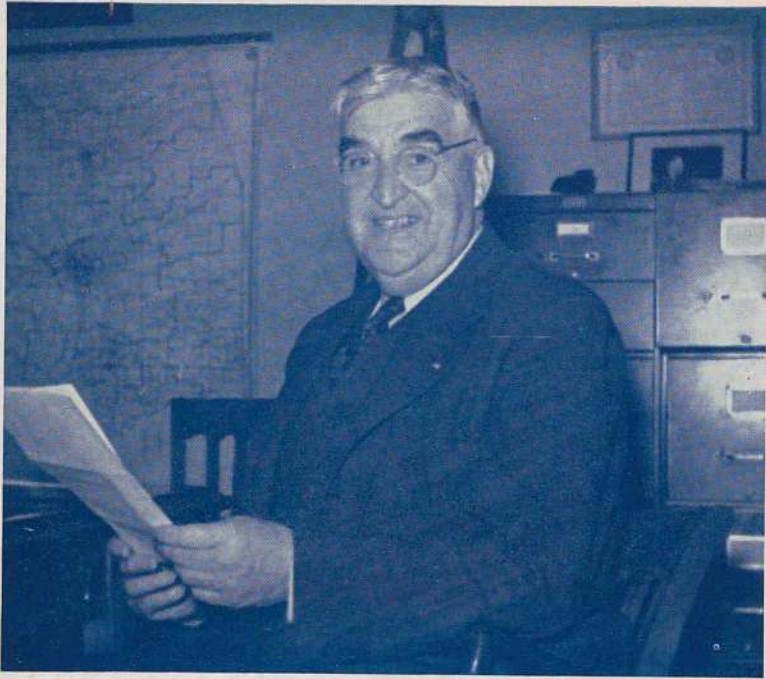

*T*HE duties of the Controls are to maintain order in the halls, at rallies, and other school events, and to report offenders for cutting, smoking, riding a bicycle on the school grounds, and other offenses. Contrary to the belief of many students, the Student Controls are primarily formed not to punish students, but to warn them and help them obey school rules. When a student is summoned before the Student Control, he is allowed to explain his side of the question and to be fairly tried by the Student Control. The decision is then sent to the Deans for their approval.

“*T*O TREAT each and every offender fairly” may be used to describe the underlying principle of the Student Control. The arm of the Student Control is to treat first offenders with greater lenience than would be extended to repeated offenders.

The Student Controls are composed of twenty academic, commercial, and vocational students. The Boys’ Student Control is headed by the Commissioner of Welfare, while the Girls’ Student Control is headed by the First Vice President, both of whom are elected at large by the Student Body. The Girls’ Student Control meets every Wednesday afternoon, and the Boys’ Student Control meets whenever called together by the Commissioner of Welfare.

