

NUMERT N. BOD' PAASCH

A man of the West and a true cattleman, Robert H. "Bob" Paasch, age 85, of Billings, passed away on Aug. 4, 2002, at Aspen Meadows due to multiple medical complications.

Bob was born Dec. 28, 1916, the third child of Henry and Amanda Paasch on the homestead ranch in Billings County, N.D. He attended a rural country school, followed by Belfield High School, graduat-

ing in 1933. In 1939, he graduated from North Dakota Agricultural College, now North Dakota State University, majoring in animal husbandry. He sometimes worked two or three jobs to help pay for his college expenses. He was a member of the N.D.A.C. judging team, winning trips to compete in Kansas City and Chicago and was the recipient of a Danforth Fellowship. This was an award for the outstanding college junior from each state in agriculture. He belonged to the Kappa Sigma Chi fraternity. At the time of his graduation, jobs were scarce and his first employment a week following gradua-

tion was driving a team of Belgian horses, pulling a manure spreader on the campus of the school from which he had just obtained his degree in agriculture.

It was at college he met, courted and married his beloved wife, Doreen. Their 63 wonderful years together was an inspiration to all. They moved to Billings in 1946 when the Billings Public Stockyards opened. In 1948, he started his own cattle buying company, Robert Paasch Cattle Company. He began to meet a series of lifelong friends and acquaintances, and is one of a few people who truthfully said, "I never had a day I didn't enjoy

going to work." He was also associated with Vale Creek Ranch for 20 years. During this time, Bob and two good friends purchased a piece of property south of Billings to run cattle on; part of this property sold and is now known as "The Briarwood." Dad was so pleased and proud of the development and golf course that even when he was forced into using a cane to get around he would go out and "check out the land." He had a great memory for names and events and so enjoyed. telling a story about one of his old horses, a saddle or a cowboy he knew. He could remember a herd of cattle he bought 50 years ago, who they were sold to, how good they were and the price they brought. When he quit buying cattle, they retired his selling number at the livestock ring. He loved the West, the people and seeing the "country on the other side of the hill." His other love was for his wife, children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Nothing was more important to him.

Bob was a member of The Montana Stockgrowers, Faith Chapel, Elks, and a lifelong member of the Masonic Lodge. Survivors include his wife, Doreen; sister, Ione Paasch of Phoenix, sister, Ruth Hart of Palm Court, Fla.; and brother, Ray Paasch of Medora, N.D.; son, Dick (Jane) Paasch of Billings; two daughters, Bobi (Ron) Mellor of Littleton, Colo. and Susan (Barry) Mettler of Billings. There are eight grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

vivian A. Paladin

FORT WORTH, Texas -Vivian A. Paladin, former editor of "Montana The Magazine of Western History," died May 21,

2002, in Fort Worth, after a nine-month struggle with cancer. Her friends and family will miss her warmth, wit and generosity of spirit.



Born to Hans VIVIAN G. and Clara PALADIN Marie Haugen Hilden in Glasgow, Mont., on Aug. 4, 1918, the second of six daughters, Vivian spent most of her childhood in Glasgow, graduating from Glasgow High School in 1935.

While still in high school, Vivian took a work-study job setting type for the "Glasgow Times." While attending the University of Montana School of Journalism in 1937, she became the first woman typesetter to work on the "Kaimin," the student newspaper.

Vivian left the university for a job at the "Cut Bank Pioneer Press," where she quickly moved into the editorial department, fulfilling her goal of becoming a working journalist. A tremendously talented woman and a MAY 2 4 2002

self-described "workhorse," Vivian honed her editorial skills on several newspapers along the Hi-Line, including stints in Conrad, Shelby and Havre. It was in Shelby in 1941 that Vivian met Jack Paladin, then an immigration border patrol inspector. The two married in 1946 after Jack returned from the South Pacific, where he fought with the Marines during World War II.

After her marriage, Vivian continued to work on various newspapers as a typesetter and a reporter. She and Jack moved to Helena in 1956, where he continued to work for the Immigration Service, and in 1958, Vivian joined the staff of the Montana Historical Society as associate editor of the "Montana The Magazine of Western History."

She became the magazine's editor in 1966 and served in that position until 1978, when she retired in order to spend more time with Jack, whose health had begun to fail. Vivian and Jack shared several good years before his death in 1987. Together they enjoyed boating and fishing at the Gates of the Mountains and spending time with their grandchildren.

Vivian was largely responsible for the popularity of the Montana Historical Society's magazine, "Montana The Magazine of Western History." During her tenure as editor, the magazine's circulation grew from 6,000 to

12,000 subscribers and set the standard for other historical society journals across the country. Upon her retirement, Montana historian K. Ross Toole listed the ingredients of Vivian's success: a "critical editorial eye ... a distaste for pomposity; ... an enormous capacity for hard work; ... infinite patience."

The significance of her work widely recognized. was 35 numerous awards from the National Press Woman's Association, the National Cowboy Hall of Fame, the American Association for State and Local History, and other organizations attest. She was active in several professional organizations. including the Montana Woman's Press Association and the Western History Association. In 1969 she became the first woman and the first Montanan to be elected to the Western History Association's governing council.

In addition to her remarkable contributions to Montana and western history, she will be remembered for her tenacity, her stellar sense of humor and her tremendous capacity for friendship.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Hans and Clara Hilden; son Steven; husband Jack; sisters Eleanor, Helen, Verna and Marjorie. She is survived by her

Martha M. Palm


Martha M. Palm, 68, of Billings, passed away Saturday morning, Jan. 19, 2002, at the Valley Healthcare Center.




