p. 9 WHEAT - Mary Ryker Wheat born June 30, 1897 died March 15, 1980 buried in the Ryker family plot between her mother and her brother, L. Earl. (she was 2nd wife of Claude C. Wheat. He is bu. Maple Park Cemetery beside his 1st wife).

p. 5 RYKER, Mary. A child, and the stone is not really legible.

Until Monday.

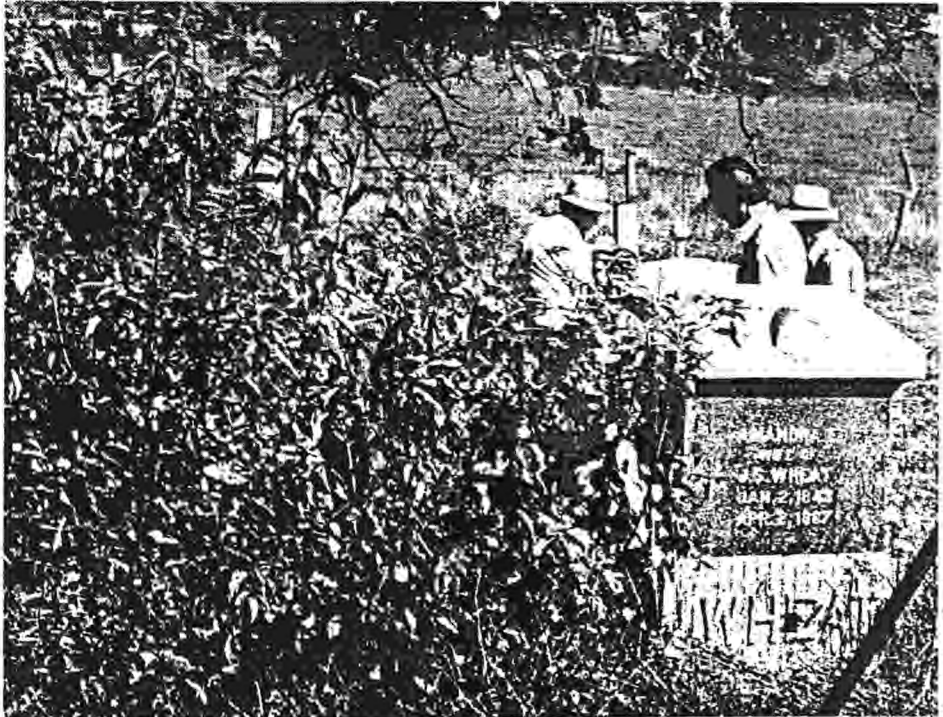
Pannell and seven other men spent the day pulling out the trees and bushes by the roots, cutting the vines and mowing around the stones.

"We're all related, more or less," Norman said.

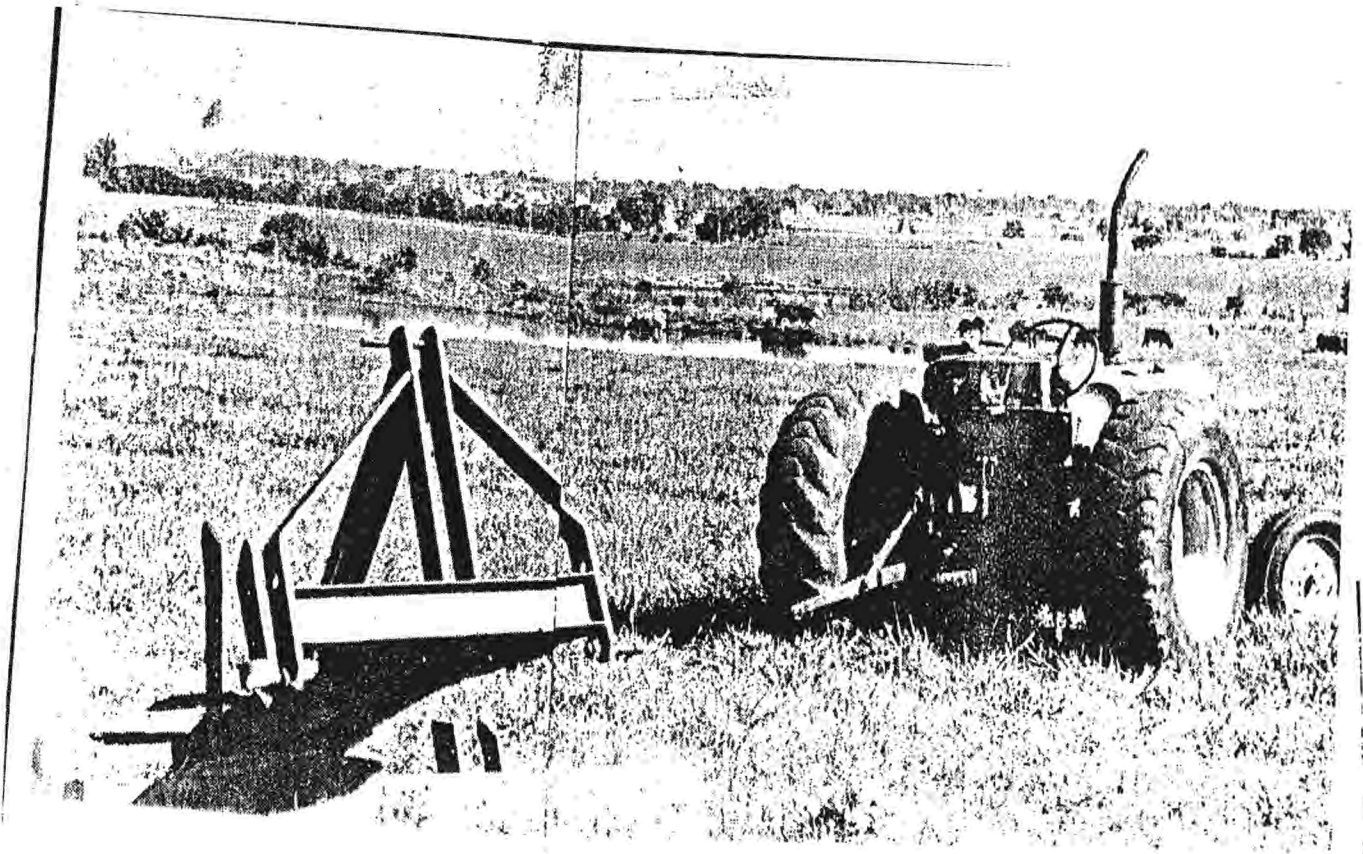
They took time out for lunch, provided by the wives, and occasional water and coffee breaks, necessary under the hot sun.