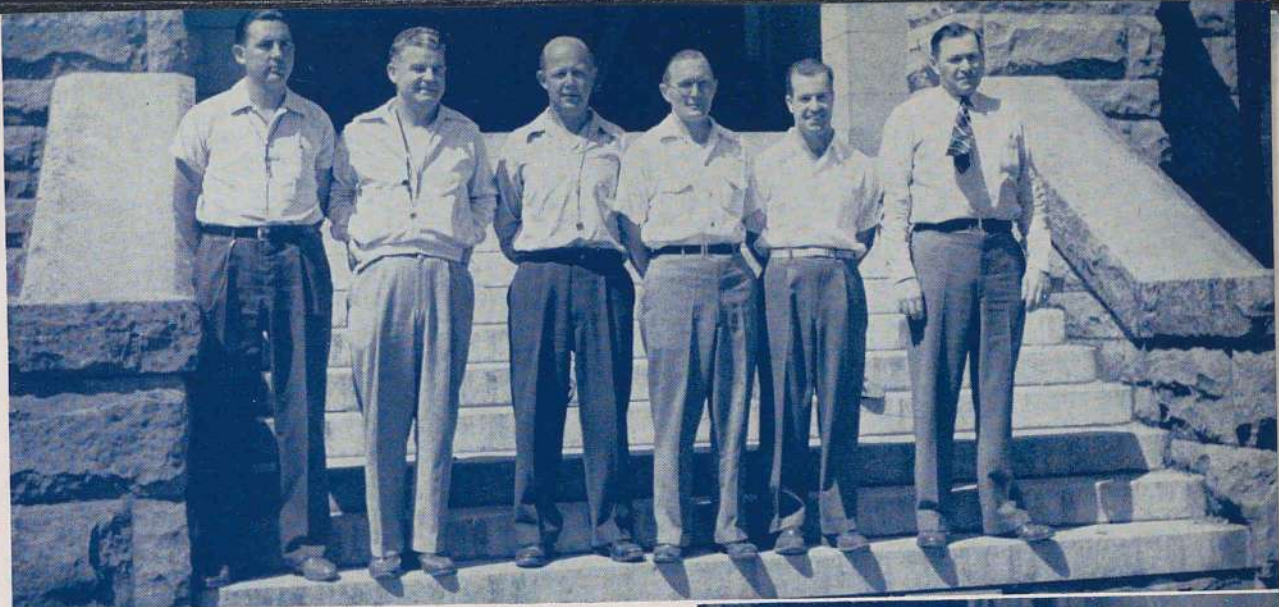

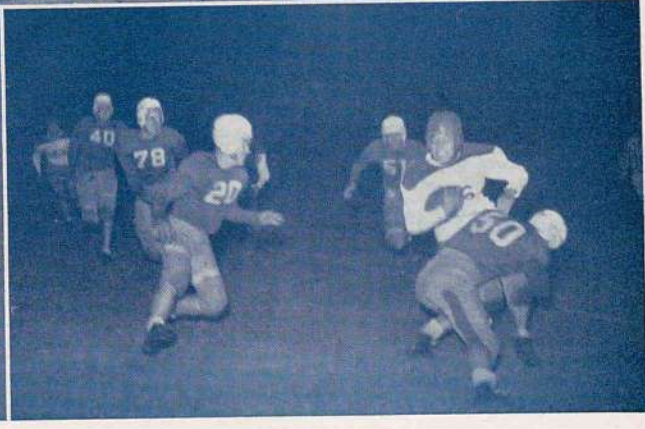

VARSITY

