ROBERTS, DIST. #85, 1872-1947  
Township 34; Range 17E

"On the 17th day of February, 1872, School District #85,  
County of Montgomery, State of Kansas is hereby formed and  
bounded as follows," so reads the record written in longhand  
by Nathan Bass, County Superintendent.  
Patrons were to meet in the house of L. Songer on the

ROBERTS SCHOOL (Continued)

4th of March, 1872, at 2 o'clock p.m. to perfect the organization, which they did, naming the district "Roberts" after the patron on whose land the schoolhouse had been or was to be built. Date of the sale was 21 Aug 1872 and the price for the  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre tract was \$15.00. Josiah Roberts and wife signed the deed.

It is an odd but significant fact that at a time when the total county population was below thirty thousand, these rural districts had the highest potential enrollments. The census of 1889-90 gave the Roberts district a total of forty-six persons between five and twenty-one years of age. Ten years later it was nineteen.

The year 1941-42 is the last of which there is a record of Roberts operating. That year Frances Jones taught an eight months school for seventeen pupils. The next several years the pupils went to the city, parochial and Clymore schools.

In the reorganization shuffle of 1945-46, Roberts district was divided between Clymore and Walter Johnson. When the property was sold by County Superintendent, Belle Chambers, the net of \$1,336.55 was divided on the same basis as the land division, i.e. 70% or \$953.18 went to Clymore and 30% or \$374.13 went to Walter Johnson.

DIARY OF L. F. DICK, of Parsons, Kansas  
Kept on a Trip to Indiana in 1921

Leroy Franklin Dick was born in Hamilton County, Indiana on July 7, 1842. He was the son of William and Mary (Beeson) Dick. He enlisted in the Civil War from Hamilton County and the occasion of this trip was a reunion of the 57th Indiana Infantry, Co. H, and other Indiana Civil War veterans in Indianapolis on Sept. 27, 1921. His wife, Mary Ann Cornelius Dick, whom he refers to in this account as "Mother", accompanied him on the trip. She was also a native of Hamilton County. They had left Indiana in 1868 and settled in Labette County, Kansas. They later moved to Parsons. His last trip before this back to Indiana was in 1899.

From the hearty welcomes they received everywhere and the number of people they knew and visited and who visited them, they were truly going back to their native country and thoroughly enjoying it. Mr. Dick died April 12, 1939 in Parsons, Kansas at the age of 97. His wife, Mary Ann Cornelius Dick had died Dec. 23, 1934, also in Parsons.

We are indebted to his granddaughter, Miss Corinne Dick, of 906 Lewark St., Coffeyville, Kansas for this account, copied from the original.

Parsons, Kansas

Sept. 23, 1921

We took train, joining Dee Parent for a trip to Ind. Train left on time at 8:25 PM. Mother wouldn't go into a sleeper so we rode in chair car. Slept some during the night. Nothing happened to note except to say that it rained all night and that our engine slowed up and broke down near St. Charles causing a delay of more than an hour, causing us to miss the big "4" morning train out of St Louis and having to wait 4 hours for next train which left promptly on time and was a very fast one. On Sept 24th which was somewhat cloudy and showing that much rain had recently fallen, crops looked good all the way to Indianapolis where we arrived at 5 PM. Boy Scouts with a lady chaparone immediately took charge of us and piloted us to the U. T. Co's station on North Illinois St. opposite the monument. The throng was tremendous, our satchels were carried by the Boy Scouts. Started for Cicero at 6 PM. Mrs. Parent going on to Arcadia. Got to bro. Eli's at a few minutes after 7 PM Charlie having met us at the station. Austin Gintner called on us a few minutes later. Mother stood the trip fine and in excellent spirits.

Sept. 25th generally fair with only a few clouds. We both slept fine after visiting to a late hour. Mother and sister Ella after a splendid breakfast put on their bib and tuckers and us 3 took I. U. at 9:25 for Arcadia. Eli went to his S. S. class. Went to Shep Nobles where we were received in open arms-caressed with kisses. Del, Mede and Mother found their tongues tied in the middle and such a clatter. Shep and I were not slow either. Dinner was a rich one, of old Mother Stehman style. In PM saw Pel Winders, Geo. Walser, Ale Lively, Dave Knapp and wife, where we visited about 30 min. Then at 5 PM Floyd N. and wife having heard of our coming, came in a fine auto and took us to Charlie N's where we had a most hearty greeting. On our way here we stopped at the Dunkard-Grave-Yard where we looked upon the beautiful monuments over the graves of many loved ones. We arrived at Charlie

Newby's at about 6:30 PM and were heartily greeted. Dick and Emma came later also Bro. Temp. We had a splendid time to bedtime.

