





Mr. Morris, an Eng. L1 teacher, is interested in basketball officiating and journalism. In out-of-school hours, he golfs, bowls, and collects coins.






THE SEASON

Billings West High's 1962 Golden Bears started their football season with a 19-0 loss to the Miles City Cowboys. In their first conference game the following week, they lost to Butte Public 13-0, but after the game, the Butte coach said that it had been a long time since his boys had taken so much punishment. During the two weeks preceding the Senior High game, the Bears abandoned their ineffective Texas offense and returned to a modified version of last year's Wing-T. The sports writers picked the Bears to lose to the Broncs by three touchdowns, but when the final gun sounded, the score stood 13-12, the Bears coming out on the short end in one of the hardest fought games ever played in Daylis Stadium. The next week the Bears succumbed to the State Champion Great Falls Bison 20-0.

In the following weeks the Bears began to sparkle. They beat Butte Central 20-0 for their first conference win. After this win the Bears traveled to Kalispell where they trailed 13-12 at halftime, but they bounced back in the second half to maul the Braves 45-13. The Bears lost to Missoula 19-14, but led most of the game. A blocked punt in the West end zone during the final minutes of play gave the game to the Spartens. In a game in which every player saw action, the Bears triumphed over the Helena Bengals 42-14. In the season's hard-fought finale the Golden Bears beat the Anaconda Copperheads 18-6.

West High improved this year, finishing with a 4-4 conference record. Now that this year's team has shown that West High can compete with the other AA powers, it will be up to future teams to carry on a winning tradition.








TRACK SQUAD BLOOMS INTO AA CONTENDER


