Bolton was given by Mr & Mrs. Charles Long, Mrs. Harvey Maxwell and Mrs. Lueta Kellerby in memory of Martha Fitzmorris. Virginia Court Records in Southwestern Pennsylvania, Records of the Dist. of W. Augusta and Ohio and Yohogania Counties, Va. 1775-1780 by Boyd Crumrine was given by Doris Cantrall, Harriett Creager, Jesse Park, Flossie Scofield and Claire Ramsey in memory of Martha Fitzmorris. Colonial Families of the United States of America by McKenzie, complete set, was given by Samuel DeMoss in memory of Edith Caughron. These make a lot of good searching

I went to the Coffeyville Public Library and found that Flossie was right, there is a lot of good material there. They house the Montgomery County Genealogical Society material as well so that makes for a lot of stuff. This library is one with strange acoustics, a whisper in one part is heard all over but if you can work with lots of noise you have it made. I am sure the man who sat snoring the whole time I was there is not a regular feature but the many patrons are. So if you need quiet, take your ear plugs and just search away.

The census is 'crawling along'. I am behind in the proof reading but have made progress by coercing Frank into helping. Flossie and Lueta have started their weekly trek to the court house to copy records again. In Vol. 4 #4 we are going to print the death records for Wilson County from 1889-1909. We haven't been able to find out why so few were recorded and why the ones recorded were chosen. They cover from the county poor house to the leading citizens to nameless stillborn, and all possible kinds of ills but the book says they 'estimate' on the number of deaths when they reported to the State Board of Health. If anyone knows the answer, let us know.

Be sure and check page 41 for Flossie's article on where to look and write. It reveals lots of hitherto unrevealed hiding places for information. This is more complete and up-to-date than the report given at the meeting.

Sources of Indian Records: The Bureau of Indian Affairs, 1951 Constitution Ave., N. W., Washington, D. C. 20241; The Interior Bldg., Washington, D. C. (inter-library loan); The National Archives, Washington, D. C. 20408; The Bureau of Indian Affairs; and The General Land Office, which has tribal census rolls, military service, etc.

Illinois: Ill. State Historical Library, Old State Capitol, Springfield, Ill. 62706 will answer one specific genealogical question only. Census information is available from the Ill. State Archives, Springfield, Ill. 62706. (Many census records indexed.) The Newberry Library, Chicago, Ill. will copy specific pages from books for 10¢ per page with a \$3.00 minimum order. They can't do research but will furnish names of researchers. The Shawnee Library System, R. 2, Box 136A, Carterville, Ill. 62918 has interlibrary loan service on over 900 genealogical books. Write for free bibliography.

Indiana: Vigo County Public Library, 222 N. 7th, Terre Haute, Ind. 47801 will do limited research. Indiana State Library, 140 N. Senate Ave., Indianapolis, Ind. 46204 will do limited research. Fort Wayne Library, Fort Wayne, Ind. will do limited research on specific questions.

Iowa: Iowa State Dept. of History and Archives, Historical Bldg., Des Moines, Iowa 50319, will make a brief check of their holdings on Iowa families and copy for 10¢ per page.

Kansas: Kansas State Historical Society Library, Topeka, Ks. 66612 might answer one specific request requiring little time.

Kentucky: Kentucky Historical Society, Box H, Frankfort, Ky. 40601, has folders on families, and cards with vital statistics which they will check. Office of Secretary of State Land Office, Frankfort, Ky. will check land records.

Maryland: Hall of Records Commission, P. O. Box 828, Annapolis, Md. 21404, will check indexes free if stamped self-addressed envelope enclosed. (Of course, this is a must for any request any place.)

Massachusetts: New England Historic Genealogical Society, 101 Newbury St., Boston, Mass. 02115, might be a helpful source.

Michigan: The Detroit Society for Gen. Research, Inc., Burton Historical Collection, Detroit Public Library, Detroit, Mich. 48202. State of Mich. Dept. of Education, State Library Services, 735 E. Michigan Ave., Lansing, Mich. 48918, will check Michigan census records free.

Missouri: Mr. John Mills, Co. Clerk, St. Clair Co., Osceola, Mo. will help on above county in addition to Courthouse information.



New Hampshire: New Hampshire State Library, Concord, N. H. 03301 would copy specific references for 10¢ per page or 25¢ per micro-print. New Hampshire Historical Society, 30 Park St., Concord, N. H. 03301 has index to 1800 census which they might check for you. They charge 15¢ per page for the first ten pages of photocopying then 25¢ per page thereafter, plus postage and handling with a minimum charge of \$1.00

North Carolina: State Dept. of Archives & History, Raleigh, N. C. has the largest genealogical collection in the state as well as county records. There are many indexes.

