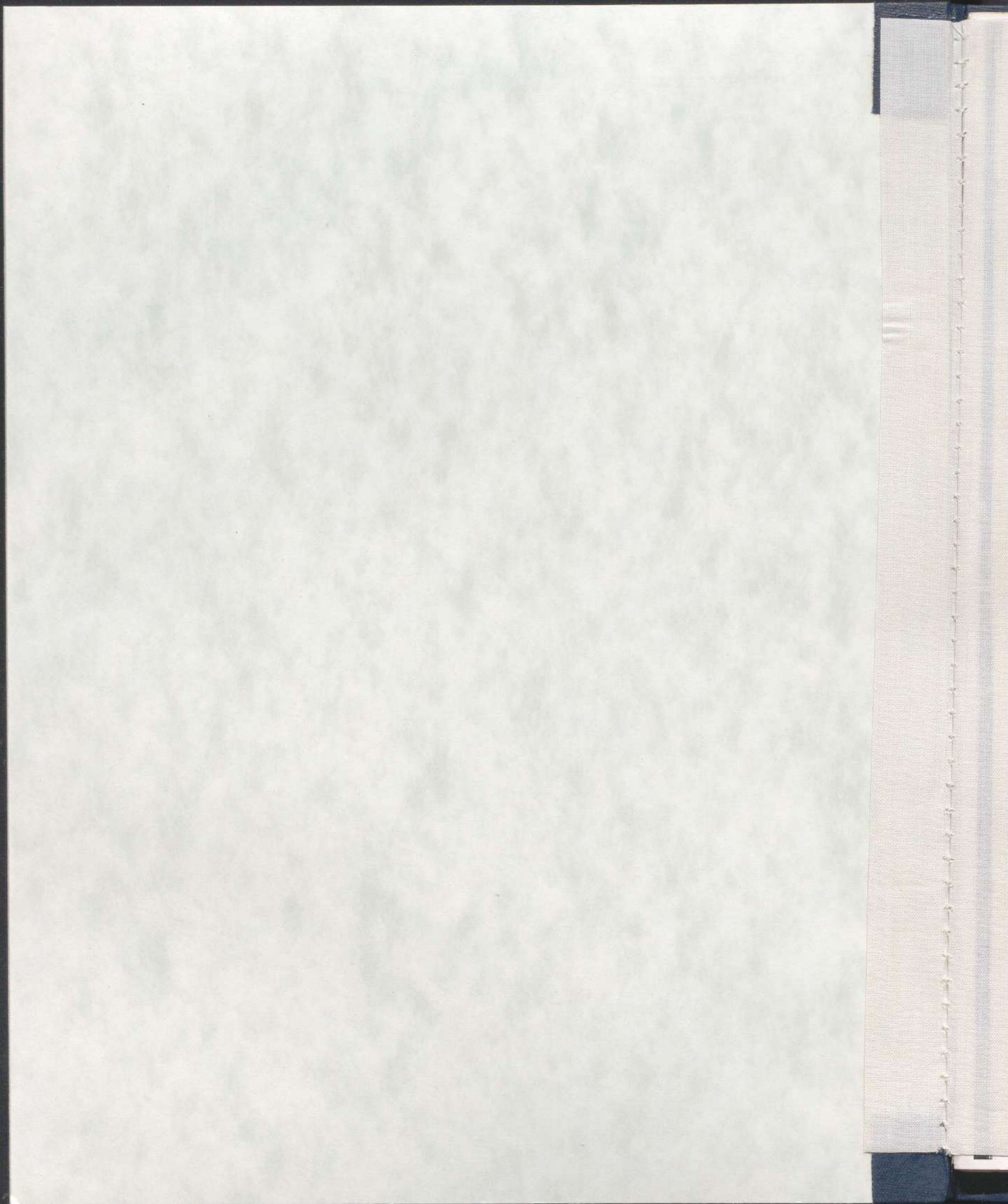

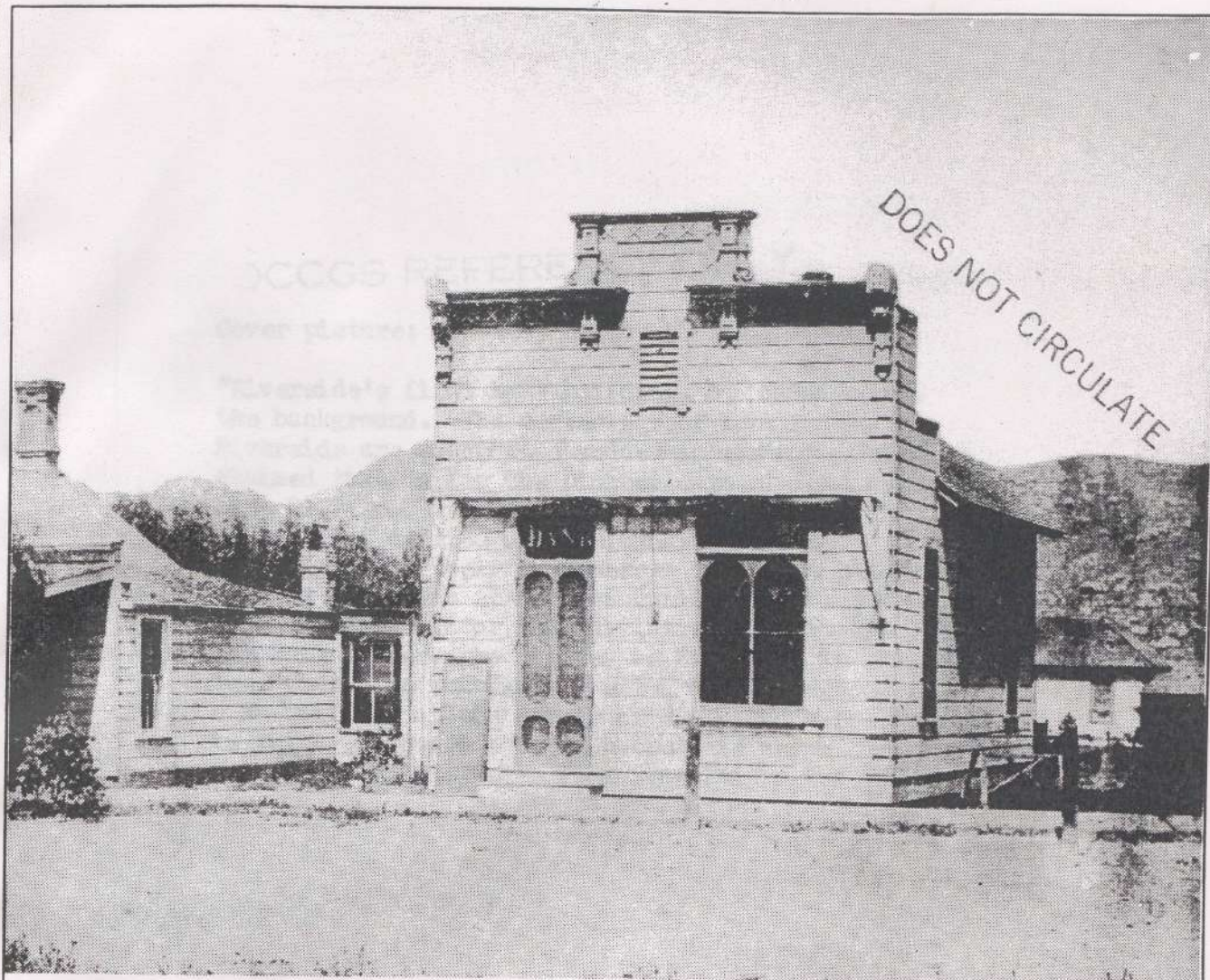

It is claimed that during the pioneer days of that city, Burt Brothers, who operated a general merchandise store, also carried on some banking for the convenience of their customers. The first bonafied banking house was opened for business on December 6, 1880, as a result of the initiative of O.T. Dyer, an Illinois banker, who arrived in Riverside in July of that year. He immediately set about to erect a small bank building at the corner of Ninth and Main Streets in which he opened a bank on the date above mentioned."

APPENDIX II

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES OF SOME EARLY RIVERSIDE PIONEERS

Material contained in these short biographical sketches was abstracted from several sources including Elmer Wallace Holmes' "History of Riverside County" and John Brown's "History of San Bernardino and Riverside Counties." In preparing these sketches the intent was to provide basic genealogical items as aids for researchers. More thorough information can be obtained from various other publications as listed in Appendix III.

CLAPP, James D....born about 1817 in Connecticut where his father, Nathan CLAPP, was a native...family moved to York, Livingston County, New York, when James D. was two years old...he attend Wyoming (N.Y.) Academy...taught at the Temple Hill Academy at Genesee, N.Y....lived in Hazel Green, Deleware County, Iowa during the Civil war ...returned to Livingston County, N.Y. afterwards... married there to Mary Jane, daughter of John DODGE, who was born in Wardsborough, Windham County, Vermont, October 24, 1784 and died in York, N.Y., April 