
PLAINVILLE UNDEFEATED IN THIRTY-TWO CONSECUTIVE GAMES

The Plainville Cardinal football team won 27 straight games and tasted no defeat in 32 games.



The second team Cards come in for their share of glory. Their record is 11 wins and 8 losses. They won the first place trophy in the MCL B-Team tournament.






