THE GENEALOGISTS' PARADISE

I found my genealogists' paradise in Salt Lake City at the Library of the Genealogical Society of the Latter Day Saints. There may be other places just as good, but I haven't been to any of those places.

Your only problem is what to do first. You are so eager to look around and to plunge right in. It is all right to take a quick look just to get the overall picture of what is there and where. The attendant at the information desk is glad to offer suggestions, and you will find this same helpful attitude throughout the building.

Even tho you have read the statistics of over 100,000 books, and over 750,000 microfilms with 250 microfilm readers on which to read them, you can't really conceive of this marvelous collection all in one place, which is being added to constantly.

As in all libraries, the first thing to do is to consult the card catalog. There is one section for specific family names which should be the beginning of your research, as there are many family histories already compiled.

This should be easy if you have done your homework well in providing yourself with an alphabetized master list of all the people you are working on, as these names are alphabetically arranged. When you copy the references given it is important that you copy all of the numbers and letters in the reference exactly as they are written, i.e. capitalized or small letters. If there is an "F" above the reference this denotes a microfilm instead of a book, but sometimes they will have both listed on one card if they have the microfilm as well as the book.

I recommend that you copy all the references down before you start your research. It may take more than half a day but it must be done sooner or later.

The next step will be to copy all the references given for the locations your ancestors were known to have been. Again, this would be easy if you had done your homework and prepared a notebook with a tab for each state, and under that tabs for each county with a sheet of notebook paper showing the names of all the ancestors who were in that county and about what period, also listing their birth and death dates, as well as their wife's name and date of marriage. The names of the parents might be helpful if you have so many ancestors you can't remember, or if it is a name frequently used in the family. I had not done this and wasted a lot of time having to go over the same material. The references should be written on separate pieces of paper so you will always have this sheet to add to as you find additional ancestors and to take on your next research trip.

The kinds of materials you may find under the counties would be Federal Census records, probate records, deeds, cemetery records, county histories, tax lists, parish and church records and Rev. or Civil War veterans buried there. They will usually mention whether indexed or not, and if it is not indexed you

have to pass it up most of the time as it is too time-consuming. So always index anything you do.

The census records are on micro-film and sometimes they also have them in book form. The references will show this information on the same card. They also have a table near the card catalog with books giving census references for both the U.S. and Canada.

Under the State references there will be much general information which covers all or many counties, so you should copy as many of these references as you feel will be of benefit to you. Under this category you might find "Rev. War Soldiers Buried in Illinois", etc.

Now, I'm sure that you just can't wait any longer, so you go to the basement where the books and microfilms for the U.S., Canada, Great Britain and Ireland are. There might be others but these were all I noticed. I know the Swiss and German records were on the first floor, but I didn't pay any attention to the others. They have consultants on each of the main countries who try to help you, but I found you had to have the location very well pin-pointed in order to do any good.

You are supposed to get your own microfilms from the many steel file drawers, which are very well identified, but there are girls who will help you any time you need help. You are not to refile the microfilms as a misfiled one is lost as far as being available for use. They have a copier to make copies of any part of the microfilm you would like copied and charge only 15¢ a page.

There are regular copiers you may use yourself for only 10¢ a page. These are a great time-saver.

You are expected to get the books from the open stacks yourself, so that is one reason you must be careful to copy the reference number completely and accurately. You are not to reshelve the books, as they are hard to find if not in the proper place.

On the 1st floor there are slips you may fill out requesting information on an individual, and if they have any information they will place it in a box nearby for you to pick up at a certain time. They had over 90 million cards on individuals on the most recent information I read on this wonderful library.

On this same floor there are hundreds of large ledgers containing family group sheets- all filed alphabetically, which you are welcome to look through. They want everyone to supply them with these family group sheets, as they are so helpful to the people of their religion, as well as the rest of us. This is one way we can repay them for sharing this wealth of information without charge.

It is important that all genealogists and historians everywhere supply this wonderful organization with a copy of everything they collect, even in manuscript form.

You may write in ahead to determine what is available for the particular areas you are working on, and if there is nothing it might pay you to go to the county seats involved.

They will give you some information free by mail if it doesn't require too much time, so it is worth a try, but do plan to make a trip to Salt Lake City as soon as you can. Flossie Scofield.

This letter from Benjamin HODGES to his daughter, Elizabeth Jane (HODGES) OWEN, was found in the Owen family Bible in the possession of Janet K. PEASE. She has copied it exactly as it is, complete with spelling errors. Benjamin himself didn't write the letter as he couldn't write, so had to get a neighbor to write it for him. Elizabeth OWEN lived in Macomb, Ill. at the time, the letter was postmarked Quincy, Illinois.

Graystone, Wilson County, Kansas
June the 8, 1870

Dear Dauter:

I take this Present Opertunity to rite you afew lines to Let you know that I am in tolarble good health at this time But hae a very hard spell of sickness here 3 or 4 weeks ago I was troubled with my kidney But I have got over it now. the measseals raiged (measles raged) here terebly Last Spring your uncle Thomas folks all had them and Marions Folks had them Marion died with them he died on the 16th of April. I am coming back to Illinois if I have good luck and I want to start by the first of next July. Marion Hodges Wife and children air going back to thair folds and I am going to go as far as Mt Sterling with her. We had the coldest winter here the Past Winter that was ever known here in Kansas the winter killed all the fruit and wee have a very Backward spring and it is Wet Besides the People air not done Planting corn yet the Wheat and oats looks well, thair is a good Prospect for Plenty of small grain this season. I got a Letter From Mary about a week ago and tha (they) was Well, the (they) have got 33 acres of good wheat this year. the health of this county is Pretty good the Friends air all in pretty good health. you must excuse me for not riting any sooner for I cannot write myself and what riting I have done some Body Else has it to do. And I cannot get it done at evry moment I Like I could if could I do it myself I want you to rite to me immeadeaty and if you can send me 2 or 3 dollars I would like it very mutch for I Expect to be scarce of money to come back With if it is the Will of the Lord to spair me I am coming Back to stay with you all the Balance of my Days No more at Present From your father Benjamine Hodges To John Owen and Jane Owen.

(Submitted by Janet K. Pease. Note: it is unclear whether Benjamin ever made it back to Ill., there is no death record for him in McDonough Co., Ill. and he is not buried in the Owen family plot in Oakwood Cemetery, Macomb, Ill. Since this letter was carefully preserved in the family Bible, I believe that he may not ever have made the journey.)