31, 1873. James D. Clapp came to Riverside in 1871 principally to find a better climate to restore his health...he brought 20 acres of land on Brockton Avenue, which he set out to oranges and other fruits. Later, in 1880, he purchased 2½ acres on Ninth Street...member of the Republican party ...and the Congregational Church. James D. died in Riverside March 23, 1896, and his wife died there November 9, 1902. Their only daughter, Helen E., married S.G. AMES of San Diego.

CROSBY, Chester Augustus...born July 11, 1845, Putnam County, New York, son of David and Elira (MARVIN) CROSBY, both natives and lifelong residents of that county... David Crosby died at about age thirty...son Chester was taken into the home of a relative who reared him to young manhood...at the age of 16 he entered Claverack College on the Hudson and took a two year course...at the age of 21 he engaged in the shoe business in partnership with an uncle, F.G. CROSBY, in Ottawa, Canada...in 1879, due to ill health of his wife, Chester Crosby sought a milder climate, came to California and located in Riverside... he bought thirty acres of land in the Arlington area... in 1891 he sold 12 acres to Mrs. William THAW...in 1900 he accepted a position with C.E. RUMSEY, becoming the manager of a ranch purchased by him at that date...the nucleus of the new famous Alta Cresta groves... consisting of 175 acres. Chester Crosby married at Carmel,

Putnam County, New York, May 18, 1868, Emma E. FOWLER, a native of that county...they had three children: Chester E., resident of San Diego; Harold D. of Pasadena and Ruth. Mr. Crosby was a Republican...member of the First Presbyterian Church.

