PREFACE.

A visit to the old burying ground near Sheppard's Mill is not without interest to those who care for the past. Lying just beneath our feet as we reverently move among the graves are the remains of men and women who once peopled this part of the county. They were tenderly laid in this secluded spot so long ago, that no one comes here to weep over their graves and are quite forgotten by the present generation who never knew them.

What stories could they tell; these silent sleepers lying here, of life in old colonial times; when the Indian dwelt by the running brook and hunted the deer in the forest. When the country was new and homes in "Old Cohansey" were won through toil and struggle, when a living faith and hope of a better life led these men and women to the church in the grave yard, where sustained and comforted by the preacher's word, they endured the privation, sickness and death that came at last to all.

What tales could they relate, living under kingly rule, of British oppression and unjust taxation; of the love of country, of liberty, of independence, of the long years of war; with sorrow, sickness or death in every household, of victory at last, of peace and happy homes.

In the thicket where the holly grows, the stream still flows onward to the river, unmindful of the changes since the church folk at the noontide hour slacked their thirst with its waters, while near at hand was the church where they heard of the living waters that satisfieth the soul

Within this enclosure they laid their loved ones, here they too found rest, each in their narrow cell. Surely, this is hallowed ground and sacred to their memory.

HISTORICAL SKETCH.

One of the old burying grounds of Cumberland County in which burials ceased long ago, is located in the township of Hopewell not far from the Greenwich line, and about one mile from Cohansey River. Sheppard's Mill station on the New Jersey Central Railroad is less than half a mile distant.

The church known as the "First Cohansey Baptist Church," which once stood near the centre of the present enclosure, was the result of a compromise between the early Baptist settlers who located about 1683 at Shrewsbury Neck; on the south side of Cohansey River and those who settled in 1685 on the north side, near the present site of Bowentown.

Rev. Thomas Killingsworth, an Englishman of unusual attainments was pastor over the settlers on the south side of the river, while Rev. Timothy Brooks was the leader on the north side, two societies, each with a house of worship, so they continued until the death of Mr. Killingsworth in 1709, when the congregations were induced to unite.

The members agreed upon a new site, that of the present grave yard as the most convenient; with Mr. Brooks as minister. Here about 1714 a church was erected. Mr. Brooks died two years later and the church was supplied once a month from Cape May.

Rev. William Butcher was ordained as pastor in 1721, dying after a short pastorate, December 12, 1724. Rev. Nathaniel Jenkins of Cape May, after supplying the church again for six years, was settled in 1730. He was a man of superior education and talents, active in the affairs of church and state. During his ministry the church grew in numbers and influence, a new and larger house of worship was built in 1741, and the lot surounding it dedicated to the burial of the dead. On the 2d of June 1754, Mr. Jenkins ceased his earthly labors, much lamented.

Rev. Robert Kelsey, an Irishman by birth, succeeded Mr. Jenkins in 1756. He is said to have been "a man of genial character, witty and instructive in conversation, fervent in piety, orthodox in doctrines and faithful in labor." Through his records we have some knowledge regarding the affairs of the church during his ministry.

He died May 30, 1789, in the 79th year of his age and is buried in the church yard.

Rev. William Rogers supplied the church after Mr. Kelsey's death. He was a graduate of Rhode Island College 1769, a professor in the College of Philadelphia while serving the church here. His is one of the promineut names we meet with among the many who ministered to the people of West Jersey. It is reported twenty-three were baptised during the two years following the death of Mr, Kelsey.

Rev. Henry Smalley took charge of the church July 3d 1790. He was a recent graduate of the College of New Jersey and entered upon his work with commendable zeal, good judgement and an earnest lofty purpose. It was during his pastorate a more convenient site was secured and a substantial brick church erected at Roadstown, about two miles northwest of the former location, this church was dedicated in 1802.

The old house of worship was offered to the Baptists of Fairfield Township if they would place it in repair and make use of it.

One circumstance connected with the old church is worthy of notice in that period, when, during the winter clergymen preached in overcoat and mittens, while the congregation shivered and shook with the cold; we have the authority of Rev. Morgan Edwards that the church had a stove as early as 1789.

Mr. Smalley's pastorate lasted forty-nine years when he was called to his reward. The church at Roadstown still stands, a fine example of the churches of the early nineteenth century. Close by is a well filled grave yard over a century old.

In the old grave yard, the inscriptions from whose stones will be found in the following pages, is the burial place of the first white female born in Cohansey. Another interesting stone is that of Lieutenant Mulford, whose life was a sacrifice to the cause of American liberty.

Quaint and curious are many of the inscriptions to our eyes, but the same love and tenderness for the dead was shown then as now; when the mystery surrounding the change we call death seems as difficult of solution as ever.

NOTE.

In copying the time worn stones, a few mistakes were unavoidable. These the compiler has been able to correct through the courtesy of Mr. Charles E. Sheppard of Bridgeton, who more than a generation ago transcribed the names and dates. From Mr. Sheppard's manuscript two or three names and several initials have been incorporated in the list, to be found at the close of the inscriptions on page seventeen.
