St. Mary's

St. Mary's Cemetery---Taken from the Marshall Democrat News
They Sloop in Their Beloved Adopted Soil--Many Irish Immi-
grants are Buried in Mount St. Mary Cemetery near Shackelford
by a Staff Reporter

Nestling on the south slope but near the top of a gradual knoll in a country of easy undulation is Mount St. Mary Cemetery, historic Catholic burying ground of Saline county. There in the bosom of their beloved adopted soil, beneath whispering pines and amid the peace of rural quiet, sleep the mortal remains of many Irish immigrants and their descendants, most of them farmers in the Shackelford neighborhood. And sharing with them the undisturbed passage of time which death provides are several of their priests, continuing, one likes to believe, the office into eternity.

Mount St. Mary Cemetery is about two miles northwest of Shackelford. A census of the Irish Settlement in the early days of Saline county can almost be read on the tombstones of this cemetery. Names which the visitor sees are Prior, Judge, Finnegan, Frain, King, Fitzsimmons, McKeever, Holmes, Lynch, Horgan, Darr, Kennedy, Welch, Cook, Kellett, Stockman, Pittman, Hamill, Roe, Mitchell, Loftus, Langan, Castle, Meschede, Flynn, and others. Many a monument tells the story of a courtship in Erin, of an Irish gallant taking the colleen of his choice under the protection of his brave arm and the two starting for that virgin country of mystery and

opportunity that lay far to the westward across the Atlantic from the Emerald Isle.

Biographies of Fancy-Thus the visitor sees on quite a few of these stones abbreviated facts from which fancy can weave biographies of romance and stern realities. Taking at random a few of these the legends on the marble are:

"John Judge, born 1850, County Galway, Ireland, Died April 1920. Margaret, his wife, born 1856 County Galway, Ireland, Died February 17, 1922."

"John Finnegan, born March 15, 1829, Roscommon County, Ireland, Died August 26, 1917, Bridget Finnegan, born Feb. 2, 1830 Roscommon County, Ireland, Died July 11, 1907."

"John Hays, a native of County Waterford, Ireland, Died June 10, 1872, 35 years old.

"Thomas Barr and Marry Barr, Donegal, Ireland."

Then one comes across an inscription telling of a young man who emigrated to the new country alone who faced the trials of pioneer life without the encouraging voice and companionship of a helpmate.

"Rev. Edward Hamill, born in Armagh, Ireland, March 26, 1814, ordained priest June 29, 1849, departed this life August 3, 1889."

First Pastor of First Parish-The visitor now is standing at the grave of the man who played a large part in the Irish Settlement, who was the first resident pastor of the first Catholic Parish in Saline county. Much credit is due to him

for the economic upbuilding of that section as well as its spiritual guidance. He was a man of learning and intelligence always striving for the advancement of his parishoners. He built the original Catholic church here in Marshall.

The history of Mount St. Mary Cemetery dates back to November 16, 1847, when forty acres of land were entered to Francis Damariae, a French Catholic priest, who made periodic visits to the Hibernian immigrants. This land was entered in the land office at Clinton, Mo., under the congressional act of April 24, 1820. The patent was issued by President Zachary Taylor, August 1, 1849.

Land Given to Church-According to rumor this land was purchased by several families and the title put in the name of Father Damariae. That rumor seems logical because records at the Courthouse here at Marshall show the remaining six hundred acres of the section were entered by Patrick Holmes, Patrick Loftus, Ellen Loftus, Michael Langan and Michael Flynn. The purchase price was \$1.25 an acre. Following out the history of the land the records show that March 21, 1848 which was the year after it was entered, Father Damariae transferred the title to Peter Richard Kenrick, archbishop-elect of St. Louis. the consideration was \$1.

With the organization of the Kansas City diocese this real estate was transferred to the bishop of the new diocese. Then August 18, 1893, Bishop John J. Hogan conveyed to Stephen Trigg all except 2.70 acres near the southwest cor-

ner. That retention is the plot that is the cemetery. The Trigg brothers, Steve and John, live in a house a few hundred yards west of the graveyard.

A Small Building First-But this forty acres was not obtained merely to be used as a cemetery. Soon after its entry a small frame church was erected just west of the residence of the Trigg brothers. W. H. Meschede, Marshall attorney, was baptized in that tiny church. As the temporal affairs of the community progressed the little church was replaced by a large stone edifice, constructed of sandstone quarried out of the Vaughn hill, which is south of the present home of Joseph Hamill. The house where the Trigg brothers live was built for a parsonage.

