This has no real bearing on our group but I tho't it should be shared. From the Neo. Daily Sun, 29 Aug, 1911. Trpy, Mo., Aug. 28., Mrs. Nancy Edey, 96 years old, today married her 6th husband, Ree Inlow, 24 years old. The bride's 5th husband died 6 weeks ago at the poor farm. The Throng at the depot cheered as the pair stepped lightly aboard the train bound for Hannibal. The couple appeared oblivious to the staring crowd. The bride was gowned in a plain black dress with a belt made of a piece of leather and a clothesline. She wore a sunbonnet and appeared happy. Inlow wore overalls and a hickory shirt. He was coatless and smiled as he helped his aged bride aboard the train surrounded by eager spectators. bridegroom, too, has lived near nearly all his life. He stated he was marrying her because of his love for her. Lincoln Co has been practically keeping Mrs. Inlow for the past 5 years. She has been living in a tent between Silex and Whitesides, for the last few weeks. Mrs. Inlow drove to Silex this morning and joined Inlow. After their brief wedding journey they will return to her tent, where they will make their home until winter. The bride has tatained good health and can see without the aid of spectacles. Her hearing is also good. Mrs. Inlow is familiarly known to Silex residents as 'Aunt Nanc'. The bridegroom is employed on a farm near Silex."

HENRY WITE died last night. Last night about 11 Henry Witt, for more than 40 years a res. of Neodesha and vic., died at his home 712 Indiana, aged almost ol years. The cause of death was a general wearing out but he had suffered greatly before his death. Funeral services will be held at the home at 10AM tomorrow, Mar. 12 12, 1913, conducted by Rev. H. H. Rhule. Interment will be in Choteau Cem. in Mrgy. Co. & mi. SE of Neodesha with honors of GAR. Henry Witt was b. in Knox Co., Ohio and there grew to manhood and marr. Miss Rebecca Garrett. In 1870, with his fam., a wife and 6 children, he came to Kans. and sett. on a farm in Mtgy. Co. He was a harness maker by trade and had a harness shop on his farm. In 1889 his wife died and the next year he was marr. to Mrs. M. J. McPaul, who survives him. Soon after his second marr. he moved to Neodesha and engaged in the harness bus. for about 6 years. ... Mr. Witt served 4 years and 3 mo. in the Civil War, Co. A., 65th Ohio Inf. and was wounded in the ankle by a bullet. .. He was a member of he Methodist Church... Of the 6 children but 2 are now living, Geo. of Nowata, Okla. and Mrs. Lizzie Donlavy of Salem, Ore. Mr and Mrs Geo Witt are here. Neodesha Daily Sun, 11 Mar 1913

ALBERT W. EVANS, aged 45 years died at 1 AM at his home, 402 W. Main of pneumonia. Deceased leaves a wife and 6 children, Iva, Lizzie, Eunice, Laura, Walter and John, and parents and 4 bro. and 2 sis. at the old home in London, Ky. and 2 bro. in Kans, J. D. at LaFontaine and J. N. of Neodesha, both of whom were with the fam. at the death bed. The funeral will be Wed. afternoon at 2 at the Baptist Church with Rev. R. W. Shaw in charge. Interment will be in Fairview Cem. Cherryvale Republican. --Mr. Evans and fam. formerly lived in Neodesha and mov. here about 4 years ago. When here he was employed at the smelter.

MRS. MARGARET BERRIGAN, mother of Abner, Thomas and Wm. Berrigan of Neodesha, and Daniel of Muskogee, Gkla, died at the home of Thos. SE of town last night at midnight, aged about 85 years, of old age. Mrs. Berrigan was a native of Ireland and an old and respected res. of this vic. She was the mother of 9 children. Five of them are buried at St. Paul Kans. and her husband, Patrick Berrigan, who d. about 5 yrs. ago is buried there also. St. Paul having been their home when they first came to Kans. The sons are all here and expect to start tonight at midnight for St. Paul with the body of their mother where, tomorrow, funeral services will be held at the Cath. Church. Interment will be in the Catholic Cem. at St. Paul by the side of her husband and children.

MRS. MARY AYARS, aged 81 years, 6 mos. and 23 days, wife of Henry Ayars, died at her home at 510 Iowa, yesterday aft. after an illness of several days with a severe case of lagrippe. Funeral services will be held at the res. Sun. afternoon at 2 conducted by Rev. J. Kansas Morgan and interment in Neodesha Cem. Mary Haas was b: in Badan, Germany, 15 Jul 1831 and grew to womanhood in Germany and marr, a man with the same name as hers, They came to America and sett. in Pa. in 1854 where Mr. Haas died. In 1856 Mrs. Haas came to Ks., sett. at Leavenworth where on 15 Apr 1861 she was marr. to Henry Ayars. They came to Wilson Co. in 1872. To this union 5 children were born. One died in infancy. The others are Mrs. Mary Ward of Wichita, Miss Maggie Ayars and Chas. Ayars of Neodesha and Mrs. Lizzie Shaffer of Francis Okla. There are 7 grandchildren. All the children are here and when Clarence Ward arrives from Francis tonight, the g'chn will all be present. Two nephews of Mr. Ayars, John Licktie of Garnett and Joe Licktie of Greeley came last night. She was a member of the Evangelical Church.. 1913 Neodesha Daily Sun 8 Feb 1913

