History of Stone Cemetery

Stone Cemetery, one of the oldest burying grounds in Jasper County, is geographically located in the State of Missouri, Jasper County, Jackson Township, in the North one-half of the South East Quarter of Section 18, Township 27, Range 31. This quiet little burying plot pre-dates the Civil War by two-score years.

In 1846, Thomas Dale and his wife Elizabeth received a land grant of 400 acres from the United States Government, this acreage was soon extended to include an entire section. The sixty Negro slaves who accompanied the Dales from their home in Farrin County, Texas, were used to clear a portion of the ground for cultivation, and to set aside a small tract of land to be used as a cemetery. Around this two and one-half acre plot, the Dale slaves erected a wall of limestone. Some of the stones were hauled more than ten miles by ox-cart from Shoal Creek, the rest were quarried from Scotland hill. Entrance to this enclosure was gained through a passage along the west wall.

Records of the very early burials in the Stone Cemetery were kept by the individual families and usually recorded in the family Bible, thus no complete written record is in existence, however, many of the early interments are marked with well preserved head stones. Some of the earliest burials include: a number of the colored slaves which belonged to Thomas and Elizabeth Dale, migrants from passing wagon trains, and members of the early pioneer families.

In November 1866, the Dale family sold their vast holdings to Abraham and Eliza Collings, a pioneer family from Piatt County, Illinois. This transaction is registered in the County court records, in Carthage, Mo. in Deed Book H, at pages 165-167. The original record of this transaction is written by hand in very faded brown ink. Although this instrument is almost a century old, it is very legible and constitutes the first written record of Stone Cemetery. This deed gives an accurate description of the land that Thomas Dale sold to Abraham Collings, and gives reference to the two and one-half acre burial plot as: "A grave yard enclosed with a rock fence."

The original stone wall, which had been placed without mortar, became a natural refuge for small game, and a favorite hunting ground for sportsmen who often dislodged the rocks in an effort to reach their prey. In time, this practice almost dismantled the stone wall. Fearing that the ancient stone enclosure would soon be completely demolished, the Citizens of the community began the arduous task of procuring rock to repair the wall.

In June 1921, Frank M. Layton reconstructed the wall which had surrounded the two and one-half acre plot. Many of the original stones were replaced and mortar was used to give the wall strength. The first name of this little cemetery was "The Stone Wall Cemetery."

The first addition to the cemetery was 142 ft. of land which bordered the east boundary of the original cemetery, this addition was donated in 1915, by Eula Lane, daughter of Thomas Irwin. The second addition was donated in September 1947, by the heirs of the late Homer E. Chambers. In 1927, the east portion of the stone wall was torn down and a new wall was constructed by Ernest McReynolds, to include the additional burial space, also stone house. The first interment in this addition to Stone Cemetery, was the pioneer physician, Dr. James Brock, M. D.

The first Cemetery Association was formed in February 1915. The officers were:

The purpose of this organization was to care for the cemetery which, at that time, was almost entirely covered with undergrowth and wild vegetation. With the aid of the other community residents, Mr. Chambers and Mr. Reynolds worked long and tedious hours clearing the little cemetery of the wild vines, weeds, and saplings which had been allowed to grow unmolested for many years.

In January 1935, the first cemetery board retired and the new officers to serve in this capacity were:

The present "Stone Cemetery Association Incorporated," was formed May 26, 1941. The names which appear most often on the markers are:

Hickey, Patrick, Robinson, Cawyer, Collings.

At the present date, entrance to Stone Cemetery is gained by transversing a leaf strewn narrow lane which terminates within the walled inclosure. From the cattle guard, which marks the east entrance, one may view the quiet little park area with its well-trimmed lawns and white gravel paths.

The neat rows of monumental markers bear mute evidence of the passage of time, for many years have marched by since the beginning of this cemetery, in the early 1840's. It is with well deserved civic pride that the people of this community look upon ancient Stone Cemetery, as it lies tranquilly sleeping in peace and dignity.