# Historical Society Is Compiling Cemetery Records

In an effort to preserve records of the people of this area, the Lawrence County Historical Society is attempting to locate and catalogue all cemeteries in Lawrence County, according to the president, Fred G. Mickwinkel, of Mount Vernon.

"With the increase in family history the past few years, more and more out of state visitors are requesting help and records," he said. "We especially need the help of the public in locating small burial sites."

Many times the locations of small abandoned graveyards are known only to the people of the community.

"We need to know these locations, even if there are only one or two graves," he said, "so we can record any data which may be on the tombstone. Eventually this

information will be filed at the society's headquarters in the Jones Memorial at Mount Vernon."

A number of records are already on file, and more are being added. Anyone who has compiled any record of burials, or tombstone inscriptions is asked to file a copy with the

We have inscriptions from Spring River Cemetery made by Herald Meyer about 1968, or so. These are at the Lawrence County Library in Mt. Vernon. ## Lawrence County Pioneers In Graves All About Us

All among us, and sometimes under us, sleep the pioneers of Lawrence county who began to move to lands left vacant when the Delaware Indians were moved into Oklahoma, the first arriving on Turnback creek in 1831.

They were few in number, in the beginning, but there were deaths among them soon, for theirs was a hard life with scant medical assistance and even less medical knowledge available to them.

Some were infants, or young mothers who died in childbirth.

There were no established cemeteries, so most burials were in family plots on the original homesteads, some as individual graves long since forgotten, some in groups which became small graveyards as neighbors were offered space. Some were marked, in the beginning, by wooden crosses, some by hand-crafted sandstone monuments which have weathered away.

When more elaborate markers were erected, many were of marble, a soft stone particularly susceptible to air pollution which has rendered some which haven't fallen or broken illegible.

Some of the early-day burial grounds are still in existence, still cared for. Some have disappeared, either on farms or in towns.

At first the county's growth was slow. The best list available from 1840 shows 158 adult males, most, but not all, heads of families. Ten years later, however, the 1850 census counted 754 families. Total population was 4,859.

Some of those 1840 family names are still familiar ones in Lawrence county; Allen, Anderson, Baugh, Browning, Cherry, Colley, Dunkel, Elkins, Ellis, Gibson, Heagerty, Henson, Hillhouse, Jennings, Lee, McGehee, McKinsey, McNatt, Miller, Mullins, Orr, Phariss, Rinker, Schooling, Taylor, Toliver, White, Williams, Williamson and Young, to name a few.

Aurora, which started from scratch in 1870 and was a town with an estimated population between 200 and 300 as late as 1880, has spread over several old graveyards.

There was once a fairly extensive burial ground beneath what is now called "the old high school". When it was built in the 1920s, the district offered to move graves, and some were moved at the request of the families. Others, however, were left, and now rest beneath the building or the school grounds.

One of those moved was the body of "Uncle Billy" Cline, whom Civil War bushwhackers had killed with

a shot through the window as he lay in bed in his home two miles north of what later became Aurora. His body now lies in the Buck Prairie cemetery (pictured).

Another forgotten burial site in Aurora was on the southwest corner of Church and Elliott. It was federal land outside the original town, and because it was owned by several who had no place to bury their dead used it. When Franklin school was built on the site most of these unmarked graves were covered up. A few were moved to the old city cemetery across Elliott.

When the Lawrence County Historical Society published the latest county history in 1974, Fred G. Mieswinkel compiled information concerning 109 cemeteries within the county border, and listed almost a score of others concerning which little is known.

One of these is a burial ground located in what became Aurora's lead and zinc mining area.

