LETTERS OF GEORGE HAWORTH, 1699, 1701 and 1704

George Haworth emigrated from Bacup in the parish of Rochdale, Lancashire, England, with a host of other Quakers when William Penn came on his second voyage in 1699 to Philadelphia. He tells of the sea voyage, early life in Bucks Co., Pa. and gives advice to any members of the family who may wish to set out for America in these letters to his family still in England. The second letter in 1701 was addressed to his brother James, who, with their mother had moved to the town of Hapton, near Burnley in Lancashire. Philadelphia, 26, of 8 Mo., 1699

To My Dear Mother, Brother and Sisters:

After my dear love to you all with my dear love to all my friends and neighbors, hoping that you are all in good health as I am at present, blessed be the Lord for the same; though I have been very weakly at sea in the latter part of our journey, but it pleased the Lord that I got on shore at a place 100 Leagues short of Philadelphia, where I was informed that my sister dwelt there at a place called "Hurbells," and so in much weakness I got to the place and quickly found her, and staid there one week and then set sail in a sloop for Philadelphia for which I paid 5 s. (shillings) My Sister was in good health and she hath four children, two boys and two girls, and her Husband being well also, and is in good health. He is a hatter to his trade. We were about 14 weeks at sea. After we left Liverpool a long and tedious journey we had, for we being thronged in the ship I believe hurt many, for we had many distempers amongst us as Fevers, Flux and Jaundice and many died at sea about 56 and at shore there died about 20. Henry Mitchell died at sea about mid-way, his son John is dead also, and one Ellis Schofield and Robert Brewer are dead and he hath left his goods to be returned to his kinsfolks at Liverpool.

My Brother-in-law is dead and the child died also about three days before my sister. She was indifferently well most of the way, but about 100 Leagues of sight of land she bore a child and it died and then she died and left her household goods to my Sister and one-half of the clothes and the other half she left to me. Thomas Musgrave is dead also at sea, and Henry Mitchell's wife died at shore. As for my Sister here, she doth somewhat incline to come to meeting; but she liveth so far remote from any meeting that she seldom goeth, but as for her husband he doth not incline to come to Friends Meetings. If my Brother, or any of my neighbors do incline to come into this country, let them be careful that they do not come too many in the ship as we did, for being thronged and the smell of many, then many fainted away and died.

We wanted water and beer to drink, for having salt beef we were much athirst and could not get enough to drink, for the Seamen stowed the hold so full of goods that they had not room enough for water and beer, and then wanting such things as might have nourished us, we suffered hard-ships. But if any come let them buy for themselves, over and besides the ship's allowance, spices, brandy and cheese, let the seamen pretend to what they will, or else victuals themselves and bargain for being carried over and goods, and then bring for yourselves but little beef and some bacon and what flour is very good, and cheese and butter and eggs and any other mild sort of food. And as for your goods you bring, let them be bedticks, very good, with all sorts of bedding.

Letters of George Haworth continued

Bring no hats except very good and hardwares; So be careful of being thronged in the ship or a summer's journey, lest you be hurt as we were. We had a very hard passage; we were brought to an allowance of water and beer and then for every 4 we had 2 cases of water and beer and then 2. So no more, but very dear love to my Mother, Brother, and Sisters, with the rest.

GEORGE HAWORTH

13th of the 5th mo. called May, 1701

Dear Mother: After my dear love to thee and to my Brother, and sisters, and to all of my relation and well wishers, these come to let you know that I am well at present, hoping these few lines may find you all in good health also. I have had my health reasonably ever since I came into the country, but at first being a little weakly I was with James Haworth, and then I hired myself for a year and I had about 10 Pounds wages in the year; and since I was free to work by the piece or by the day, 2 s(hillings), 6 d.(pennies) a day, and victuals, and in harvest if we take our work we get 3 s. 6d. a day. So if any of my relation have a mind to come to this country I think it a very good one, and that they may do well, but be sure to come free. But if you come servants they must be sold for four or five years work hard, so be sure to come free, and bring such things as will suit plantation work, as horse chains and plough gears, and all things suitable to work with, as plough irons and things for selling.

Bring store of goods, clothes and good surge and beddings of all kinds with good store of silk to sew withall, and good bed ticking and good light hats and iron pots.