EVANS, Samuel C....born at Fort Defiance, Williams County, Ohio, in 1823, son of Dr. John EVANS, a native of Kentucky who died in Indiana in 1842...arrived in Riverside 1874...one of the originators and president of the Riverside Land and Irrigation Company formed in 1875. That company purchased lands and water rights giving them control of the entire water system of the Riverside Valley...the canals extending twenty miles and thousands of acres of fertile land were brought under irrigation. S.C. Evans was a director of the Riverside Water Company, president of the Riverside-Arlington Railway and of the Loring Opera House Company and developed several hundred acres of oranges and an extensive vineyard...member of the Presbyterian Church, ...a Republican. His two sons, S.C. Evans and P.T. Evans both resided in Riverside.

GARCELON, George W....born in New Brunswick in 1832... moved in 1852 to the United States...locating in Lewiston, Missouri...married there in 1858, Mary F., daughter of Edward P. TOBIE...arrived in Riverside in 1872, purchased several parcels of land...growing his own nursery stock, planted citrus and deciduous trees...in 1873 he built the first plastered house in the colony...a Republican, in 1888 he was a Supervisor from his district ...member of the Board of Trade, and in 1886 was one of Riverside's representatives to the Chicago Fair and had charge of the exhibit...member and trustee of the Congregational Church. Mr. Garcelon died March 9, 1905.

GILMAN, James M....born in Meredith, Belknap County, New Hampshire, June 9, 1842...son of James and Susan (MEAD) GILMAN, both born and reared in the same county. The great-great grandfather Gilman, also named James, was the immigrant ancestor of the family in America...James M. was one of eight children born to his parents... other surviving children were Granville B., D. Frank and Lillie E., wife of F.S. PRESCOTT of Oakland, California. In 1869, James M. came to Riverside, where he pre-empted one hundred and sixty acres, bought 80 acres of railroad land and took up an additional 80 acres under the Desert Act; about one half of the land was tillable and the balance pasture land. He also had an orchard of 50 acres in prunes, plums, apricots, almonds and olives as well as a vineyard. In 1909, the property was incorporated under

the name of the Gilman Home Company... James M. Gilman married in Riverside, January 14, 1871, Martha B., daughter of Dr. Isaac SMITH, a pioneer of Riverside, arriving here in 1853 from Iowa. Mr. and Mrs. Gilman had eight children; M. French, Herbert M., Carrie A., James G., Arthur F., C. Mabel, Ethel S. and one child who died in early childhood. Mr. Gilman was Deputy Assessor of San Bernardino and Riverside Counties... a Democrat... belonged to the Baptist Church in Banning.

HALL, Priestley... born in Cincinnati, Ohio, May 15, 1859, only son of Dr. John Hall, a pioneer of Riverside... came to Riverside with his parents in 1873... in 1880, Mr. Hall bought one hundred and sixty acres of unimproved land of Mrs. Annie Denton CRIDGE... later added another 80 acres to this and together with 40 acres left him by his father made him owner of 280 acres within the city limits of Riverside. The first 20 acres were subdivided in 1886... he graded avenues and streets, laid out parks and planted and cared for thousands of ornamental trees... was assistant engineer under C.C. MILLER with the Gage Canal System, bringing water to Riverside... President in 1887 of Hall's Addition Water Company... in June, 1887, he incorporated Hall's Addition Railroad Company, was made president and general manager and built and equipped $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles of street railway upon which were operated mule-cars... this line later consolidated with the Riverside-Arlington Railway and Mr. Hall became a director. He also organized a nursery company supplying stock of all kinds to Riverside and surrounding counties... July 29, 1890, in Riverside, he married Agnes OVERTON, who was born in Avoca, Wisconsin... was a Republican and Prohibitionist... member of the Second Church of Christ Scientist of Riverside... a Mason, member of Evergreen Lodge, No. 259... he died July 27, 1911.

HOLMES, Elmer Wallace... born December 8, 1841, at Brockton, Massachusetts of Pilgrim ancestry. His father died in 1851 leaving his mother with five children dependent upon her, Elmer being the oldest... at age thirteen Elmer apprenticed as a printer... enlisted in the Thirty-fifth Massachusetts Infantry during the Civil War... discharged Fall, 1863, re-enlisted 1864, was a lieutenant at close of the war... returning to civilian life in Massachusetts, he was a foreman on the Randolph Register, which paper he subsequently purchased and managed... later a partner in the Brockton Gazette... health reasons forced him to sell out and move to California in 1874, and in April of 1875 he settled in Riverside. He was associated with several newspapers of the time in Riverside, and in 1888

San Bernardino County elected him Assemblyman...in 1893, he was appointed to the Board of County Supervisors and was then three times re-elected to that post. In 1863, he married Ruth C. NICKELSON of Harwich, Mass., who died giving birth to a son Elmer Elwood. In 1871, Mr. Holmes married Alice E. ODELL of Randolph, Mass., and they had two daughters: Anne Lucia, who married Loye Holmes MILLER of Riverside and Alice Bertha, who married Otis D. BALDWIN of Riverside. Mr. Holmes was very active in the citrus growing efforts of Riverside and represented this city in Chicago and New York at the world fairs as a means of introducing our fruit into that great distributing market. Active also in local school affairs, he organized the Riverside High School, was the author of the Union District High School Law, and served six years as a board member on the board of city trustees from 1884 on...principal organizer of the Riverside Library Association in 1879, and it was through his efforts while acting Mayor that the library was presented to the city and made a free public library...author of several books, including; "History of Riverside County," published in 1912. Mr. Holmes died in 1913.

