both cases if has not been paid heretofore. She further states that she knows of no public record of her said marriage.
