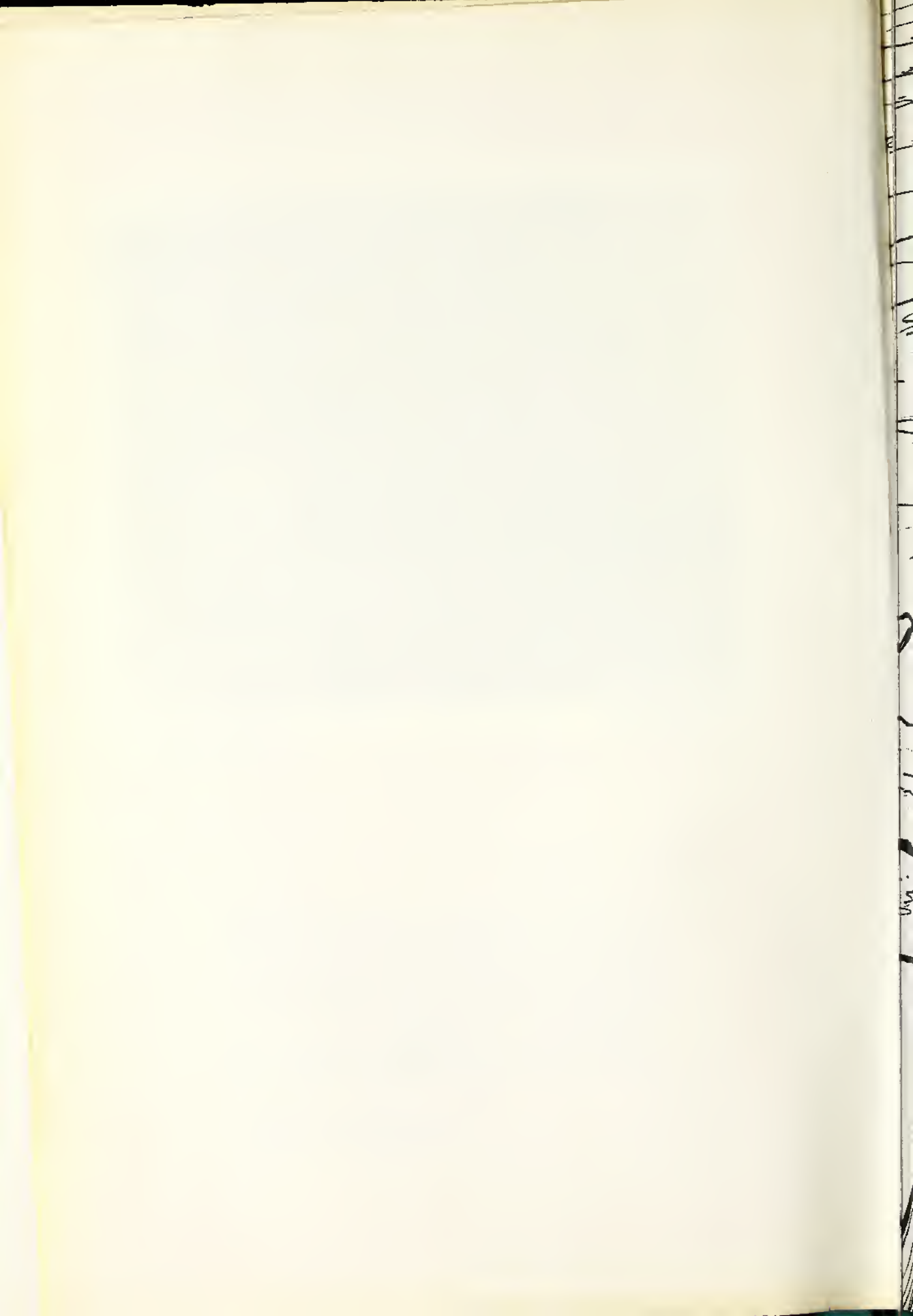
To the Class of 1959:

- 23-27 RE Week arrived with daily chapel services and the Reverend William Lindsay as featured speaker for the week.