Sept. 26th. Mother and I had a fine rest. Got up at 5 AM feeling fine. Mother in good spirits, no grunting or grumbling. Several called on us. After Dinner Dick and Emma came over and took us up thru Dogtown. Stopped & took a look at Sister Dell's old Home then up by Hobbs Grave Yard & out to Sam Evans where we had a 20 minutes visit that was worth a trip to Panama & could not be improved upon except that Becky looked so poorly. Then we called at Ramonds & here we saw Floyd also. We found Claiborn in very poor health, but able to be up part of the time. He has a lovely wife nee Fox. Here we were made to feel at home. Bro. Temp came for the night. Floyd & wife came after Supper. It seemed that we worked a whole Dozen good visits into one, until a late Bed time. I must not, I cannot forget the great kindness and Tender love shown us by all at this lovely Home. I must not forget, the huge joke Sam Evans pulled off on mother. He said old age made some old people better looking, which is so in my case but my God look at Mollie!

Sept. 27th. We got up at 5 AM feeling fine. After breakfast Bro. Temp took me to Arcadia where Shep W and I entrained for Indianapolis via U. T. line, got there at 8:30. Found a great throng, poorly organized for information But in all other respects perfect. Only found 3 of our old "Co. H", Kies, Literal & Phelan, all recruits. We had a Dinner that I shall never forget. Perfect in every respect, an up to date "cafeteria". We passed a pleasant PM mingling with the great throng. At 4 PM I took U.T. to Noblesville where I spent 1½ hours visiting John Sperry & Wm Hadley who is in very poor health. Then got on U. T. to Atlanta where Dick and Emma had taken Mother who had dinner at Bro. David's & who I found at Ollivers. It would take too long a time to go into details about all that happened here. David & Dany came too & we all had supper together visiting until a late hour. Yes! Lelah & Husband came in, which added much to our Enjoyment. They are fine. Shep remained over in Ind.(ianapolis).

Sept. 28th. Had a good night's rest. Mother feeling fine & it was noticed she had already lost 3 wrinkles from each cheek. At 9 AM Olliver and Sadia & Mother & I took U. Also met Harry Warman son of Frank Warman a schoolmate of my mother. Also met Tom Gummer with whom I spent a few bright moments. He then visited Mother at Nora's after Supper. Jim Hill & wife came over and Spent the evening to a late bed time at Nora's. Nora & Husband have recently purchased the Home Bro. Fatty built for Sister Del who would never live in it. Its an Excellent Home of real convenience. They are proud of their Home and well they may be for it has many fruit trees & a fine Garden in an Excellent Neighborhood and fronting on the U. T. line about 2 squares distant from their home, & from where we can see Several old time houses.



Diary of L. F. Dick continued

Sept. 29th. Again we have had a good rest & Mother & I got up at 5 AM both complaining of feeling fine and ready for a Delightful Breakfast which we enjoyed to the limit. Just as we had finished breakfast James Hill Drove up & called for us to go in a 2 seated carriage with him & wife to the Dunkard Grave Yard. Nora, Aunt Lizzie & Verna going along. We spent a most interesting hour & a half in looking at the monuments & stones that mark the resting place of our loved ones & Friends. Its the most beautiful & finely kept of its size we have ever seen and the church has been remodeled & a Basement the full size of the church has been added. Lighted all over by electricity. Its simply grand. In driving a little careless Uncle Jim allowed his Horse to get too near to the Edge of the beautiful cement roadway and 2 wheels dropped 6 or 8 inches breaking several spokes which came very near causing a Serious accident. We got out all O.K. Then Brother Jim Drove across the way to George Morbaugh's where Charlie Hartley a son of Gilbert Hartley was putting up corner gate & fence posts of creek pebbles & cement and had his auto with him & he got into it at once & drove us back to Uncle Jim's & to Nora's where we again had a great dinner, at which Bro Dave joined us, he having just came on U. T. line. Lela came & spent the afternoon. At half past 4 Lou & I again took a stroll. Met Del & Mede who had just came from a call upon Aunt Han Sanders & who is slowly passing away, Having lost almost all her reason. We stopped at the 2 Ben Dickovers & had a Short visit then called on Mike Mosbaugh & wife where we spent a most pleasant hour. Then meeting a daughter of David Leamine, now Mrs. Warman this was a pleasant surprise to meet her. Lou & I just back home in time for supper & finding that Bro. Temp had called and arranged for a tour of the country with Mother on tomorrow at which I was much pleased & of which she can tell best.