JARVIS, John T....born in Ontario, Canada, March 10, 1848, son of Jonathon and Eliza JARVIS...arrived in Riverside 1880...citrus grower, real estate and insurance agent...active in the Republican party, Independent Order of Odd Fellows and the Masonic Order...member of the Episcopal Church...married in Ontario, Canada, Miss DUNDAS in May, 1869. Mr. and Mrs. Jarvis had eight children, four of whom survived: John, Lelia, who married M.O. PANN of Riverside, Constance and William M.

LA RUE, Scott...born in Franklin County, Indiana, July 19, 1874, son of Seneca and Samantha (LEACH) LA RUE, born natives of Indiana...a resident of California since 1876...citrus grower...director in the local water company...married on September 26, 1900 in San Diego, Maude WEBSTER, who was born in Wisconsin and lived in Nebraska. They had six children: Harold, Mildred, Richard, Norma, Aileen and Marion. Mr. La Rue was a member of the school board...a Republican.

MILLER, Capt. C.C....born in Oneida County, New York in 1824...son of Chauncey and Alice RENEY) MILLER, both natives of that county where his grandfather, Grant MILLER, settled in the early days of the colonies and built the first house in that vicinity...C.C. Miller educated in schools of New York state until about age 21, when he joined the family in Ohio, where he entered Oberlin College...two years later he entered Cleveland University...graduated there in 1852 in civil engineering

... (2 years with) the Illinois Central and Atlantic and Ohio Railroads... to Tomah, Wisconsin, and for the next ten years was engaged in building many railroads in Wisconsin and Minnesota... identified with the building up of Monroe County. He enlisted in the Civil War... Captain of Company M, 49th Vol. Inf.,... in Missouri under General DODGE... Honorably discharged in 1865... employed as assistant chief engineer in the building of the West Wisconsin and St. Paul Railway, and later as Chief Engineer of the Wabasha and Lake Superior Railroad... his wife's ill health made it necessary to seek a milder climate... in 1873 he came to Riverside as chief engineer and superintendent of El Sobrante de San Jacinto Rancho, later engaged in the construction of the canals of the Riverside Water Company's system... his family arrived here in October 1873... in 1874 he bought a block of land lying between 6th and 7th and Main and Orange streets... the desirable location of his home and the lack of accommodations caused them to open his home to visitors... and year after year he added to his cottage home - "Glenwood Cottage"... from which has developed the Glenwood Mission Inn of Riverside. (This was the beginning of today's famous "Mission Inn," which his son, Frank, brought to such prominence throughout the world.)... In 1881, C.C. Miller retired, selling out the Glenwood Hotel to his son, Frank A.... In 1852, Captain Miller was married to Mary, daughter of Dr. CLARK, a physician of Lorain County, Ohio. Mrs. Miller came from Quaker stock... Captain and Mrs. Miller had four children: Emma, who became the wife of G.O. NEWMAN; Frank A., who married Isabella Demarest HARDENBURG; Alice, who married F.W. RICHARDSON; Edward E., who married Emma C. TOMPKINS.

MILLER, Frank Augustus... born at Tomah, Wisconsin, June 30, 1859, son of Captain Christopher C. and Mary (CLARK) MILLER... arrived in Riverside with his parents in 1873... married Isabella Demarest HARDENBURG in 1880... she was one of the first school principals in Riverside and died there July, 1908, leaving one daughter, Allis Hardenburg Miller who married Dewitt V. HUTCHINGS. Mr. Miller married again, December 8, 1911, Marian C. CLARK of Riverside. Frank Miller was the founder of the Glenwood Mission Inn, long the central attraction which Riverside offers the tourist... he took the initiative and secured the financial help required to build Riverside's first business blocks, the Loring Opera House and the Rubidoux, and later devised the idea and secured the assistance of H. E. HUNTINGTON and several other citizens in transforming Mount Rubidoux and its vicinity into Huntington Park... was very active in the

fight for county division where the political influence he secured was the factor which gave ultimate success and made Riverside the county seat...the same influence was powerful in securing the location in Riverside of the government Indian school - the Sherman Institute... Mr. Miller died June 15, 1935.

MORRIS, W.P....born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, December 18, 1844...second oldest child of Hiram and Elizabeth (HART) MORRIS, both descendents of English ancestry and early settlers of Philadelphia...enlisted for service in the Civil War in Company C, First New York Cavalry...in the Army of the Potomac under General McClellan...was present at the surrender of General Lee...wounded in 1864, discharged July 7, 1865, New York...one year later he enlisted in the United States Cavalry service and with other troops was sent to Wilmington, California in 1867...injured there, he was discharged in 1868...employed on the survey of the first railroad into Los Angeles from Wilmington... later was in the sheep business...joined his brothers, Thomas K. and W.P. Morris in a ten acre tract in Riverside and set the land to fruit...a Democrat...elected justice of the peace of Banning in 1889 and held that office for fifteen years.

NORTH, Judge J.W....known as the real founder of Riverside...born in Sand Lake, Rensselaer County, New York, January 4, 1815, a son of Jonathan North who was a Methodist preacher. The North's originated in England, the immigrant ancestor settling in Hartford, Conn. The grandfather of John W. North moved from Litchfield, Conn. and settled in Rensselaer County, New York. John W. North was admitted to the bar of the Supreme Court of the state of New York and he practiced there until 1849, when he went to Minnesota...located in St. Anthony Falls (Minneapolis)...in 1850 was elected to the legislature, introduced and managed the bill founding the University of Minnesota...conceived the idea of forming a colony in Southern California...in March, 1870, he sent out circulars...the Riverside area was chosen as best suited for the proposed town...soon settlers began coming... in 1875, he established law offices in Riverside, San Bernardino and San Francisco...Mr. North married twice...first in 1845 to Emma BACON who died without issue in 1847. He married second, in 1848, Ann H. LOOMIS, a native of New York State, and they had six children: Emma B., George L., John G., Charles L., Edward and Mary. Judge North died in Fresno, California, February 22, 1890.

