BEFORE 1800 there were no 'FAMILY' names in Ostfriesland, Germany, only SURNAMES. The last name changed each generation. People in Ostfriesland used the PATRONYMIC system in naming their children. The children were named after their father's FIRST NAME with an 'S' added to denote that it was a surname (last name). In 1815, the state of Ostfriesland joined the state of Hanover, Germany and it decreed that no one could use the PATRIARCH's system of surnames anymore. The oldest LIVING Patriarch's name became the FAMILY name to be carried on to the next generation.

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DID YOU KNOW? "that 'bushwhackers', during the first year of the Civil War, came into the streets of Maryville and destroyed the only paper in existence in the county--destroying the machinery and files and throwing its type into the street. There was no further attempt at editing a paper until about 1866, after the war was ended; hence there can be no knowledge gained from such sources commonly employed in compiling a roster of men."

Mrs. Lemuel Gault returned from Bedford, Ia. Thursday, where she attended the funeral of an aged uncle, Edward Howe, whose death occurred 28 of March. Another uncle Isaac Howe died in his Colorado home March 26. The two men were past 85 years of age. Their sister, Mrs. Roberts, who was Mrs. Gault's mother, died March 15, at age 97.

Miss Myrtle McPherren of Stanberry and Miss Nellie Swearengen of Bedison, State Normal School School students, have diphteria and are quarantined at the home of John Lorance on West First Street.

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ALLISON FAMILY REUNION--Aug. 1926

In 1878, Mr. and Mrs. James Allison settled on a farm south of Bedford about 12 miles, just over the line in Missouri and there reared their family of several children.

Last Sunday noon, June 27th, 80 of the 115 living descendants of the Allisons held a reunion at the Bedford Picnic Grounds in honor of Mrs. James Allison of Bedford, James Cleave of Georgetown, Canada and Mrs. Susan Barbaree of Paris, Canada.

Well filled baskets were brought in by the various families and one long banquet board was formed of the several tables provided at the picnic grounds. There was plenty of room, plenty to eat and everyone had a most enjoyable meal and spent a very pleasant afternoon in visiting. It had been about five years since a similar union of the Allison families had been held.

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THE MISSOURI STATE ARCHIVES are the only central depository for records from each of Missouri's 114 counties, including marriages, divorces, wills, deeds and naturalizations. They were microfilmed by the Mormon Church and given to the state. State and federal documents, such as penitentiary records, land grants and census reports, also help make up the 1.5 million documents on file.

In addition to helping visitors with research, archives staff respond to simple requests for information by mail. More extensive research must be done personally. The archives are open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Thursdays until 9 p.m. Saturday hours are 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Records of births and deaths since 1910 are located at the Bureau of Vital Statistics. Military records of Missourians are in the Office of the Adjutant General.


