## The Bluff Cemetery

Possibly the oldest cemetery in the Miami Township is the Bluff. It is on Route F, east of Miami, a mile and a half approximately, in the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section 34, Township 53, Range 21. It is on the bluff over-looking the Miami River bottoms. From the earliest records it was known as the Bluff Cemetery or burying grounds. In the 1881 History of Saline County, Mo. on page 438 it states that the first death in the Miami community was that of John Harris, who was buried in the old Bluff graveyard, in 1818.

It could have been placed on this high spot because of the experience of the early settlers with the floods in the Missouri River bottoms. The conjecture has been made that the big flood of 1826 might have caused the pioneers to realize that the cemetery must be placed on high ground for protection and permanency, but it seems likely that it had been used and was established before that date.

The ground for the cemetery was deeded on the 6th day of May, 1851, by William Mullins and his wife, Barsheba Mullins, to Alfred Wheeler, William C. Hill and Henry Ferril, as trustees, in consideration of the sum of two dollars. This plot, containing one acre, more or less, was designated in the deed as "the old burying ground". The deed is made to the above named trustees and their successors in office, forever, for the purpose of a burying ground. Of interest, too, is the

use of a word "mete and bounds" in the description, and the use of black oak trees and white oak trees of certain stated diameter to mark the boundaries. Also the deed reserves the timber growing on the plot for the use of the parties of the first part (Mullins).

This deed was not recorded until May 19, 1856. The original deed is in the possession of A. H. Edmonds, Kansas City, Mo. Mr. Edmonds also has, as well, a copy of a re-survey of this cemetery made by the deputy surveyor of Saline County, William B. Mullins, a grandson of the original grantors, in 1871.

The cemetery, in later years, was sometimes referred to as the Black Cemetery, as the adjoining land was owned by Daniel Black. Today, it is owned by C. W. Hamner, Sr., whose abstract calls for a certain number of acres less one acre for cemetery.

The earliest date found on a stone was 1852; however there could be earlier ones, but due to the condition of the grounds it was difficult to locate them. There is quite a growth of weeds and brush. There have been on internments there for many years. It would be almost impossible to estimate the number of graves due to the age of the place. Many of the stones are still in fairly good condition; many show the wear of the weather, and no doubt there are many unmarked graves.

Among the family names found were: Burnsides, Kieffer, Kile,

Campbell, Gallbraith, Hogan, Hosttetter, Wheeler, Erwin and others.

### The Miami Cemeteries

The earliest cemetery in the town of Miami and probably one of the oldest in the township was known as the Methodist Cemetery. It is in the northeast section of the town in an area between the two roads leading east and bounded by Missouri Highway #41. It is described in a deed made January 5, 1876, by which Jesse J. Ferril and Mary, C. E. Ferril and his wife conveyed to B. F. McDaniel, Henry Mertens, A. R. Edmonds, J. E. Gentry, Jacob Greenabaum and J. F. Webster, composing the Board of the City of Miami, County of Saline, the State of Missouri, and their successors in office for the use of the city and the inhabitants thereof for a burying ground, that portion of section 5, township 52, range 21, that lies at the northwest end of third street in the city of Miani ----, containing one acre more or less, generally known as the Old Graveyard. At present this plot is in a deplorable condition. Weeds and brush have taken over as well as trash dunped in places. Stones have broken and fallen over; some have been piled against the trees. Many of the graves are no longer marked or even bear a resemblance of even being there. The inscriptions on many of the headstones are illegible; the weather has worn the soft stone until the name cannot be deciphered. earliest marked stone found bore the date 1844 and the most recent 1873. There have been many earlier dates; no doubt

there were earlier burials. Because of the condition of the place it was impossible to do justice to reading the stones where they could be found. Among the names found were:
Handley, Davenport, Richardson, Kaer, Casebolt, Hicklin,
Hewitt, Miller, Blount, Culbertson, Williams, Crowder and others. There is an iron fence surrounding a few graves.
Markers within this inclosure were for: Sarah, the first wife of W. F. Hicklin, died 1845; and Barbara, second wife of W. P. Hicklin, died 1855. These inscriptions are clear and easily read. Near the entrance to the cemetery is a small plain headstone for J. F. Handley, Co. C, 7th Missouri Cav., nothing else. The same type of marker was found in another cemetery, causing us to conclude that they were possibly government markers.