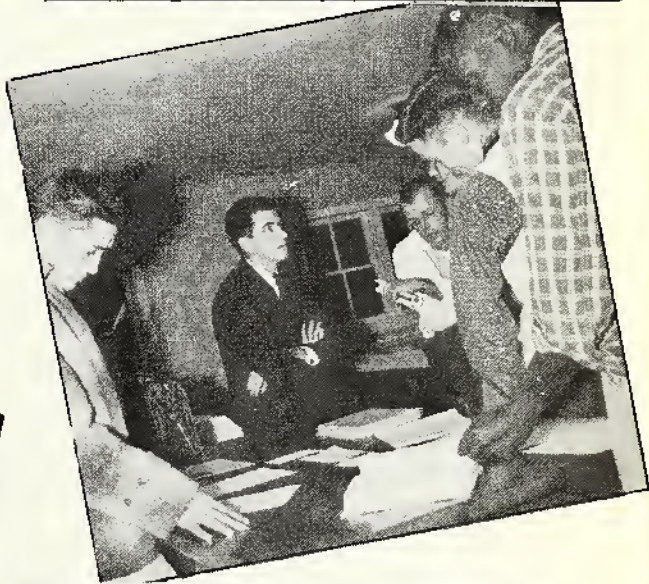
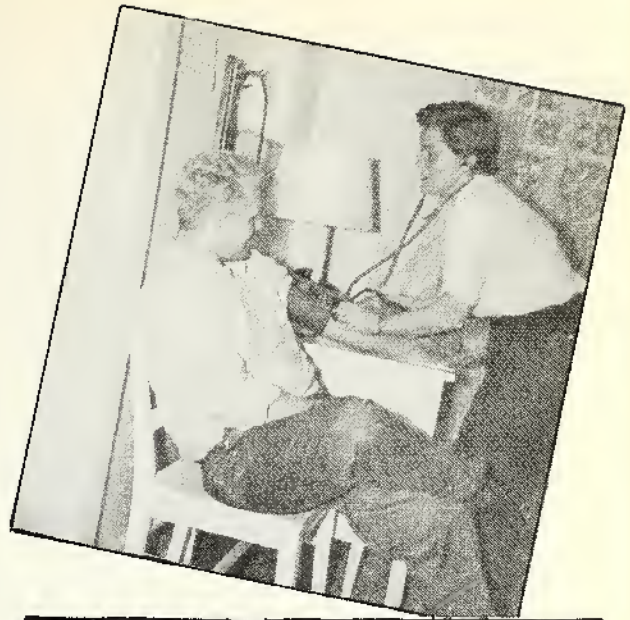
MARCH

23 The Junior-Senior Banquet and Prom were held in the Northern Hotel.

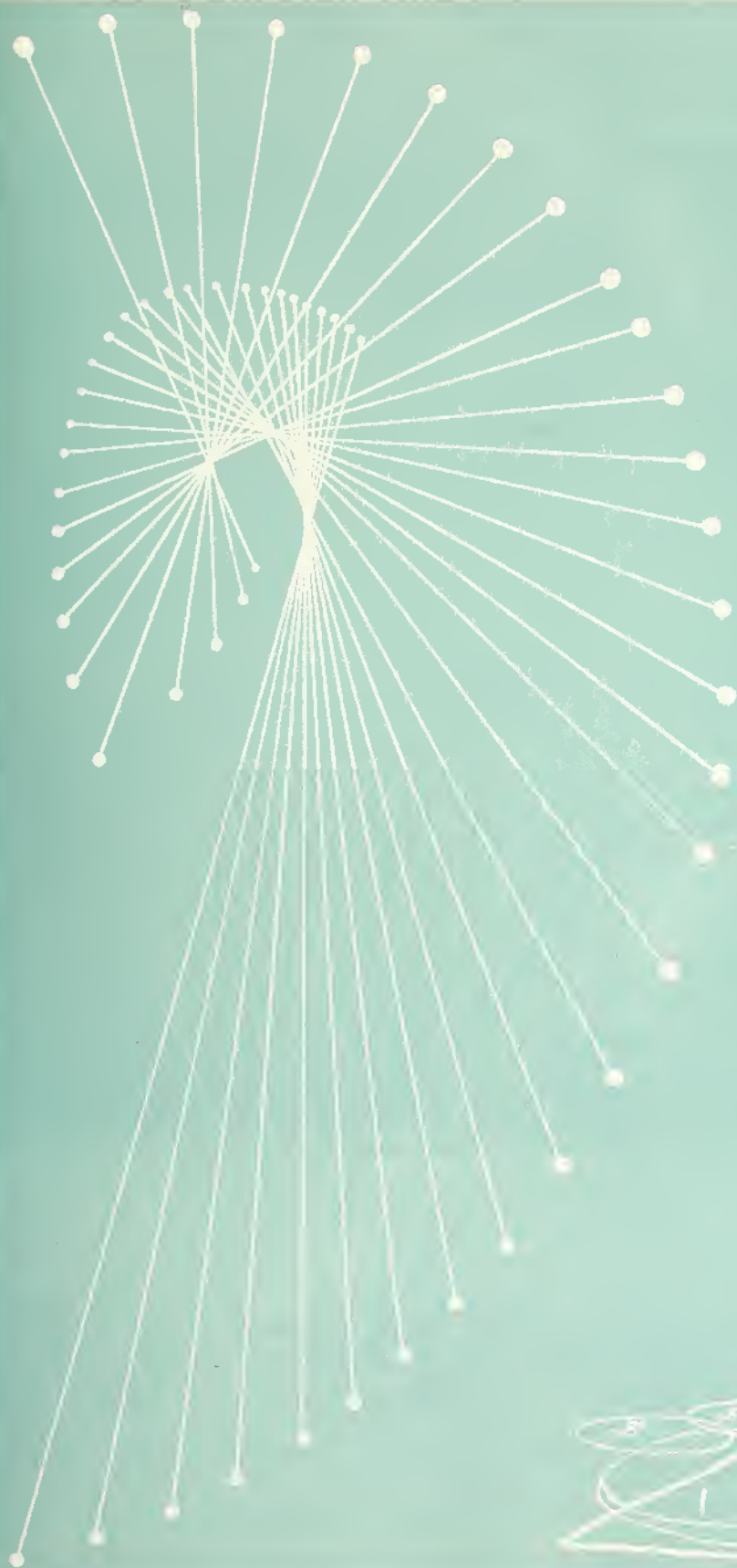
26-29 Finals and goodbyes went hand in hand as the RMC doors began to close.
