That age is best which is the first, When youth and blood are warmer; But being spent, the worse, and worst Times, still succeed the former.










Superintendent Dr. Fitch






The School Board Gets

The school board is the apex of the school organization structure. It is composed mostly of farmers, (president) Gordon Gengelbach (1), Richard Mallen (2), John Carpenter (3), Charles Kellam (4), and Richard Barmann (5), who also is an engineer for Leeds and Northrup. Vice-president Dixie Ozenberger (6) is the non-farming juvenile officer of Clinton County.

The school board is the policy making body of the school system. They meet on the first Monday of every month to decide what shall be done, how to accomplish certain tasks, and what to do with the school's money.

The school board passed a bond for \$545,000 last year to build the new building. They have enough money left over to remodel the old building.

Most of the Juniors and Seniors were moved from their old lockers to the 114 lockers in the new building.












Jr. High Demolishes DeKalb






