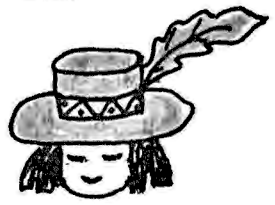

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## CALENDAR

### Old Style - New Style

A document written in London on March 16, 1612 (present style, would have been dated by an Englishman, March 6, 1611; by a Spaniard, March 16, 1612; by a Dutchman, March 6/16, 1611/12. Before 1752, the year in Great Britain began March 21. All of March, however, was called the first month of the year. In 1751, the Calendar was changed to conform to that adopted by the Catholic countries on the Continent in 1582 under Pope Gregory. Beginning in 1752, the New Year was Jan. 1st.

Many American Colonial records show Old Style/New Style dates with a double-year notation applied to dates occurring between Jan. 1 - Mar. 24.

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News Clips from the 1893 Hopkins Journal, Hopkins, Missouri:

Dr. Benjamin Franklin GOODSON was born in Clinton County, Ohio, September 27, 1851 and died at his home in Hopkins January 28, 1899. Dr. Goodson had resided here 17 years and was a community booster. He was instrumental in establishing the first telephone system and was a member of the school board for 12 years. He was the father of Ethelbert, Lulu, Clifford, Frank and Galen GOODSON.

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Officers of the First National Bank of Hopkins are F.M. WIDNER, president; R.H. WILFLEY, vice president; and E.C. WOLFERS, cashier.

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1893-94 school faculty: C.A. HAWKINS, George F. KINNEY, Myrtle BOVARD, Ella TORRANCE, Irma McCOY and Della CLINTON.

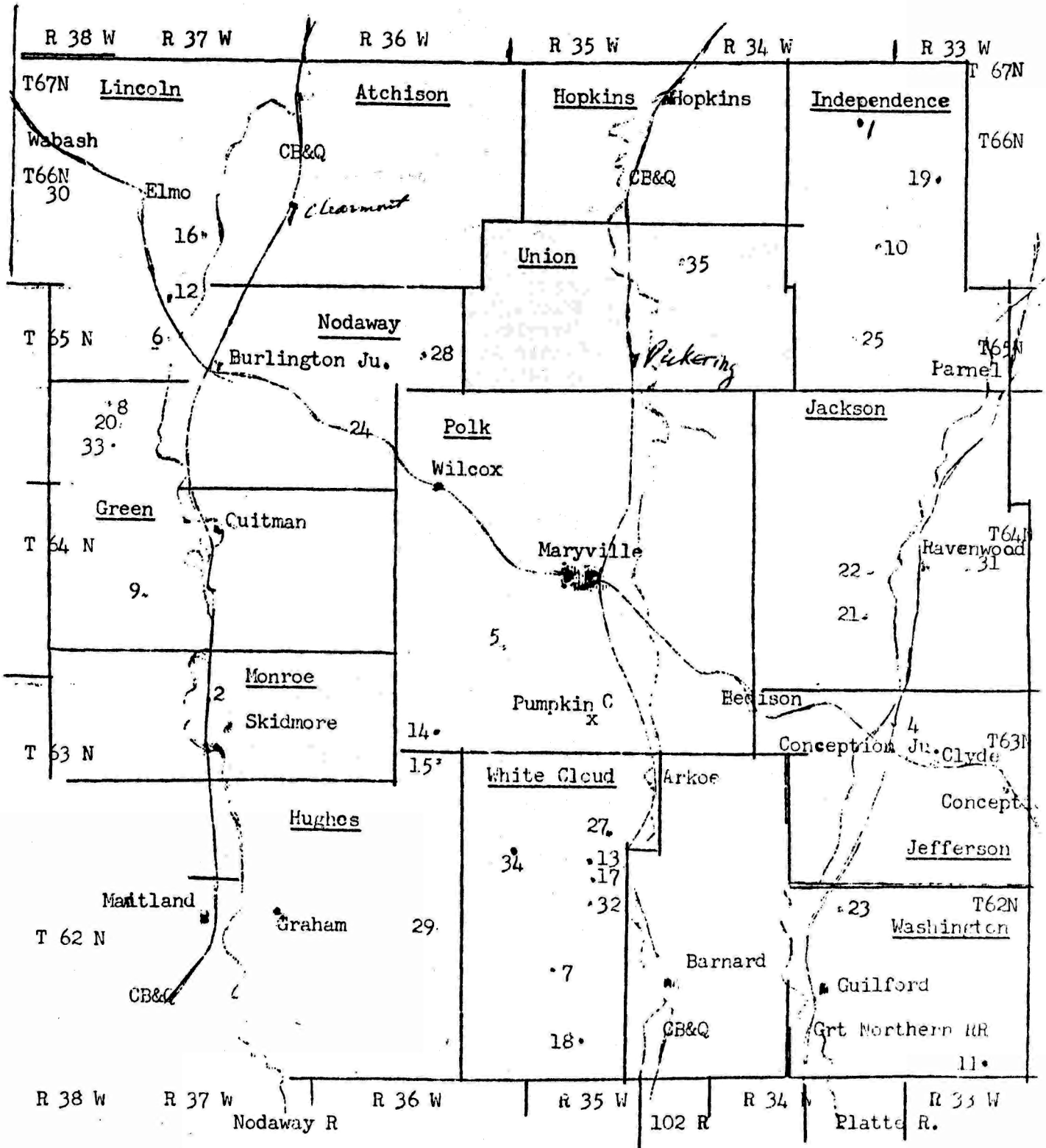

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Before the first white settlers (1839) the Indians followed trails across the south part of Hughes Township. Migrating bands of the Sacs, the Foxes, the Sioux, the Pottawatomies, and the Ioways followed two main trails as they travelled back and forth across Nodaway County. When they entered the county from the south, the Indians followed the Paradise Trail. In general, it is believed

that Paradise Trail followed a midway path between White Cloud Creek and the 102 River up through or just to the east of Maryville, then followed the 102 River on up into Iowa. There was an early Indian camp or village where Paradise trail crossed into Hughes Township to ford Rain Creek and Elkhorn Creek and pass through the Graham area to the Nodaway River, which they followed into Iowa.
