




This Woodmen Band in 1907 and 1908 led the downtown parades in Liberal.







Epworth Hospital was built in 1919 by the Methodist Church Conference at a cost of \$87,000.00. A three story building of copper chief brick with Bedford stone trim, it had 54 rooms, including an operating room, clinic room, X-ray department, diet kitchen, dining room, storage room and laundry. In later years additions were made and remodeling has been done.
