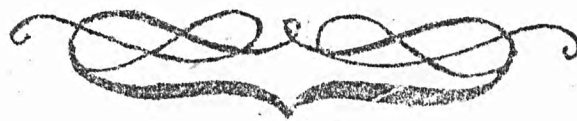

## STRYKER

Aged Fredonian Died at Her Home Northwest of Town, May 3

---

Elizabeth Josephine Stryker was born September 15, 1850 at Huntington, W. Va., and died May 3, 1934 at her home near Fredonia, Kans. She was the oldest daughter of Calvary Chapman and Nancy Jane Paine. She spent her early childhood in W. Va., moving to Iowa in 1855 and in 1856 to Jasper Co., Mo.

She was married August 19, 1868, to Jacob Lowe Stryker, to which union ten children were born; Mary Eliza, Alfred Calvary, Laura Ann, Jacob Lowe, Bruce Everett, Charles Franklin, Maurice DeWilton, John Earl, Wm. Lester and Edmund Milburn. Earl died at the age of ten years. Milburn was drowned in Wyoming at the age of 29 years. The rest of the children are living and were with their mother during her last illness.

She first came to Wilson Co. in 1870. In 1872 she and her husband settled on the homestead where her family was reared, and where she spent the last years of her life. Despite the fact that her large family consumed much of her time, she found time to take part in the welfare of the community. She was an active member of the M. E. Church of Grand Valley. For 8 years she was supt. of the Sunday School. Later, she transferred her church affiliations to the Methodist Church of Fredonia, of which she was still a member at the time of her death. She was also a member of the Eastern Star of this city and for years was active in the Fredonia Woman's Relief Corps.

Mrs. Stryker was one of our last pioneers. She sprang from the pioneer stock of America who carved their homes from the wilderness lands of Va. and later took part in the great struggle that gained them political freedom. Her father's ancestors, the Chapmans, lived near Tays Valley, Va. Her mother also resided in Va., and was a direct lineal descendant of Robert Treat Paine, who signed the Declaration of Independence.

She inherited from her ancestors the strong character, the indomitable courage, the steadfastness of purpose and the unconquerable spirit, all of which virtues were so conspicuous in the lives of the early founders of this country.

Coming when a girl to a new country where even the comforts of life were unknown, she spent her time helping to build a home that she later saw ruthlessly destroyed during the Civil War. While her father was serving in the Union Army, marauding hands destroyed his home and laid waste his lands; causing the ultimate death of his wife, and untold hardship to his children. Mrs. Stryker supplies for her mother and younger members of the family, was met by Quantrall and his band. These raiders took the supplies and her shoes but, upon the direct orders of the leader, she was allowed to keep her horse and to go unharmed to her home.

After the war, she assisted in the support of her father's family, teaching school and working and helping care for the younger members of the household. Two years after her marriage she came with her husband to Kansas to build, anew,

in a land that was then rugged and wild. Here, they resided, taking from the soil by hard work and endurance that with which they built their home and reared their growing family. They lived in this home until they were parted by the death of her husband, May 28, 1906. Since that time she has maintained the old home, surrounded by her children and friends, living her life to its end amid the comforts and joys she made with her own hands.

Besides the children, Mrs. Stryker is survived by 27 grandchildren, 6 great grandchildren, one sister, Mrs. Sigel Brown, of Avilla, Mo., one half-sister, Mrs. Jewell Driver of Carthage, Mo., and two half-brothers, D. A. Chapman and C. M. Chapman of Avilla, Mo.

Funeral services were held at the M. E. Church in Fredonia at 10 o'clock Saturday morning and were conducted by the pastor, Rev. J. W. Campbell. Interment was in Fredonia Cemetery.

Pall bearers were her 6 sons and the music for the service was furnished by Mr. & Mrs. Fred Rettig, Miss Anna Bailie and F. D. Harlan, with Mrs. Don Fink at the organ.

Just after his return from the war he came to Lynn county, Kans., where he resided for about 40 years; then moved to Neosho Falls, then removed to his farm near Toronto, and later moved to town where he resided until his death. He was converted and united in the Baptist Church at 17 years of age. Some years later he joined the Methodist Episcopal Church and remained an active member until the end of life. He was the father of 5 children, one son preceded him to the beyond. He leaves behind two sons, two daughters and a devoted companion.

Grandpa Pendley, as he was called, was held in the highest esteem by all who knew him and a host of friends mourn his death. He was very patient in his afflictions, not a murmur passed his lips.