NORTH, John G....born in St. Anthony (Minneapolis) Minnesota, September 16, 1855, son of Judge J.W. North... attended the University of Pacific at Santa Clara,

California...in 1870, joined his father who had just organized the Southern California Colony Association and concluded the purchase of the tract of land upon which Riverside is now situated...for four years he served as Assistant Secretary of the Colony Association...admitted to the bar April 10, 1894...became a prominent attorney with a wide practice...very active in local affairs, he was stockholder and director in the Citizens National Bank and the Security Savings Bank of Riverside, attorney for the Riverside Trust Company and its allied corporations and a member of such diverse groups as the National Geographical Society, National Forestry Association, California Water and Forest Association, Los Angeles Bar Association, Southern Archaeological Institute, Sierra Club, and was a Knight Templar Mason and member of the Knights of Pythias. In 1876, Mr. North married Augusta C. NOURSE, who died in 1891, leaving four sons: Jon C., Maurice E., Alfred C., and Richard L. While in London, England on business, John G. North died January 9, 1910.

OGDEN, Frank P....born December 18, 1871, in Knox County, Illinois...adopted by M.B. Ogden and his wife, the former Sophia LINDQUEST...on November 22, 1880, the Ogden family arrived in Riverside...M.B. Ogden died there February 15, 1910. Frank P. bought acreage in 1891 which he set to oranges...on December 23, 1891, he married Clara R., daughter of Bruce DOUGLAS of Vermilion County, Illinois. They had two children, Edna M. and Elta D., both born in Riverside County...Mr. Ogden was a Republican...they were members of the Highgrove Methodist Episcopal Church.

PULS, Henry A....born in Prussia, Germany, October 24, 1847...in 1850 came with his parents to settle in Cook County, Illinois...father was Gottlieb Puls. Henry A. became a carpenter...married about 1875, in Evanston, Illinois, Mary E. HUSE, a native of Farmington, Franklin County, Maine, and sister of Curtis F. Huse of Los Angeles. They had one daughter, Winnie Inez who married Albert O. KNOLL. Mrs. Puls died April 7, 1910. Mr. Puls was a citrus grower and owned property in San Diego, Riverside, San Bernardino and Los Angeles Counties...one of the six persons who promoted and organized the Orange Growers' Association.

ROE, James H....born in Birmingham, England, November 18, 1843, son of Rev. Charles HILL, a native of the north of Ireland, and Mary (STEADMAN) ROE, a native of England...when he was eight years old his father came to this country, locating in Boone County, Illinois, where he had

charge of a church until the Civil War. The father was commissioned as a chaplain of one of the Illinois regiments...at the close of the war was put in charge of the Southwest Department of the Freedman's Aid Commission. James H. Roe...schooled in Boone County until 1859...entered the University of Chicago...in 1862, he accompanied his father, who was chaplain of the Fifty-sixth Regiment of Illinois Infantry to the front...participated in...campaign in the Shenandoah Valley under General Banks...later at surrender of Harper's Ferry. In 1864, he was commissioned a lieutenant in Company D, One Hundred and Thirty-fourth Illinois Volunteers...served in Kentucky and Missouri...then re-entered the University of Chicago, graduating in 1865...in 1866 established a drug store in Marshalltown, Iowa until 1868...moved to Belle Plaine, Iowa...came to California in 1873...purchased twenty acres in Riverside...in 1874, taught in the public schools...in 1876, established a drug store...in 1878, started the first newspaper in Riverside - the Weekly Press...deacon and treasurer of the Baptist Church...author of the manuscript "Notes on Early History of Riverside, California...married in 1870 at Marshalltown, Iowa, Lovina, daughter of Owen PRICE. J.H. Roe died at Riverside August 16, 1900. His daughter, Mary Edna, married Frederick JOHNSON and died March 21, 1907. His son, Robert P., lived in Los Angeles.

SHAW, Martin R....born in White County, Indiana, February 19, 1862...moved in 1870 to Iowa...came to Riverside in the year 1873 with his mother, Mrs. Rebecca (RUSSELL) SHAW, a native of Madison County, Indiana, widow...and three other children...although only eleven years old, Martin R. hired out as a laborer on a ranch operated by his uncles, P.S. and W.P. RUSSELL...six years later he left the ranch and returned to Riverside where he learned the trade of painter...then began to work in an orange packing house...for eleven years he conducted a cigar business...then became Chief of Police of Riverside, serving from April, 1906 to June 1, 1907...married in Riverside, July 15, 1895, Carrie, daughter of Jacob SCHROEDER, of New York state...they had three children: Louise M., Agnes, and Eugene...Mr. Shaw belonged to the Independent Order of Odd Fellows and the Woodmen of the World.

SHUGART, Dr. Kelita Davis...born April 13, 1829, Randolph County, Indiana...died in Riverside, May 10, 1879...(with his parents to Cass County, Michigan...finished his medical studies in the Keokuk (Iowa) Medical College in 1858, continuing practice in Iowa...vicinity of Belle Plaine from 1853 until 1860...to California in 1870...his original

place was bounded by Ninth and Tenth and Mulberry and Lime Streets...Dr. Shugart married in Michigan on July 25, 1852, Martha T. REAMS, a native of that state and the youngest of 14 children born to her parents. She died in Riverside November, 1903...they had two daughters: Lillian, married to L. C. WAITE and Leilia R., who died in 1872. Dr. Shugart was a Mason...American Medical Association...California State Medical and the Southern California Medical Societies...San Bernardino Medical Society.