It is understood that Jesse J. Ferril and his father, Henry Ferril are both buried in this cemetery, but their stones may be some of the ones that are gone; at least they were not seen. They and their wives, and Henry Ferril's nother are said to be buried there, but the father, John, was buried at Cooper's Fort in Howard County.

The present burial grounds used in Miami is located on the east side of the town, bounded on the east by Highway 41.

Lying side by side are the Baptist, the I. O. O. F. and the colored cemeteries. All are well-kept. The I. O. O. F.

Cemetery was deeded by William Bell and his wife, Mary, to the Grand Lodge of the I. O. O. F. of Missouri in consideration

of twenty-five dollars paid by the members of the Western Star Lodge No. 45 of I. O. O. F. of Miami, Mo., with the stipulation that this lot of ground be kept exclusively for the burial of the dead who may be members of said Independent Order of Odd Fellows and their families, and the said ground is not to be sold or transferred in any manner or used for any other purpose. This deed was dated the 11th of May, 1869. Slightly over five tenths of an acre was conveyed. Later the Baptist Cemetery was opened for use. It no doubt was deeded by William Bell and his wife, Mary, as it is in the same area as the I. O. O. F. cemetery, but the deed to it was not located when the other deeds were found. An addition was conveyed on December 10, 1901, the deed made by William M. Bell and his wife, Mary, to John D. Snelling, John A. Hawkins and W. H. Wheeler in consideration of seventy-five dollars paid by them as trustees of the Baptist Church at Miami, Mo., and their successors for the benefit of the said congregation, containing one twenty-fourth of an acre. The description says that it is to begin at the northwest corner of the I. O. O. F. Cemetery, thence west----. It also mentions further along in the description east to the southwest corner of the Baptist Cemetery, which indicates that this was an additional fractional acre to the established Baptist Cemetery. On November 8, 1913, an additional tract of land was added, which was bought from James C. Haynie and Alice B. Snelling, by G. N. Jackson, J. H. Hooper, and

W. S. J. Bure, trustees, and their successors, for the Miami Cemetery Association of the County of Saline, town of Miami, State of Missouri. Thus a third section was added to the existing I. O. O. F. and Baptist Cemetery. The cemetery has been incorporated for years. In fact, the three cemeteries were incorporated in 1925, under one titlethe Miami Cemetery to comply with the terms of the will of Ira V. Davis, who died in 1925. His will left \$2000.00 to the cemetery providing the cemetery was incorporated and the money invested in first mortgage real estate or bank stock. Other bequests have been made which swelled the funds. A caretaker has been employed, and the grounds are kept in good condition. Judge George Wilson is in charge of the records and has had that responsibility for many years. There must be some five or six hundred graves in the combined cemetery. A few of the family names found there are: Royar, Wheeler, Webster, Haynie, Miller, Bishop, Bruce, Ruckel, Burns, Greenabaum, Letwich, Davis, Dinkel, Rogers, Bondurant, Kirtley, Cunningham, Switzer, Latimer, Seibert, Grady, Peterman, Casebolt, Minor, Ulrey, Jackson, Hisle, Nunn, Jennings, Hamner, Metcalf, and many, many more that space does not permit listing.

The Christian Church Cemetery

North of N-1 School on a road leading east, approximately one half mile is the Christian Church Cemetery. For many years it was known as the Robertson Cemetery. It is located in

Section 16, Township 52, Range 21. The land belonged to the Robertson family and a deed was made April 15, 1873, by Emily Robertson to S. Pemberton, A. K. Sydenstriker, and David Vaughan, elders of the Christian Church, for an acre of land to include the present burial grounds on he forty acres of land on which the residence of Emily Robertson is situated. This indicates the location was used as a burial spot before the said deed was given and that the grounds include more than an acre. The first grave noted to be in an early time was dated 1855. There could be earlier ones than that.

The present owner of adjoining land is C. D. Peterman. The plot is well fenced, so that it is protected from livestock. Weeds and light brush have taken over, making it difficult to get over the grounds to get an accurate report on the graves. Animals have burrowed under some of the stones causing them to topple. Weather and the elements have taken the toll of the stones, toc. Many are quite hard to read. Names of people are found in all these old cemeteries who, in their time, were important and useful people in their communities and have left to us a heritage of which we should be proud. Family names in this one are: Robertson, Pemberton, Haynie, Wilson, Bates, Cabell, Berry, McDaniel, Pate, Henton, Zea, Sibley, Nichols, McCullock, Eubank, Hudson, and others.

