ELK CITY, SCHOOL DIST. #11  
1871-1966

Township 32, Range 14

The history of the Elk City Public Schools covers the period of 1869 or 70 to the present. The Elk City area was a part of Kansas and Montgomery County inhabited by the Osage Indians and was opened to homesteaders after the removal of the Indians and after the organization of the county about 1868-69. Most of the settlers came from Mid-Western states and many of them were veterans of the Civil War, eager to establish themselves in this frontier country.

The population of the area increased rapidly as these pioneers sought the most advantageous location in this area for their city. After several attempts at finding suitable water supplies at Tipton, Louisburg and Bloomfield or Fish Trap as some called it, inhabitants of those places moved to Elk City where water and free lots were available and where the best sawmill in the country turned out building lumber.

On April 1, 1871, Elk City municipal government was formed and a charter applied for. On the 7th the County Superintendent, Nathan Bass, issued an order of organization for School District #11, Montgomery County. Patrons met on May 12, 1871, in the "storehouse of Dr. Molta" and completed the organization.

Mr. Nod Davis recorded that school was held in a one-room log building immediately north of the present grade structure in 1869 or '70. On April 22, 1872, the school district got a trustee's deed to lots 1 to 12 inclusive from the townsite commissioners for one dollar. This was the location of the log school house. The remainder of the half block cost them \$22.00 in 1884. Other places where school was held were the stone Presbyterian Church on the site of the present Baptist Church, an unused billiard hall west of the Santa Fe station, and the building later used by the Marr Locker plant.

In 1874, a two-story, four-room, frame building was erected on the site of the present grade school. And because of growing enrollment, the four-room two-story part of the present structure was erected in the early 1880's. In 1895 a two-story two-room addition was built onto the west side of the brick building and all classes moved into it. In 1918 two more rooms were added onto the northwest part of this much added to schoolhouse.

The present high school building was built in 1929. From about 1886 until that time high school classes were held in the same building with the grades. It was a three year school until 1918 when it added one more year of studies to its curriculum.

North Carolina Wills I, pp. 50-51. Warren Andrews.

In the name of God Amon, I, Warren Andrews of the County of Tyrroll in the Province aforesaid, being sick of body but of perfect and sound mind and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die, do make ordain, constitute and appoint this my last will and testament, in manner and form following (to wit)

First, I leave in the possession of my son Edmun Andrews, one negro man named Simon, one feather bed and furniture, two cows and calves, two pewter dishes, one bason and some spoons, also, one iron pot, all the above articles I leave in the possession on my son Edmun Andrews for the use and benefit of my daughter Millie Blunt and her children, to be supported on, at the discretion of my said son Edmun during the life of Thomas Blunt, her husband and after his death, I desire what of those said articles before mentioned being then remaining shall be delivered up by my son Edmun or his heirs, or exocutors to my daughter Millie Blunt or to her children in case she is not then living or the value thero of, to be divided between my said daughters children, only giving unto my grandson Benjamin Blunt, something more than an equal part with the other children, which I leave to the discretion of my son Edmun and my daughter Millie Blunt, as they shall think best.

Item, I give unto my daughter Millie Blunt, five shilling sterling, to her and her heirs forever.

Item, I lend unto my daughter Martha Pearso the plantation wheroon she now lives during of her natural life and after her death, I give the said plantation to her son, Lovick Pearso to him and his heirs forever. I, likewise lend unto my daughter, Martha Pearso, the use of one negro man named Tency, one featherbed and furniture, two pewter dishes, one bason and some spoons, during her natural life and after her death, these said articles to be equally divided or the value theroof amongst my said daughter Martha Pearso's children, Lovick Pearso excepted, to them and to their heirs forever.

Item, I give unto my daughter Elisabeth Andrews, one negro man named Harry, one featherbed and furniture, two pewter dishes, one bason and some spoons to her and her heirs forever.

Item, I give unto my son Edmun Andrews the land wheroon he now lives, which I purchased of James Bonner containing one hundred and fifty acres, as will more fully appear by the deed I had from the said Bonner, also, I give unto him one negro man named Sam, one negro man named Robin, one black walnut desk, one black walnut oval table, to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give unto my son, Ethelred Andrews the land wheroon I now reside, it being the land I purchased of Orsburn Jeffers,

as will more fully appear by the deed I had from said Jeffers. Also, one negro woman named Diner, to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give unto my son Levi Andrews one negro man named Nod, one table to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I lend unto my loving wife, Sarah, one negro man named Pompo, one featherbed and furnituro, it being the bed whereon I now lie, also, one horse named Streamer and bridle and saddle, two cows, and calves, two powder dishes, three plates, one basin and some spoons, one iron pot, one safe that she keeps her cloathes in, and all the above articles after my said wife's death, I desire they may be returned back and equally divided amongst such of my children then living.