STREETER, Henry M....born in Heath, Massachusetts, March 18, 1829, son of Charles and Rhoda (RICE) STREETER, both natives of that state...(around 1830) moved to North Adams...learned the trade of tailor and worked at it for about ten years...then secured a position as express messenger and mail clerk with the Boston and Albany Railroad for the next ten years...arrived in Riverside November, 1875...bought 40 acres. Married in Cairo, Illinois, March 11, 1868, Amelia S. NOBLE, a native of Springfield, Vermont. They had no children...Mr. Streeter was a Republican...in 1879, a candidate for the state assembly, elected; re-elected in 1880...in 1890 was elected to the state senate from this district and served until January, 1895...member of the Congregational Church.

TWOGOOD, Adoniram Judson...Simeon TWOGOOD b. December 17, 1792, New York, died 1870, Onondaga County, New York, married Harriet HOAG. Adoniram J. Twogood, son of Simeon and Harriet, born February 17, 1831, Onondaga County, New York, married 1866, Benton County, Iowa to Miss Alice CODDINGTON. Adoniram J. settled in Benton County, Iowa in 1855; enlisted in 6th Iowa Calvary, Company I, in 1862; served three years, was "commissary sergeant", visited California in 1870 with Judge NORTH and Dr. GREVES to discover a townsite...settled in the Riverside colony by 1871. In partnership with D. C. TWOGOOD, his brother-in-law, Adoniram grew and sold oranges. He established East Riverside Land Company in 1886 with the former Iowa Governor, MERRILL and Mr. S. H. HERRICK. Mr. and Mrs. Twogood had one son, Fred and a daughter, Louie M., who died in 1908 at age 39. A.J. supported the Baptist Church, the Republican party and the G.A.R.

TWOGOOD, Daniel C....born December 14, 1835, in New Orleans, Louisiana, where his father Donald H., a native of New York state was engaged in contracting. His mother, Eliza (EDWARDS) TWOGOOD, also a native of New York state, died in Upper Alton, Illinois in 1839 while the family was en route to the north...the father

continued to New York...placed his children in the care of a relative and returned to New Orleans to continue his business...while there met his death a few years later...Daniel C. lived in Lansingburg, New York until 1856...when he went to Marion, Iowa...farmed near Belle Plaine, Iowa...until 1864, when he sold the farm and moved into Belle Plaine...and with his brother established a grain elevator business...sold and started for California and settled in Riverside. He married January 1, 1859, in Marion, Iowa, a cousin, Lydia Adeline, daughter of Simeon TWOGOOD. She died in Riverside, January 28, 1910. Their two children were Carrie Belle EDWARDS, who was born near Belle Plaine, Iowa and died in Riverside in 1880; and Jessie Nettie, born in Belle Plaine and died in Riverside in 1885. Mr. and Mrs. Twogood were members of the Riverside Baptist Church.

WAITE, Captain Lyman C....born in Walworth County, Wisconsin, September 12, 1842, son of Sidney and Parmelia (BARKER) WAITE, both natives of western New York...entered Lawrence University at Appleton, Wisconsin in 1860...enlisted as a volunteer in 1862...assigned to Company D, Twenty-first Regiment, Wisconsin Volunteer Infantry...later made Captain of Company C...was with Sherman in his March to the Sea...In 1869, he located in Belle Plaine, Iowa...became principal of the graded schools...in 1870, entered the law office of Clark and Tewksberry...arrived in Riverside December 8, 1870. In January, 1871, admitted to the bar in San Bernardino County and opened an office in Riverside...was first justice of the peace of the new colony...first notary...taught school in Riverside in 1872-1873...purchased ten acres of land and added more, developing it and carrying on a nursery business...the first marriage ever celebrated in the new colony was that of Captain Waite and Lillian M. SHUGART, the only daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Shugart, pioneers of this section...ceremony was performed by Rev. I. W. ATHERTON, April 5, 1872...they had six children...the eldest a son, who was accidentally drowned when less than three years old...the others were Marion P., Charles E., Lillian Martha, Leilia M. and Mildred M. Mr. Waite was connected with twenty-two corporations serving as president and director for many of them...member of the city council...very active in the banking, water, and orange grower's associations.

WOOD, T. J....known as the first settler of Riverside (who did not belong to the founders)...established his family here in October, 1870...Mrs. Wood was the first white woman to reside in Riverside...Mr. Wood was a carpenter...member of the Odd Fellows Lodge...born in South Carolina in 1838. Mr. and Mrs. Wood had three children.

THE FIRST DECADE OF RIVERSIDE

Excerpted from "Banking History of Riverside," by Roy L. Haglund.