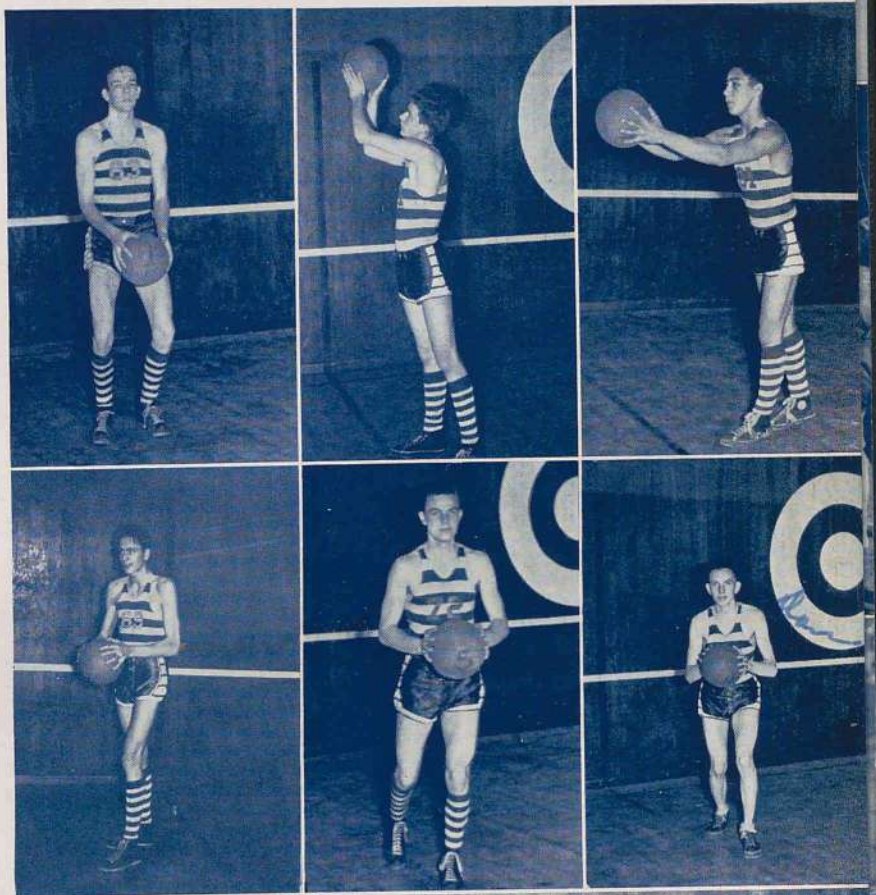

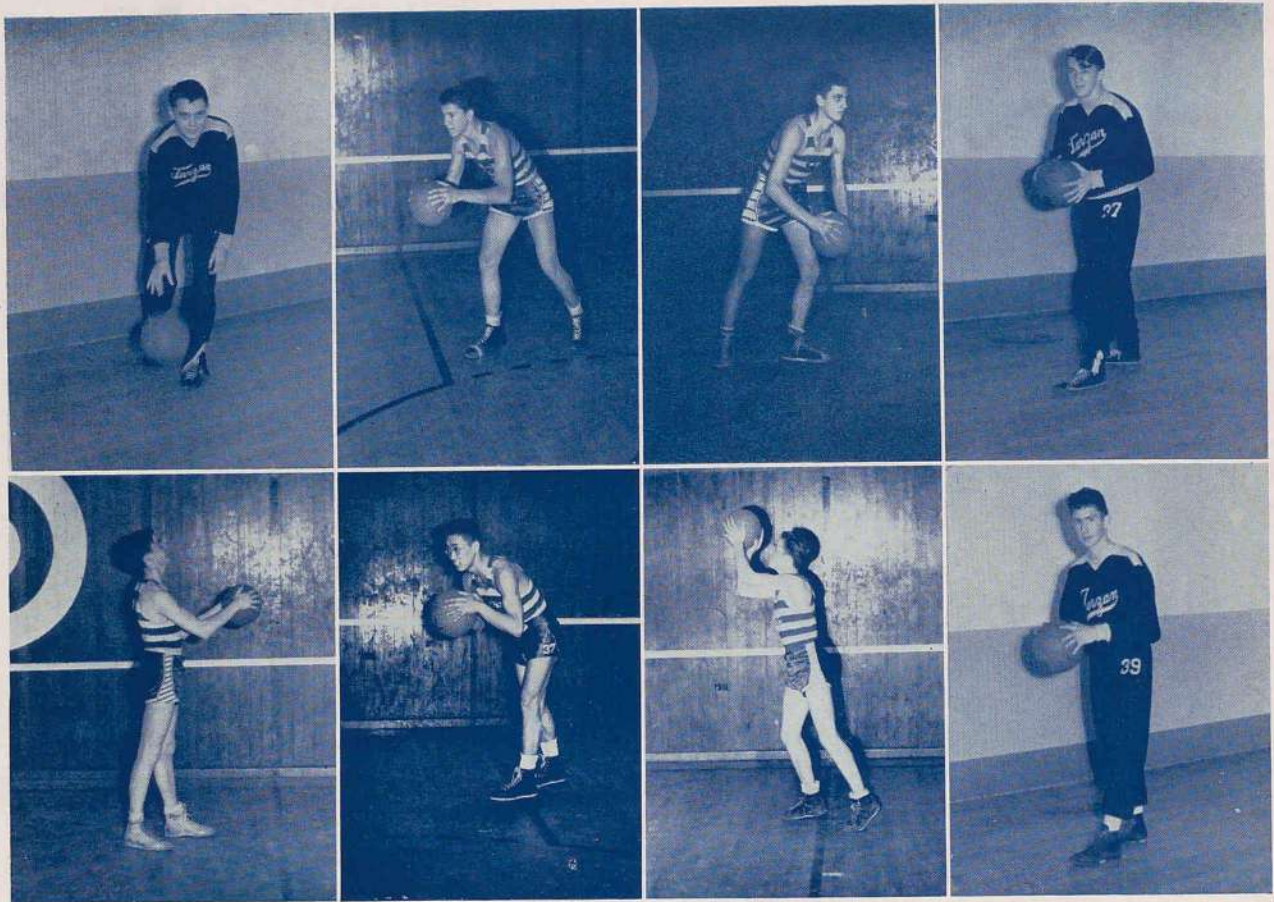

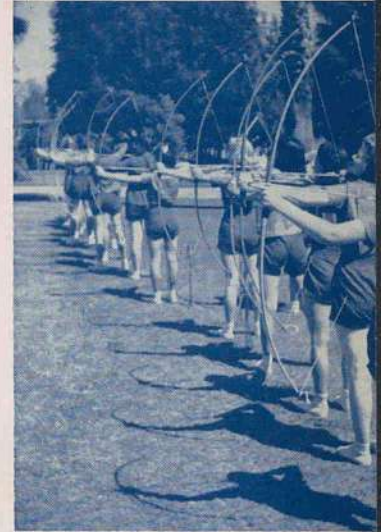
