ROBBINS SCHOOL DISTRICT #64

1871 - 1965

Township 35; Range 15

During its 94 years of operation as a separate district Robbins, #64, had its boundary changed nine times without very materially affecting its size. When Nathan Bass, County Superintendent, issued the order for its organization on June 27, 1871, and when the patrons met in the home of John Harmon on the 8th of August to elect officers, the district had an area of approximately 6 square miles. This was its size on the date of dissolution, July 1, 1965. Considerable land was taken from Robbins to form District #110 in 1903 but this was returned again in 1904.

The school building has always been on its present site in Section 2 of 35-15. In July of 1949, additional land was bought on the north of the original lot from Mr. and Mrs. Harry Roberts for \$1.00 "and other valuable considerations". There seems to be no record of the original site being purchased or leased around 1871. School census figures for that year give 41 as the number between 5 and 21 years of age residing in the district.

In 1955-56 bonds were issued in the amount of \$13,274.25 to build an addition onto their schoolhouse and to modernize it. When the project was completed there was a balance in the above account of \$4.43.

This year and the two following, 1956-58, the district employed two teachers, Mrs. Bernice Shores and Mrs. Dovea Davis. From 1958-59 on, one teacher cared for the children. Enrollments for the three years Robbins was a two teacher school were 27 and 28 and 27. In 1950, it was 29 and in 1959-60 it was 27. The figure has varied from 16 to 29 for the fifty years before the district was made a part of Unified School District #445. The last year of operation Mrs. Jo Mitchell had 14 children attending.

On July 1, 1965, on application of Coffeyville School District #3 to include Robbins in it's unified area and by virtue of the School Unification laws of the 1963 and 1965 Kansas Legislature, the State Superintendent of Public Instruction declared it a part of the larger Unified District #445.

Eli Roberts had a sawmill on his farm (2 miles) and he sawed and hauled the lumber for the first building.

The notorious Dalton brothers attended Robbins in the 1880's.