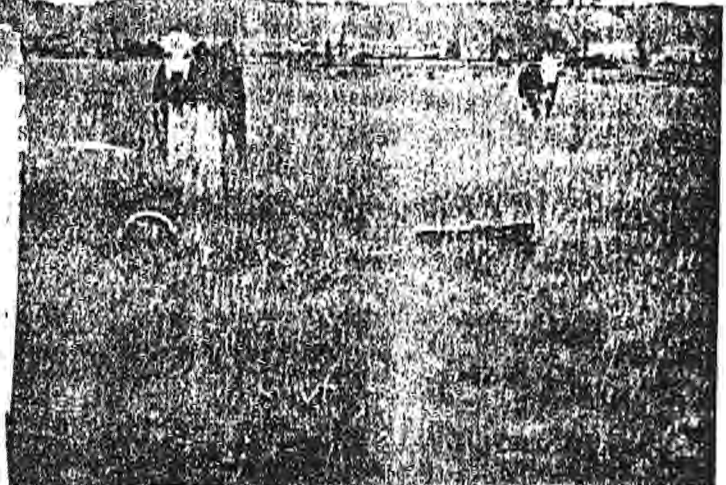

**CEMETERIES** (cont. from last week):

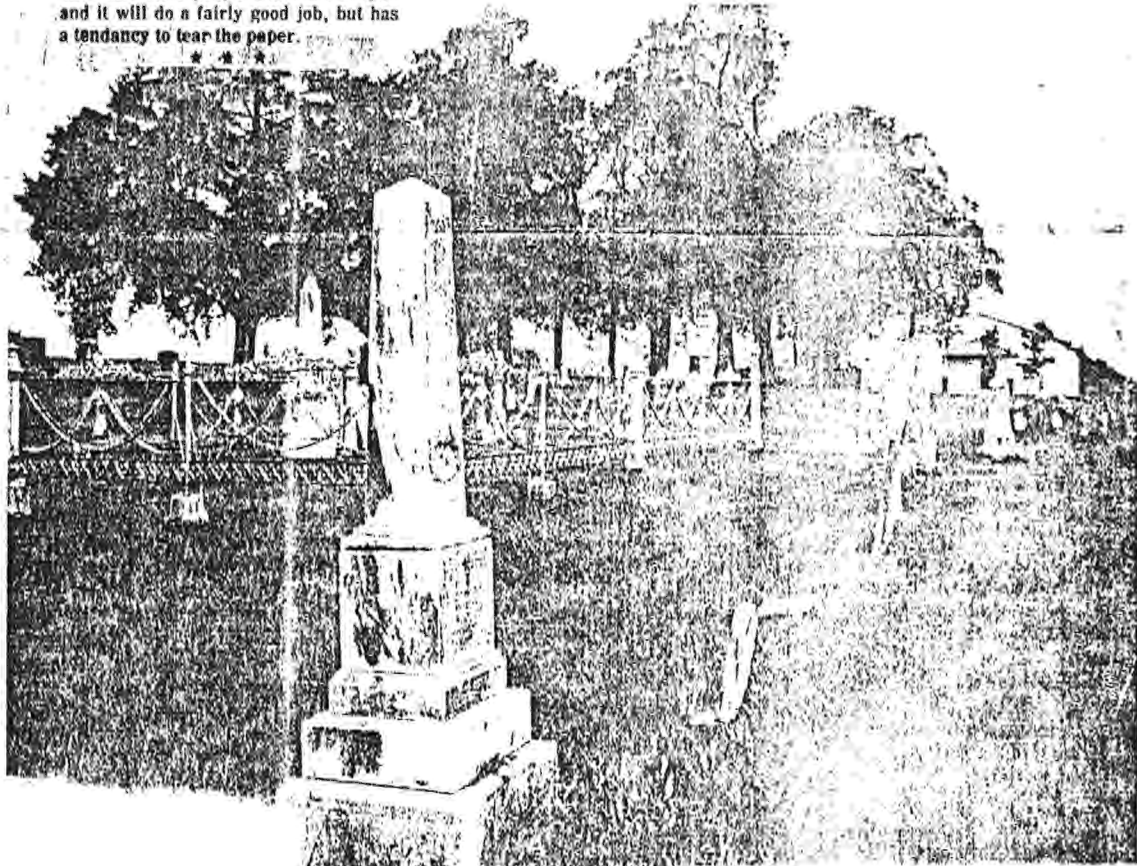
If you'd like to do rubbings from some of the old stones, arm yourself with plenty of paper and a black charcoal pencil. Most any kind of paper will do but it needs to have some strength. Rice paper is the most durable and is excellent, but it is expensive and it may be that you'd like to try first on plain typing paper or even wrapping paper. A friend tells me that she has tried a type of paper towel that has been satisfactory. I have tried white shelf paper and found it would work, too.

Take along a roll of masking tape to fasten the paper to the stone. Then rub the pencil side-wise as you do the white chalk. If it is a windy day, be sure your paper is firmly attached or have someone to help hold it firmly on the stone. I have had some people use black crayon and it will do a fairly good job, but has a tendency to tear the paper.