Item, I give unto my loving wife, Sarah the sum of five pound proclamation money to her and her heirs forever.

My desire is after my death, that all the residuo of my estate of what kind so ever, not here mentioned shall be appraised by two freeholders, such as my exocutors shall think proper and equally divided amongst such of my children as shall be then alive or their heirs.

Lastly, I nominate constitute and appoint my three sons, Edmun Andrews, Etholred Andrews and Levi Andrews, Exer's to this my last will and testament, thoreby revoking and disannulling all others heretofore by me made. In witness whereof the sd Warron Andrews hath herounto set his hand and seal, the forth day of May, in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and seventy two.

## Diary of L. F. Dick, of Parsons, Kansas

Kept on a Trip to Indiana in 1921 (cont'd from Feb. '74)

Two prize fights, one whites, one blacks, also Balloon as centron, Baby show, Noblesville & Cicero bands, the latter lead by Nate Cornelius. Mother and I were on our feet practically all day and were constantly surrounded by loved ones & friends of other days, their children and grandchildren & great grand children. We were cordially greeted with smiles & kisses and hearty handshakes by Charlie Newby's whole family, Harbin Hobbs, Henry Brehm, Morris & wife, who was a Becha Webb, John Busher, Mary Busher, Heinman & Husband, Anna Busher Hartley & husband, John Bender, William Misbaugh & two sons. Dan Overdorf & brother John, Cassie Mosbaugh Long, Del mosbaugh White, Mat Stehman Metsker, "judge" Fred Hines, Albert Slack, comrad Tom Baker, Bennie Sumner, Letta Hill Caraway & husband, comrad Sam Dale, comrad Nat Dewy, Mrs. Henry Stehman, Leroy Roberts & brother, John Leming, cousin Claude Dick, Dave Knapp & wife, Nora Cornelius Groves, Sam Snyder & wife nee Kerr, three Snyder sisters, Susan, Mary Ann & Christina, Dr. P. Carson, Reece, Carpenter & wife nee Keck & daughter Hattie, Gus Clifford & wife nee Holcroft. Mrs. Dole Miessee Crum, Mrs. Fred Cornelius, John Grubb, Ky Kinder, Mrs. Winkler nee Patton, Mrs. Jo Young Patton, August Ginterd, Mrs. Cornthwait nee Bender, Urias Bender, Cassie Bender, Bennie Bender & wife nee Kaufman, Victor Harrison, Mrs. Albert Slack nee Winders, Andy Berg and sons & daughter, & grandchildren of the above named old timers too numerous to name at this time.

Sister Ula who is president of the Ladies Aid, of the M. E. church & its church treasurer had to be at the church most of the day, where meals were served, netting the church \$35.00. After supper Sister Ella had to go back to the church to help clean up for Sunday. Brother Eli had to go up town to help tag premiums and watch the drawing of the prize Auto. Mother feeling too tired to walk up town remained in doors & I stayed with her. We washed supper dishes & rested until both returned. Sister bringing a Basket of Grub left & not sold. Brother Eli brought a letter of invitation from Bro. David daughters Ella & Ada to be sure to come to their Fathers tomorrow, it being their mothers birthday and to bring along a Basket of Grub. Mother and I had previously been invited. It was now 9:00 PM but Bro & Sister got busy. Eli went out & caught a chicken, cut its head off. Ella got water hot for scalding. Eli scalded and picked the chicken. Mother put on the finishing touches & then cut it in pieces & it was soon fried to the Queens taste. Ella baked pie & cake & "Et ceteries" in plenty. Charley and I visited the while. I must not forget the Corn Show for it merited all that could be said in its praise it might be equalled but not excelled, the pumpkins were very large and heavy. The product of one vine was a wonder, having thirteen large pumpkins. The smallest weighed 20 lbs. and the largest 50 lbs. Both sweet and Irish Spuds made excellent showing. Specimen sheaves of Red Clover were worth going many miles to see. The display of canned Fruits and vegetables was very fine. Likewise the needle and crochet work. The Baby Show was not equal to the Babys shown in Parsons.

The various kinds of Races, while fairly good, were not pulled off with the spirit and vim the same kind of Races are often pulled off by our S.S. Boy & Girls of Washington Ave. M.E. Church in Parsons. If prize fighting helped to raise the standard of morals in any community, an item

might be added there, but it don't add to morals anywhere so whats the use.

