While gathering the information for this book, I had the opportunity to meet many people in Perry and I would like to thank them for their help in supplying me with information and granting me permission to go browsing around their property. I would particularly like to thank Marion McPhail and her daughter and son-in-law Lorraine and Dennis Kinney, all of whom found the way into the Hibbard Cemetery (Location 45) and unearthed and cleaned the stones for me. Lorraine and Dennis also unearthed and cleaned some of the older stones in Leland Cemetery (Location 29), mostly the ones belonging to the Leland family.

On one unforgettable exploration, Mrs. Stephenson of Perry took Colon and me into the woods, up a steep hill, through shrubs and brush to the Leighton Cemetery (Location 32). On our return to her home, Mr. Stephenson then took us to the Frost Cemetery (Location 30). We rode down a bumpy, rutted dirt road in a cart that was attached to his tractor, and I really didn't think I would get out of that cart alive. Also, many thanks to Dana Altvater who took me back into this same Leighton Cemetery so that I could recheck the dates on the stones. On our trek he pointed out to me what a bear trap looks like. I had seen several of these "arrangements" on my previous treks through the woods but little did I know what they were!

Thanks also to Charles F. Washburn of No. Perry who sent me information on three cemeteries and to R. L. Corbett of Anchorage, Alaska who described the location of ten cemeteries.

I wish to express my appreciation to Boy Scouts Kevin Murray, Scott Johnson, Matt Raye and Aaron Hennequin. As part of their Eagle Scout Project and under the leadership of Michael E Leddy, they cleared Gleason Cemetery (Location #3) of the overgrowth of ferns and straightened up the gravestones.

Above all I want to thank my husband, Joe, who patiently filled his time in Eastport researching vital records while I was crawling through the woods in Perry. And even more thanks to him for his patience while I compiled and typed this book.

INTRODUCTION

The inspiration for this book developed after I became interested in genealogy in 1988 and discovered that some of my ancestors had lived in Perry, Maine from the very early 1800's. I made a trip to Perry in the early summer of 1988, to search for clues about these ancestors, eager to find where they had lived and where they might be buried. I became acquainted with Colon Morrison, Sr., of Perry, and he gave me directions to about 20 cemeteries in town, but most of them, except the most obvious ones, were impossible for me to find. Also, being a city person, there was no way that I was going to tramp around in those woods by myself. I returned to California not only extremely dissatisfied with my lack of discovery, but also with a sadness and a concern that with time these cemeteries would be lost to future generations and forgotten forever. However, all was not lost, as three months later I had another opportunity to visit Perry. This time Colon Morrison spent more than a day taking me to many of the cemeteries in the woods, finding and cleaning the stones while I copied the inscriptions. During the spring and summer of 1989 Colon searched out some more cemeteries, and in preparation for my third visit to Perry in the fall of 1989, he dug out gravestones from under decades of debris, cleaned them and then copied many of the inscriptions. When I arrived that fall Colon took me to all of these cemeteries so that I would have personal knowledge of each one of them.

While this book is an attempt to record as many gravestone inscriptions as possible of the former townspeople of Perry, I'm sadly aware that the book falls far short of recording all of the people who lived in Perry during the 1800's. Some of the families probably moved away, but it is more likely that many of the people were buried on their family farms and that no gravestones were erected for them.

The names in each cemetery are listed in alphabetical order. While this may separate family relationships, most of the cemeteries are so small that these relationships can be assessed. In other cemeteries the gravestones were in such a state of disarray or so overgrown with grass and shrubs, it was impossible to determine exactly which ones belonged together. However, with some of the larger, well-kept cemeteries I have included a list of gravestones by rows.

The listings in this book are presented in a manner which provides a consistent format and does not represent the exact order of information

on the stone, although all pertinent information is included. Any information that is not actually on the gravestone inscription is enclosed in parentheses. This could be information obtained from the Town Military List, from the Perry Town Records, stories told to me by various people in Perry, or information obtained during my own research. While comparing some of the dates on the gravestone inscriptions with the Perry Vital Records, I discovered many discrepancies on the date of death. I have no explanation for this, so genealogists are cautioned to use the data in this book with care.

When more than one given name is on a gravestone, only one surname is listed for the group and the given names are listed under the surname. Whenever a woman's maiden name is stated on the gravestone, she is listed in the index under both her maiden and her married name(s). When a person's parents are stated on the gravestone, their names are listed in the index.

All of the inscriptions have been double-checked, but as with any human endeavor, error can occur. If you discover any such errors, or if you have information about any other burial sites in Perry, please let me know so that I can update any future editions.

May you enjoy this journey into the past.

As the story was handed down through the family, the Dana farm was used as a station on the 'underground railroad' and more than one runaway slave was rowed across to St. Andrews under cover of darkness. One middle-aged male slave, however, for reasons unknown, stayed on and worked on the farm for some years. He eventually died and was buried on the farm, about 100 feet west of the present-day Methodist Church. I am not sure if there ever was a gravestone, but if so it has undoubtedly disappeared or become overgrown. Unfortunately all of my family's records and diaries were destroyed in a fire so I know of nothing in writing concerning this gravesite. I remember discussing this matter with my grandfather and other family members, and they all believed the story was true."