And as for the land, there is both good and bad, both hills and vales, and the common products of the land are Wheat, Rye, Barley, Oats, Beans, Peas, Buckwheat, Indian Corn, Apples, Cider, Peaches, and Cherries; and cattle and horses there are plenty, and good all over the country as far as I know. There are fishes and fowls in plenty, and this last winter there was a great snow, and some got store of deer, Eight or Ten in a week's time, and what varmint we have, as Wolves, I have seen some, but they have not hurt me, though I have been near them: there are a few Panthers, and Bears, but they hurt nobody as I know of and land is dearer then it was when I just came. There are several sorts of grapes, Strawberries, Mulberries, Whimberries, but they grow upon stalke three or four feet high.

There are many sorts of Wood, as Black, Red, and White Oaks, and many other sorts as the Chestnut and Walnut. We have Turkey wild in the Woods, Pheasants, Partridges, with many other sorts of birds of divers colors and strange colors and notes: and thus much for the country and its products. This is to let you know that I went ashore at a place called "Hurbells", and there found my sister. She hath four children, two sons and two daughters, John, James, Mary and Sarah, and there I stayed about a week, and then my Brother came along with me to Philadelphia, and since then, I have not seen them, though they are in good health when I last heard from them, and then came into the country of Bucks, where my cousin James Haworth dwells, and dwelleth near to him, being about 250 miles from my sister,

Diary of L. F. Dick, of Parsons, Kansas  
Kept on a Trip to Indiana in 1921  
(continued from the May 1974 issue)

She (cousin Cemla Slultz) was glad to see us and wanted us to remain over night when her husband who is one of the County Commissioners would be home. Our time was too short for such a pleasure. We then drove over to cousin Othniel Harveys where we spent a most pleasant  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour. Found cousin Sibilla in poor health but still quite lively. Here it was like pulling Teeth to get away from these Dear loving kind hearted cousins. Its always a treat of real merit to be with them. We then drove on over to cousin Santford Harveys, both him & wife were invalids yet they were able to make us feel that our coming was most heartily appreciated. Our  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour here will long be remembered as one of the jolliest kind. We drove from here to Westfield where we hunted up Dear little old Comrade Nate Johnson, who did not know me and couldn't tell whether he had Ever seen me. I soon made him know that he had seen me very often in the  $4\frac{1}{2}$  years we served in the Same Company. He seemed real glad to See me & his eyes brightened up very perceptably when I asked him if his memory was still clear as to his play with the Confeds at the big commisary at the East foot of Missionary Ridge. He said its all plainer to me now than things that happened just recently. He said he did not know that he was Entitled to a "Hero" medal & \$10.00 per month extra pension. I assured him it was Law & that I thought we both were entitled to be placed upon the Roll of honor if we make the proper effort to have it done. He said he would be more than glad to do his part if he could be shown how & asked me to start the ball to rolling. I looked upon him now as I looked upon him During the War, as one of the Noblest of Noble soldiers in our "Army." He has had 12 children born to him & has many Grand children, two of them were in the World War, one of them on the front line at St. Michel & the Argone, the other was in the Navy. From their appearance I should judge they were as Patriotic and as brave as their beloved Grandfather. We now parted with this Dear old comrade who never will be appreciated at his true worth. On our way near Noblesville a  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch belt broke in the left hand front spring in Brother's Auto. He carefully (drove) into Noblesville to a Garage & had a new one put in. A Belt costing 10 cts in Parsons time to put it in here, 10 minutes, charge 75 cts. or  $4\frac{1}{2}$  cts. per minute. The Garage people here seem to have their Gall as well as other places we had heard from. From Noblesville we drove out the Strawtown road noting all the old Farms as we used to know them & the many divisions & improvements made since we were here last. We got to Charlie Newby's about dark where we found our good wife & a splendid supper awaiting us & which we relished & enjoyed to the limit. Then came Dear Emma & Dick to visit with us this last evening we expected to stay in this part of our Tour. We cannot speak of those present in too high praise for their loving kindness shown us by all. We just visited & really had two real visits: The women in one part of the House where jollity must have reigned supreme, we men thot so from the hearty laughing from that quarter. We, the men, had another part of the House & we sure had much to say of common interest. We will not forget this gathering while life and reason lasts us. At about 11 PM Emma & Dick bid us hearty adieu & went home. When we reflect on such happy gatherings

I am wondering if we are really doing right in not trying to meet loved ones & special Friends more often.

