## INTRODUCTION

Since this volume contains the roll of patriots of Clay County, Missouri, who went out from our midst to fight the battles of Democracy and World Freedom, it seems fitting and proper that the name, address, and branch of service of each of such freemen be preserved; for as the months and years pass the more interest in and necessity for such a roll will be felt, and the foundation for a more complete and permanent record will have been laid.

Serving as Secretary of the Local Board for Clay County, Missouri, from the very first organization to the final completion of the work of such body, which was generally known as the "Local Draft Board" and was provided for by the Selective Service Law, to raise and organize the greatest army in the history of the United States—an army that very materially helped subdue the war-mad Hun, I feel a personal interest in this small part of the whole as pertaining to the greatest of world wars. A very large number of the names of the following list of soldiers and sailors were duly registered by our Local Board and were either inducted into the various branches of service by us or volunteered into the branch of service of their choice. And, coming in touch with the soldiers and sailors of this list, we were to see and know the "cream of the land," the bravest, the manliest, and the most physically fit; and, having seen and examined them, heard them talk and come to under-

stand them, we had the spirit of patriotism grow in us, and we were repaid for our earnest efforts.

The Local Board worked hard and faithfully during the year and half of our drafted service, and long and tedious seemed the days and weeks of the labor necessary to carry on the work; but, by having the hearty and efficient assistance of the Legal Advisory Board, consisting of every lawyer in the county, listed as a permanent or associate member, and also the Medical Advisory Board, and with the full co-operation of the whole community, we had the matter well in hand.

Having done the work that came before me with the full knowledge of the importance of it, and given it my best judgment as I saw the proper course to be pursued, and now feeling that the end justified the means, I submit the foregoing note.

We are indebted to our Clay County boys who answered their Country's call. We should try to more fully realize the great sacrifice which they made for us. They gave up their homes and loved ones, their farms and careers in business; they went out to fight against lust and greed, and, if necessary, they went to give their lives for freedom and democracy.

Clay County did her share with every call from Uncle Sam. Our boys either enlisted or bravely answered the call of selective service; our women toiled for the boys' welfare and sent thousands of articles toward the battle lines along with the sign of the Red Cross; our men answered the calls of the four Liberty Loans, Red Cross drives, and all other calls for money.

To-day, as we pass homes here and there over our county, we see blue stars in the windows and on so many of the service flags we read "Over There." The tragical part of it all is that we find in some homes the blue stars changed to gold. These gold stars help us to realize just what it cost our county to share in the great victory beyond the seas. If money had been our only cost, it would now be an easy burden for us to bear. It took more than money to do our part. The vacant chairs and gold stars tell too well the story to almost a score of homes in our county. It was a great price to pay, and the supreme sacrifice of our boys and the broken hearts of loved ones here at home demand greater honor



than we know how to give. Their gifts are not for to-day alone, but for the future of America and the nations of the world.

We must not forget, we can not forget our boys who answered the call. Some of them sleep on the hill-side tombs somewhere in France; some of them are to-day on German soil; and many of them have returned to their homes.

In making out the Honor Roll of all our boys, great care has been taken that not a single name should be missed. It may be that mistakes have been made and some names left out, but not intentionally. The lists of names have appeared in the county papers with requests for corrections and additional names, and the publication of this book has been delayed in order that no one should be missed.

I desire here to express my appreciation to Miss Laura Campbell, Chief Clerk of the Local Board; to Mr. Edgar Archer, County Clerk; and to Mrs. Robert Withers, County Representative of the Adjutant-General's Office in collecting biographies of soldiers and sailors, who so kindly assisted in the collection of these names.

May this book, dedicated to those who made the supreme sacrifice, be a little memorial to all who were and are in the service of Uncle Sam.

Lewis Calvin Cook was the son of Mr. and Mrs. L. L. Cook, and lived near North Kansas City. He was born in Pierce County, Wisconsin, February 11, 1897.

He attended the schools at Sedalia, Missouri, and was a member of the Reorganized Church of Latter-Day Saints.

October 22, 1917, he entered the service at Chetek, Wisconsin, and was with the 132d Artillery. He was later made a commissioned First Lieutenant.

The sacrifice of life was made in the battle of the Argonne Forest, October 18, 1918.

## EARL D. CHANSLOR

Earl D. Chanslor, son of Mr. and Mrs. John W. Chanslor, was born at Kearney, Missouri, April 24, 1895.

Earl had attended the Mt. Gilead public school and at the time of entering the service he was following the occupation of farming in Oklahoma.

He was a member of a Machine Gun Company, 109th Infantry, and received training at Camp Travis, Texas. In May of 1918 he sailed from Camp Upton, and was killed in the battle of the Marne, July 15, 1918.