Oct. 2nd, 1921. At David Cornelius Atlanta. Present at surprise Dinner. Mrs Sarah Webb nee Sharp, Lon Webb & wife nee Shell, Andrew Shell & wife nee Webb & daughter Mildred. Marshal Oneil & wife nee Webb, Boss Sharp & wife nee Porter, Ray Cornett & wife nee Kaka and two children Gerald & Geneva, Mrs. Mollie \_\_\_\_\_ nee Sharp, Mr. Jack Cochran & wife nee Cornelius and two children David & Joe, Mrs. Ruth Knotts & Chas., Walter Cox & wife nee Summer & 4 children Helen, Alberta, Rosella & Geo. Robert, Ed Stokes & wife nee Cornalius. Russell Summer & wife nee Conrad & baby Mary Jane. Eli Cornelius & wife, Maude Brunson nee Summer, Goldie Cornelius nee Small, Olliver Cornuelius & wife, John Fox & wife, Glenn Whistler & wife, Nura Groves & Husband & two Daughters Audra & Elizabeth and Jerome Carr. From Parsons, Kansas were Leroy & Mary A. Dick. This was a day that will be long remembered by all who were present. All came in good cheer & all seemed to go away with joy in their hearts. The Dinner was all that need to be wished for in good things to eat & all seemed to enjoy it to the limit. Stories of Early Days were indulged in by Mrs. Webb, Mrs. Schell, Boss Sharp, Jerome Carr, David & Danny Cornelius & we of Parsons, Kansas. The younger ones greatly enjoyed the stories of the old Log Schoolhouse & Slab Benches, the day schools, Early Sunday Schools, Spelling Schools & Singing Schools & going to church. The kind of clothes worn & modes of locomotion to and from. The comparison of all those things, then & now showed a wonderful contrast which was listened to with Deep interest & much merriment. About 4 PM all began to prepare for the parting in a happy day so full of good cheer. Goodbys were said in deep feeling of regret. That time rolls on so fast & that partings for many of us may be the last here on Earth. But a lively hope was expressed by most of those present that we shall so live out this life that when the End comes we shall meet in Heaven where parting will be no more.

About 4:30 PM John Fox & wife, in their Big Auto, with Olliver Cornelius & wife, Glenn Whistler & wife and Mother and I drove out to the John Fox Farm, 5 miles north east of Atlanta, going via of old Kinderhook, of our earliest recollections. The Fox Farm is finely located on rich alluvial Soil, every foot of which is plowland ornamented by a beautiful Grove of young Native Trees & small orchard of Several kinds of fruit Trees. A large house and Barn & other out buildings all Freshly painted. Many fine cattle, sheep & hogs. This farm consists of 120 acres, an ideal one for such energetic young people. We love them for their moral worth & genial dispositions. We are also proud to say as much for Zelda & husband Glenn Whistler. These are the kind of young people that make the world better for their having lived in it. From this beautiful home we move on via of the Hobbs Grave Yard & Omega to another beautiful home of 134 acres. The home of our very Dearly beloved niece & her charming good husband. Both of whom so richly Entertained us and cared for us. Here we had to bid farewell to the Handsome, jolly, lovely Six who so

kindly piloted us here. Their kindly faces will Ever be in our memories while life and reason remains with us.

After Supper, callers were Floyd Fouch & wife nee Bright, Harrison Billhymer & wife nee Eller Fox, Mother of Claiborn Fouch's wife nee Fox & Joe Plummer & wife nee Dick our own Dear Niece. We think Mr. Plummer is a worthy companion & a genial Energetic Gentleman, full of business. On account of Dear Claiborn's condition real jollity was below par. However he contended that making of it did not hurt him but our fears for his welfare kept us all within bounds. All his Kin & neighbors join in giving him unstinted praise for his sterling worth as a citizen & business young man. Honest to a fault, genial in disposition towards others, Full of energy & go ahead activity. We do hope and pray for his recovery to wonderful health. The above callers & us, with our hosts, passed a few hours in cordial & loving visiting. We will always remember it with pleasure.

Oct. 3rd 1921. At Dick Fouch's we were all up early & ready for the Grand good breakfast which was prepared & served by our own Dear Nieces, Emma & \_\_\_\_\_. Their canned Sausage & Side meat was greatly relished by us. After breakfast Dick & I went out for a lookaround. Dick had Dug his sweet spuds & had them in an out building. They were a fine average in size of extra good quality. 18 bushels of them, some of them very large. Grown in 5 rows about 60 feet long. He has a little motor engine that pumps water out of a 90 foot driven well into large zinc tubs and troughs for all his stock & fowls. Its fine equipment for the purpose & saves much hard labor. During the forenoon Raymond & Floyd called in & visited a short time. They were going to Indianapolis on a matter of business and wanted Pa's opinion of it. The rest of the forenoon was spent in visiting. Dear Claiborne seemed some better & more cheerful and laughed heartily at some of the stories that were told. Their youngest boy Gene (single) is up in South Dacota Feeding a Threshing machine at \$7 per Day.

