WILL OF SAMUEL GAINOR

In the name of God-Amen

The last will and testament of Samuel Gainor of Terrell county in the Province of North Carolina-planter-where as I Samuel Gainer, Senior, being of perfect health and memory at this present writing prays be to God for it and well knowing the uncertainty of this life, doth appoint this to be my last will and testament in manor and form as followeth.

First I bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God our Heavenly Father, hoping through the mercy of my blessed Savior Jesus Christ to obtain mercy and forgiveness for all my sins and as for my body to be buried at the discretion of my executor in decent Christian manner and as for that small potion of goods, as it hath pleased God to lend me in this life. I give as follows:

Item: I give to my well beloved wife-Ann Gainer, one featherbed and all the furniture there unto belonging, and one cow and calf.

Item: I give to my son James Gainer five shilling present current money of Virginia.

Item: I give to my son Samuel Gainer, five shillings current money of Virginia.

Item: I give to my son William Gainer, one pound, fifteen shillings, Virginia current.

Item: I give to my daughter Mary Whitley, five shillings Virginia current.

Item: I give to my daughter Elizabeth Griffen, five shillings Virginia currency.

Item: I give to my son Thomas Gainer, one pound fifteen shillings, Virginia currency.

Item: I give to my son Arthur Gainer, one pound fifteen shillings, Virginia currency.

Item: I give unto my daughter Fary Fainer, five shillings, current money of Virginia.

Item: I give unto my son, Joseph Gainer, my negro man, after the decease of my well beloved wife, she to enjoy the use of said negro without any molestation during her life and after decease to go to the said Joseph Gainer, or his assigns.

Item: I give to my son Benjamin Gainer the plantation and land therunto belonging after the decease of my wife. she to enjoy the land during her life without any molestation and after decease to him, the said Benjamin Gainer and his heirs forever.

Item: I give to my grand daughter Murning Gainer, one cow and calf.

And for all the rest of my estate I lend to my well beloved wife during her widowhood and after decease to be equally divided amongst my children and I do appoint my well beloved wife and my son Samuel Gainer to be my whole and sole executors of this my last will and Testament.

In witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal This first day of October in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and fifty one.

JOSEPH GAINOR'S WILL Sept 18, 1793 old will book pg 288
- Born 1725 Tyrell Co North Carolina Beaufort County, North Carolina

In the name of God Amen. I Joseph Gainer of the State of North Carolina and the county of Beaufort, N. C. Knowing the certainty of death, and that it is appointed of all men. Once to die, I do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner, and form following there by revoking, annulling, and making void all wills by me here tofore made. In Primis.

My will and desire is that my executors here after named do speedily and punctually pay my just debts.

1st Item. My will and desire is that my beloved wife have the use of my dwelling house and plantation and land where on I now live and all my other property during her widowhood. For her support.

My will and desire is that after the expiration of my wife's widowhood that the aforesaid lands consisting of twelve hundred acres, all adjoining and lying on both sides of the creek, should fall to my son Joseph Gainer and his lawful issue forever. And if the said Joseph Gainer should die without lawful issue then the lands is to be equally divided between my daughters, Isabella and Drepina Gainor, that is to say, the plantation that I now live on to be given to Drepina and the plantation over the creek to be given to Isabella .

2nd Item: I also give and bequeath to my son Joseph a negro boy, named Jack and six cows and calves, one bed and furniture

I also give and bequeath to my daughter Isabella six cows and calves, one bed and furniture

I also give and bequeath to my daughter Drepina six cows and calves, one bed and furniture.

I also give unto my daughter Hannah Clements the negro wench, Venus and all her increase during her natural life. After her death, said wench and her increase to be equally divided between the rest of her children.

If all her children should die without lawful issue then the said wench to be returned and all her increase back to the rest of her brothers and sisters.

I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Penelope Lanier one negro boy named Quash. I also give unto Barsheba Gainor Andrew one negro boy named London

I also lend unto my daughter Isabella Andrews one negro girl named Silvey, during her natural life and after decease she and her increase to be divided between her lawful issue if any and if not said wench and her increase to be returned and divided equally between brother Joseph and her sisters.

I also lend unto my daughter Drewpina one negro girl named Ester during her natural life and after decease, she and her increase to be divided between her lawful issue if any and if not said girl named Ester with all her increase be returned and divided in the manner before mentioned that is to say to her brother and sisters.

Item I also give and devise unto my Grandson Gainor Carroway a certain tract of land containing two hundred acres bought of Austin Swenson commonly known by the name of Tillers Ridge to him and his lawful issue forever if any, and if not to his sister Barsheba Caroway. And her lawful issue if any. And if not said tract or parcel of land to be returned to my son Joseph Gainor. I also will and desire after my wife's widowhood, that the following negro namely Moses, Friday, Hercules and Presby and Sinnay and Ning go to

be equally divided between my son Joseph and his sisters
to my grand children, Gainor Carroway and Barsheba
Carroway, but if they should die without lawful issue
that it should return to my son Joseph and his sisters.

Item My will and desire is that my executor raise out
of my estate eighty pounds current money and purchase
a likely negro girl for the use of my two grandchildren
Gainor and Barsheba Caraway and in case that my two
grandchildren should die without lawful issue or heirs
issue begotten of their body. My will is that the
negro girl and her increase if any be returned to my
son Joseph Gainor and sisters.

Item My will and desire that my son Joseph Gainor
have my working still.

Item my will and desire is that after my wife's death
or widowhood that the whole of my estate not mentioned
be equally divided between the whole of my children
that is now living and my two grandchildren Gainor and
Barsheba Caraway have an eighth of all the residue of
my estate that is not mentioned if they live and have
lawful issue.

Lastly, I do hereby nominate, constitute, ordain and
appoint my friend, William Clements, Warren Andrews
and William Gainor and my loving wife Susanna Gainor
to be executors to my last will and testament in
witness where of. I have here unto set my hand and
seal this eighteenth day of Sept one thousand and
seven hundred and ninety three, signed and sealed
and acknowledged to be the last will and testament of
the above sia.