New York: New York State Historical Assn., Fenimore House, Cooperstown, N. Y. 13326 will do some research free.

Ohio: The Ohio Historical Society Library, 1813 N. High St., Columbus, Ohio will check indexes free. The State Library of Ohio, 65 S. Front St., Columbus, Ohio, 43215 will check limited specific requests.

Oklahoma: Oklahoma Historical Society, Historical Bldg., Oklahoma City, Okla. 73105 will check limited amount.

Pennsylvania: The Genealogy Section of Pa. State Library, Education Bldg., Walnut St. & Commonwealth Ave., Harrisburg, Pa. will check surname cards for number of references to a specific name and copy specific references in books for a specified amount.

South Carolina: University of S. Car. Library, Columbia, S. C. 29208 has newspapers on microfilm available for interlibrary loan and many books on S. Carolina (no bibliography). A nominal fee to cover insurance and postage is charged. S. Car. Dept. of Archives and History, 1430 Senate St., Columbia, S. C. 29201 might answer a specific inquiry.

Tennessee: Tenn. State Library and Archives, Library Section, Nashville, Tenn. will check census indexes and will furnish bibliography of books available on interlibrary loan.

Utah: LDS Library, 50 E. North Temple St., Salt Lake City, Utah 84150 will answer specific requests which aren't too time-consuming and will furnish copy of index card or archive record if request is furnished on Form 239 which forms they will furnish.

Washington, D. C.: National Archives, Census Records, will furnish census information if requested on Form GSA7029 for a fee of \$2.00 if anything is found. It must be a county with a small population, however. Military Service Records, National Archives, will furnish pension, bounty land or military records for the \$2.00 fee if anything is found. Order the proper form GSA 6751 from them.

W. Virginia: State of W. Va. Dept. of Archives and History,

Charleston, W. Va. 25305, has some books available for inter-library loan but furnishes no bibliography. They will answer specific requests not requiring much research. W. Va. University Library, Morgantown, W. Va. has "Guide to Manuscripts and Archives in the W. Va. Collection", by James W. Hess, available on microfilm for interlibrary loan or it may be purchased from them for \$5.00 a copy. The collection of material is also available on microfilm for interlibrary loan.

I would not hesitate to write to any of the historical and genealogical societies and libraries with a specific request. All they can do is say "no". Never overlook a public library in the area in which your interest lies. Most people are willing to help if the request would not be too time-consuming--such as "send me everything you have on John Doe". Everton's "Handy Book for Genealogists" also gives many sources. I tried to list some of the unusual.

I have been doing research for only five years and some of the copies I sent for are already fading away. I think we would be wise to type copies of these valuable records as soon as they are received. Perhaps it is not too late to copy those which are already fading first. Mine have not been exposed to light so it is just the normal thing with certain kinds of copiers. We would begrudge the time it takes but in the years to come we would be glad we did it.

#### ADDITIONS:

Connecticut: The Conn. Hist. Soc., 1 Elizabeth St., Hartford, Conn. 06105 will loan books on interlibrary loan for one month for a fee of 50¢ per volume up to 4 books per month. The Conn. State Library, 231 Capitol Ave., Hartford, Conn. 06115 will reply to specific requests if not too time-consuming, and will make copies of specific articles for different prices for different types and sizes of copies. The most interesting material listed in the brochure they sent was the Town Vital Records giving births, marriages and deaths up to about 1850. From 1850 to 1897 they are available in the town offices and thereafter from the State Dept. of Health, Vital Statistics Section, 79 Elm St., Hartford, Conn. 06115. The State Library also has a card index by name to most of the federal census records through 1850. They have many other valuable sources indexed.

North Carolina: Genealogical Services Branch, Div. of the State Library, Dept. of Cultural Resources, 109 E. Jones St., Raleigh, N. C. 27611 will lend through interlibrary loan the census of their state 1790-1880, as well as Raleigh newspapers and county records on microfilm. They will check for specific family names through interlibrary requests. They welcome queries.

Vermont: The Vt. His. Soc., Montpelier, Vt. 05602 has volunteers who try to help with requests as they have time. They have the index to the 1800 Vt. census, and indexes to the 1850 and 1860 Mortality Schedules of Vt. They charge a minimum of 50¢ for handling and postage plus 10¢ per page up to 25 pages.