Quite a number of graves are unmarked, or the marker has

deteriorated. It is difficult to make an accurate estimate of the number of graves, but a guess would be there might be as many as one hundred fifty. It seems there have been no very recent burials there.

## Shiloh Cemetery

an acre.

(This Shiloh Cemetery is near Miami and not to be confused with Shiloh on Highway 41, east of Marshall.)

Shiloh Cemetery, located east of Miami about six miles, was deeded on August 26, 1880, in consideration of a dollar, by Lenty Mullins and his wife, Susan Mullins, to Milton Harris, Edward Cooper and A. W. Hutton, trustees of the Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church, for the use and benefit of said church. The deed goes on to describe the number of chains measured each way and does not designate the acreage. It is possibly

The plot, apparently, was not used for burial purposes previous to the giving of the deed in 1880. Found was a stone bearing the inscription, Maggie, Nov. 2, 1880, child of W. A. and L. A. Mullins, which seemed to be the earliest interment. The names on some of the stones were: Mullins, Gibbons, Stephens, Mayfield, Kemper, Huff, Hitaffer, Hupp, Leisure, Keyton, and others. The most recent burial noticed was in 1957.

The grounds were in fairly good condition, not bad. They showed that someone was taking care of it. There must be between seventy-five and one hundred buried at this location.

The graves are well marked and can easily be read. The legal description of the location is: Section 31, Township 53, Range 20.

## Harmony Cemetery

Harmony Cemetery is east and north of Miami, Section 30, Township 53, Range 20, on the road generally designated the Brunswick Road. It was deeded to the trustees for the Harmony Presbyterian Church, J. T. Cooper, J. O. Davis and William A. Burnsides, for the church and burial purpose by Amos H. Sullivan and his wife, Mary, on May 26, 1876.

The Amos H. Sullivan mentioned above was well-known as Dr.

A. H. W. Sullivan who had a wide medical practice around Miami during the latter part of the last century. He was the father of three sons that were well known physicians, Dr. Temp, Dr. Frank and Dr. Hazard Sullivan. The cemetery is in bad condition. It is difficult to get through the weeds and other growth. The church building is also in bad condition. No services have been held there for some time and still

longer since regular preaching services.

The cemetery covers approximately an acre of ground, more or less. It contains seventy-five or a hundred graves. Most of the stones seem to be in a good state of preservation and can be read. Names of families that appear on these stones are Sullivan, Gadbury, Kitchen, Burnside, Bernizer, Witt, Cooper, White, Lyons, Milsaps, Hutton, Casebolt, Moore, Barnes, Thornberry, and others.

## Mt. Horeb Cemetery

Mt. Horeb Cemetery is located approximately at the eastern edge of Miami Township on Missouri State Route O and is about three miles southwest of Slater. It comprises nearly two acres of land. It is located in Section 8, Township 51, Range 20. The deed to the ground was made by Peter Rea to the trustees of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church for church building and burial purposes. The deed was dated June 15, 1859 and not recorded till Dec. 16, 1872, thirteen years later. Peter Rea was a minister of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and owned the eighty acres of land on which the cemetery is located. The church is no longer there. According to the inscriptions on some of the stones indicate the place was used as early as 1855. A stone marking a Woodson grave bears the marking Aug. 21, 1855, and another stone bears the name, Nancy Baker. She died Sept. 25, 1855. About 1920 the cemetery was incorporated and the first directors were Joseph A. Johnson, president, John Wall and E. M. Nugen. The present directors are: Percy H. Johnson, Preston Yates, A. L. Venable, John Sherman and Silas Thompson. Among the family names found are: Claycomb, Dawes, Beeler, Page, Johnson, Burruss, Trimble, Hays, Yates, Wall, Nugen, Wilhite and others. There must be two hundred graves in this cemetery. An average of six people are buried there each year, it is said. In the northwest corner of the plot are the graves of a few negroes who had been slaves of some of the church people and had continued to live with them.

## Bethel Cemetery

The Bethel Cemetery is located approximately a quarter of a mile north of Sharon which is on Missouri State Route C northwest of Slater. It is another of the early cemeteries. The Bethel Baptist Church is adjacent, and it was established in 1849.