- 1870. June 24 - John W. NORTH party arrived at site of present day Riverside. Deed was issued by California Silk Center Association to the Southern California Colony Association on September 15, 1870. Fifty families invested and 30-40 families moved here at once.
- December - L.C. WAITE, first Justice of the Peace, first school teacher and groom in first marriage, and later a prominent banker, came here from Wisconsin.
- 1871 June 12 - Post Office opened in Riverside with Dr. John P. GREEVES as first Postmaster.
- July 1 - First water reached Riverside by canal.
- " - First public building, a school, was built at a cost of \$1,200.00. There were 25 students.
- 1872 - First church was established, Congregational.
- 1873 - First navel oranges planted by Mr. & Mrs. Luther C. TIBBETS.
- 1874 - Samuel Cary EVANS and Captain W.T. SAYWARD arrived and purchased 10,000 acres adjoining the Southern California Colony Association land to the south and organized the Riverside Land and Irrigation Company.
- 1875 November - First newspaper published: "Riverside News".
- B.D. BURT and his brother constructed the first brick building, Keystone Drug Co., corner of Eighth and Main Streets. Bur Bros. and later Emil ROSENTHAL both operated general stores and did some banking business... mainly safe-keeping of money.

- 1875 June 13 - Glenwood Cottage, later to become the famous Mission Inn, established by Frank A. Miller.
- 1878 February - First Citrus Fair held in Town Hall, Ninth and Main Streets.
- June 20 - Riverside Press begins publication.
- 1880 June 26 - Press headline: "Riverside Gives World Its Finest Orange"
- December 6 - O.T. DYER opened the first bank in a small frame building near Ninth and Main Streets. (cover picture)

HISTORICAL NOTES ON RIVERSIDE

Earliest inhabitants of the Santa Ana River Valley were the Cahuilla and Serrano Indians. On March 20, 1774, CAPTAIN JUAN BAUTISTA DE ANZA and his company of Spanish soldiers camped on the river bank near the place where Riverside now stands, on his way from Tubac to Monterey. Again on New Year's Day, 1776, he camped at the same place on his second journey. This time he brought 242 colonists with him to increase the Spanish population of California.

In the early 1800's BERNARDO YORBA, LUGO and LOUIS RUBIDOUX, JUAN BANDINI and his son-in-law ABEL STEARNS grazed their herds of sheep in the valley of the Santa Ana. JUAN BANDINI received the first grant of land in the Riverside area in 1838. It was called El Rancho Jurupa, and it adjoined the Santa Ana River. In 1847, ABEL STEARNS married a daughter of JUAN BANDINI and later came into possession of El Rancho Jurupa. The portion of the ranch not given to Stearns was sold to LOUIS ROBIDOUX, a Frenchman cum Spaniard, Mexican and American. The spelling of the name was changed to RUBIDOUX. In 1868, 8,600 acres of the Rubidoux Rancho were sold to LOUIS PREVOST, a French nurseryman and silk expert from Los Angeles and his California Silk Center Association. When PREVOST died in 1869, so did the silk craze and the land was purchased by JOHN W. NORTH and his eastern associates for the purpose of establishing a colony. NORTH'S company was called the Southern California Colony Association. The town was named Jurupa, but was changed to Riverside in 1871 when the upper canal from the Santa Ana River reached it. In 1874, two new subdivision projects were started and a year later combined into the Riverside Land and Irrigating Company.

Riverside became an incorporated city in 1883 and had a population at that time of 3,000 people. City boundaries were drawn to include all the land owned by the Riverside Land and Irrigating Company - 56 square miles in all. Riverside was a precinct of San Bernardino County until 1893, when the town was taken into the newly established Riverside County.

Riverside is famous for the Mission Inn, the Mt. Rubidoux Easter Sunrise Service, the Riverside International Raceway, and of course, its orange industry. In 1873, L.C. and ELIZA TIBBETS planted the first Washington Navel orange trees from which California's \$100,000,000 citrus industry grew. In 1879, the first Citrus Fair was held in Riverside and continued each year until the building burned in 1888. In 1892, the first marketing cooperative was founded in Riverside, its success leading to the founding of the California Fruit Growers Exchange. The California Citrograph, the magazine of the citrus industry, was first issued in Riverside in 1915. The Citrus Research Center at the University of California at Riverside was established in 1907 to research the area's agricultural problems and is still very active today.

Riverside is considered one of the cultural centers of California. In schools, art, music and literature it has always excelled. It had the first polo field and golf club, the first Easter Sunrise Service and one of the first junior colleges. It is one of the few cities of its size which present community operas. Magnolia and Victoria Avenues were among the earliest tree-lined boulevards in the state. When Anza camped in Riverside, the only trees were the Cottonwoods growing in the riverbottom. Some prominent varieties today are the Shamel ash, pepper, eucalyptus, palm and, of course, the orange.

Historical landmarks in the area (registered by the California Historical Landmarks Advisory Committee and the Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation) are:

PARENT WASHINGTON NAVEL ORANGE TREE - planted in 1873, still producing fruit. Location: Magnolia and Arlington. (State Historical Monument #20)

SITE OF LOUIS RUBIDOUX HOUSE - In 1844, Rubidoux and his family arrived in California and shortly thereafter he purchased the Jurupa Rancho. He was a prosperous stock raiser and he planted orchards and vineyards, raised grain, built the first grist mill in the area, and operated a winery. Location: 5500 block of Mission Boulevard.

SITE OF OLD RUBIDOUX GRIST MILL - One of the first grist mills in Southern California. It was the only mill of its kind at the time and it supplied a great need. Location: 5504 Molina.