Oct. 5th 1921. At Charlie Newby's. We got up at 5 AM finding the air fresh & bracing. We went out to the Cattle yard and found Charlie & Berlyn milking. They milk 7 cows, all Shorthorn, very good ones. When milking was done we all went in & washed & found a sumptuous Breakfast awaiting us. My! My! but it was good. Around this festal board we lingered in love and affection made so by the unstinted kindness shown us by all in this beautiful Home. We feel that we have a halfway promise that Libby & Charlie & Floyd & wife will visit us next summer or Fall providing no preventing Providence intervenes. We have assured all our Kin & friends when we met that we will make it our pleasure to try to repay their uniform kindness. At 7:30 Brother Temp & I bid them goodby & started to find my Dear old comrade Lieut. Charles Disbrow. We went via Hobbs cemetery & stopped for  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour at David Hobbs wherewe had a most pleasant little visit with him & his charming Daughter Blanch, who, with her husband (DR.Sinclair) keeps house with David. Here we met a son of our old schoolmate Lafayette Webb who we were glad to meet. He impressed us as being a fine companionable fellow, certainly fine looking. We then Drove to Tipton where we saw Dear Myrtice who has just began to set up housekeeping again in Tipton. She was sore perplexed that this moving had to occur just at this time when she would have had us to visit with her. I told her not to be distressed on this account. That we would make up for it when we came again, if so it may be. We then went on to Sharpsville, where we learned that comrade Disbrow lived in Green Town to which place we proceeded to go and where we found my Dear old "Lieutenant", very lonely indeed. He having to give up his wife in Death last Jan. and his Daughter two weeks previous to our coming. This daughter was the Housekeeper for both Father and Mother for many years. Of course he could not help feeling very lonely at his age, 83. But he said so sweetly and so hopeful, "I am just awaiting the call of my master. It won't be long." Then he said, "I am so glad you thot enough of me to come and see me and I am so glad to see that you are so well preserved. Are you still in the Faith and hope and Trust that you were baptised in 1868? I told him I surely was and am so glad to know that you are, as ever, a champion of these three great attributes of christian Religion. We then had some conversation about matters of our service which was made plain to me.

We are indebted to L. F. Dick's granddaughter, Miss Corinne Dick, of 906 Newark, Coffeyville, Kansas for this account, copied from the original. Leroy Franklin Dick was born in Hamilton County, Indiana on July 7, 1842. He was the son of William and Mary (Beeson) Dick. He enlisted in the Civil War from Hamilton County and the occasion of this trip was a reunion of the 57th Indiana Infantry, Co. H, and other Indiana Civil War veterans in Indianapolis on Sept. 27, 1921. His wife, Mary Ann Cornelius Dick, whom he refers to as "Mother", accompanied him on the trip. She was also a native of Hamilton County. They had left Indiana in 1868 and settled in Labette County, Kansas. They later moved to Parsons. His last trip before this back to Indiana was in 1899. Mr. Dick died April 12, 1939 in Parsons, Kansas at the age of 97. His wife, Mary Ann Cornelius Dick had died Dec. 23, 1934, also in Parsons.

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THE NORTH CAROLINA REGULATORS

The history of North Carolina during the royal period is, like that of other colonies, the story of a constant struggle between representatives of the people and the representatives of the crown. There were disputes over questions of government, of commerce, of finance and of religion. In the "back country" extortionate fees, excessive taxes, and the oppressive manner of collecting them brought about a popular uprising, known as the Regulation. Violence followed the refusal to pay taxes, and in Sept. 1768 Gov. William Tryon was forced to lead a military expedition against the Uplanders or the Regulators. They, however, were not prepared to withstand the governor's "lowland" forces and submitted without bloodshed. New outbreaks occurred in the fall of 1770 when Upland leader Harmon (Or Herman) Husband had been arrested and jailed at New Bern, where grim Gov. Tryon was building a wilderness palace for himself and his successors. The Uplanders, the Regulators, took matters into their own hands and marched on New Bern with the amiable double intent of freeing Husband and burning the town. To the amazement of the generally unpopular Tryon, his old enemies the planters, stormy opponents of the Crown and its officials rallied to his side. Thus, on May 16, 1771, with a force of about 1,000 officers and men, he met about twice that number on the banks of the Alamance, where after two years of fighting, with losses on each side nearly equal, the undisciplined Regulators were routed. About 15 were taken prisoners, and of these seven were executed. The survivors could only wait in seething anger for their next chance. Did you have an ancestor who was a Regulator?
