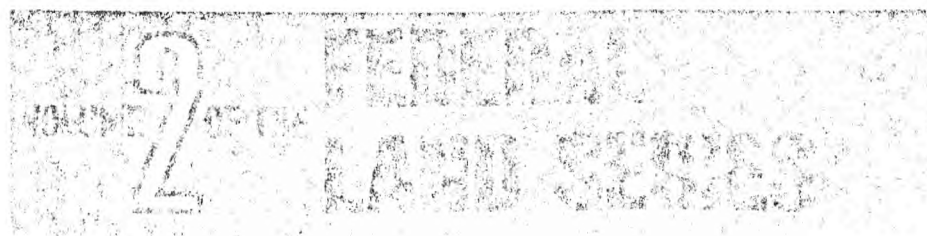

This outstanding work is of particular interest to genealogical researchers seeking evidence of Revolutionary War service of ancestors.

The assignability of bounty-land warrants based on certificates of military service made possible a vigorous business in large-scale land speculation. This relatively neglected aspect of American land policy is thoroughly illustrated in Smith's book, clearly showing the identities of the major land speculators and the extent of their holdings.

This volume also provides much more information of great value: it lists bounty-land warrants exchanged for scrip, it provides exact tract descriptions for certain Ohio counties, it reveals the extent of political intervention in locating land grants, it includes "reaveats" or warnings of fraudulent warrant sales.

Elizabeth (Bessie) married Cleveland Polson and their two children were Grant and Bonnie Polson. Vera Wilson married Alvin McCall and their two children were Arthur and Shirley McCall.

Arthur Robert Maxwell was born Feb. 3, 1874 at New Albany, Kans., and died in 1942 at Nashua, Montana. He is buried in the cemetery at Glasgow, Montana. He never married.

Barnabas Gable was born in 1770 in Pa., and married Elizabeth Cohen on Dec. 18, 1795 in Greene Co., Tenn. His name appears on the muster roll of a company of gunmen under the command of Capt. Removed to Platte Co., Mo. in 1839 and to Kansas in Feb., 1855; Elias Gable, born in 1813 in Greene Co., Tenn., and died Mar. 31, 1888, and is buried in the Maxwell family plot at Weakley Cemetery, Wilson Co., Kans. He married Elizabeth Hocket, born in Greene Co., Tenn. and died in Platte Co., Mo.

Elias Gable and Elizabeth Hocket Gable removed from Greene Co., Tenn. to Platte Co., Mo. in 1832 or 1833. Their children were: Henry Gable, born Jan. 28, 1832 in Greene Co., Tenn. and died July 23, 1910 at Edmond, Okla. (Okla. Co.). He married Abigail Bowers Feb. 25, 1897. (He was a prisoner of war at Galveston, Tex. during the Civil War, having been captured at Poison Springs, Ark. during a battle for supplies there.)

The second child of Elias and Elizabeth Hocket Gable was Elizabeth Jane born Oct. 13, 1833, Platte Co., Mo., and died April 9, 1909. She married Eli Roach. The third child of Elias and Elizabeth Hocket Gable was Tabitha Gable, born Mar. 3, 1835, Liberty, Mo., married Robert Maxwell April 2, 1854 at the Christian Church in Carthage, Mo. She died Mar. 15, 1922. The fourth child of Elias and Elizabeth Hocket Gable was William Gable, born Feb. 1, 1838, at Platte Co., Mo. He married Harriet Odum and died Feb. 29, 1908.

W. W. JOHNSON, for more than 30 yrs a res. of Neodesha and vic. died at his home in this city, 11th and ill. yesterday afternoon about 2:30 aged 81 years. By occupation Mr Johnson was a farmer but he had been retired for a number of years. His aged wife, besides the son and daughters and grand and great grandchildren are left to mourn.....

NEW TROUBLE FOR CITY CLERKS -- The last Legislature made a new law that requires that all births and deaths must be registered by the city clerk. Provision was made so that the clerk will not have to do this gratis; he will be entitled to collect a fee of 25 cents for births and deaths. This law makes such registration compulsory and a fine of \$50 and sentence of 6 months in jail is tied to it to be attached to doctors, undertakers and others who may neglect their duty in the matter.....The law becomes effective the 1st of July, and thereafter all children born can have a certificate of that fact issued that may be kept as proof to be offered in court or elsewhere. ...