The ground for the church and cemetery was not deeded to the trustees until 1871, many years after the cemeter had been in use and quite some time after the church was established. The owner of the land was Rueben E. McDaniel. In his will he directed his executors, namely: Reuben E. McDaniel, Giles R. McDaniel and Alexander S. McDaniel to offer at public sale to the highest bidder a lot or parcel of land, on which was situated a church building, containing three and ninety hundredth acres, to be taken out of the Southeast quarter of Section 7, Township 52, Range 20. John C. Scott and George W. Latimer as trustees of the Bethel Baptist Church were the highest bidders in the sum of one dollar. In a Codicil to his will, Mr. McDaniel instructed his executors to convey to the trustees of the Bethel Church a way or road from the Miami and Cambridge Road to the church of not less than eight feet wide. In 1944, assisted by Judge Perry Storts, some of the interested in upkeep of the cemetery, formed an incorporation for the purpose of maintainence and care of the cemetery. The first officers of the organization were: Miss Mary McCord, President; Mrs. Aubrey Morgan, Vice-president; Miss Gladys

Huffman, Treasure. Those serving at present: Lewis Deibel, President; Miss Mary McCord, Vice-president; Mrs. Aubrey Morgan, secretary; and Miss Gladys Huffman, treasurer. The cemetery is quite well-kept. There are probably between two hundred and fifty and three hundred graves. Many of the early ones are urmarked. The earliest one found was that of a man by the name of Hewitt who died in 1849, and is buried in a vault on top of the ground with a slab of marble-like stone for a cover.

Family names found in this burial place are those of many of the first settlers of the community: McDaniels, Latimer, Ross, Rogers, Lewis, Carr, Quisenberry, McCord, Clements, McAmis, Hupp, Storts, Dulanye, Paxton, Huffman and numerous others.

This cemetery is still in use today.

# Mount Carmel Cemetery

About six miles north of Marshall, in Section 16, Township 51, Range 21, just west of Missouri Highway #41, lies the Mount Carmel Cemetery, adjacent to the Mount Carmel Methodist Church. It is another one of the older cemeteries of Miami Township. It contains the graves of many of the pioneer settlers of the surrounding territory.

The deed was given on the 15th day of March 1854, by William Brown and his wife, Lucy Ann, to William Brown, Thomas R. E. Harvey, Joshua G. Tucker, David Guthery, John Hood, Philander Y. Irvin and Thomas Duggins, Trustees, for four and forty

hundredth acres in consideration of one dollar.

A corporation was effected in 1927 and an endowment plan set up for the care and up-keep of the cemetery. The first board was composed of Judge Henry W. Harvey, C. B. Brown, W. B. Wilhelm, J. W. Irvine, and E. W. Tanner. The present board Theodore W. Harvey, C. Edwin Brown, Huston Holland. J. W. Irvine and I. G. Dyer. The records of the cemetery were kept by Judge Harvey during his lifetime and are now in the hands of his son, Theodore W. Harvey. The cemetery was resurveyed and plotted by the County Engineer, Mr. Pat Barnard, in 1854. It is fenced with a strong wire fence and is kept mowed in the growing season. This location is one of the higher elevations in the county and has good drainage. early graves are on the east side of the church. The west side of the churchyard was opened for burial purposes around 1910 and now has quite a few graves. The east side of the yard is relatively full.

Tombstones bearing the names of men and women prominent in their day, along with some who were only temporary residents of the community, are found. Among the names are many of the Brown families, Tucker, Harvey, Sauffley, Irvine, Edmonds, Price, Duggins, Clayton, Hendricks, Edwards and many others, the names of families of the early day. Names of families that established their homes made this their permanent residence and left a heritage to their descendants many of whom still live in the community.

There are many unmarked graves, especially of an early date Among the earliest marked grave is that of Jaqueline G. L. Harvey, 1842, which would certainly bear witness that the plot was used for burial before the deed to the ground was made. In 1849, Adelaide, wife of Col. John Brown, died. In 1852, two children of J. A. and M. J. Sauffley were buried according to dates on the tombstones. There were no doubt others. from the early day to the present this cemetery has been in use. As was previously mentioned, the east side of the churchyard is quite well filled. Most of the stones are in rather good condition and generally speaking legible, but a few are broken and eroded by the elements. In the case of one familythe Tucker family, Judge Harvey S. Tucker, before his death in 1929, had erected a large granite stone and on the faces of it he had engraved the names and dates or members of his family. These names also appear on the smaller stones at the grave of each. These stones were all old and soft and eventually will be illegible. Thus on the hard granite he preserved the record of his family in a more permanent way. In view of the fact that it is impossible to count the number of burials, only a rough estimate of possibly three hundred is offered.