J. W. MONROE aged 72 years, better known as 'Buck' Monroe, a farmer of this community for nearly 30 years, died at his home just W of Neodeshaathis morning at 5,30 of erysipelas with which he had been afflicted for about 3 weeks. Funeral services will be held tomorrow at Monroe Chapel on N. 11th at 2, conducted by Mrs. Melissa Rainey of the Holiness Church. Pall bearers .. members of the GAR. ... members of AHTA invited to attend in a body. Interment in the Neodesha Cew. John Wilson Monroe was born in Licking Co Ch. and at the age of 11 went to Ill with his par. He went then into Laurel Co Ky and was there marr. July 16, 1871 to Miss Iduma Elam who survives him without issue . . . they came to Kans in 1884 where they liv. continuously in Neodesha since. He served 3 years in Co. E, 98th Ill. Cav....It was thru his activity that the Holiness organization has a meeting house on N. 11th and for this reason it is named Monroe Chapel. Hugh Monroe, a bro., died a few months ago and another bro., who is an invalid, lives in Palestine, Ill. Ransom Elam of Winfield a bro. of Mrs. Monroe, is expected here to attend the funeral. Neodesha Daily Sun 17 Jan. 1913

MRS. THOMAS MONTGOMERY aged 71 years, died at her home 5 mi NE of Neodesha last night at 11 after a short illness of acute indigestion. Funeral services will be held Sun. at 11AM in Bethel Chapel, by Rev. M. A. Follat, pastor of the U.B. Church at Buffville, and interment in Bethel Cem. Mrs. Montgomery's maiden name was Lousaner Rutledge. She was born in Gibson Co., Ind. where she grew to womanhood and marr. Mr. Montgomery. .. came to Kans. 28 years ago and sett. on the farm which has ever since been her home. He died 12 years ago. ..six children, 4 of whom survive. They are Arthur, Frisco fireman, of Neo., and Newton, Jos., and Lawrence, who have made their home with their mother on the farm. Neodesha Daily Sun 18 Jan 1919

CAPT. S. H. JULIAN aged 91 years and 6 mos. passed peacefully away this morning soon after midnight at the home of his dau. Mrs. H. L. Hale. Funeral serv. will be held at the home 908 Osage tomorrow afternoon at 2. Interment in Neodesha Cem. Capt. Julian had been a res. of Neodesha but 8 years and at this time of course had retired from active life, but he was a striking figure in his walks about town, his gaunt and erect frame amd military bearing giving evidence that in time he had been a powerful man, both mentally and physically. Born in Monroe Co Tenn, in 1837, he went with his par. to Green Co., Mo. where he was educated...marr. at 21, May 15 1043, Miss Sarah L. Vestal, a native of Ind. He was a farmer and a J P for 12 years. In 1862 he was made Capt. of the No. state Militia and during that year he participated in several battles....in 1863 he was appt. recruiting agent for his cong. dist. and enrolled over 1,200 men into the Union Army...... After the war Mr. Julian still lived in Mo. til he and his aged wife came to Neodesha to live with their dau. Mrs. H. L. Hale. Mrs. Julian died here about 6 years ago. Five children born to them grew to maturity and marr. One son, C. F. Julian died leaving a fam. Those living are Mrs. Hale, R. F., Miami, Fla., Mrs. Mary Forshee, Pomona, Cal.; S. H., C. E. Mrs. George Martinson and Mrs. Robt. McDonald all of this city are grandchildren. ..member Presbyterian Church, Mason, Odd Fellow, and GAR. Neodesha Daily Sun 4 Oct. 1913

W. R. PURKAPILE died today, aged 73 years, at his home in the NW part of town after a short illness with lagrippe...Interment was in Neodesha Cem. W. R. Purkapile was born in Menard Co Ill, coming to Wilson Co. in 1882 and settl. on a farm 2 mi. N of Fredonia where he lived til he moved to Neodesha in 1903. Since his wife's death July 23, 1905, he has lived alone, taking his meals at the home of his son, C. O., near by. Another son, John, lives just N of Neodesha. Other children are Harry, whose home is here, James of St. John Oregon, Frank of Hamlin, Tex, Will of Eureka, Kans, Mrs. L. E. Mowry of Sedalia, Mo. and Miss Clara Purkapile of Denver, Colo. ...member of AHTA. Neodesha Daily Sun 21 Feb 1911

MRS. SARAH DUFT, aged 71, d. at the home of her son, Ezra Duft N of town, at 7:15 PM last eve. after illness of sev. months. Funeral services were held at home this aft. 3 PM, by Rev. J. W. Megan, Baptist Church, interment in Neodesha Cem. Mrs. Duft's husband died here 2 years and a half ago. She leaves 6 sons and 3 dau. Three of the sons live at Neodesha, one at Fay, Ckla, one at Thayer, and one at Great Bend. The 3 dau. live at Thayer. All are here to attend the funeral except the son at Great Bend and the one in Okla.

This cemetery is near New Albany. Cross the RR west of Owen Mason's and the cemetery is back in the fields near the river on a place where the banks are very high and it does not flood.

Mrs. Ray Garrett took Mrs. J. D. Long, Mrs. Howard Cantrall and Mrs. Giles Creager to visit this cemetery in the spring 1964. We found it needs to be fenced, brush removed and mowed. There were wild flowers in bloom and the stones were beautiful but need to be set up.

The first account book is obviously missing since he started practicing here in 1867 and continued until his death in 1907. Some of the pages were undated but were in the book containing the earliest entries so it can be assumed that they were in the 1800s. The short list at the end of this article is the babies he delivered, and this is the only record there is of the births. Some in paranthesis have been identified.