MISSION INN - Frank A. Miller (1857-1935) fulfilled his dream by recreating this early California mission style setting of a hotel. Location: 7th, Main and Orange Streets. (State Historical Monument #761)

DE ANZA CROSSING OF THE SANTA ANA RIVER, 1775 and 1776 - On January 1, 1776, the first party of colonists to come overland to the Pacific Coast crossed the Santa Ana River south of this marker and camped between here and the river. Recruited in the presidios of Sonora, Mexico and led by Lt. Col. Juan Bautista de Anza, who had established the trail a year earlier. This humble and heroic band of 242 men, women and children continued north to found San Francisco; thus was set a boundary to Russian expansion from the north. Three precarious missions were maintained by uncertain ocean voyages prior to the opening of Anza's trail. Afterward, the flourishing missions and ranchos of Spanish California sprang from the droves of cattle, sheep and horses brought over the trail. Location: near the Union Pacific Bridge which was built in 1904.

HERITAGE HOUSE - A lovely example of Victorian elegance brought to Riverside by the early settlers. Built in 1891, it features a beautiful staircase of polished wood, quaint gas lamps, and fireplaces of tile in each room. It was the home of early citrus growers and was purchased for restoration by the Riverside Museum Associates in 1969. Location: 8193 Magnolia Avenue.

VICTORIA AVENUE - is one of the most pleasing streets in the city, as it winds through fragrant groves of citrus for seven miles. Lined with tall Palms, it features a bridle path down the center divider. Originally planted in 1892, it now has 2647 trees of 21 varieties.

FAIRMOUNT PARK - has 183 acres, which include Lake Evans. Located near the downtown area of the city.

MT. RUBIDOUX - is the site of the first outdoor Easter Sunrise Service held in the United States for all faiths.

S.C. EVANS HOME - 7606 Mt. Vernon Avenue, built of adobe in 1874 by Indian labor.

AGUA MANSA BELL - Made in 1866 for the San Salvador Church in Agua Mansa, which has now vanished as a community. This bell is the oldest remaining historic object in the area. Location: Mission Inn Garden.

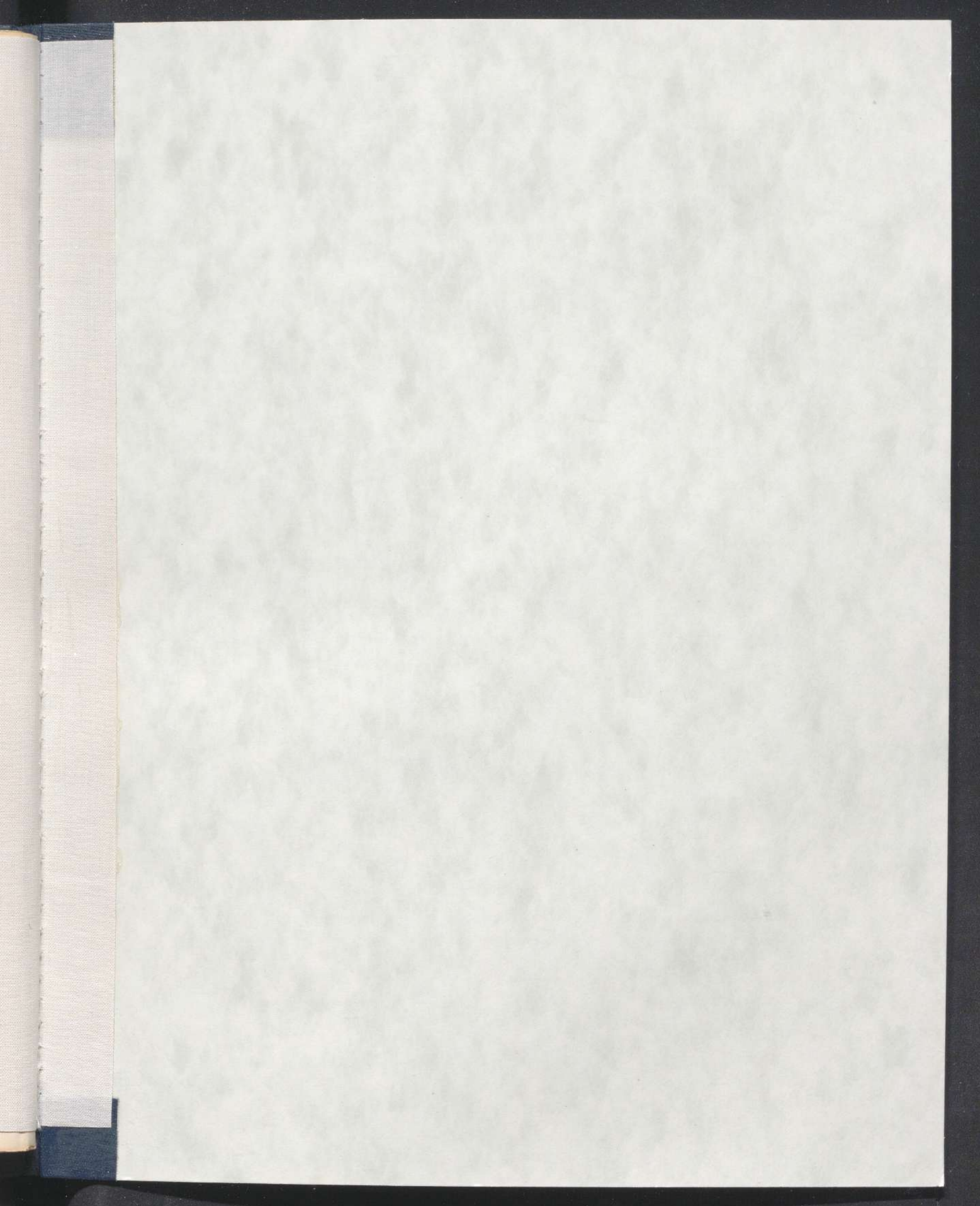