Sept. 30th. We got up at 4:30 both feeling fine and particularly happy at mother's cheerfulness. Its doing her great good to be here. At  $\frac{1}{2}$  past 5:00 Ad Groves took Lou and I in his auto for trip to Indianapolis, where we arrived at 7:00 AM going via the Range line thru Westfield & Carmel. We came direct into north end of Meridian Street. The air was just crisp enough to make it a most pleasant ride. We spent a short time in sightseeing then went to State House where we found Lineus Hines, the State Supt. of Schools with whom and several friends we spent a most delightful 2 hours. Having got all the army information that seemed possible we went to a nearby restaurant and had a Fish Dinner that sure was good, 50¢ for both. We then got on a W. western street car for 872 Urel Ave. where we found comrade Ad Orr & wife & dear Horra's wife with whom we spent a very pleasant  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hours. All were so pleased to meet us that it was almost pulling heartstrings to part with them. Sweet little Lelah took us thru her splendid cottage from Basement to Garret and oh how splendidly it is arranged & equipped with furniture, rug and carpets & beautiful Dishes. If Horra gets home safe they ought sure to be happy. We parted from them with regrets that we could not stay longer, but promising to see them on our way Home. We then went over to 3638 Central Ave. to see Charlie Rockhold but failed, he was not in. I left notice of my call in the keyhole. We then took car for U. T. central station from which we took U. T. to Noblesville, where we arrived at 5:00 PM. Had a  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour with John Sperry & the same with comrade Wm. Hadley both greatly pleased by my call. The latter in very poor health.

Diary of L. F. Dick continued

I stopped at Cicero, Lou went on to Arcadia. It was 6:30 when I got to station at Cicero. There met Al Slack, had a talk & on the way to Eli's met Tom Kindes, Sam Dale, George Dale & others, younger ones too numerous to mention. Met Eli at Home. He & Charlie had just finished their Supper & left  $1\frac{1}{2}$  Gal. of very fine vegetable Soup for me & as it is a favorite with me I did it ample Justice. Sister Ella & Mother had been invited to a Supper with the Benders & Cornthwaits. (She) must tell her own story of this social function. However I may here add, that she seemed to have enjoyed it hugely & praised the extreme kindness bestowed on her by all who were present.

After Sister Ella & Mother returned & we had again got to real visiting Sam Snyder & Mrs. Gordon, niece of Sister Ella's & Fred Cornelius' widow, called in all of which added much toward the real pleasure we enjoyed to a late Bed time.

I have now had 6 days of the greatest and most pleasing observation thru towns, cities & country, in my old beloved State of Indiana. Still the home of so many loved ones & Friends and old Army comrades. However I note with a Sad Heart the tremendous Death toll since I last looked on their faces 22 years ago. Oh! Dear, Dear loved ones of both kindred & Army comrades. I thank God that my life has been spared & that I may yet Shed Tears of love & affection in memory of them. But back to memories & matters & things past and present, of vital import to those who are trying to so conduct their moral efforts & their best Energies toward leaving the world the better for having lived in it.

First I must note the wonderful Effect of Prohibition. 22 years ago Saloons were numerous, men and women were Drunk and maudlin reprobates having no regard for Decency. Roads were not generally improved. The land was not near all brought into productiveness by ditching & clearing. Barns & Houses needed painting and remodeling, likewise schoolhouses & churches wherever men got together there was much profanity & blackguarding. Now I find no Saloons. Have not seen a Drunk man nor one under the influence of strong drink. The land has practically all been Drained & brought into a fine State of cultivation. Houses & Barns & Schoolhouses & Churches have been remodeled, very often larger ones built, & all painted nicely. Roads have so generally been improved that it is hard to find a piece of Dirt road. Meeting men now you seldom hear an oath nor open blackguardism. What a wonderful change in 22 years. What has brought it about? The answer is plain: Its Prohibition. Let us hope and pray that it has come to Stay forever.

Oct. 1, 1921. In Cicero, Ind. at Bro Eli C's Home. Brother Temp and I, after breakfast, at 6:00 AM got into his car for a spin in the morning air. Took the Stringtown town Road and went to Noblesville before many were up. Got a Dimes worth apples. Saw Columbus White & H. A. Cottingham & cousin Orin Scott and daughter Hazle. The latter in poor health. Took Strawtown road around to Cicero via old Home Farm. This is Home Coming & Corn Show Day here. Probably 2,000 people in attendance. Corn was very fine, Needlework fine, Vegetables fine. Amusements, Footraces, Bicycle races, Sack races, Hobble races,
