
Looking at the season from the positive side, the Homecoming victory over East Buchanan, who ranked fifth in the state at that time, is hopefully a glimpse of future victories.


The attendance record was broken at the homecoming game, and over all, the attendance at all home football games has never been higher.


If the public continues to support the program and the large group of young lettermen continue to improve, Plattsburg should have many successful seasons in the future.


With twelve lettermen returning and more hard work, the girls are looking forward to adding "winning" to the many things they learned in their initial year of basketball."




Robbin Ogle- Most Rebounds and Best Field Goal Percentage










## Industrial Arts Students "Build On" To Grade A Projects






# New History Classes Bring More Knowledge to PHS
















# Jr. High Sports Arrive


## New Courses Provide For Career Experiences.

Mrs. Bodle also taught home economics to the girls. They enjoyed preparing and tasting their own meals.











The 1974-75 girls' track season was a success in many ways. Several school records were set and the girls scored well at major track meets.