## PAUL HANSEN

Paul Hansen, son of Mr and Mrs. Conrad Hansen was born March 7, 1894. He was graduated from the Glenwood school in 1908 and attended the Christian Church at Antioch and the Evangelical Church at Northmoor. He was an active worker in the Young People's League of the Evangelical Church.

Paul was one of the first to be drafted from Clay County and received his short training at Camp Funston. He began his duties for Uncle Sam October 3, 1917, but spinal meningitis caused his death at the Base Hospital, Fort Riley, Kansas, November 26, 1917.

## CLYDE GUSTINE

Clyde Gustine was born in Excelsior Springs, May 15, 1887, and died somewhere in France, May 27, 1918. He grew to young manhood in the Excelsior Springs community. He attended the public schools of Excelsior Springs and was a member of the Baptist Sunday-school of that town.

He was one of the first Clay County boys to make the supreme sacrifice. He enlisted at Fort Madison, Iowa, in June, just before the first registration day of June 5, 1917. He was a member of Company K, 168th Infantry, 42d Division—the Rainbow Division.

Mrs. Gustine received a letter from Clyde after the first big battle in which the Americans turned back the German hordes, stating that he had come through without a scratch. In this letter, or in one closely following, while on picket duty, Clyde wrote that it would soon be time to go into the thick of another battle. He said he did not know what might happen to him this time. It was in this second battle that he was gassed and lost his life.

In a brief letter to Mrs. Gustine, Chaplain W. E. Robb stated that Clyde died as a result of gas wounds on May 27, 1918, and was buried at Pexonne, grave No. 26.

## GRAHAM T. ELLIOTT

Graham T. Elliott, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. B. Elliott, of Missouri City, was born near Liberty, Missouri, November 14, 1899. At the time of his enlistment he was following the occupation of farming. Like others from our county, Graham was anxious to do his part and entered the service at an early age in life.

Graham left Liberty with old Company H and received training at Camp Nichols and Fort Sill. He sailed with Company H and was in Company H, 140th Infantry, 35th Division.

Mr. Elliott received word from the War Department last fall stating that his son was missing in action, but could find no definite information for many months. The last letter received from Graham was dated September 23, 1918. The Red Cross took up the search and found that Graham was wounded September 26th and that hospital reports showed he had died October 2, 1918.

He was buried in the village cemetery near Bouzency, France, grave No. 138.

## BERNARD GEORGE STONE

The second Liberty boy killed in the war was Bernard George Stone, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Stone. He was born in New Baltimore, Virginia, October 15, 1897. He came to Liberty with his parents when five years old, attended the Liberty schools, and would have been a member of the senior class this year (1919). He was a member of the Liberty Baptist Church and Baptist Young People's Union.

The sacrifice was made on a quiet sector in Alsace, August 10, 1918. George was a member of the old Company H, 3d Regiment, Missouri National Guards, when the company went to the border. Later, at Camp Doniphan, he was transferred to the Headquarters Company of the 140th Infantry, and was with that company at the time of his death.

## COLEBY CHILES COWHERD

Coleby Chiles Cowherd was born at Platte City, Missouri, July 9, 1890.

He was educated in the schools at Salem, Missouri, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, Platte City, Missouri, and in William Jewell College.

On July 16, 1918, he entrained for Jefferson Barracks. Later he was transferred to Camp McArthur, Waco, Texas, where he was made a Corporal and later assigned to duty in the personnel office, Headquarters Detachment.

Coleby was selected with five others from his company, without request or the exercise of influence for the Officers' Training School, and orders for his transfer came two days before his death. He died of pneumonia following influenza, on October 12, 1918.

A paternal great-great-grandfather was a major in the Revolutionary War and his grandfather was a surgeon in the Confederate service in the Civil War. His maternal grandfather was a Captain in the Mexican and Civil Wars.

## JASPER ALEXANDER BOONE

Jasper Alexander Boone was born August 24, 1886, in Platte County, Missouri. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. George Boone, of Clay County. His school work was done in the rural schools of Platte County, where he spent about half of his life.

Jasper entered the service September 19, 1917, and was trained at Camp Funston. He was given officers' training and was made a Corporal in September, 1918. He was in Company F, 356th Infantry, 89th Division, and was never transferred from his company. His death occurred November 11th, from wounds of November 5th, received in the Argonne battle.

He was a member of the Providence Baptist Church north of Liberty and had served as clerk of the church for ten years. He was also secretary and treasurer of the Sunday-school for two years.

## J. D. JACKS

J. D. Jacks was born in Platte County, June 20, 1900. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Jacks, who formerly lived in Liberty.

