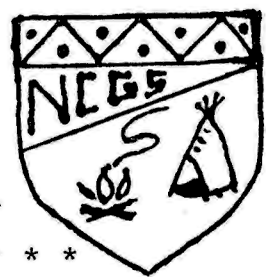

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NEW IN THE LIBRARY

The Heritage Collection Committee has for some time been making cassette recordings of oral histories of people living in Nodaway County. Now they are offering a new service to area residents. They will make 15 minute video tapes of personal or family documentaries pertaining to Nodaway County.

The original tape becomes the property of the Heritage Collection, but copies can be made for anyone providing their own tape, plus a nominal fee. If you have audio tapes of older family members, they would like to make copies to be put in the collection.

John Schrier does the videotaping and Mary Jackson conducts the interviews. The audio tapes and the video cassettes will be permanently housed in the Heritage Room at the Maryville Public Library, but may be checked out. Several interviews have been completed and will be available for viewing on Saturday, Sept. 19, in the former Place's store building, during the Constitution's Bicentennial celebration.

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## EARLY SETTLERS IN NODAWAY COUNTY

John and Charity (McMichael) Kennedy were natives of North Carolina. They moved to Indiana in 1825, settling first in Fayette county and then later in Rush county. In 1844, they removed to Missouri, settling first in Platte county, and then in 1850, they and some of their children settled in Nodaway county.

John and Charity were the parents of ten children. When they moved from Indiana to Missouri, not all of their children went with them. The family was thus divided between the two states, and with the passage of time, the Indiana Kennedys and the Missouri Kennedys drifted apart as their numbers rapidly increased with the births of grandchildren and great-grandchildren, etc.

In the year 1855, W. C. Bell, who was a son of John and Charity's oldest daughter, Margaret (Kennedy) Bell, made a trip from Indiana to Missouri to visit his grandparents. His traveling companion, Joseph Ross, was a cousin of his, being a grandson of John Kennedy's sister Sarah, who had married James C. Ross.

They made the trip by train, boat, stage and by foot, staying with former neighbors, friends and relatives on the way. Their grandfather had always said that he would always recognize friends and relatives if they would come to see him. The boys thought it a good joke when they visited their grandparents and talked to them quite awhile without being recognized.

William, James, Sarah Jane Cain, and Samuel T. moved with their parents to Missouri and settled in Nodaway county. Nancy Kennedy Ross's only child, Benjamin Frank Ross, was adopted and raised by his grandparents, John and Charity, and he homesteaded with them in Nodaway county.

NEW STATE LAW PROTECTS ABANDONED FAMILY CEMETERIES

On July 13, 1987, Governor John Ashcroft signed House Bill 60 into law, providing for the first time a criminal penalty for those persons who knowingly destroy or damage our abandoned cemeteries. The legislation was introduced by Representative Joe Driskill, District 154.

The law protects "any tomb, monument or gravestone, or other structure placed in any abandoned family cemetery or private burying ground, or any fence, railing, or other work for the protection or ornamentation of any such cemetery or place of burial of any human being."

According to the law, "an abandoned family cemetery or private burying ground shall include those cemeteries or burying grounds which have not been deeded to the public as provided in chapter 214, RSMo. and in which no body has been interred for at least twenty-five years."

The law also provides for the visiting of these cemeteries. If there is no public entrance, any person may visit during reasonable hours and only for purposes usually associated with cemetery visits.

The law does not prohibit the court from ordering the disinterment and removal of the remains from a cemetery and interment in a suitable location.

In a letter the the MoSCA, Mr. Driskill said, "Since no law is self-enforcing, I urge you to contact the prosecuting attorney and sheriff in your county to make them aware of the new law and of the need for its enforcement. In particular, you need to remind your officials that, even though violent and other serious crimes must take precedence in their work, the vandalism of a family cemetery is also a crime."

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HAVING TROUBLE GETTING COPIES OF ILLINOIS BIRTH & DEATH RECORDS?

There is good news! In the August issue of HOOSIER CONNECTIONS, there was a letter from the wife of the Illinois Lt. Gov. George H. Ryan, about a bill allowing public access to the state's vital records.

The bill was sponsored by Senator John Davidson and authorizes the Illinois State Archives and other libraries, approved by the Illinois State Registrar and the Director of the Illinois State Archives to provide public access to reproductions of birth records 100 years or older and death records 50 years or older. This information is on file with the State Office of Vital Records. The copies of these records must be made at no cost to the state.

The bill had successfully passed both chambers of the Illinois General Assembly, and only required Governor Thompson's signature to become law.

APOPLEXY Stroke or cerebrovascular accident caused by hemorrhage or blood clot in the brain, resulting in coma, followed by paralysis, usually on one side, or death.

ANTHRAX A fatal infectious disease usually found in cattle and sheep, but transmissable to humans, caused by the anthrax bacillus; can affect brain, lungs or intestines. Also called Woolsorters' or Ragsorters' disease.

CATARRH Inflammation of a mucous membrane, usually nose and throat. (Submitted by Jewel Bond)