# The Fairville Cemetery

The Fairville Cemetery is located approximately one half mile east of Missouri State Highway #41 on State Road N. It is described as being in Section 4, Township 51, Range 21. The

deed shows that it was given by Mrs. Julia A. Brown, Oct. 19, 1832 in consideration of one hundred dollars paid by F. L. Shaw and Jermiah Graves as trustees of the First Baptist Church at Fairville, Mo. One acre was to be laid off in a square, as nearly as possible in the east corner of the tract of land where she resided. The same to be used as a burying ground. As in other of the older cemeteries the plot must have been used as a burying ground previous to the actual giving of the deed.

The inscription on the earliest stone found was that of a child, Lester H., son of Rev. I. E. and V. E. Dotson, who died Feb. 19, 1876 and the next earliest that of Daniel B. Little, who died Dec. 28, 1878. There may have been others and earlier ones but they were not found.

The grounds of this cemetery are well kept at this time. An incorporation was formed in the 1920's and for some years Mr. Jess Arnold took care of the business of the cemetery, along with the help of Mr. Chas. Seal. At present Lawrence Leimkuehler has the books.

It has been a number of years since any interments have been made, possibly in 1920. In fact, since the road in front has been graded, widened and gravelled the entrance to the driveway into the cemetery is impossible because of the deep water ditch.

The names of people active in the Baptist Church and prominent in the community are to be found on the stones. Some of these

names are: Hawkins, Withers, Shaw, Bacon, Hudson, and those of the three wives of Dr. E. M. Talbott, a practicing physician in the Fairville community for many years.

The most of the stones bear inscriptions that can be read.

There are a number of unmarked graves in this place, too. The graves of the original trustees of the church to whom the deed was made were found. F. L. Shaw who died in 1890 at the age of 78 years, and his wife, Catherine, who died in 1879.

Jermiah Graves died 1896 at the age of 78 years and his wife,

Marietta, who died in 1915. The grave of Mrs. Julia A. Brown, who made the deed is in Mr. Carmel Cemetery, where she lies beside her husband. She died in 1888.

An estimate of one hundred graves might be our best guess.

Private Cemeteries in Miami Township

There are many, many private or family cemeteries in Miami Township. Some are the burial sites for entire families, and others for a child or two. Very few have been too well protected; many have been protected from absolute obliteration by the iron fence erected so long age. It is impossible to make anything like a complete record of these scatter-burials; some have even been cultivated over, and in a few of those cases a few stones may be piled around a tree or in a fence corner, leaving a meager record for us today. The generation that knew about these things is fast declining.

In the Fairville community, on the farm belonging to Mrs. Margaret Irvine Leimkuehler, in Section 32, Township 52,

Range 21, not far from the dwelling on the place, are the graves of two children of S. S. and Addie T. Reynolds, a daughter who died in 1869 and a son in 1872. These graves are enclosed by an iron fence and the stones are legible. On I. G. Dyer's farm, in the same neighborhood, Section 9, Township 51, Range 21, there are the graves of two children by the name of Boatright. The farm was originally owned by the Brown family, and the children were relatives. Farther east in the Norton community, on land belonging to Mr. and Mrs. Tom Hoffman, is the Hyland Cemetery. two graves within an iron fence. They are the graves of John Hyland, Rye, Sussex, England, born May 27, 1802, died Saline Co., July 29, 1885. The second stone bears the inscription Isabelle Hennison, wife of John, died 1875. John Hyland was the great-grandfather of Mrs. Hoffman. It might be of interest that John and his first wife, Mary, left England April 3, 1828, according to a church letter given to them before they left England, certifying that they had been continuous members of the Baptist Church of Christ since May 6, 1821 in Rye, Sussex, England and were now leaving to go to America. This letter is now in possession of a member of the family. Located on the Pinnacle in Van Meter State Park, just west of the early brick house, which was west of the present caretaker's house, is the Van Meter Family Cemetery. There are fifteen graves in this spot, fourteen members of the family and a faithful colored woman who had been with the