In time fences began to be run across the prairie and because of these and the lack of public roads it became increasingly difficult for the parishoners to reach the church. Then the Chicago and Alton railroad was built and Shackelford grew in population. So it was that Bishop Hogan sold all but the cemetery ground. The rock of the church was taken to Shackelford and used in the foundation of the new church and a parsonage erected on the three acres obtained there. Title to the land appears in the name of individuals because it is the custom of the Catholic church for ownership of real estate to be in the name of the bishop of the diocese.

Father Hamill a Strong Character-As the visitor stood there

at the grave of Father Hamill he thought of the many stories he had heard of the experiences of this strong character. He thought of the time the priest swam his horse across a stream in winter to answer a sick call and how he froze his legs to the knees from the icy water and was for years afterward required to give them medical treatment and suffered much pain. He thought, too, of the worm with greater force against the stone and it fell into a crevice of the monument dead.

A Fatalistic Thought-How like that worm, mused the spectator, were those babies at whose graves he looked. Held to life, by a single, weak attachment; helpless to stop the ravage of disease that tossed them against the stone of destruction; prey to a nature that can be so cruel and heartless, finally succumbing when the breeze of death blew stronger. With what unconcern Atropos the Inflexible can cut the thread of animation?

The eye read:

"In memory of Rev. James Mulvey, 1857-1893."

That brought recollection of a tale, Father Mulvey was the pastor at Shackelford. An insurance salesman, handsomely dressed and driving a spanking fine team of horses to bright and shiny buggy, went into the community. J. D. Prior, whose father, William Prior, came in the spring of 1845, was keeping store at Shackelford then and well remembers seeing this salesman. The priest bought a policy and died a few months after taking it out. The company made

immediate payment through its impressively dressed representative and on the strength of that promptness got many patrons in the neighborhood.

Gypsy Girl Buried There-Over in the northeast part of the cemetery is a grave of medium length surrounded by an iron fence, waist high, four feet wide and six long with a small gate at one corner. Within that inclosure is the grave of a gypsy girl.

It was in the autumn of 1882 that a band of gypsies was traveling through the Schackelford community. There was an ill child among that tatterdemation crowd. The child died, and the people of the community offered burial space in the Mount St. Mary Cemetery. And so Lena, daughter of wandering nomads who confessed no home, was buried on that sloping hillside that overlooks miles of country to the east, south, and west. The modest stone at the head of the grave reads:

"Lena, daughter of Fred and Rachel Schwartz, died November 25, 1882, Aged 14 years."

Fred and Rachel, sorrowing parents, resumed their restless wandering but each year they came back to that little grave and spent several days tending it and mourning the loss of their beloved daughter. One ...to feel that to these two typsies at least home was at the graveside of that child. And so they returned, year after year, each visit showing the deepening lines of age. Then one year they missed, and that was the end. None ever heard anything about

them.

That was many years ago. But the monument still stands as an erect sentinel and the iron fence is a sturdy though rusty guardian to prevent any unknowing footstep from tramping the typsy child's grave. Growing on the mound now in neglected profusion are lilies, planted by faltering hands and wetted by copious tears of a bereaved mother and father. Let Lena's Fence Remain-In the early days all the graves in Mount St. Mary had iron railings or fences around them. It was decided to take them down because their presence made it so hard to keep the cmetery in good condition, these fences being harbors for sprouts, shoots and weeds. But Irish sentiment, which is prone to show a sympathetic heart, decreed that the grave of the little gypsy girl should remain just as it was left by her parents. Graves belonging to the landed and influential families of that community are without individual protection but that one grave of the "orphan dead" stands forth in marked contast and isolated prominence because of its iron protector, left standing because of warm Celtic hearts.

Cemetery is Well Kept-This cemetery is kept in good condition There is a committee of three which cares for it. Each Sunday following Decoration Day those associated meet at the cemetery and elect one committee member for three years. The three directors serving now are Joseph Hamill, John Stockman, and John Cooke. There is a fund to provide upkeep.

The visitor aroused himself from his reverie, walked passed the old grave of Father Hamill and the new grave of Joseph B. Meschede covered with sun wilted flowers and made his way to the entrance. There he turned to look back over the scene of solemnity, this city of the dead whose first inhabitant was an itinerant tailor.

"Requiescat in pace," he murmured.