The Dear Nieces had an Early Dinner of Chicken and Noodles. Yum, Yum & then some, it was sure a fine Dinner. After the Dinner Dick went to Garage & got their Big Auto, a "Chevelrey" & Emma, Mother and I got in with him & he drove down to see Aunt Betsy Dresher, who lives with her youngest daughter & son in law. In the short hour we were there we found time to talk over many happenings of our schooldays at old Men. S- House & other events incident to our lines up to this time. It was a most enjoyable hour with one whose memory is so well preserved at her age, 85. She is in fair good health but can't get about well, on account of Rheumatism in her knee joints. We drove from there to Clate Carson's, found no one at home. I got over into the orchard & got 4 Big winter apples, the only tree in the orchard having any fruit on it. We then drove on to see Mrs. Allie Albert & son Carpenter with whom we spent an hour most pleasantly. Allie is not in the best of health tho able to do most of her housework. She was so glad to see us and tried to prevail on us to stay all night, at least, if not longer. Her husband was some distance from the House making improvements in Hog pens. We did not get to see him. We then drove over to the Madison & Hamilton County line then north to the Aroma line then west to Aroma & then south to cousin Lydia Beeson's Farm. We could not use the road there from Arcadia on account of the repairing of a Bridge. We found

cousin Lydia and her batchelor son Joe and her cousin \_\_\_\_\_ Shaw. All in good health in fact cousin Lydia is much more spry than we expected to find her. O how glad her & son seemed to be to have us call even for so short a time, but they were insisten on us at least staying all night. I gorgot for the moment that cousins oldest daughter who is now Mrs. Johnson was also there & living on part of the old Home Farm of Cousin Lemuel & who has a Daughter living in K.C. Mo. She expects to visit her daughter about Holidays & Lydia thinks she may come along too & if so will surely extend their visit to see us. Joe is a fine looking young man and seems quite a companionable & I learn he is held in high esteem by his neighbors. I wish he may come too. It is nearly Sundown when we leave here & it is putting it mildly to say we hated to part with these kind people. The Sun is just peeping over the western horizon & shine squarely in our Eyes as we go westward via Aroma & the place where the old Ironwood Seminary stood amidst the neighborhood of the Harveys, Leemans, Baldwins, Utzes, Aults, Holloways, Smiths, Wrights, Moors & Carpenters, all prominent in the early history of the settlement in this part of the world even unto this day. We pass through Omega & again take a look at the late home of our beloved sister Delilah & her daughter Corah. Again I am reminded that with the death of this sister only 4 out of 12 children are still living. O how time takes its toll in Death. These 4 are Brothers: Temple C & William W & Sister Gulaelma & myself. I the oldest & William the youngest of the 12.

We arrived at home after Dark, and found a delightful supper awaiting us prepared by Dear Claiborn's wife who surely is a connoiseure in cooking. Brother Temp was here before us of which we were glad as he is quite companionable in evening visiting. There were no callers & the time passed to a late Bedtime in Home visiting.

Oct. 4th 1921. Still at Dick Fouchs. We all go up Early. Clai-born not so well as yesterday. Brother Temp & I got ready to make an all day trip & after bidding Dear Claiborn & wife as hearty good-by, then I felt a Deep sadness come over me, we Started out via Arcadia & old Boxleytown to Sheridan. Here we found our comrade Jimmy Spencer; our Drummer Boy. He was 13 when we enlisted in '61 & he served to the End of the War. He was small of stature on entering Service & never grew much in Service but he has grown in hight since. He is now a Grandfather. He used to talk very fast & talks faster now. Our meeting at this time, the short, was a most pleasant one & we were both sorry that we couldn't have more time together. We parted in Tears. Bro. & I then drove via Lamong & Eagletown to William Slutz where we were most heartily received & entertained & just forced to Stay to Dinner which was one the kind cousin Cinda always puts up. Just too good for Two Kings & more Queens. Age has crept on these two Dear cousins very perceptably since I last visited them. But they are quite jolly & full of good sensible talk Despite the fact that pangs of Rheumatism has overtaken them. They have never had children born to them & the prospect for any don't look very promising even now. After Dinner we drove over to cousin Cemia Slutz's. Found her in fair good health but very hard of hearing.