family many years. She is buried in the northeast corner, next to the wall. The VanMeter family came to this part of the country in 1834. The first graves were those of children in 1845 and 1855. They were the children of Rebecca VanMeter Prosser and her husband John W. Prosser, both of whom were buried there, also. The rest bear the VanMeter name. last burial was that of Mrs. Annie Pittman VanMeter in 1944. She was the wife of Abel J. VanMeter. It was she who gave the tract of land to the State of Missouri for a Park. Originally there was a high iron fence surrounding the plot, and at one time there was an iron fence surrounding the graves of David Parsons VanMeter and his son George A. In 1925, Mrs. Annie VanMetor had the iron fence which surrounded the plot removed and a sturdy concrete wall made to enclose the The entrance made is a stile with easy steps up and over the wall down to the level. This entrance is in the center and there are seven graves on either side as you enter, the colored woman's grave, as mentioned, being in the corner. Her name was Ann Sales, who was noted locally as a fortuneteller. Outside of the wall is the grave of a negro man who had worked for the VanMeters.

This cemetery was ravaged by vandals several years ago, and the stones torn from their founddations. The damage has been repaired.

Southwest of Miami on land belonging to Crete Malan is the grave of Judge Ish, an early personage. Two stones are there,

so it might well be presumed that the second grave is that of his wife. Both are enclosed within an iron fence. Many stories are told of the Judge having his coffin made previous to his death and keeping it stored in his house. The coffin was said to be much larger than normal.

On the farm of J. W. Parks, east of Miami, is a single grave; the stone badly defaced by the weather bears the name of Rogers.

On the farm known as the Garnett place and in more recent times known as the Hamner farm, but now owned by Mr. and Mrs. Ward Ankrum is found the Garnett Cemetery where several are buried.

Another family burial plot that the ravages of time and man have taken their toll is the Cooper Family Cemetery on the farm owned by Arthur Elson, east of Miami. This family were related to the Cooper family of Cooper's Fort in Howard Co., well-known to early residents of this country in the time of the Indian raids about the time of the War of 1812. Buried in this cemetery was Tobias Cooper in 1854 and his wife, Mary Wolfskill Cooper in 1896, and several children who died in infancy.

On land known to many of an older generation as the Withers place, but now owned by Herman Lowenstein, are several graves. This land is about one mile east of Fairville.

The Hickman Cemetery is on Route O, west of Slater some three or more miles. It is protected by a wire fence which keeps

livestock out and is reasonably well-kept. There must be between fifteen and twenty graves arranged in neat rows with stones to mark each grave.

Southwest of Miami, on land owned by Carlisle Morrison there are five or six graves. The stones for only two remain, and one bears the inscription, William M. Parson, died Nov. 18, 1850, aged 35 years, the other, Leroy Minor, Dec. 29, 1850, aged 56 years.

## The Negro Cemeteries

There is a cemetery southwest of Miami in Coon Hollow, where the faithful workers of past years were laid to rest. It is in very bad condition, being badly overgrown with weeds and brush, until it is almost unrecognizable as a cemetery. It contains many unmarked graves along with some that have been marked, some with wooden markers which have deteriorated with the years. The last burial was sometime about twenty years ago.

On Cow Creek there are two cemeteries, both of which are in bad condition. The Baptist Cemetery is on land given for the purpose by Mr. I. C. Withers, who came to this county in 1866. It is a fractional acre probably. It was not learned when it was first used as a burial place, but it contains the graves of perhaps seventy five. There is no way of telling for sure as the markers are badly eroded, and many graves were never marked. Originally a neat little church was on these grounds, but that has been gone for a long time. The

last burial was about 1952.

South of the Baptist Cemetery and east was the Methodist Cemetery. At one time a nice little church and an adjoining school house, known as Sandy Hill, was located there. buildings have been gone several years, and so completely gone are all of the signs of these buildings that it is difficult to realize they ever existed. The land for this came from Mr. Baldwin Harl who came to Saline County from Virginia in 1852. It was not ascertained when this plot was used first. There must be at least over one hundred graves here and occasionally there are burials still made. At Miami the colored cemetery is just north of the old I. O. O. F. Cemetery, on a slope that is bordered on the east by Mo. Highway #41. The cemetery is well kept and is neat. Many of the markers are of stone. Some, however, have the temporary marker placed at the time of intermnet. No doubt there are many unmarked graves. Possibly as many as a hundred and fifty are buried there.