J. D. attended the schools of Liberty and was a member of the Christian Church of Liberty, having united with this church in 1911.

He enlisted in Kansas City, November 12, 1916, and was ranked as a Second Class Seaman in the Dynamo Department in the United States Navy. For some time before his death he had been on the ship *Alabama*. He was removed from the ship to the Naval Hospital in Philadelphia, and died of spinal meningitis March 26, 1917. His body was brought back to Liberty and was later buried at Parkville, Missouri.

## LLOYD KINGERY

Lloyd Kingery was born in Kentucky, May 4, 1888. He was the son of Mrs. Frances E. Kingery, of Liberty.

Mr. Kingery was educated in Indiana and learned the trade of shoe-worker in Springfield, Illinois. He became an expert at the trade, and had worked in a number of the larger cities of the country.

April 2, 1918 he entered the service of his country and was trained about two months at Camp Funston. The remainder of his training was received at Camp Mills, New York. He was with Company G, 356th Infantry, 89th Division.

Mrs. Kingery received word that Lloyd was killed in action November 10, 1918, and was buried in the commune of Villemonttry (Ardennes), France.

## CARL FRED MUSBACH

Private Carl Fred Musbach was killed in action at Château-Thierry, July 18, 1918. He was a member of the 66th Company, United States Marine Corps. With the brave and fearless spirit of the Marines, Fred went through the hardest fighting of that great organization.

Fred was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Gottlieb Musbach and was twenty-six years old at the time of his death. He was born in the State of Nebraska in May, 1892, and came with his parents to Clay County when three years old. He was a member of the Second Baptist Church of Liberty, and one of the gold stars on the church service flag tells the story of the sacrifice made for his country.

This young man was the third of the Liberty boys to make the supreme sacrifice on the battle-fields of Europe.

## SELDON HOWE MURRAY

Seldon Howe Murray was born in Liberty, Missouri, April 6, 1893, the only son of Mr. and Mrs. C. S. Murray. He grew to manhood here, receiving his education in the public schools and at William Jewell College. At the time of his death he was manager of the Savings Department of the Citizens' Bank of Liberty.

In April, 1917, he was elected City Treasurer of Liberty. The following August he enlisted as a private in the Medical Corps with Base Hospital No. 21 of St. Louis, and arrived overseas in the following November. Later he was made a Corporal.

While employed in the Quartermaster's Department in France, he made application and passed a satisfactory examination for the Artillery Branch of the Officers' Training School, but orders to report for training did not arrive until after his death.

Seldon was a member of the Christian Church of Liberty, having united with that church when sixteen years old.

After a short illness from pneumonia, he passed away at Rouen, France, October 21, 1918, and was buried in St. Sevier Cemetery near that place.

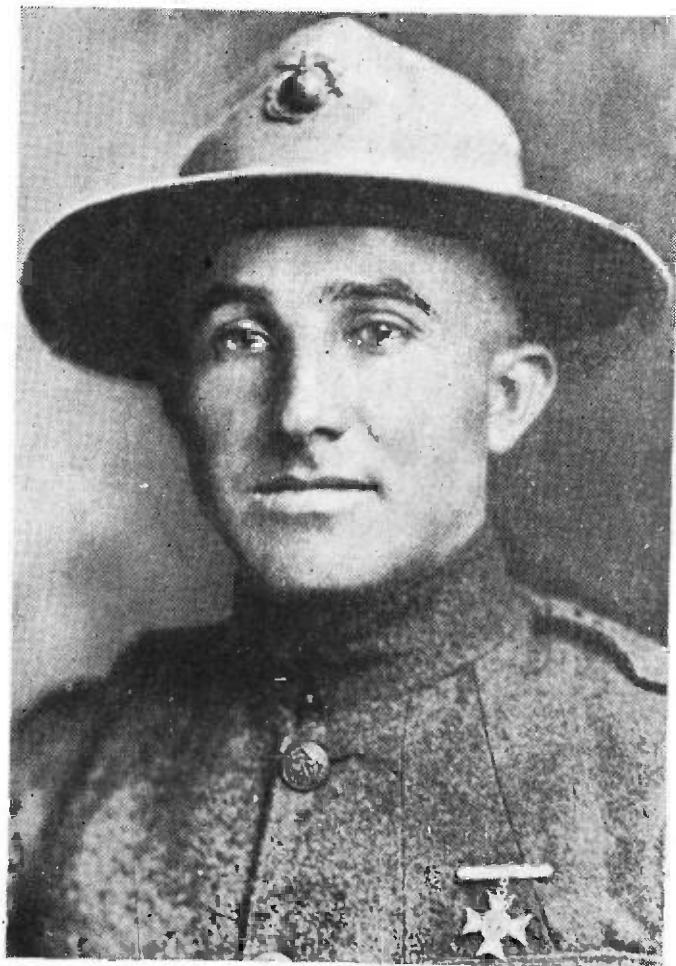
## JAMES P. IRMINGER

James P. Irminger, son of Mr. and Mrs. William Irminger, was the youngest of four sons and was born February 24, 1891. He attended the Liberty schools and spent two terms in the Agricultural College at the University of Missouri. He was a member of the Baptist Church in Liberty.

