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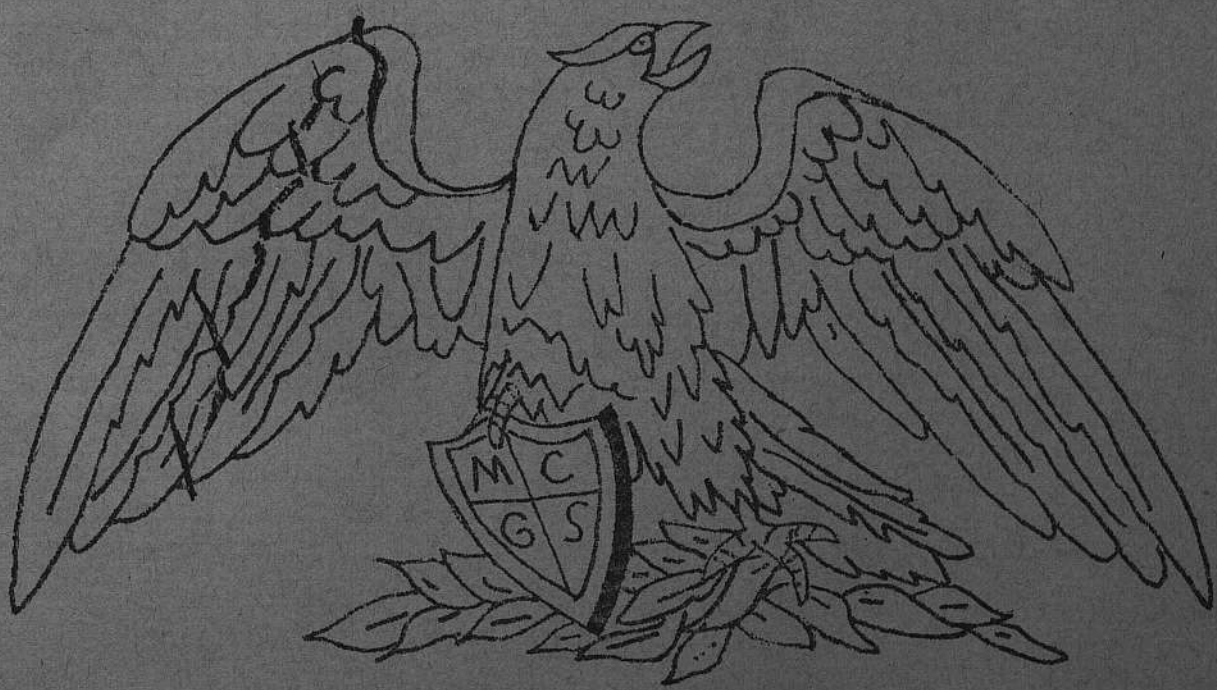

INDEPENDENCE, DIST. # 5

1896

Township 32, Range 15 & 16

The development of the Independence School System coincides with the organization of the entire county. Montgomery County was organized in June (3) of 1869. The city was incorporated in July (25) of 1870 and the district #5 was organized by order of County Superintendent, B R. Cunningham less than a month later, August 20, 1870. That the school house was one of the first buildings erected is indicated by the fact that the patrons met in the school house on the 31st of August, 1870, to complete the organization. The building stood on the southwest corner of 13th and West Maple where the E. U. B. church now stands. It was dedicated April 16, 1870, and Miss Mary Walker opened the first term of school on April 21, 1870. The population of school age children (5-21) years was given in August of 1872 as 153. Just how many of these attended Miss Walker's school is not recorded but her enrollment must have been heavy.

In April and August of 1871, the Independence district received from the County Superintendent, Nathan Bass, the sum of \$311.60 from a total County fund of \$3,866.88. Superintendent Bass noted in his account that School District # 5 was the only one in the County which had "complied with the law to entitle them to their division", of the money.

By March of 1872, Independence had become a city of the second class and a new two-room brick building had been erected. This Lincoln school as it was called cost \$2,300.00 and was thought to be too far away from the center of town. When it was replaced by a new Lincoln School in 1878, it was said by some to be too far "in". This structure in the Concannon addition to the city had 4 rooms and cost \$8,000.00.

When the state constitution was adopted it was thought the interest on the money derived from sale of the two sections of each thirty-six and the county fines and forfeitures would support the schools. This proved inadequate for the years 1872 to 1874. The amounts received per pupil on the school census were 87 cents and 65 cents respectively. Even by dismissing school when the funds were exhausted this would be unsatisfactory and districts soon began to levy local taxes.

By 1883, the city population was listed as 3,200 and a new 2 story, 7 room building was erected in the 1st ward at a cost of \$10,000.00. Twenty years later it was torn down and the new Washington School built. New Washington and Lincoln school buildings opened for classes in October of 1902.

Population of the community passed the 10,000 mark in 1903-04 with the locating of new industries due to the abundance of natural gas, brick, shale, and cement materials. The Prairie Oil and Gas Company later to be merged with the Sinclair companies moved to Independence in 1904 and have been a stabilizing force in the community's development. By the year 1907, population had risen to over 15,000 and the city had besides

the Lincoln and Washington schools three ward buildings, eight room, two story and basement, brick structures, the Willard, Longfellow and McKinley buildings.

The High School needs of the community were cared for by the city until the establishment of the Montgomery County High School by the Kansas legislature in 1897. Fortunately for Independence it was located at the County Seat. It began operation in 1899 under S. M. Nees, who had been Superintendent of the Independence Schools. Out of respect to Professor Nees, the building was named for its longtime principal.

The Independence system never did entirely abandon some freshman and sophomore work during the years of the County High School's service.

In 1922, the facilities of the County High School were taken over by District #5 and a 1 to 12 program of education offered by Independence. In that year the Junior High School and the Riley schools were built. The Riley building was a concession to the people North of the tracks to secure their votes for the Junior High bond issue.

In 1925, two years of Junior College were added and agitation began to separate the seventh grade Junior High children from the older High School and Junior College students.

The depression of the 1930's and new concepts in education resulted in studies in consolidation and use of W. P. A. funds to erect new monolithic concrete buildings on the sites of the Washington and Lincoln Schools, large enough to accomodate pupils from the other ward buildings. The Junior High building was brought up-to-date and a large gymnasium was attached to it. Forty-five percent of the cost came from W. P. A. funds. The schools were occupied in the winter of 1939-40 and the Willard, McKinley and Longfellow schools were closed.

In 1954, the old Montgomery County High School building was razed and its heating plant made over into an office for the board of education and the Superintendent.

In that year a new combination High School and Junior College building was built at the North edge of the city and the school organization converted to a 6-4-4 plan. Kindergarten had been begun in 1925 as an added service.

In 1965, July 1, Independence, #5 and the districts adjacent, namely, Peebler, #42, Sycamore, #46, Morgantown, #36, Forty, #40, Central, #58, Maple Grove, #52, Jefferson, #28, Fairview, #59, and White Post, #68 were disorganized to form a new Unified School District, #46, providing schooling from kindergarten through 14 or Junior College. At the same time the Independence Junior College became a Community Junior College whose taxing area was roughly the north half of the county.

Thus the original small district of several square miles and a modest valuation grew to become the nerve center of a district of over 157 square miles and over 22 million valuation. Now every school age child in Unified School District, #46, had the privilege of an education

equal to that of every other child in this district. Modern equipment, new concepts in education, transportation and federal involvement make all this possible.

CHERRYVALE, SCHOOL DISTRICT #8
1870-1966
Township 32, Range 17E

Before a town site was laid out for Cherryvale the people of this area had organized a school district. The date given is October 10, 1870, and R. B. Cunningham was County Superintendent of Schools. One record states that the first school house was built in 1872 and the first school taught in 1873 with Miss Mary Greenfield as teacher.

Other records give an enrollment for the 1871-72 school year of 43 pupils, so classes must have been held in private homes or buildings until the new school was built.

In the fall of 1882, a two-story brick structure was erected on the site of the present Junior High building, the title of which was given by a trustee deed, dated January 15, 1877, by E. Herring, Probate Judge out of the land office at Independence for a consideration of \$1.00 (K -- 444). By this time the school population had doubled since Cherryvale had become a third class city in 1880. Railroad activity accounted for further growth and 5 years after Chorryvale was proclaimed a third class city, its school population was around five hundred and the city population 2,601.

By 1902, gas had been found in commercial quantities, brick plants had sprung up over the county with one on Corbin's Mound just south of the city; there were two railroads, an Iron works, a zinc smelter, glass company, barrel factory, bicycle and machine shops, a planing mill, marble works, two elevators and a flour mill. There was also the Tannahill Manufacturing Company whose product was not listed.

The school district voted \$17,000.00 in bonds to build two ward school houses, one on each side of the Santa Fe Railroad. School population now was about 1000, and the city census for that year showed a population of 3,485. Population growth reached a high of 6,018 in 1907, held above 5,000 until 1912 and above 4,000 to 1933.

Thus the size of the Chorryvale School system as fixed in the first decade of the 1900's has remained much the same up to the present. A small area of $\frac{1}{4}$ square mile in Labette County was added in 1917; the Corbinville District #111 to the south was added in 1946 and the surrounding area, comprising the Pleasant Dale, #18 and the Billings, #38 were added to it on July 1, 1966, by virtue of the 1964-65

Unification acts of the Kansas Legislature. This last major change nearly doubled the district's valuation while adding fewer than a hundred pupils to its total.

The internal organization of the district has changed. A new Junior High School Building was erected on the original school site in 1939, large enough to house the elementary school children east of the Santa Fe tracks.

From these early days of 1882, when G. B. Lossle was assisted by four teachers, caring for about 1,000 pupils to the present when thirty-five persons are employed to care for its 688 children, nineteen superintendents have supervised and ministered to the educational needs of the community. We know that G. B. Lossle was in charge in 1882. The dates of service for Messrs. Mosier, Crane, I. H. Dana, Harris, Taylor, and Richardson are not available. Whereas Leonard Leas of Redding Township York County in Pennsylvania being in Weakness of Body but of Sound Mind & Memory Calling to Mind the Certainty of Death and the uncertainty of Life have made and appointed this my Will and Testament Revoking and Disanulling all other Will or Wills before by me Made this only to be my last Will and Testament in Manner and form following. Viz: Imprimis, first I Commit my Soul to God who Gave it to me and my Body to be Decantly Buried at the Discretion of my Executers hereafter named all funeral Charges and other Worldly Debts everywhere to be paid. Six pear of Goors and reeds I order and inpower my said Exocufors to Sell my Personal Estate Either by Privet Sale and or at Publick Vendue and my Lands in the same Manner but if the war is not over and Setled not to Sell it till they see it Safe to Sell and when the sales is made the Money arising from said Sales with the Money paid from my Son Daniel Leas I order my said Exocuters to Equally Devide the same between my Children and that as following to Wit, to my Son William Leas, Mary the Wife of George Neas, Ursalla the Wife of John Cough, Abraham, John, Benjamin, Catharino, Jacob and Sarah Leas, Share and Share alike that is to say after the Logacys is paid I give and Bequeath to my Grand

There are three distinctive colonies of Leas families established in Indiana alone, yet no common ancestor has been found. Colonies are also located in Pa, Va., Minn., Ohio, & Ill.