James was anxious to help win the great victory and enlisted in Kansas City, December 12, 1917. He was immediately sent to Paris Island for training. He sailed from Philadelphia, March 14th of the same year, for the active scenes of battle.

He was a member of the 16th Company, 5th Regiment, 3d Battalion, United States Marine Corps.

At 8:30 o'clock on the evening of June 30th, a company of Marines stormed a patch of woods near Château-Thierry which was filled with machine-gun nests. James was in the midst of this fight and was killed by a machine-gun bullet while doing his duty for home and country. He was the first Liberty boy to give his life for the great cause.

## OSCAR LLOYD EVANS

Oscar Lloyd Evans was the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. D. Evans and was born in Kansas City, May 6, 1900. He was a member of the Methodist Church.

March 29, 1917, Lloyd decided to enter the service of his country (although he was not quite seventeen years old) and enlisted in the Navy. He was sent to the battleship *Utah* after training at the Great Lakes.

May 14, 1917, he died at Portsmouth, Virginia, of spinal meningitis. His death occurred eight days after his seventeenth birthday, and he was one of the youngest of our Clay County boys to make the supreme sacrifice.

## SPARREL HARRIS

Sparrel Harris was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Sparrel Harris and was born near Paradise, August 17, 1886.

He attended the rural school at Prairie Home and was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church at Paradise, having united with this church when sixteen years of age.

Sparrel enlisted as a private April 26, 1918, and was with the 356th Infantry, 89th Division.

This young man, so far the only one from his community to make the supreme sacrifice, died of disease December 27, 1918, while with the Army of Occupation somewhere in Germany.

## WILLIAM EDWARD BLEVINS

William Edward Blevins was a member of the 3d Kansas National Guards until August 5, 1917, when he received an honorable discharge. He enlisted in the service against the Hun April 4, 1917. With his company he went to Fort Sill, Oklahoma, September 24, 1917. Later he was transferred to Company B, 139th Infantry, 35th Division, and sailed overseas in April, 1918.

William Edward was the son of Mr. and Mrs. John M. Blevins, of Linden, Missouri. He was born at Linden, July 28, 1898, and attended the schools at Linden and spent one year in the high school at Oskaloosa, Kansas. He was a member of the Christian Church at Barry, Missouri, and had also been a member of the Presbyterian Church at Oskaloosa, Kansas.

He was killed in the battle of the Argonne Forest by shrapnel, September 28, 1918. He was buried in the American Battle Area Cemetery at Châtel-Chenery, Ardennes, France.

## FRANK WILLAM BULLOCK

Frank William Bullock was born in Anaconda, Montana, October 19, 1890.

He was a member of the Episcopal Church at Hamilton, Montana, and a member of the Masonic Lodge. He was a graduate of Central Station Institute, Chicago, and New York Electrical School, New York. For four years he was manager of the Missouri Gas and Electric Service Company at Liberty, and manager of the Public Service Company of Oklahoma at Vinita, Oklahoma, at the time of his enlistment.

He enlisted in the Engineering Corps and was sent to Camp Humphreys, Virginia. Here he was made Acting Sergeant of Company F, 8th Troop Regular Engineers. He also made application and passed satisfactory examination for officers' training, Electrical Branch of Engineers.

In October, 1918, he had a nervous breakdown and was in the hospital two weeks when discharged. Soon after the physical breakdown, the papers came transferring him to the Officers' Training Corps. After the discharge he went to his old home in Montana to recuperate, but the high altitude affected his heart and already shattered nerves, which resulted in his death on November 21, 1918.

## STANLEY C. BARNETT

Stanley C. Barnett was born in Clinton County, January 4, 1892. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. William Barnett, and spent several years of his life near Nashua, on the farm.

Stanley attended the high school in Golden City, Mo. He was a farmer by occupation, but when the Huns needed to be turned back, Stanley left the farm and enlisted in the army of Uncle Sam. He enlisted as a private, Infantry, Regular Army, in July, 1918. After training in the camps, he crossed to the battle-fields of France. His career as a soldier was cut off by disease when he died in France, November 18, 1918.

A great-uncle, William Scarce, served in the Civil War, and a great-grandfather, General Rogers, served in the Mexican War.
